





- How Dave Carver conducts a search for addresses with very high registrations. He'll teach us how to use Excel to look up and deal with your findings.

#### <u>09.27.2023 Recording</u>

#### 09.27.2023 (Wednesday)

#### • Welcome | Dave Carver

Today we are going to talk about residential voter addresses. We have found people at UPS stores, PO box, and industrial addresses. Even cemeteries. We have found over 1500 addresses that were questionable. We have found almost 8000 on farmland. The question is, is this a recent thing. We have also learned that you can't just make assumptions but have to dig a little deeper. Even with an equestrian center we found in New Jersey, we found there was a home within the center. The people who owned it lived there. We also know that UPS stores, commercial addresses, and post offices were pretty explicit. When I look at my records today, there is no one in Madison, NJ who are registered at a UPS store because we brough it forth and then followed up. I have found 14 people using a digital mailbox as their home address for voter registration. What we learned recently is by using digital mailboxes, people are registering. When Bryson sends out today's notes, he will include my slides from my presentation here. You can use property tax records and other resources to determine whether people are using real addresses. With that, I'm going to open the floor for questions and discussion.

#### • Open Dicussion

- o **Dr. Rick**: Boxes are not legal residences according to the state of GA.
  - Dave Carver: This goes back to knowing your state laws. In NJ, an address constitutes a location where someone sleeps at night. Our job is to just bring it to the election officials attention. I have found that people use motels/hotels as addresses which is not a legal address.
  - Willard Helander: There is no legal advice here, but the question is whether someonbody is eligible to vote. It's a correction of an address that is not an eligible address.
  - Gail Lee: If they don't correct it. Then what?
  - Willard Helander: At that point I would get engaged with legal council.
  - **Dr. Rick**: The only way to deal with a county that isn't acting in accordance with the law is to take them to court.
- Janice Arnold-Jones: Not so different from what we see on state law on residency. You must abide at that address to be a resident there. What does abide mean? Case law suggests you have to sleep there but it's a little lucy goosy. I did not know about the digital mailboxes and I'm going to jump on that. Over the last several elections, in a particular county in NM, we have found a certain number of votes where we can't identify where they came from. Registering at a business is not legal. There are some accommodations for the homeless but even then, registering at a PO box is not legal. There are other facilities. Our law is very specific, it requires a physical address. It's pretty easy to assign GPS coordinates which is also acceptable. Dave, states are different but our systems are very similar.
  - Dave Carver: A new law in NJ suggested that judges may suppress their address by court order due to past dangerous events that have transpired.
  - **Jarnice Arnold-Jones**: Does NJ have a confidential address program for domestic violence?
  - Dave Carver: Yes but it's few and far in between.
  - **Jon Lareau**: They used to have a flag to determine whether addresses had the legal right to be protected. They have now removed that flag from the data.
- o **Diane Wolta**: Digital mailboxes are not connected to USPS?

- Dave Carver: They are actually connected to Staples. They are not USPS facilities.
- **Dr. Rick:** Are you referring to the services that receive mail?
- Dave Carver: I know Staples offers their own solution in NJ.
- **Jon Lareau**: I know for a fact Staples use it because our 501 c(3) uses their services as a business address.
- Willard Helander: There are several approaches to take when people have addresses contrary to the statute.
- Walter Berkowicz: One of the previous selections that I've worked when working on the early voting list is that there wasn't a state ID on it so I had to match on address. You would think the address would be the same between the two files but the vote by mail system is not integrated with the county voter registration addresses. It just highlighted that we could be spending a lot of time on the quality of addresses in one file but there's an entire different file that we aren't accounting for.
  - Willard Helander: You have to mail that it's a voter signature.
  - Walter Berkowicz: People can continue to register but the addresses don't match. It was just an example of how we can't just assume that these addresses are going to be the same across these systems because they aren't integrated.
- **Dan Heim**: This is an anecdotal statement. We have a lot of homeless folks in FL. You can go into the SOE using what street corner you sleep on and use that as an address.
  - **Dave Carver**: This is a result of the people who we have elected.
  - **Dan Heim**: The UOCAVAs will use the county courthouse as their address.
- Janice Arnold-Jones: I was surprised to learn that many states have their voter registration file in one data set and the voter history in another data set. Is that a positive or negative in terms of this discussion.
  - **Dave Carver**: Voter registration is one to one relationship. The voter history is a one to many. It's a snapshot of a point in time which means I can understand it.
  - **Kevin Formolo**: Voter registration does get updated. There should be an update for that as well.
  - **Dave Carver**: I voted in my current county last November. If I were to vote, it would account for my new address while also having my voting history follow me.
  - **Dr. Rick**: The little glitch we have found is when we find duplicates.
- o **Virginia Hall**: In OR, we do have a law that allows you to register anywhere. I'm tempted to look around for tents in locations that seem fishy. We have the loosest voting laws in the country.
- Steven Marquardt: The voter registration systems is more on the database side of things. We see two
  fields come out of our systems. We need to be specific about what we are asking for from each of these
  entities.
  - Willard Helander: You will often have those records attached. Some people still work with green visors because it makes it easier to have confusion.
  - **Tim Vetter**: There was a time when the quantity of registrations pretty well stuck with a line. Now ERIC which claims the voter rolls is doing the opposite. We now have more active registrations than people to support them.
  - **Willard Helander**: I'm anxious in IL to anecdotally comment to me about how ERIC does not provide any data. They don't supply enough information to make a match.
- O Jan Shaw: When I compare voter registration list to another, individuals sometimes have a voter registration date that is different. I'd like to hear more about the process by which they verify voters to see if they haven't already voted in another county within the state.
  - Willard Helander: There is no list adjustment during election day.
- Ned Jones: I think there is a movement now for states to leave ERIC. There are 8 including VA and TX is now leaving. All ERIC is, is a voter rolls inflating system. The states have to report their eligible but unregistered voters which includes 17 year olds. One of the big issues is the sharing of person information with third parties. This is happening right this minute, the Center for Voter Participation is using those lists to get more people registered. The complaint is that there is old voter information. This would be a list of voters who are no longer at the address and they get this list back daily during their meetings. This is why keeping the voter rolls as clean as possible. Getting rid of these vacant voter addresses will help close loopholes and minimize fraud.
- o **Dave Carver**: Every week we are coming up with new ideas for future discussions on how to make sure that the voter rolls are clean. What can we do to help our local elections to make them right? They appreciate our help. Election officials are overworked, underpaid, and understaffed.

• Willard Helander: Dave's demeanor is so helpful and positive. That's what makes the difference.
