RE: *Functional changes to the Oakwood Board of Health if the State of Ohio eliminates local health districts*

(2021 biennial budget bill, Sub. H.B. 110, 134th General Assembly)

Provisions have been included in the state's pending biennial budget bill that will eliminate small local health districts, forcing them to merge with larger county health districts. The bill is currently in conference committee, but is anticipated to pass in the next two weeks.

Oakwood's Board of Health is created by the City Charter, which means the bill would not eliminate the board itself. Instead, Oakwood would no longer constitute its own health district, and the bill would strip away "all the power and authority conferred upon city boards of health by State law and such other duties as may be imposed upon it by the State sanitary code," leaving a body whose duties are imposed by city ordinances only. (See Charter, Sec. 7.03.) City ordinances would need to be adjusted to ensure that they are not inconsistent with state law pertaining to health districts.

Under this arrangement, the following table lists functions currently performed by the Board that would cease, as well as functions that may continue or begin. (Note that Public Health Dayton-Montgomery County will take over responsibility for functions that cease at the local level. Also, PHDMC's fees for inspections and licenses will be somewhat higher than what Oakwood has historically charged, but that is beyond the city's control.)

Functions that must cease	Functions that may continue or begin
Providing for prompt diagnosis and control of communicable diseases	Advising Council on legislation that may impact public health
Studying and recording the prevalence of disease	Advising city staff on policies and facility rules that may impact public health
State-mandated inspections (restaurants/food service, pools, school facilities, salons, barber shops, tattoo/piercing, jails, etc.)	Advising the Oakwood City School District on general health matters not addressed by the county health district
Issuing licenses and approvals (restaurants/food service, pools, school facilities, salons, barber shops, tattoo/piercing, jails, etc.)	Serving as a liaison between the county health district and city staff, as well as other Oakwood stakeholders (i.e., schools, library)



Quarantining, containment, and closure orders	Advising city staff in public nuisance abatement matters
All vital statistics functions	Recommending and/or conducting public education events, community health-related activities, etc.
State-mandated reporting, audits, etc.	Collaboration with Safety Dept medical director to ensure best EMS practices
	Recommending and/or conducting health-related training for city staff and other Oakwood stakeholders (<i>i.e.</i> , schools, library)

Norb,

As promised I am providing you with a weekly update in regard to the Jessup project. I met with Thom Shrader (Manfreda Contractor) yesterday morning to go over the timeline for opening the sidewalk and overall completion of the exterior of the building. As you can see, the stone columns have been started and the exterior façade is progressing nicely. However, the stone that was shipped from Canada arrived in two different pallets and one of the pallets was severely damaged upon delivery. The stone mason has verified that the replacement stone will be manufactured on July 20th and hopes to take delivery by the end of next week. Due to the damaged stone, the EFIS cannot be applied to the building until the stone work has been completed. The EFIS should only take one week to complete.

The cladding on the façade and new roof will be completed on July 23.

Thom anticipates all exterior work (and fence removed) to be completed by August 6th with the first day of school starting on August 25th.

I know how important it is to have the sidewalk reopened before the start of school. I will continue to communicate with Thom daily on the status of the project.

Ohio Humanities Taking Applications for \$1.3M in ARP Funds for Public Humanities Nonprofits

Arts nonprofit Ohio Humanities is currently accepting grant applications from nonprofits with a public humanities mission that have been affected by the pandemic. It will award a total of \$1.3 million through the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act of 2021, under the National Endowment for the Humanities' (NEH) Sustaining the Humanities through ARP (SHARP) program.

The ARP allocated \$51.6 million in emergency funding to NEH for local distribution through 56 state and jurisdictional humanities groups, according to an Ohio Humanities release. Funds support organizations, programs and professionals at the local level to advance economic recovery within the cultural sector due to the effects of the pandemic. Eligible projects may include
