Subject: Bias Based Profiling 2022 Annual Review

In order to maintain compliance with the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation Standard 2.06M and the Lauderhill Police Department Policy 01.220, an annual review concerning bias based profiling for the period of January 1st, 2022 through December 31st, 2022 was conducted.

The City of Lauderhill, according to the 2021 US Census population estimate, has an estimated total population of 73,458. The estimated racial breakdown of the city was 80.5% African American or Black, 11.3% White or Caucasian, 7.4% Hispanic or Latino, 1.2% Asian, 0.2% American Indian and Alaska Native, and 4.4% Two or more Races.

According to the Broward Sheriff's Office, the City of Lauderhill Arrest Records indicate there were 912 adult arrests in 2022. Of those arrests, 827 were Black (90.67%), 85 were White (9.32%)

According to the Asset Forfeiture Report there were 8 total Asset Forfeiture cases. Of those, there were 8 Black defendants (100%), 0 White, and 0 from any other ethnicity in the forfeiture proceedings.

According to the Broward Sheriff's Office, the City of Lauderhill Arrest Records indicate there were a total of 4 Driving Under the Influence (DUI) arrests in 2022. Of those arrests, 4 of the arrestees were Black (100%), 0 White, and 0 of any other ethnicities.

During the year of 2022, the Lauderhill Police Department issued 4,325 Uniformed Traffic Citations according to our Records Management System. Of those 4,325 citations, 3,668 of them were issued to Black individuals (84.81%), 596 to White (13.78%), and 61 to those listed as either Indian, Asian, Other or Unknown (1.41%).

In a review of all Internal Affairs complaints for the period of January 1st, 2022 to December 31st, 2022, there was 1 allegation of bias-based profiling which was investigated and at the conclusion was determined that "No Further" action was warranted. This was out of a total of 16 complaints received for the year.

Based on the results of this annual review, the Lauderhill Police Department is in compliance not only with CFA Standard 2.06M, but also Lauderhill Police Department Policy 01.220.
