### (C) Narrative :

On March 31, 2020, I attended the autopsy for the decedent, Krys Brandon Ruiz. The autopsy began at approximately 0945 hours and was conducted by Doctor Manny Montez, with the assistance of SBSO employee John Kolbert and SBSO Coroner's Detective Bibby. SBSO Forensic Technician Loza was also present and took photographs of the decedent prior to the autopsy (refer to supplemental report #22 for further).

As the autopsy began, I noted the decedent was lying in a large black body bag on the examination table. Once the bag was open, I noted the decedent was laying supine and there were two visible perforations to the right upper deltoid area of his shoulder. In addition, he had one large perforation to the back right side of his head, just above his right ear. The decedent's skull appeared to have been pierced and his brain was clearly visible.

During the autopsy Dr. Montez located two small bullet fragments in the decedent's right shoulder area. These items were collected by Forensic Technician Loza.

The autopsy concluded at approximately 1110 hours. Doctor Montez has yet to determine a cause of death and there will likely be additional tests before a cause of death finding can be made.
