Program Construction Controls Manager (PCCM)

A minimum of twenty (20) years of recent experience in construction management of large and complex engineering/construction programs similar to the WSIP. Experience as a PCM in at least three (3) relevant, verifiable projects and at least two (2) related water-delivery projects with features (dams, tunnels, large diameter pipelines, pump stations, treatment plants, reservoirs, and etc.) similar to those being implemented under the WSIP.

Experience as a PCM in at least three (3) relevant, verifiable projects that have utilized Primavera (P3E or P6) and Expedition, and possess knowledge of Primavera and Expedition. Must also have a baccalaureate degree in Engineering, Construction Management, Business Administration or relevant discipline from an accredited institution.

The ideal candidate would possess one or more certifications such as a CCE/CCC from the various industry related associations such as the AACE; a certified PSP, or other similar certifications (e.g. CCM; PMP) from other industry associations (e.g. CMAA; PMI).
