Narrative Summary of Performance
April 1, 2018 to June 30, 2018

This quarter had notable progress in all five areas of the grants. We held the first two law enforcement awareness briefings (LABs), training 37 officers. DPD officers taught crucial components of the LAB, including an overview of CVE, FTOs, HVEs, and DT info and cases. Civilians joined in to share resources for off-ramping individuals who may be radicalizing before they reach the stage of mobilization, as well as a cross-cultural awareness section. Areas addressed included refugee 101 (who are refugees, the security vetting process, etc.), community concerns and perceptions, Denver's demographics, and more.

The community awareness briefing (CAB) was revised and streamlined, and two CABs were scheduled to be taught in Q5.

After signing the contract with Goodwill Industries at the beginning of the quarter, there were several mentoring activities at Denver Public Schools through the end of the academic year. Fresh mentoring partnerships will commence in late August/early September, and continue throughout the 2018-2019 academic year.

For the newcomer academies, we revised our goals and focus based on input from the Denver Office of Immigrant and Refugee Affairs (DOIRA).

On the outreach front, we met with many diverse organizations, bringing our total organizational connection to 70+ since February (when PC and OCS were hired). DPD participated in Denver's PrideFest parade for the first time, with an entry of four DPD cars decorated with pride flags, and 16 officers and recruits walking the parade route and handing out DPD swag (slap bracelets, keychains, etc.). DPD officers and civilians also participated in several iftars at local mosques to celebrate with our Muslim community, and attended an open house for the new offices of a refugee resettlement agency. We contributed to the planning and delivery of Colorado's World Refugee Day celebration, and joined in a local school's "international night" event. We also amplified the reach of these community engagement events through DPD's Twitter and Facebook posts (see a few examples below).
