

Sharing your camera feed enables the Statesboro Police Department to respond to incidents at your location faster and equip officers with advance knowledge of the situation. It will keep our residents and business owners safer and build closer ties within our community.

GETTING STARTED IS EASY JOIN TODAY!

You will have access to priority based streaming and panic alerts. Policy based sharing means YOU decide when you want to share a live stream continuously, on emergency, or at any other time you designate.

Access to your cameras is conditional upon mutual agreement between you and the SPD.

There will be no impact to your network - the appliance builds a separate tunnel on a secure network to transmit alerts and video.

You will gain access to your own cameras, even if they are not currently EDGE based, via the advanced Fusus cloud platform.

For **home owners** who only want to register their cameras:

Registration does not mean we have access to your cameras. We will only know a camera is present at your location should the need arise. Once you are registered, you will also have access to our Community Safety Portal, which will enable you to chat with other members of the community, and share information that pertains to the safety and well-being of our residents and businesses.

- Be able to share and receive information on illegal activity in our area
- Coordinate with nearby businesses to mitigate crime
- Help prepare your residence for major events or incidents of civil unrest
- Retain access to a shared network of business contacts

- Camera feeds can be configured to be shared all the time, automatically activated by a trigger, or only on emergency alert.
- The panic app enables you to turn on all cameras on your network, sharing live feeds and your location with the emergency operations center and first responders.
- Video traffic from your camera(s) is encrypted for security, and only the Statesboro Police Department will have access to live or recorded video.
