Um, as we're walking to the back lot two of our officers get dispatched to a, uh, man with a gun call in the 100 block of North - I believe it was North 8th Street, initially. Uh, call came out as subject wearing dark clothing, uh, with a - with a gun. Uh, I believe it was Officer (Carrillo) and Officer (Mendoza) were dispatched as primary and secondary. Um, they went out to start searching the area. I got into unit - I believe it's 0216, who is supposed to be the Watch Commander's car, but our Watch Commander doesn't fit in it, 'cause he's 7foot tall, so I drove it. I went out the parking lot, um, they advised they were searching the area and they were unable to locate the subject. So the last information we had was that they were walking northbound in the 100 block north of George Henry alley, so I cut to the 200 block to see if maybe it was a delayed response and that the person was further out. As I'm getting to that area, Officer (Carrillo) announces that, um, that he found the subject matching the description, wearing a blue jacket and black pants, uh, walking in that 100 block north George Henry alley, so I started heading there. I can hear him and Officer (Calderon), uh, coordinating how they're going to, uh, approach the subject, who possibly had a gun. Um, Officer (Calderon) was talkin' about waiting at the north end of the alley, offset from the alley, and to have Officer (Carrillo), uh, kind of push him out towards the street side. Um, Officer (Carrillo) was giving announce- - or updates on the radio that the subject was noncompliant and still walking away from him. Um, so at that time I arrived and I parked right next to Officer (Calderon), which is in the 100 block of East Walnut just prior to the George Henry alley access, and as I did Officer (Carrillo) put out that the subject is now walking west through the field. So in that area, um, there's a - there's the old theater, then north of the theater all the way to Walnut is a giant vacant lot that's got some parking spaces, and then. uh, like a community garden. So he said that he's walking west across the lot. so I peeled away from Officer (Calderon) to see if I could see the subject. Um, I could see a silhouette in the middle of the field kinda walkin' around, so I used my driver's side spotlight, lit them up, pulled up my car at an angle where I was face-on to the south curb of Walnut Avenue facing the subject, and then put my spotlight on him. Um, the spotlight was ineffective, because I had a giant bush in the way, which I didn't account for at the time, um, so I exited my vehicle, got out with my flashlight and tried to illuminate the subject even further. As I did I announced to the subject that, um, "Lompoc Police, show us your hands, show us your hands." The subject briefly put their hands up in the air and it looked like they had their, uh, their long sleeves pulled over their hands, um, so I couldn't see the hands, just, like, a - I don't know, just, like, a - almost, like, a stub, you know, (unintelligible) type thing. Um, briefly come up, come down, didn't see anything in their hands, but they

were - they were acting in a weird - weird way I guess is how I'd describe it, um, kinda pacin' around, kinda anxiety looking. Um, and then at that point they look over at where Officer (Carrillo) is at, I could see him down in the alley further south of us. They look at Officer (Carrillo), they look at our lights, look at Officer (Carrillo) and then start walking towards us at a brisk pace, um, more or less towards Officer (Calderon), so at me, but at the angle towards Officer (Calderon). Um, we continue to give commands, I take out my duty weapon, because of the - the mention of subject with a firearm. um, the fact that they're not being compliant to officers trying to stop him earlier, um, you know, the - their agitation level, just, uh, something felt wrong about it, so I took out my handgun.
