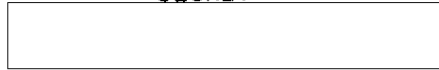

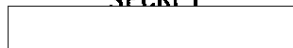

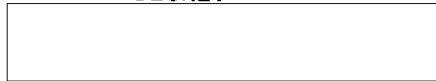

DDAC members the officers you requested, but the latter only after a time-consuming bureaucratic-engineering effort; INR has also selected a senior officer, the Director of their Office of Politico-Military Analysis.

3. The initial DDAC meeting took place on 11 May, at which time the committee's charter was fully coordinated. I have employed for this memorandum the same DCID-like format that was used to announce the establishment of the IPC in March 1982. Next winter after the committee has successfully completed its shakedown cruise, the charter can readily be amended as appropriate and reissued as a DCID.

4. By reserving certain sensitive matters to the DDAC principals, we plan to broaden the membership of the Imagery and SIGINT Subcommittees to include other players, principally the military services. The HUMINT Subcommittee, however, will be limited to the agencies represented by the IPC principals.

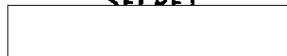

MEMORANDUM FOR: National Foreign Intelligence Board

SUBJECT: Foreign Denial and Deception Analysis

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 102 of the National Security Act of 1947 and of Executive Order 12333, I hereby establish a Foreign Denial and Deception Analysis Committee (DDAC). The mission and functions of the DDAC are described below.

1. Mission

Under the auspices of the Intelligence Producers Council and in conjunction with the National Intelligence Officer for Foreign Denial and Intelligence Activities (NIO/FDIA), the Committee will advise and assist the DCI in the discharge of his duties and responsibilities with respect to the analysis of foreign activities to thwart intelligence capabilities of the US Government through denial and deception; and it will promote the effective use of Intelligence Community resources for this purpose.

2. Functions

Under the general guidance of the DDCI, the DDAC will provide the authoritative Intelligence Community forum to:

- a. Coordinate the Intelligence Community's national-level, all-source analysis of the purpose, means, and effectiveness of Soviet and other foreign intelligence denial and deception measures.
- b. Ensure timely review of intelligence denial and deception issues, identified either within DDAC, by the other Community committees, or by departmental entities, for the purpose of developing a Community assessment (including differing views).
- c. Oversee the maintenance of comprehensive data bases, containing raw and finished intelligence entries, on information about foreign denial and deception actions, means, methods, and measures.
- d. Facilitate dissemination of information concerning denial and deception intelligence to appropriate analytic elements.

- e. Commission and oversee assessments of substantive intelligence damage suffered or anticipated from compromises of classified US and allied information involving intelligence sources and methods or other related material; and, for this function, oversee the maintenance of a comprehensive, integrated data base containing information pertaining to compromises of technical-intelligence collection disclosed through a variety of means, and related information.
- f. Foster overall assessments of Soviet and other appropriate foreign denial and deception organizations, policy, capabilities, and activities.
- g. Examine intelligence actions the United States might take to offset foreign denial and deception activities.
- h. Working with the NIO/FDIA, develop and sponsor training programs, seminars, and symposia to increase the Intelligence Community's awareness of, and improve its analytical capabilities to address, denial and deception issues.
- i. Make recommendations to the DCI.

3. Intelligence Community Responsibilities

- a. Individual intelligence production components will support the preparation of Community assessments sponsored by the Committee.
- b. Upon request from the Committee Chairman, Intelligence Community elements shall, within established security safeguards, provide information pertinent to the Committee's mission and functions.
- c. Member agencies will not be inhibited from producing independently their own denial and deception intelligence assessments.
- d. Each intelligence agency will work with the NIO/FDIA and the Committee to establish appropriate training programs.

4. Composition and Organization

- a. The Committee Chairman will be appointed by the Director of Central Intelligence.
- b. The members of the Committee will be representatives designated by CIA, DIA, NSA, and State/INR, the agencies which provide the IPC principals.
- c. The military services, FBI, and CIA/DO's CI Staff will designate representatives to participate in Committee deliberations, as appropriate at the invitation of the Chairman, on the issues being examined.

- d. The Chairman will establish subcommittees to identify, review, and analyze foreign intelligence denial and deception measures against the two major technical-collection disciplines: imagery and SIGINT; and will establish a subcommittee to analyze selected, significant, sensitive human-source reporting in order to identify possible deceptive elements. In addition, the DDAC's HUMINT Subcommittee will conduct a periodic review of information provided double agents.
- e. The parent Committee itself will retain responsibility for assessing measures countering certain sensitive intelligence sources and methods that are too sensitive for assignment to a subcommittee.
- f. The Chairman will establish other subcommittees, working groups, and panels, as appropriate.
- g. The IPC Staff will provide the Committee with secretariat support.
