The Oakwood water plants reduced the hardness level by 66% on the average while the sodium content of the water increased by 261% on the average during 2019. Both of these percentages are within normal operating ranges.

III. WELL PUMPAGE REPORT AND CHARTS

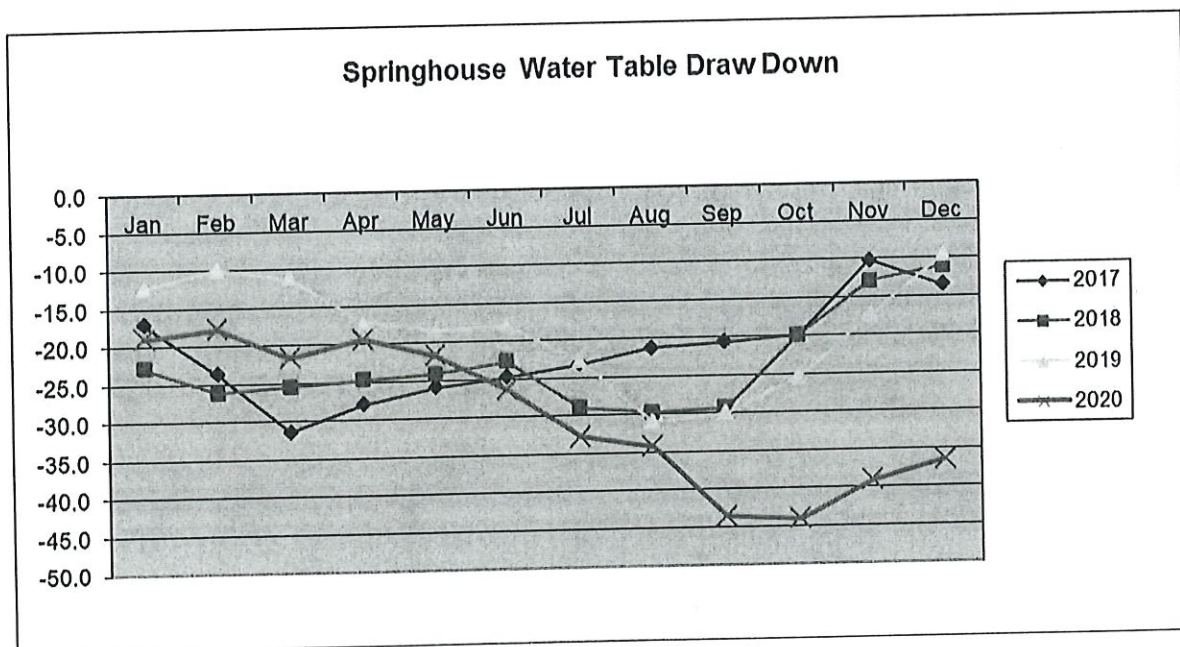
The eight production wells produced 506,086,000 gallons of water in 2020, which is an average of 1,387,000 gallons per day. In 2019, the eight production wells produced 507,833,000 gallons of water. This represents a .35% decrease in raw water produced in 2020. The 2020 maximum day well production was on July 6 at 2,632,000 gallons. It is common that our highest usage occurs during the summer months when many property owners irrigate their lawns. The 2020 minimum day well production was on September 29 at 682,000 gallons. The minimum day production normally occurs in the fall or winter.

Out of the 506,086,000 gallons pumped in 2020, 33,613,000 gallons were used to either backwash the iron and manganese filters or regenerate the softening units at 210 Shafor and 120 Springhouse. This represents 6.64% of the total water pumped for the year, a 2.56% decrease from 2019. The prior flow meters were replaced in 2020 and accurately report plant production.

Add to Working from Home bullet...

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Ohio Legislature enacted, and Governor DeWine signed into law, House Bill 197 on March 27, 2020. The Bill, among other things, clarified how to treat municipal income tax withholdings during the time when a majority of Ohioans were working from home, rather than at their principal place of business. These state tax provisions clarified and amended the municipal income tax withholding rules that were currently in effect in Ohio. Until the COVID-19 pandemic legislation, an employee may generally perform services on a temporary basis up to 20 days per year in a municipality before triggering the municipality's income tax withholding rules. If the employee exceeded the 20-day threshold, the employer was required to withhold the applicable income tax for that municipality. If the threshold was not met, the employer would instead continue withholding municipal income tax based on the employee's principal place of work. When Ohio declared a state of emergency and rolled out various stay at home orders in response to the COVID-19 outbreak, many Ohioans were no longer commuting into a central office, but rather were working remotely in different municipalities. For many, the 20-day threshold would be / had been exceeded, and employers were questioning whether they would need to withhold municipal income taxes based on where each of their employees were located during this pandemic time. The enactment of H.B. 197 clarified this confusion. Employees working from home during the pandemic (or within 30 days after the emergency was lifted) were considered to be working in the location where they would typically be reporting on a regular and ordinary basis (*i.e.*, their principal place of work). Employers continued to withhold municipal income taxes as if their employees' were working from their principal place of work.

