INTRODUCTION

The public has a right to know how well the Kent School District's superintendent has performed his job. But when Joseph Riley made a public records request for a summary sheet from the superintendent's 2022-23 performance review, the district refused to release it. That concealment is a violation of the Public Records Act (PRA), Chap. 42.56 RCW.

Mr. Riley brings this action to ensure full disclosure so that parents, students and taxpayers in Kent, Wash., may evaluate the top executive's management of the district and its 43 public schools. In addition to seeking an order for disclosure, Mr. Riley seeks an award of attorney fees and penalties as authorized by the PRA. COMPLAINT - 1 Johnston George LLP

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I.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1.1 The Kent School District ("district") is located within King County, Washington. The public records at issue are maintained in Kent, Wash.

1.2 This Court has jurisdiction pursuant to RCW 42.56.550(1). Venue lies in this court pursuant to RCW 4.12.025(1) and RCW 42.56.550(1).

II. <u>PARTIES</u>

2.1 Joseph Riley is a resident of Kent, Wash. He made the public records request at issue in this action.

2.2 The Kent School District operates common schools under Title 28A of the Revised Code of Washington and article IX of the Washington Constitution. It is an "agency" as defined by RCW 42.56.010(1). The district is one of the largest in the state, serving more than 25,000 students and reporting a general fund budget of more than \$530 million for 2023-24.

III. <u>FACTS</u>

3.1 On January 27, 2024, Mr. Riley made a public records request to the district "for the 2022-2023 Superintendent Annual Plan/Evaluation Summary Rating Sheet." He emailed the request to <u>PublicRecords@kent.k12.wa.us</u> as instructed by the district's website.

3.2 On January 31, Dawn Boster, an assistant to the district's general counsel and designated records officer at that time, sent an email to Mr. Riley acknowledging receipt of the request and assigning 23-24-109 as the tracking number.

3.3 On February 7, Ms. Boster informed Mr. Riley that the district had closed the request without production of the superintendent rating sheet. Attached to her email was a letter signed by "Kent School District, No. 415." The letter said:

Your request is denied for the reasons which follow: The responsive documents do not contain any references to instances of misconduct. As stated in <u>Bacon v</u>. <u>Washington Dept. of Corrections</u>, 113 Wn.App.1007 (2002): "It is well settled in this state that while "balancing of the employee's privacy interest against the public interest" is not allowed under RCW 42.17.255, the Court must balance the "public interest in disclosure against the public interest in the "efficient administration of government," citing <u>Dawson, v Daly</u>, 120 Wn.2d 782, 797, 845 P.2d 995 (1993). In cases where there is no misconduct reference in performance evaluations, such documents are exempt from disclosure.

This is consistent with the right of a board to review the performance of an employee in executive session under the Open Public Meetings Act, RCW 42.30.110(1)(g), to ensure the efficient, open and candid review by the Board of Directors. Executive sessions, in turn, are generally confidential as to the public for the same reasons, under RCW 42.23.030(4) and RCW 5.60 as the case may be; and, enforced through RCW 42.20.100, RCW 9.80.010, the Superintendent-Board of Directors Employment Contract, CR 65 and cases interpreting injunctive relief, and the like.

At this time the District deems your records request 23-24-109 as closed.

(Footnote omitted; underlining in original).

3.4 Upon information and belief, the document being withheld from Mr. Riley reflects

concerns about Superintendent Israel Vela's performance and elicited a rebuttal from him.

3.5 Upon information and belief, the Kent School Board has used the superintendent's

performance evaluation (including the summary sheet at issue) as a factor in its decision-making.

- 3.6 Mr. Riley requested an identifiable record.
- 3.7 The requested record is not fully exempt from disclosure.
- 3.8 The district continues to unlawfully withhold the record.

CAUSE OF ACTION – PUBLIC RECORDS ACT

4.1 The allegations above are incorporated by reference herein.

4.2 The record requested by the plaintiff is a "public record" as defined by the PRA.

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4.3 The district violated RCW 42.56.070(1) and RCW 42.56.080 by failing to promptly disclose a record, in whole or in part, upon request.

1.4 The district unlawfully withheld public records in the absence of any applicable exemption.

4.5 The district failed to provide the fullest assistance and most timely possible action on the plaintiff's records request in violation of RCW 42.56.100.

V. REQUESTS FOR RELIEF

The plaintiff respectfully requests the following:

1. An order for the defendant to show cause, pursuant to RCW 42.56.550(1), why it denied the plaintiff an opportunity to inspect or copy all non-exempt records requested;

2. An order declaring that the defendant agency violated the Public Records Act;

3. An award of penalties of up to \$100 per day for each record unlawfully withheld from the plaintiff, pursuant to RCW 42.56.550(4);

4. An award of all costs, including reasonable attorney fees, as required by RCW 42.56.550(4); and

5. Such other relief as the Court deems proper.
