Good Afternoon:

On Friday, March 1, 2019, at 2:22PM, our dispatch alerted us to an occurrence of shots fired in the Linden area at [REDACTED] (Columbus Police Incident#190165115). Multiple calls were received from citizens regarding the occurrence. We did not receive the shot spotter alert until approximately ten minutes later. Lieutenant Kuykendoll (who I have cc'd on this correspondence) was seated at her computer at the time and received the delayed alert with a notice that there was a ten minute delay. Lt. Kuykendoll stated she heard the audio alert that there was an occurrence of shots fired but no information was attached to the alert. Units with the mobile unit did receive the alert before desktop computers however the delay was significant. I was asked to email you about this occurrence in case there is a problem with the system. Thank you in advance for your time in addressing this matter.
