He attended Brooklyn Tech and was a ham radio operator in high school. In 1942, at age 17, he joined the US Army Air Corps serving in World War II in North Africa and Italy and, after the Allied Victory, with the occupation forces in Vienna, Austria. His many decorations included the French Croix de Guerre with Palm and the British Order of Bath. His long military career culminated with his appointment in 1975 by Governor Hugh L. Carey as Chief of Staff to the Governor; Commander, New York Army National Guard; and State Director of Civil Defense. Vito married Dorothy Williams, a farm girl from Ohio, in 1947 with whom he had three children. After he lost Dorothy to cancer in 1987, he met and married his second soul mate, Mary McGough in 1993. Together they enjoyed the company of their burgeoning family and many good friends as they cruised the world and enjoyed the beach at Breezy Point. 
