SCAM ALERT

Please be aware that criminals are working full time to steal your money. We believe that most are aware of this, however the criminals keep setting the bar higher with their attempts.

There has been numerous reports of citizens receiving phone calls from a fictitious local number(s) and a male subject stating that they have your loved one(s). They state they have kidnapped them and give you details. They even in some cases have a female in the background screaming for help.

This event can be traumatizing and play with your emotions making you believe that the voice is the actual loved one.

We are not here to say that this does not happen in real life. We know it's possible, however in the reported incidents it has been proven to be a scam.

The "kidnapper" demands that you send money via Western Union , Money Gram, Cash App etc.

We ask you to please if your receive this call to contact authorities first before you send any money. A traumatizing event can send you in to "Tunnel vision" which is understandable, but please try to be mindful.
