Howard Weaver, a Yale Dean

Howard Sayre Weaver, a former dean of the Yale University School of Art and a director of the Media Design Studio at Yale, died Friday at his home in Guilford, Conn., after a long illness. He was 57 years old.

He had been dean from 1968 to 1974, and also had served as director of the Poynton Fellowship, which sponsors journalism seminars. He went to Yale as special assistant to the president in the early 1960's, and also held the post of associate secretary of the university.

He was born in Fredonia, N.Y., and served in World War II as a pilot in the

China-Burma Theatre. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Yale. He was an information officer with the American Embassy in Bangkok, Thailand, before joining the Yale staff.

Mr. Weaver is survived by his wife, the former Deborah Drummond of Guilford; three daughters, Sayre Andre of Mayville, N.D., Stephanie of Guilford, and Deborah of Boston; two sons, George and Howard S. Jr., both of Guilford; a brother, George, of Fredonia, and a sister, Ruth Pinkerton, of Winter Park, Fla.

There will be a funeral service today at 1 P.M. at Dwight Chapel at Yale.
