Reason

At approximately 12:37am on July-7-2016 the R/O was sitting in the pva area of the minuteman on beach dr near the intersection of seaside rd facing west. The R/O observed a silver mercedes traveling south on nc 904 approaching the flashing red light to indicate all south bound traffic to stop before proceeding through the intersection. The silver mercedes failed to stop as the driver was turning west onto sunset blvd. The R/O then pulled out of the pva of the minuteman in pursuit of the silver mercedes. When the R/O got behind the silver mercedes the R/O then activated the emergency equipment. The driver of the vehicle stopped in the turning lane near the entrance to chandlers Ln. The R/O then approached the vehicle and asked the driver for his license and registration. The driver replied that his license was in the trunk of his vehicle. The R/O told the driver that the reason he had been stopped was failing to stop at the flashing red . The driver replied that he was tired and was driving back from Wisconsin and was just trying to get home. The R/O asked the driver if he would step out and get license. The deiver stepped out of his vehicle and opened the trunk of his vehicle. The driver retrived his license and handed it to the R/O. At that time the R/o identified the driver as [redacted] While the R/O was standing at the rear of the vehicle with the trunk still opened [redacted] walked back to the drivers area of his vehicle. The R/O formed the opion through training and experience the odor of marijuana was coming from the trunk area of the vehicle. When [redacted] returned to the rear of the vehicle the R/O asked [redacted] to be honest and explain why the odor of marijuana was coming from the trunk area. [redacted] replied that there was some marijuana in the trunk of his vehicle. The R/O asked [redacted] if he would get it from the location he had the marijuana stored. [redacted] opened his luggage and pulled out a clear zip lock bag containing 4 smaller clear zip lock bags and a pack of OCB rolling papers. The R/O asked [redacted] how much he had and Mr [redacted] replied about a ounce maybe a little more. [redacted] stated that the marijuana was his for self consumption not to sale. The R/O asked [redacted] where he got the marijuana from and he replied he got it in Wisconsin. [redacted]

was honest with the R/O and because of that the R/O charged [REDACTED] with the lesser of the charges of POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA and also charged POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHENALIA. [REDACTED] received a written warning for FAILURE TO STOP AT A FLASHING RED LIGHT. [REDACTED] was very polite and cooperative.

This case was dismissed and the evidence in this case has been placed on a Order of Destruction.
