[redacted] and from his comments learned that [redacted] and a member of the [redacted] had served as a go-between in that he placed Daniel Schorr of CBS in touch with a New York attorney named [redacted] (phonetic) who in turn placed Schorr in contact with "The Village Voice." [redacted] was particularly concerned that [redacted] part in the matter remain a secret and stated that his identity should be protected at all costs. [redacted] was unaware as to whether [redacted]

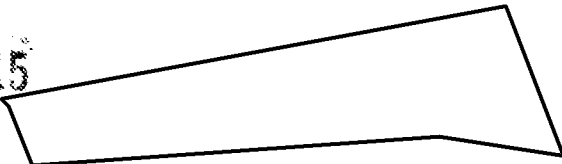

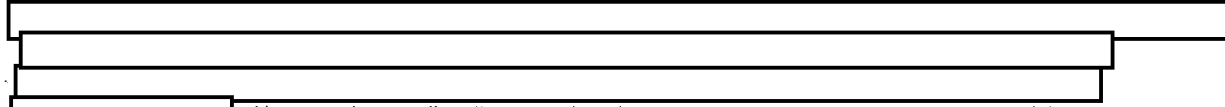

He instructed that through appropriate liaison channels we determine the particulars of any agreement among the [redacted] [redacted] with regard to the use and disposition of classified materials furnished by the [redacted]

Upon being interviewed [redacted] in essence stated that she is the [redacted] "The Village Voice" had agreed to donate [redacted] in connection with the publication of the [redacted] Because of adverse publicity [redacted] [redacted] did not know how Schorr had obtained the [redacted] CBS News, reportedly placed Schorr in contact with a New York Attorney named [redacted] (phonetic) who in turn placed Schorr in contact with "The Village Voice." It was not known if [redacted] had ever actually had possession of a copy of the [redacted] u

This memorandum is to furnish the results of that interview to the Department. It will be hand carried to [redacted] who will be orally advised that we will not interview [redacted] prior to 6/21/76. u
