Supplementary Report: Primary 2014-Sep-10

On 09/10/2014 at approximately 1500 hours I received a complaint via telephone regarding a violation of a protective order.

I spoke with the complainant, Rachelle Speights, who stated she had been in a relationship with a Walter Reichard in the past. She further stated she had received a protective order against Mr. Reichard and further stated he was presently violating the order while she spoke to me on the phone. I asked her if she was currently safe where she was and she

stated she was in her vehicle with the doors locked. I then asked her to explain the protective order she currently had. She stated she has a valid long term protective order, No: 1KE-14-131, which was signed into effect on 04/28/2014 and states the defendant, is not to be within 500 feet of Ms. Speights or not commit or threaten to commit acts of domestic violence, stalking or harassment. I next asked if she could describe to me how Mr. Reichard was violating the protective order. She stated she had entered the Safeway Store on the East side entrance, next to Customer Service and Mr. Reichard followed her in. She stated as she entered the store she proceeded to move away from him as quickly as possible.

Ms. Speights stated as she was gathering her food items from various parts of the store, Mr. Reichard proceeded to follow her around the store watching from a distance. Ms. Speights stated she gathered enough food items and proceeded toward the registers, she further stated as she was doing this, Mr. Reichard walked right past her in what she described as "being in arm's length." Ms. Speights advised me at this point she became extremely scared and hurried away from Mr. Reichard towards the checkout area. I asked if Mr. Reichard had said anything to her yet and she stated he did not, however he was staring at her with what appeared to be a focused and determined look.

She stated it was "creepy" how he was staring at her and made her extremely uncomfortable. Finally Ms. Speights stated Mr. Reichard had proceeded to the Customer Service stand to purchase what she believed were cigarettes, however kept looking back at her as she waited in line to pay. She stated he looked back at her two or three times and finally walked towards the Starbucks barista stand and stared at her while he was walking past the aisle she was waiting in. Ms. Speights stated she almost didn't purchase her items and ran out of the store, but decided to quickly pay and leave at a hastened pace. I asked if that was the end of Mr. Reichard following her around and she stated "No it wasn't." She stated as she was packing her groceries into her vehicles she looked around at her surroundings and watched Mr. Reichard exit from the same entrance she did, closest to the Customer Service counter, and proceeded to pace back and forth while watching her. At this point in time she became frightened that Mr. Reichard would do something to her in the parking lot and jumped into her vehicle. She stated this is when she contacted K.P.D. and spoke with me.

I advised Ms. Speights I would check with the security camera footage in Safeway right away and contact her later today. She thanked me for my assistance and hung up. At approximately 1515 hours I contacted Safeway General Manager, Justin Kestle, and advised him of the information I had received. Both he and I reviewed the security footage and observed Ms. Speights walk into the entrance she described and immediately following her was Mr. Reichard. I next asked Mr. Kestle if he could retrieve the video footage of the customer service counter and he did. I observed Mr. Reichard approach the counter to purchase an item believed to be cigarettes. I also observed Mr. Reichard look back several times in the direction of Ms. Speights.

I observed these motions to be more of a deliberate stare than a glance over his shoulder. It appeared as Mr. Reichard was purposefully staring at Ms. Speights as she waited in the checkout line. At the end of Mr. Reichard's transaction he proceeded to walk towards the Starbucks Barista and looked immediately to his left as he proceeded past Ms. Speights. This also was a continuous stare and not a casual glance. Mr. Reichard walked several steps while staring at Ms. Speights. I asked Mr. Kestle if he could make a copy of these video files for me and he stated he would delegate this to his assistant manager who was more familiar with the download process. I left my contact information with Mr. Kestle and thanked him for his assistance.

At this time I am forwarding this report to the Ketchikan District Attorney's Office and requesting a warrant for the arrest of Walter Reichard (09/23/1980) for Violating a Protective Order, a violation of Alaska Statute 11.56.740, which is a Class A Misdemeanor.



Lawsuit filed over '14 arrest

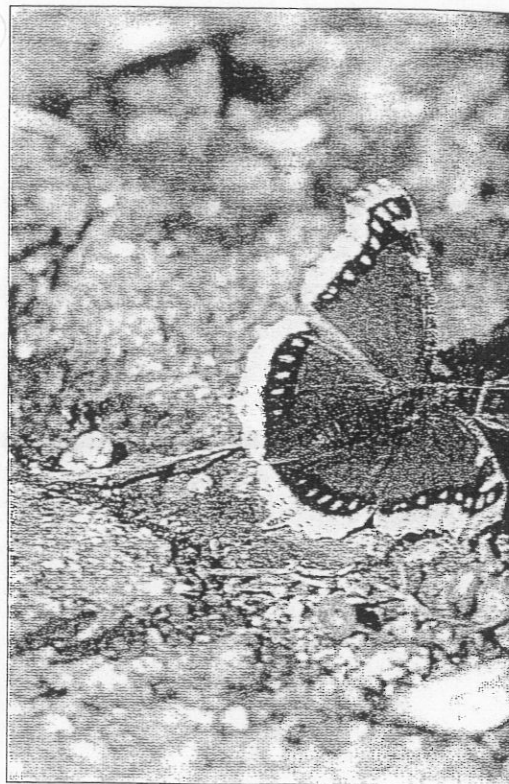
A local man filed a multi-million dollar lawsuit against the City of Ketchikan, the Ketchikan Police Department, and several individuals Monday in Ketchikan Superior Court, alleging malicious prosecution, false arrest and other charges stemming from his September 2014 arrest.