Several lawsuits were filed claiming H.B. 197 was unconstitutional. Most suits were dismissed but are currently being appealed. This could impact refund requests for 2020. With the emergency lifted, the provisions related to municipal income tax were set to expire on July 18th. On June 28th, the Ohio General Assembly approved Sub. H.B. 110 which effectively extended the pro-employer local withholding tax provisions to December 31, 2021. However, Sub. H.B. 110 allows for the retroactive treatment of Sec. 29 of HB 197, the temporary municipal income tax withholding provision. Sub. H.B. 110 fundamentally alters the purpose of the emergency authority by allowing taxpayers to file refund requests for tax year 2021 for withholdings held from their principal place of work. This retroactive change to the intent and application of HB 197 will result in potential positive income tax collections results for some

cities (like Oakwood) and negative results for other cities. That said, it is impossible to predict or estimate the actual impact.

Subject: Oakwood Property Tax Renewal

Date: July 20, 2021

OAKWOOD, OHIO: At the July 19, 2021 public meeting, Oakwood City Council approved a resolution to place a property tax renewal issue on the November 2, 2021 ballot. As a renewal only, this tax issue maintains the current level of property taxation and will not increase property taxes.

The city has an existing 2.72 mill property tax levy that is due to expire at the end of 2021. The 2.72 mill levy was first approved by Oakwood voters in 1991 and has been renewed every five years since then.

The current effective residential millage rate of this tax levy is 1.27. The issue raises about \$468,000 annually since it was first approved thirty years ago. It costs about \$39 per year for each \$100,000 in residential property valuation. The money it generates is used to provide Oakwood public services including police, fire & EMS; roadway maintenance; and parks, recreation and leisure services.

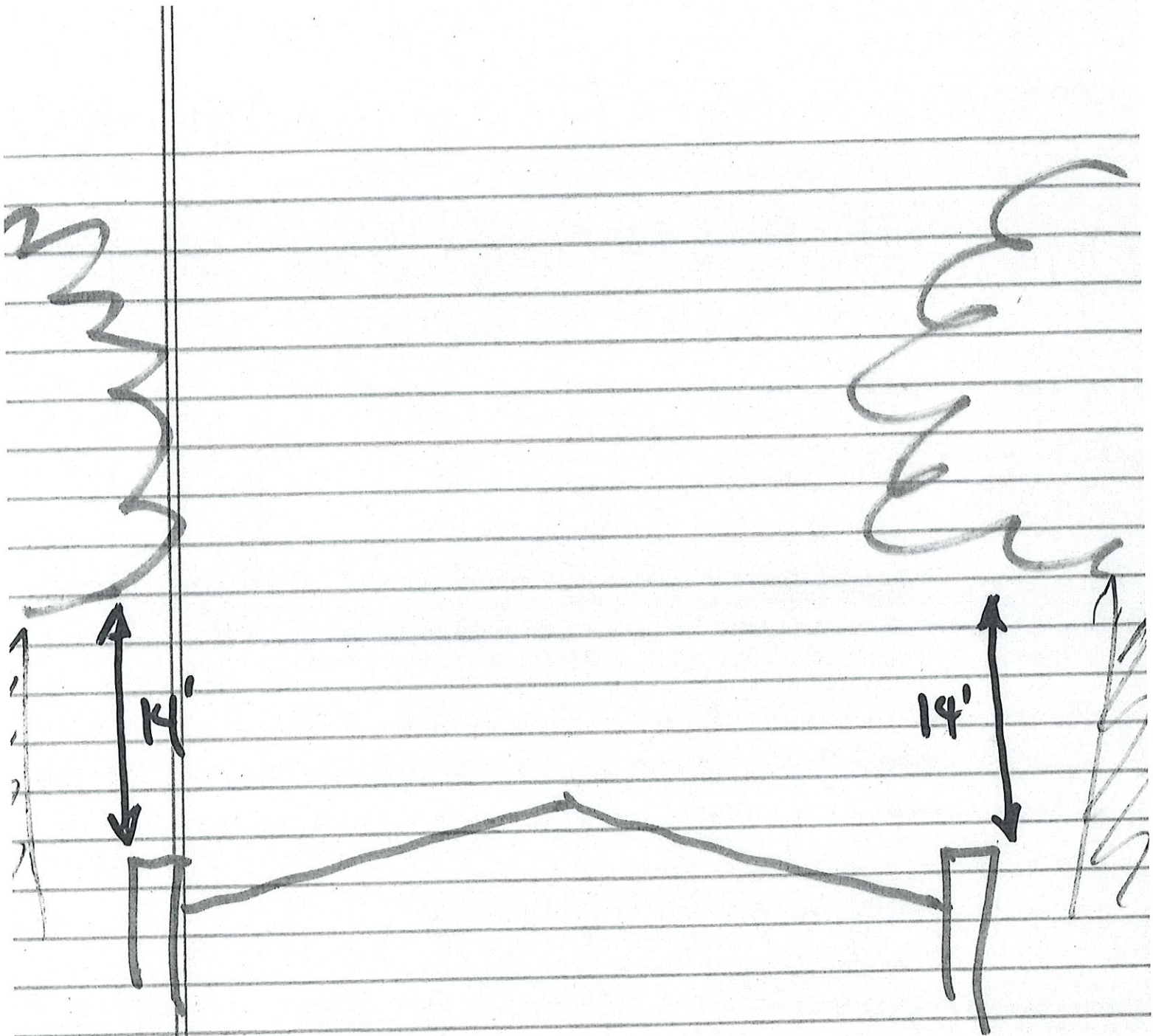
