Dep. Grayson narrative

On 07/17/22 at approximately 1500 hours, I was patrolling south on the 700 block of North East 6th St, Atlanta IL, I observed a maroon truck pulling on to 6th St, failing to signal. I turned around to get behind the truck with Illinois registration. The truck pulled in to the Atlanta IL meat locker off of NE 6th street, failing to signal pulling into the parking lot. I pulled into the meat locker parking lot, behind the vehicle that was now parked and activated my emergency lights and initiated a traffic stop.

I observed the male driver to moving around in the vehicle and reaching down and appeared as he was making furtive movements, as if he was trying to hide or destroy something. I approached the vehicle and observed the male I know to be Sean Samples due to recent police contact on 07/11/22 for possession of methamphetamine, please see case #2022-15557. I observed Sean's chest to be moving at a fast pace and he would not stop moving around in his seat while speaking to me. Sean's hands were both shaking. I know these signs to be common with nervousness. Sean's dog jumped onto his lap and came towards the window. I asked Sean to step out of the vehicle and speak with me. I observed Sean to have blood shot glossy eyes and to have constricted pupils at this time. Sean started to sweat and became agitated by yelling that I have no reason to stop him and that I cannot pull him over if he is already parked. I believed Sean to be under the influence of drugs, due to the way Sean was acting.

I asked Sean to step out of the vehicle. Sean stated that he could not get out of the vehicle. Sean repeated himself multiple times stating the same thing. I asked Sean to step out of the vehicle again. Sean rolled the window up, locked the doors and stated he was not going to exit the vehicle and did not have to get out of the vehicle. I explained to Sean multiple times that he failed to signal twice when required to. Sean demanded to see my video footage. I advised Sean that he needed to comply with my commands. Sean Stated that he was not going to exit the vehicle and began to yell stating that he wants other Officers to come here to witness what was going on. Sean got on his phone and started to call 911 and multiple other agencies such as Illinois State Police, Sectary State Police, Logan County Sheriff's Office, and 911 again. Sean at this time grabbed his chest and stated that he is having medical issues. I radioed my supervisor Sgt. Bauer to ask permission to pop the window to remove Sean from the vehicle. Sgt. Bauer stated to hold off until he was on scene. Sgt. Bauer stated to get his license and proof of insurance for now. I asked Sean for his license and proof of insurance again. Sean stated he does not have to give it to me, stating I cannot pull him over. I advised Sean that he was driving on a public roadway and has to provide a license and proof of valid insurance. I advised Sean to give me both documents. Sean slightly cracked the window and slid his License through the crack, and rolled the window back up. Sean stated he did not have proof of insurance with him and would get it.

Atlanta Officer Ummel and Dep Maslanka arrived on scene. Officer Ummel tried to talk with Sean to get him to comply and exit the vehicle. Sean would not listen to Officer Ummel. I approached the vehicle to speak with Sean. I explained to Sean that I observed him fail to signal and I believed him to be under the influence of drugs. I advised Sean that I wanted him to exit the vehicle to speak with me. Sean stated that he knew what was going to happen if he opened the door or window. Sean stated that I would smell cannabis and then search the car and arrest him. I advised Sean that I had not said anything about cannabis or searching the vehicle. I asked Sean if he had cannabis in the vehicle, Sean stated that he learned his lesson and left it at home. I asked Sean again to come out of the truck he stated he was not going to exit the vehicle.

Sgt. Bauer arrived on scene and spoke with Sean. Sgt. Bauer was able to get Sean to roll the window down to speak to him. I began to fill out a citation for failure to signal when required. While Sgt. Bauer was speaking with Sean, Sean stated that he had a small amount of cannabis in the vehicle. Sgt. Bauer convinced Sean in to exiting the vehicle. Sean exited the vehicle, I searched Sean's person and did not locate any weapons or drug contraband on his person. Dep. Maslanka stood with Sean, while Sgt. Bauer and I searched the vehicle.

Sgt. Bauer located a metal pipe with a clear baggie with cannabis inside of it under the driver floor mat. I located a glass pipe with white substance in it located in the glove box. I know this glass pipe to be commonly used to smoke methamphetamine. I believed the substance in the glass pipe to be methamphetamine. I located a metal pipe with burnt cannabis inside of it under the passenger seat. Sgt. Bauer collected all of the evidence and placed them in to plastic evidence baggies. Sgt. Bauer secured the evidence in my squad car.

I asked Sean to come talk with me at my squad car. I asked Sean when the last time he used drugs. Sean stated Monday when I arrested him. I asked Sean not to lie and be honest. I asked Sean again when was the last time he used methamphetamine. Sean stated Monday. I asked Sean what about the loaded meth pipe in his vehicle. Sean stated "whoa! Whoa! Did you hear (talking to his phone)". Sean repeated "loaded meth pipe? The meth pipe in the glove box". I asked Sean how he knew the meth pipe was in the glove box. Sean stated "I was telling Glenda". I advised Sean that I never stated anything about where the meth pipe was at. Sean stated yes you did you said it was in the glove box. Sgt. Bauer stated no he didn't he stated that it was just in the truck. I advised Sean that I will ask one more time when the last time he used was and if he lied he was going to jail. I asked Sean when the last time he used drugs was, Sean stated Monday. I advised Sean that he was under arrest. I placed Sean in handcuffs double locked and checked for fit. I read Sean his Miranda Rights, and advised Sean that he was under arrest for possession of methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia. I placed Sean in the back seat of my squad car.

The owner of the vehicle Glenda Grass stated that Justin Perez could take the vehicle and the dog. Sgt. Bauer ran Justin information

through Logan Dispatch. Logan Dispatch stated Justin was clear of warrants and a valid driver. Justin took possession of the truck and the dog. I transported Sean to Logan County Jail. While the Jail staff was booking Sean in, I issued Sean a copy of his Citation for failure to signal when required. Citation #228116, I issued Sean a copy of a civil citation #00930 for possession of cannabis in motor vehicle. Sean signed both citations. Sean stated that he had his turn signal on. I advised Sean that two times I observed him fail to signal. Sean stated "my turn signals are automatic in the truck, I do not have to activate them". I asked Sean your turn signals are automatic? Sean stated yes they turn on automatically. I advised Sean I have never heard of automatic turn signals. Sean was released to jail staff with no other incident.

I uploaded pictures of the methamphetamine and pipe to a CD that was logged in to evidence. I uploaded a DVD with my in car camera audio/ video and logged it into evidence. I cloud shared my in car camera video / audio to the SA Office. I logged the evidence collected into evidence locker #2. The glass pipe with methamphetamine inside of it will be sent off to ISP Crime lab for testing and weight. The glass pipe was logged in to evidence locker #2.
