Seventeen men were indicted in Federal District Court in Brooklyn on charges of smuggling millions of dollars worth of heroin from Sicily.

The Government asked that the defendants be compelled to forfeit their profits from an operation that officials said had started in June 1979.

The "organizers, supervisors and managers" of the ring, according to the indictment, were Riccardo Cefalu, 54 years old, of Greenlawn, L.I., and Francesco Mafara, 40, and Riccardo Cozzolino, 30, both of Palermo, Sicily.
