### NARRATIVE:

On Sunday, 03/28/21, at approximately 2100 hours, Forensics Supervisor Nancy Fabela contacted me, via my department issued phone, and advised that an officer involved shooting had occurred in the City of Lompoc. She requested that I respond to the North County Forensics Office and meet with CSI Technician II Tiarra Avalos; and together we would respond to the Sheriff's Lompoc substation for further information.

At 2125 hours, I arrived at the North County Forensics Office. CSI Tech II Avalos and I loaded up the Forensics response van with our equipment. At approximately 2130 hours, we headed towards the Lompoc substation. While en-route to the Lompoc substation, Forensics Supervisor Fabela called and advised that two Lompoc police officers were involved in the shooting and there was one deceased person. She requested we respond to the

Hilton Garden Inn, located at 1201 North 'H' Street in Lompoc, to begin processing the two police officers. She advised that once we arrived at the hotel, to contact Lompoc Police Detective Reyna for assistance.

We arrived at the hotel at approximately 2205 hours, and met with Detective Reyna.

### PHOTO DOCUMENTATION OF LOMPOC POLICE CORPORAL ANDREW WHITE (Room #108):

At 2225 hours, I (with the assistance of CSI Tech II Avalos) took overall and close-up digital photographs of Lompoc Police Corporal A. White. Overall and close-up photographs were taken from the front side, left profile, back side, right profile, arms extended front, and back and a close-up of his hands. A photograph of the officer's face was taken for identification purposes.

Corporal White advised that there were no scuffs, marks, tears, or suspected blood on his uniform. I photo documented the keys from his front left pocket, his black wallet from left back pocket and his black patrol notepad from the right back pocket. His duty vest and belt contents were then thoroughly photo documented (*refer to the digital photographs taken of Corporal White's duty vest and belt for further details*). The duty vest and belt contents consisted of the following (*refer to attached worksheet for details*):

#### Duty Vest:

- Collapsible baton in pouch (on right side of vest, next to medical pouch)
- Breast pouch located below name plate with miscellaneous items belonging to the officer
- Medical zippered pouch, with miscellaneous medical equipment including a black multi-use tool (leatherman)
- Handcuff pouch with two sets of silver-colored handcuffs and a black handcuff key
- Assigned radio in pouch
- Breast pouch located below metal badge with miscellaneous items and pens belonging to the officer
- Flashlight pouch with flashlight
- Pepper spray pouch with MK-3 spray can, 1.3oz

#### Duty Belt:

- Two spare magazine pouches - with 2 loaded magazines marked as "A" and "B"
  - Magazine A - one 17 round capacity black Glock 9mm magazine with 17 unexpended rounds of Hornady 9mm Luger in the magazine.
  - Magazine B - one 17 round capacity black Glock 9mm magazine with 17 unexpended rounds of Hornady 9mm Luger in the magazine.

- Taser holder with yellow taser (X300076PT) attached
- Four (4) leather belt keepers
- Tourniquet
- Duty weapon in its holster - Glock 17 Gen4 9x19 (9mm-S/N#BHAV094) with an attached Surefire X300 Ultra flashlight (B338727)

*\*Prior to photo documentation, SBSO CID Detective Heidt assisted in rendering the weapon safe\**

- One unexpended Hornady 9mm luger round was removed from the chamber of the weapon. The 17 round capacity Glock 9mm magazine had 12 unexpended Hornady 9mm luger rounds in the magazine.

- Keys and silver-colored handcuff key on metal key keeper.
- Pouch with "Watch Guard" mic. Mic was marked with 'LPD. 9' (Model: MIC-WRL-TRN-400, FCC ID: YJV-TRN400)

The following items were collected by me (*later marked as **Item#1, Tag#09070134***):

● The two spare magazines and ammunition ~ Magazine 'A' was collected at 2305 hours and Magazine 'B' was collected at 2313 hours.

● The duty weapon (along with its magazine and ammunition) ~ Duty weapon was collected at 2324 hours. The round from chamber and magazine with ammunition from gun were collected at 2334 hours.

Corporal White's duty vest and belt were returned to him.

Photo documentation and officer processing was completed at 2340 hours.

