## Dep. Grayson Narrative

On 08/14/22 at approximately 1627 hours, I was traveling eastbound on Woodlawn Rd. While at the stop light at Woodlawn Rd and North College St, a male in the Walgreens parking lot was yelling "he does not have a license". I asked the male who he was talking about he stated the male driving the maroon van. I observed a male with no shirt on wearing sunglasses and a hat driving a maroon van that passed me traveling westbound. I turned around to get behind the vehicle. The van pulled into Ayerco gas station parking lot. I observed the male to get out of the driver seat and walk around to the passenger seat. I pulled into the vacant lot to the north of Ayerco gas station. I observed a male, Joshua Shaffer, who I knew from previous police contacts get into the driver seat. The van, Chevrolet Uplander with Illinois registration [REDACTED] registered to Brandon Neibuhr, pulled out of Ayerco headed westbound on Woodlawn Rd. I pulled behind the vehicle traveling westbound. The vehicle turned right off Woodlawn Road on to Main St. The vehicle failed to signal 100 feet prior to turning left into the Casey's Gas Station. I activated my emergency lights and initiated a traffic stop. We came to a stop at 1006 Woodlawn Rd (Casey's Gas Station parking lot).

I approached the passenger side of the vehicle. I advised the male driver, Joshua Shaffer, he failed to signal turning into the Casey's parking lot. I asked Joshua for his license and proof of insurance. I asked the male passenger, who later identified as Philip Elwood, for his license. I asked Philip if he was tired of driving. Philip stated that he was never driving. I advised Philip he passed me at Woodlawn Rd / North College St. Philip stated that he was not driving again. I advised Philip I followed him to Ayerco gas station and I watched him get out of the driver seat and into the passenger seat. Philip stated he did not have his license with him. I asked Philip to come back to my squad car to run his information. Joshua provided me with his license. I took Joshua's license back to my squad car to run his information. Philip got into the passenger seat of my squad car. I ran Joshua's information and he came back valid and clear. I ran Philip's information, Philip came back revoked and on probation. I advised Philip that he was revoked.

I asked Philip if there was anything illegal in the vehicle that would violate his probation. Philip stated that he had expunged and expunged in the vehicle. I asked Philip where it was located in the vehicle, he stated it was under the passenger seat. I advised Philip to stay in the passenger seat of my squad car. I approached the vehicle, and advised Joshua to exit the vehicle. I advised Joshua that Philip stated he had expunged and expunged in the vehicle. I advised Joshua I was going to search the vehicle. I requested another unit through Logan Dispatch. I began searching the vehicle. Dep. Wagner and Sgt. Bauer arrived on scene.

I located the following items in the vehicle.

Expunged. Located on the passenger floorboard in a plastic grocery bag.

Expunged. Located under the passenger seat cover.

\*Green cloth bag with plastic baggie inside of it with expunged inside of the plastic baggie. From my training and experience I knew this to be expunged. Located in red plastic book bag on passenger floorboard.

\*Joshua's book bag (Joshua stated the book bag was his) in the back seat floorboard between driver and passenger seat. In the book bag was a gold plastic container that had plastic baggie with expunged inside of it, and a plastic baggie with white crystal substance inside of it. I later weighed and field-tested the substance and it was positive for methamphetamine and weighed 0.55 grams.

\*Blue plastic pouch that contained a plastic straw with liquid and white substance inside the straw.

I completed searching the vehicle and did not locate any other drug contraband or weapons in the vehicle. I advised Joshua that he was under arrest. I placed Joshua in handcuffs double locked and checked for fit. I asked Joshua if he had any other drug contraband on his person. Joshua stated that he had a bag with a pipe in it, in his waistband of his shorts. I advised Joshua I was going to grab the bag from his waistline. I had Joshua stand in front of my squad car so we were in view of my front camera. I opened Joshua's waistband and observed a green bag. I grabbed the green bag and pulled it out from Joshua's waistband. As I pulled the bag out, a blue in color glass pipe fell out of the bag and hit the ground. The glass pipe broke. I placed Joshua in the back seat of my squad car. I placed Philip in the back seat of Dep. Wagner's squad car. I collected the broken glass pipe and placed it into a plastic evidence bag. I observed on the ground where the glass pipe broke, was a small pile of brown substance what I believed to be methamphetamine from the pipe. I collected the substance and placed it into a plastic evidence baggie.

I secured the evidence in my squad car. I opened the front passenger door of my squad car where Philip was sitting, and observed there to be white substance on my front passenger seat. I later collected pictures of the substance. Under the front passenger seat was a glass pipe commonly used to smoke methamphetamine. I collected the glass pipe and secured it in plastic evidence bag. I went to Dep. Wagner's squad car, and placed Philip under arrest. As I had Philip exit the squad car, I observed there to be white crystal substance in the back seat. Dep. Wagner collected pictures and collected the substance. The substance was placed in plastic evidence bag. I placed Philip in handcuffs, double locked and checked for fit.

