Re: **Request for Disclosure of Public Records**

Dear Mr. Powelson:

The City of Antioch has received your request for public records dated May 9, 2023. This letter serves as the City's response pursuant to Government Code § 7922.535.

In reviewing your request, the City has determined that it is in possession of records that are responsive to your request.

The City has further determined that some of the requested records are statutorily exempt from disclosure pursuant to attorney-client privilege, attorney-work product privilege, deliberative process privilege, and preliminary drafts. (See Gov. Code, § 7927.705; 7927.500; Evid. Code, § 954; Cal. Code of Civ. Proc., § 2018.030.) Exempt records will not be disclosed to you. Where possible, the City will redact protected information, including personal identifiable information and information for which nondisclosure outweighs the public information in receiving the information, and deliver the record to you. (See Gov. Code, § 7922.000.) The City will update this list of applicable exemptions as it completes its review.

The Public Records Act requires the City to notify a requester in writing whenever a public records request under the Act is denied, in whole or in part, and to provide the name and title of the party responsible for the determination (Gov. Code, § 7922.540). To the extent this letter constitutes a denial, Assistant City Attorney Rachel Hundley, in consultation with the applicable departments and custodians has made this determination.

The release of this information is made without any waiver to claim an exemption under the Public Records Act or to make any objection permitted by applicable law to any future request for this or any other document or information.
