In the spring of 2017 I was made aware of a student, [REDACTED], who had posted an inappropriate photos on social media. In the picture was what looked like a fire arm and a comment about coming to school prepared on the last day of school. The school investigated the post, which was brought forward by another student. The picture was found to be a stock photo from the internet and the student has no access to firearms and admitted that he was acting stupid when he posted. He did not have any intentions to shoot up the school on the last day of the school year in 2017.

In the fall of 2017, this same picture was the topic of conversation in the 8th grade. A few students told school administrators that [REDACTED] had posted that he was going to shoot up school on the last day of school. During the school's investigation, they learned that the post was from last fall and again confirmed that [REDACTED] did not have access to firearms, that no one in the family had a license to carry and that [REDACTED] did not intend to shoot up the school.

In March I received a voice mail at the station from a parent who wished to remain anonymous advising of this post. I advised the school, who finally told me about this situation (I had no involvement prior to this voicemail). I interviewed all administrators who were involved and they all felt confident having spoken with [REDACTED] on a number of occasions that he had no intentions of doing harm to the school. I also spoke with [REDACTED] who relayed that he posted this last year and told me that there were no guns in his home, that all he had were air soft guns and that his father keeps them locked up until they go to the place where he gets to use them. I confirmed with the Dunstable Police that there was no LTC for the household.

About a month later, I received three anonymous phone calls from different parents regarding this same issue. I advised Mr. Lin the principal to send out a letter to 8th grade parents about this incident advising them that it was investigated and unfounded. He declined to notify the parents because he felt it would cause more problems.

Again on May 20th, the station had a walk in to the lobby about this incident. We advised the parent of the status of the case and I again advised Mr. Lin to notify the parents.