Walter Reichard, 35, is seeking \$4.5 million and court costs. His complaint alleges that the defendants' actions included malicious prosecution, slander, libel, false arrest, perjury resulting in injury and official misconduct resulting in injury.

Reichard was arrested in mid-September 2014 after Rachele Speights — who had a domestic violence protective order against Reichard that required him to stay at least 500 feet away from her — contacted the KPD and said that he had followed her into a grocery store and been within approximately 40 feet of her, according to the criminal complaint against Reichard from that case.

Speights also is a defendant in the lawsuit. She could not be reached for comment Wednesday.

Former KPD officer Christopher Travers — a defendant in Reichard's lawsuit — wrote in the complaint that he reviewed security videos from the store and that Reichard closely followed Speights into the store and was

WASHINGTON — In the Earth's oceans these days, the bigger a species is, the more prone it is to die off. That's unheard of in the long history of mass extinctions, a new study finds.

As subfamilies of marine animal species — called genera — grow larger in body size, the likelihood of them

SITKA (AP) — U.S. Forest Service employees shot and killed a brown bear near Sitka where two wilderness guides were mauled by a bear while leading a group excursion last month.

Sitka District Ranger Perry Edwards said the Forest Service workers shot the animal as it charged them on Aug. 27. The incident marked the third time in a month that a bear was shot near the city.

"From the first time they saw the bear to the time they shot that bear was four seconds," Edwards said. "There's a lot of stuff that happens in your mind in four seconds."

Edwards said the female bear, which was found to have two cubs, could have been acting defensively to protect her offspring or her food source in a nearby stream.

The two wilderness guides were injured in an Aug. 18 attack after the group they were leading came between a female bear and her cub. Earlier in the month, a Sitka resident shot a charging bear.

In the latest incident, Edwards said the employees who shot the bear had utilized the Forest Service's bear safety training, which requires staff to shoot three targets within 10 seconds. Two of the shots must strike fatal areas.

"We train all our field-going crews to use a whole bunch of non-lethal and lethal ways of dealing with bears," Edwards said. He added that the Forest Service isn't just "shooting every bear that we see. I feel sorry about what happened to the bear."

ANCHORAGE (AP) — A semi hauling double trailers and a cargo of beer crashed Tuesday on the Glenn Highway.

Cuaresma suffered injuries described by troopers as non-life-threatening. Much of the beer didn't fare as well.

Troopers say the semi-tractor detached from both trailers and rolled. One trailer was destroyed and the other trailer was damaged. Photographs taken by the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Fire Department showed beer bottles and kegs strewn along the highway.

Troopers say Alaska Lynden Transport responded to assist with cleanup.

Bethel man's body recovered from NH river

CORNISH, N.H. (AP) — Rescuers have recovered the body of a 21-year-old man who drowned in the Connecticut River, an AmeriCorps member who was working at nearby St. Gaudens National Park.

Police in the town of Cornish say Reed McWilliams was from Bethel, Alaska. He was swimming in the river with a woman on Tuesday when he did not resurface. Police got a 911 call at about 5:50 p.m. that came from the river bank of a farm.

McWilliams was spotted at about 7:20 p.m. in about 8 to 10 feet of water and was recovered by divers.

He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Gov. Maggie Hassan said in a statement she was saddened to learn of McWilliams' death. He came to serve with the Student Conservation Association through AmeriCorps.

Reichard was arraigned Sept. 19, 2014, in Ketchikan District Court on one count of violation of a domestic violence protective order, a Class A misdemeanor. However, the charge was dismissed by Assistant District Attorney Joe Kovac on Nov. 3, 2014.

Kovac, also a defendant in the lawsuit, has since gone into private practice. He did not return messages seeking comment on Wednesday.

Reichard was held at the Ketchikan Correctional Center from his September arrest through the case's dismissal. Assistant Public Defender Deborah Macaulay, who represented Reichard in the 2014 case, could not comment on that case on Wednesday.

A request from Reichard that his name be removed from the case in the State of Alaska's CourtView system was denied on Feb. 26, 2016, by Ketchikan Superior Court Judge Trevor N. Stephens, who stated that the court does not have the authority to grant Reichard's request because it did not fit within certain administrative rules, according to court documents.

The lawsuit stems, in part, from the denial of that request, Reichard said in a phone interview Wednesday.

Reichard claimed that police misrepresented to a judge what the grocery store's security camera footage showed in order to obtain an arrest warrant.

Deputy Police Chief Josh Dossett said in a phone interview Wednesday afternoon that he was not yet aware of the lawsuit.

Ketchikan City Attorney Mitch Seaver, in an email sent Wednesday afternoon, said that the city has 20 days after service of a summons and complaint to respond to the lawsuit, but that the city had not yet been served.

Reichard is planning on hiring an attorney, and he is seeking a jury trial. The case has been assigned to Ketchikan Superior Court Judge William B. Carey.

No court dates have been set, according to online court records.
