### Reason

On the date and time listed above, I Officer Covelli initiated a traffic stop on a Black Subaru Legacy for failure to have two working headlights. The stop occurred at the corner of Beach Dr SW and Shoreline Dr W and I made a passenger side approach.

Upon my approach to the vehicle, almost 3 feet before I reached the vehicle, there was an overwhelming scent of marijuana that tracked all the way to the vehicle. I asked the driver, [REDACTED], when the last time marijuana was smoked in the vehicle and she initially said "not recently." I then explained the severity of the odor and she said "4pm today." The odor grew stronger the entire approach, especially when the driver rolled down the passenger window.

Officer Kevin Long and Sergeant Traci Brisson arrived and based off the information and strong odor of marijuana we asked [REDACTED] for consent to search her vehicle as a formality.

[REDACTED] gave her consent and also gave the location of the marijuana saying it was in [REDACTED] backpack. When Officer Long and I approached the vehicle and advised the two males, [REDACTED] and another passenger [REDACTED] how the vehicle was about to be searched [REDACTED] offered up that the marijuana was "his and in his backpack" and that he wished to "get it for us."

[REDACTED] handed over his backpack where marijuana less than a 1/2 ounce was located along with two

measurement scales of marijuana drug paraphernalia. Officer Long located an open container of alcohol in the car which [REDACTED] also claimed as his own. [REDACTED] was given a citation for possession of an open container, simple misdemeanor possession of marijuana and possession of marijuana drug paraphernalia.

[REDACTED] was given a citation for failure to have two working headlamps.

**Comments**

Strong odor of marijuana, 3 feet back of the car all the way to inside the vehicle.

Occupants admitted to smoking marijuana in the car earlier (4pm) that day.

Driver gave consent to search vehicle and gave location of marijuana.

[REDACTED] claimed responsibility for marijuana and alcohol found inside of vehicle.

All occupants were compliant.