I read Joshua and Philip their Miranda rights. Joshua and Philip both acknowledge they understood their rights.

The owner of the van arrived on scene. Brandon Neibuhr asked if she could take the van. I advised Brandon that she needed to provide valid proof of insurance. Brandon provided valid proof of insurance. I advised Brandon she could take the van and leave.

I issued Joshua a written warning #28790 for no turn signal. Expunged. I issued Joshua both of his copies. I issued Philip a citation #228264 for driving revoked. Expunged. I issued Philip his copies of citations. Dep. Wagner transported Philip to the Logan County Jail. I transported Joshua to the Logan County Jail.

While at Logan County Jail, Inspector Mayes and I interviewed Philip, and Joshua. During the interview, Philip stated that he was driving and knew he was revoked and should not have been driving. Philip stated that while in my passenger seat, he got scared and removed the meth pipe from his shoe and put it under the passenger seat of my squad car. Philip stated that the methamphetamine inside of the pipe fell out of the pipe due to it being rocks and had not been melted down yet. Philip stated that he did not purposely dump methamphetamine on Dep. Wagner's seat or mine. Philip completed his interview with us and was taken back to Logan County Jail.

Joshua stated that he did not want to speak to Inspector Mayes or I and was taken back to Logan County Jail.

There was not enough substance on my passenger seat to weigh and field test. The substance on Dep. Wagner's back seat will be sent to ISP Crime Lab to be tested. I collected pictures of evidence and uploaded it to a CD to be logged into evidence. I uploaded my in car camera to a DVD to be logged into evidence. I cloud shared my in car camera to the Logan County States Attorney's Office. See Deputy Wagner supplemental report.

## Deputy Wagner Supplemental

On August 14, 2022 at approximately 1627 hours Deputy Grayson conducted a traffic stop at 1006 Woodlawn Rd. in Lincoln. During Deputy Grayson's traffic stop he requested assistance. I arrived soon after his request. When I arrived I observed Phillip Elwood in Deputy Grayson's front passenger side seat of his squad car. I observed Joshua Shaffer standing in front of Deputy Grayson's squad car and he was handcuffed behind his back. While Joshua was standing with Deputy Grayson I observed Deputy Grayson start searching through a Crown Royal bag and a dark blue in color glass pipe fell out onto the ground. When the pipe hit the ground it shattered into pieces. After it broke, it appeared a brown/tan colored substance fell out of the glass. Based off of my knowledge it appeared to be burnt methamphetamine. The glass and brown/tan substance was collected and held for evidence.

Deputy Grayson placed Joshua in the back of his squad car. Deputy Grayson directed Phillip to step out of the squad car and to sit in the back of my squad car. I walked with Phillip to the rear passenger side of my squad car and had him sit in it. I rolled the driver side rear window down so we could monitor Phillip. I also activated my rear seat camera in my squad car.

While assisting, Deputy Grayson search the suspect's vehicle. Deputy Grayson walked back to his squad car to retrieve an item. When Deputy Grayson opened the door I heard him say not verbatim that he located expunged inside his squad car from Phillip. I walked around to Deputy Grayson's squad car and observed a white, crystal like substance sitting on the passenger side seat in the squad car. When I got closer to the vehicle I observed a clear glass pipe with a bubble shape at the bottom. Based off of my knowledge, the glass pipe appeared to be used to smoke methamphetamine. I observed Deputy Grayson pick up the glass pipe and place it into an evidence bag. Deputy Grayson and I walked to my squad car and opened the rear driver side door to speak to Phillip. When we began speaking to Phillip we observed small pieces of a white crystal like substance on the seats spread out throughout the entire back seat. The substance in my squad car looked the same as the substance in Deputy Grayson's squad car. I knew the substance was not inside my squad car prior to placing Phillip in the back seat because I searched my back seat before I started my shift. I had nobody else in the back seat after I searched it and prior to Phillip being placed in it. Deputy Grayson had Phillip step out of the squad car and placed him in handcuffs behind his back. Sgt. Bauer stood with Phillip outside of the squad car while I began looking at the white substance. I took photographs of the white substance on the seat and collected it into an evidence bag to save as evidence. After collecting the substance we instructed Phillip to sit back inside the squad car.

After completing a thorough search of the van, I transported Phillip to the Logan County Safety Complex. When we arrived at the Complex I escorted Phillip into the building and guided him to the interview room. Phillip and I waited in the interview room while Deputy Grayson placed Joshua in another interview room.