**PHOTO DOCUMENTATION OF LOMPOC POLICE OFFICER MAURICIO CALDERON (Room #117):**

At 2344 hours, I (with the assistance of CSI Tech II Avalos) took overall and close-up digital photographs of Lompoc Police Officer M. Calderon. Overall and close-up photographs were taken from the front side, left profile, back side, right profile, arms extended front and back and a close-up of his hands. A photograph of the officer's face was taken for identification purposes.

Officer Calderon advised that there were no scuffs, marks, tears, or suspected blood on his uniform. His duty vest and belt contents were then thoroughly photo documented (*refer to the digital photographs taken of Officer Calderon's duty vest and belt for further details*). The duty vest and belt contents consisted of the following (*refer to attached worksheet for details*):

**Duty Vest (front):**

- Hypertough flashlight attached to the right shoulder area of vest
- Breast pouch located below name plate with miscellaneous items belonging to the officer
- Handcuff pouch with money and credit card belonging to the officer
- Medical zippered pouch, with miscellaneous items including a red Nikon camera and a "Watch Guard" microphone. The microphone was marked with 'LPD. 26' (Model: MIC-WRL-TRN-400, FCC ID: YJV-TRN400)
- Two spare magazine pouches - with 2 loaded magazines marked as "A" and "B"
  - Magazine A - one 17 round capacity black Glock 9mm magazine with 18 unexpended rounds of Hornady 9mm Luger in the magazine.
  - Magazine B - one 17 round capacity black Glock 9mm magazine with 17 unexpended rounds of Hornady 9mm Luger in the magazine.
- Pouch with silver-colored Olympus digital voice recorder belonging to the officer.
- Radio pouch with assigned radio
- Breast pouch located below metal badge with coin envelope and pens belonging to the officer
- Pepper spray pouch with MK-3 spray can, 1.3oz
- Collapsible baton in pouch (on left side of vest, next to pepper spray pouch)

**Duty Vest (back):**

- Handcuff pouch (left side) with a set of silver-colored handcuffs.
- Handcuff pouch (right side) with a set of silver-colored handcuffs.
- Handcuff pouch (right side) with two sets of silver-colored handcuffs and a black handcuff key.
- Flashlight pouch with black flashlight.

**Duty Belt:**

- Silver ring.
- Taser holder with yellow taser (X300030TC) attached.

- Latex gloves pouch with gloves.
- Duty weapon in its leg holster - Glock 17 Gen 5 9x19 (9mm-S/N#BHGP010) with an attached Surefire X300 Ultra flashlight (B338937)  
*\*Prior to photo documentation, SBSO CID Detective Heidt assisted in rendering the weapon safe\**  
- One unexpended Hornady 9mm luger round was removed from the chamber of the weapon. The 17 round capacity Glock 9mm magazine had 17 unexpended Hornady 9mm luger rounds in the magazine.
- Two (2) leather belt keepers

The following items were collected by me (*later marked as Item#2, Tag#09070134*):

- The two spare magazines and ammunition ~ *Magazine 'A' was collected at 0012 hours and Magazine 'B' was collected at 0019 hours.*
- The duty weapon (along with its magazine and ammunition) ~ *Duty weapon and round from chamber were collected at 0038 hours. The magazine with ammunition from gun were collected at 0045 hours.*

The Olympus digital recorder (from his vest) was collected at 0020 hours (*refer to images IMG\_3306 - IMG\_3312 for details*).

*\*\*\*On Tuesday, 03/30/21, I received a call from Detective Heidt, advising that Detective Kohli would be picking up the digital recorder. On 03/30/21 at 1612 hours, the recorder was given to Detective Kohli.*

Officer Calderon's duty vest and belt were returned to him.

Photo documentation and officer processing was completed at 0049 hours on Monday, 03/29/21.

CSI Tech II Avalos, Detective Heidt and I exited the hotel and secured the evidence collected in the Forensics response van.

At 0103 hours, we left the Hilton Garden Inn and responded to the crime scene to assist.

At approximately 0255 hours, CSI Tech II Avalos and I returned to the North County Forensics Office and secured the evidence in the lab.

All photos were uploaded into the North County Forensics digital imaging computer for future reference.
