OfficerID: FLAGSO\CPunsky, Case Narrative

On May 11, 2023 at approximately 1519 hours, I, Deputy Punsky responded to the area of Aviation Dr and SR 100 in reference to a suspicious incident.

Flagler County Communication Specialists received multiple calls for service in reference to a female riding her bicycle eastbound in the westbound lanes of SR 100, almost striking several vehicles. The female was described as a white female wearing a black tank top, black backpack and was riding a black in color bicycle. Shortly after, multiple calls were coming in, in reference to the same female scratching multiple vehicles with a sharp object.

Upon my arrival, I observed the described female on a black in color bicycle exiting the business plaza in front of Bronx House Pizzeria. The female then began riding her bicycle southbound on Aviation Drive. I activated the red and blue emergency lights of my marked patrol vehicle (Clearly marked with FCSO's Agency insignia) in attempt to conduct a traffic stop on the bicycle to further investigate. I activated my sirens multiple times in which the female continued to travel southbound on Aviation drive. The female glanced over her right shoulder, looked directly at my patrol vehicle and made a sharp right turn into an open field. The female then began to gain speed in attempt to elude law enforcement. I travelled through the field in an effort to get ahead of her, at which time she dropped her bicycle and continued to evade me on foot.

I exited my marked patrol vehicle and gave the female clear verbal commands ordering her to stop. The female refused to do so, as she continued to walk away from me. I approached the female, grabbed the back of her arms and advised she will be escorted to the ground if she continued to resist. The female was ultimately escorted to the ground which resulted in her placing her hands under her stomach and refusing to cooperate. The female was later positively identified via DAVID (Driver and Vehicle Information Database) Photo as, Bree Gadoury 01/05/1981.

While trying to secure Bree in handcuffs, I felt a sharp metal object scratching at my lower left leg. Bree was subsequently placed in handcuffs behind her back while laying flat on her stomach. She then rotated her body towards me and aggressively kicked me twice in the chest area.

A bystander, Brett Pennington, then approached me and drew my attention to a black handled, screwdriver like, object that he advised Bree was using in an attempt to stab me in my leg, explaining the scratching sensation I felt. It should be noted that I suffered no injuries during the altercation. Pennington would later complete a sworn written statement documenting what he observed. Additional units then arrived on scene and began to assist. While attempting to place Bree in the rear of a marked patrol car, Bree began to move her body in a wild manner to avoid being placed in the car. While on the ground, Deputies observed that Bree removed her right hand from the handcuffs and was then unsecured. Bree again placed her hands under her stomach area and refused to comply once again. K9 handler Corporal Cavas deployed his agency issued Taser X7 and gave Bree loud verbal commands imploring her to comply. After several warnings, Corporal Cavas executed a drive-stun to her rear right shoulder area which resulted in Bree complying and being re-secured. Deputies made contact with two victims of the criminal mischief (Scratching of vehicles) who stated that they wished to pursue charges. The victims completed Willingness to Prosecute forms and will provide sworn statements at a later time which will be submitted to the FCSO Records Division.

Florida Highway Patrol Trooper Lima assisted in taking Bree into custody. See Trooper Lima's report (case#FHPZ300N0246548) for documentation of his involvement.

Bree was placed in the rear of a patrol vehicle and was transported to AdventHealth for medical treatment. Based on my investigation and interaction with Bree, it was determined Bree committed the following offenses: x2 Criminal Mischief over \$1k, Aggravated Battery on a Law Enforcement Officer, Resisting an Officer with Violence and Fleeing to Elude Law Enforcement with Lights and Sirens. The black handled screwdriver was submitted for evidence. Two black bags containing clothing and miscellaneous items were collected and submitted for safekeeping.

OfficerID: FLAGSO\tcavas, Case Supplement Narrative

On May 11, 2023 at 1519 hours, I responded to the intersection of SR 100 East and Aviation Drive in reference to a criminal mischief that occurred at 5100 SR 100 East.

Prior to my arrival, Deputy Punsky had located the suspect on Aviation Drive and had taken her into custody. Flagler County Real Time Center provided an update that the suspect was still actively kicking Deputy Punsky.

Upon my arrival, I observed Deputy Punsky who had the subject on the ground and secured in handcuffs. Once Deputy Pierre arrived, Deputy Punsky and I lifted the subject from the ground and transported her to Deputy Pierre's patrol vehicle. As we attempted to place her in the patrol vehicle, she lifted her legs into the air and placed her feet on the door frame of the vehicle, preventing us from securing her. We escorted her back to the ground and Florida Highway Patrol Trooper Lima offered to retrieve a hobble from his patrol vehicle. At that time, the suspect was able to slip one of her hands from her handcuffs. She placed both her hands under her chest while she lay face down.

At that time, I commanded the suspect to put her hands behind her back. She did not comply with my lawful order. I removed my agency issued Taser from its holster and told her again to place her hands behind her back or she would get tased. I placed my Taser against her right shoulder just above her shoulder blade and counted to three. The subject still did not comply I then administered a

drive stun to her right shoulder for approximately 5 or 6 seconds until she complied and placed both of her hands behind her back. She was secured with handcuffs and a hobble before being placed in a marked patrol vehicle.

I then assisted with gathering witness statements.

OfficerID: FLAGSO\spierre, Case Supplement Narrative

On Thursday, May 11, 2023, at 1521 hours, Deputy S. Pierre responded to Aviation Dr./ SR 100 E., (Open Lot Area) Palm Coast, FL, 32164, in reference to a suspicious person, later identified to be an Assault/ Battery.

Deputy Pierre responded to the location mentioned above in reference to assisting Deputy Punskey with an uncooperative female who was actively resisting law enforcement.

Deputy Pierre assisted with aiding to restrain and securing the female who was being placed under arrest. See Deputy Punskey's arrest report for further information. While on scene the female later identified as Bree Ann Gadoury was actively resisting and was not following verbal commands given by Deputies. Bree was placed in handcuffs and was able to maneuver herself out of the handcuffs which she continued to actively resist and become combative. Deputy Pierre assisted with securely placing Bree back in handcuffs, at this time Bree began kicking Deputies. Bree was placed in leg/ feet restraints (Hobble restraints) to prevent further possible injuries to Deputies or herself.

Bree resisted being placed in the back seat of Deputy Pierre's marked agency patrol vehicle. After the assistance of other Deputies on scene, Bree was safely and securely placed in the backseat of Deputy Pierre agency marked patrol vehicle. While at the location Flagler County Sheriff's Office Fire Rescue arrived on the scene to provide medical attention. Due to Bree's hostile demeanor and uncooperativeness, the Paramedic was unable to provide proper medical treatment. Bree stated she wished to have medical treatment rendered so Deputy Pierre transported Bree to AdventHealth Palm Coast, located at 60 Memorial Medical Pkwy, Palm Coast, FL, 32164, and was also escorted by Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) Trooper Lima and Flagler County Sheriff's Office Deputy Zalak for safety.

Deputy Pierre stayed at Advent Health Palm Coast with the arrested female Bree Ann Gadoury until he was relieved by Deputy Bifano who later transported Bree Ann Gadoury to Flagler County Sheriff's Inmate Facility.

This incident was recorded using Deputy Pierre's Body-worn Axon Video Recorder and will be uploaded to evidence.com in a timely manner.

Deputy Pierre took no further action.
