DATA COLLECTION

The law also includes two new district reporting requirements:

Any school employee, resource officer, or school security officer who uses isolation or restraint on a
student during school-sponsored instruction or activities must inform the building administrator or
building administrator's designee as soon as possible, and within two business days submit a written
report of the incident to the districts office (RCW 28A.600.485(5)).
