Good afternoon Katie,

I have a question for you regarding aversive intervention plans. I know that with the new law, those have been discontinued, but is there anything being put in its place? I ask because your current student here has needed increasing levels of seclusion due to his heightened behaviors. At this point we have implemented a plan to start seclusion at the beginning of a problem with him, before things get to a dangerous level, and while he has had to be secluded several times a day with this, he is producing work and when using this plan, he has not gotten to the level of violence as he was before. Staff relaxed this plan with him yesterday, and his aggression and violence spiked again, towards both students and staff.

We have permission for this plan from his social worker and a DMHP from the agency, but I worry we are in limbo with how to properly cover our procedures for this student, given the new state law. Any insight you have would be appreciated!
