(U)	On September 19, 1962, WF T-2 advised that he knows the subject as SADEGH GHOTBZADEH, an Iranian student attending Georgetown University, Washington, D. C. The source stated that he is not aware of any information which	-)

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would indicate that the subject has been engaged in any communist activities while in the United States. He stated further that the only information concerning the subject's communist activities was a rumor prevalent in Iranian circles in Washington that the subject reportedly had participated in some communist demonstrations in Iran in approximately 1950 to 1951, and that the subject's picture had reportedly appeared in some Iranian newspaper showing the subject speaking at some communist demonstration at that time. The source stated that it was at the time that the communists in Iran were sympathetic to the government which was in power at that time in Iran, and that the subject is a supporter of The source stated that he could not furnish any additional information concerning the subject's activities, nor was he able to recall from whom in franian circles he had heard the above information.

Washington. D. C.. was interviewed on June 7, 1962, by SA at his apartment. He advised that he has known the subject for several years since both of them were from Iran and both were attending Georgetown University. He stated that the subject is very active in the ISA and is outspoken in his criticism of the Shah of Iran. stated that the ISA has in the past distributed circulars criticizing the Shah of Iran and that when the Shah arrived in Washington in April, 1962, the ISA picketed the airport, at which time they handed out a one-page leaflet criticizing the Shah. He stated that the subject was in this picket line and helped to hand out these leaflets. He stated further that the subject has only a part-time job at Georgetown University, mending sound tapes.

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The July 9, 1961, issue of "The Washington Post and Times Herald" described the subject as Secretary of the ISA in the United States of America.

On March 21, 1961, Officer

Special Investigations Squad, Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), Washington, D. C., advised SA that the subject was one of the five students arrested for disorderly conduct at the Statler-Hilton Notel on March 20, 1961. The files of the MPD, which were reviewed on September 7, 1962, revealed that one SADEGH GHOTBI ISFEHANI was arrested on March 20, 1961, for disorderly conduct and was released upon payment of \$10 bond.

"The Washington Post and Times Herald", on March 22, 1961, carried an article indicating the subject, at an Iranian New Years party, held at the Statler-Hilton Hotel on March 20, 1961, caused a disturbance by shouting "Down with the Iranian government. There is no freedom in Iran." The article stated that the subject was arrested for disorderly conduct and freed after posting \$10 bond.

The July 11, 1961, issue of "The Washington Post and Times Herald" in an article entitled "Iranians Jailed, Freed in Row Over Passports", stated that 12 anti-Shah Iranian students were arrested for staging a sit-in hunger strike at the Iranian Embassy and then released after charges were dropped with a warning from the United States Attorney that the students were visitors in the United States and should behave as such or risk losing their visas. The article stated that the students, led by SADEGH GHOTBZANED and called at the Embassy to discuss passport matters and refused to leave until they were arrested by the police. The same newspaper, on July 12, 1961, in an article captioned "Students Call Truce With Iran Envoy", stated that the students, the

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b7E WFO subject and and President respectively of b6 the ISA, had called a 15-day truce in their passport battle. b7C The students stated the battle would be resumed if their passports were not renewed. The article quoted Iranian Ambassador ARDESHIR ZAHEDI as saying that the passports would not be renewed due to the subject's and low grades. The above newspaper, on December 8, 1961, carried a picture of Iranian students which the caption related were protesting at the Iranian Embassy on the previous day to demand renewal of the passports for two students in the group and to deliver a list of political demands. The caption further related that an Embassy spokesman said that the two students, the subject and face treason charges b6 if they return home. b7C On March 23, 1962, WF T-2 advised that on March 22, 1962, he heard that b7D (U) On April 5, 1962, WF T-3 advised that he did not recall stating that b7D He stated that the subject was quite a talker but was not the type to resort to physical violence He advised further that when he told others about this statement of the subject, he treated it as a big joke and thought that everyone would receive it as a joke and not take it seriously. (11) SADEGH GHOTBZADEH was interviewed by SAs CHARLES E. LENNON and b6 , on April 10, 1962. advised that he is one of the collective leaders of the ISA b7C

in the United States. He advised that he and other leaders of the ISA, were in New York over the past week end to map the strategy of ISA regarding their protests and to determine what was the best means of getting this across to the Shah and the American people. They will picket and also will make press releases regarding their protests. He advised

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that no definite plan has been made regarding picketing but they will definitely picket the White House if any picketing is done. There will be no picketing if their demands are met by the Shah of Iran. These demands are: (1) to release all students and professors of Tehran University who are now in prison; (2) reopen Tehran University, and; (3) to reissue passports to Iranian students in the United States which the Embassy has refused in the past.

GHOTBZADEH advised that he has never to his knowledge made a statement that he will assassinate the Shah of Iran while he is visiting in the United States He He stated that he could say almost positively that he never made the statement that he would assassinate the Shah of Iran anywhere or at anytime. He stated that he never had made such a statement even in jest. GHOTBZADEH advised that it is against his principles to accomplish the change in the government of Iran by the use of force. stated that the ISA also is opposed to using force to bring about reforms in the Iranian government. He advised that he has no personal hatred for the Shah of Iran but he dislikes the things that the Shah does or permits to be done in his name. He stated that this includes the spending of money granted to the government of Iran by the United States and that realized through the sale of oil. money should be used to improve the living conditions of the masses in Iran.

Mr. GHOTBZADEH advised that they intend to do nothing which is illegal and the picketing, as far as ISA is concerned, will be peaceful. He stated that the "500 foot ordinance," which prohibits picketing within 500 feet of Embassies or of the Blair House when occupied by visiting dignitaries is unfair. If the police department places the picketers in a completely ineffective place such as on the opposite side of Lafayette Park from the White House their, ISA's, attorneys will take the necessary legal action.

The files of the Credit Bureau, Incorporated, which were reviewed by IC revealed a report dated June 22, 1961, for one S. GHOTB-ISFEHANI, born in 1936, and residing at 2511 Q Street, N.W. He was described as President of the Slamic Society of

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Persian Students, United States of America. His father is in the import-export business and contributes to the subject's education. His bank was listed as the National Bank of Washington.

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b7E WFO b6 advised that in the early part of 1960, he contacted the Office of Student Housing at Georgetown b7C University in order to list for rental purposes an apartment in his house at 3203 R Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., and as a result of this, the subject first came to his house to rent the apartment in February, 1960. The subject paid his rent by check and signed checks as SADEGH ISFEHANI. related that the subject engaged in during which the conversations with him subject made statements hostile to the Shah and the government of Iran, and that during one of these conversations, the subject mentioned that his source of income was a man not stated that the subject further identified. b6 partook most of his meals with free of b7C The subject lived at charge until objected. believes he this address until June, 1960, when went to California. advised that he and the subject stated then moved to that address in April, 1962. the that from information received from subject was not paying for his board and room. further advised that is very sympathetic to Iranian students and is a "soft touch" in this respect. having furnished assistance to other Iranian b6 students. interest in Iranian students b7C evolved as a result of their acquaintance with the subject. who introduced them to other Iranian students. had no interest in Iran or Iranian affairs prior to her meeting the subject. continued that b6 b7C is sympathetic to the Iranian students and is willing to contribute to their financial support, he does not believe that she would knowingly allow herself to be used as an intermediary to transmit funds from an unknown source to the Iranian students.

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
