I haven't received an answer yet for my question in regards to Case# 00107834 and I would like to add to this case. I found another incident SS ID 4866 for [REDACTED]. Columbus, OH where the incident was published and pushed to us at 03:26:04 and our officers determined this to be Fireworks. Similar to the first incident I inquired about, this incident was reclassified by ShotSpotter approximately 2 hours later to "other" and is now not showing when I pull a report for Single Gunshot/Multiple Gunshots/Possible Gunfire. I'm just confused about what is going on with these incidents and am hoping someone can explain.

Also, as I stated in my previous follow-up to case# 00107834, I really need communication to go through this current email (pvedder@columbuspolice.org). I think my computer must have auto-filled my personal email address when I was speaking with Chat Support previously in regards to this case because a follow up email was sent to my personal email address.
