

Oakwood Public Safety focus on mental health

According to the National Institute of Mental Health, statistics show that approximately 20 percent (51.5 million) of U.S. adults experienced a mental health condition in 2019, and it is estimated that 10 percent of all law enforcement calls for service involve a person with a mental illness. In an effort to equip every officer with the necessary skills to safely and effectively do their job, the Oakwood Public Safety Department has implemented a series of trainings in 2021 focusing on mental health.

for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) and brought the first Out of the Darkness Walk to Dayton in 2013. This walk, which has provided tremendous support to suicide loss survivors over the years, attracted more than 2,000 participants at its last in-person event at Oakwood's Mack Hummon Stadium in 2019. Because of the growth of the walk and logistics with parking, the decision was made to move this year's walk to Welcome Stadium on Sunday, October 17, 2021. "The Oakwood community has been at the forefront of suicide prevention the last eight years," Luther said. "We could never have accomplished what we did without the help and support of Oakwood's

City Council, Oakwood's Schools, and the Oakwood Safety Department. We are grateful for Oakwood's support of events and programs surrounding mental health and suicide, and we are happy to support officers and members of the community with suicide prevention programs funded by AFSP's Out of the Darkness Walk."

In addition to the Talk Saves Lives training, all sworn Safety Department personnel will complete a Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training course for Public Safety Officers during 2021. The MHFA course is designed to provide officers with the ability to recognize symptoms of mental illness and substance abuse, effectively engage a person in crisis,

and connect positively with the person in need. Oakwood officers will also receive de-escalation training that will provide officers with the essential tools and tactics needed to achieve the most desirable outcome when dealing with an individual in crisis.

Additionally, the Oakwood Public Safety Department will send all first-line supervisors to an intensive 40-hour Crisis Intervention Training certification course, and a select group of officers will attend a leading suicide intervention training program entitled Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST). Also, all public safety dispatchers will complete a crisis intervention companion training course providing them with the knowl-

OAKWOOD — The Oakwood Safety Department has started a series of training sessions aimed at improving how officers deal with individuals with mental health conditions.

The programs will give Oakwood's sworn safety personnel — all certified as police officers, firefighters and paramedics/EMTs — up to about 70 hours of training to help safely and effectively do their job, city Safety Director Alan Hill said.

"Increasing an officer's knowledge and understanding of mental illness will assist them in de-escalation, ensuring the best outcomes in challenging situations," according to Hill.

Nearly one in five U.S. adults, or 51.5 million, lived with a mental illness in 2019, according to the National Institute of Mental Health.

Mental illness-related needs

are growing among all adult age groups, Public Health-Dayton & Montgomery County records show. Some of the most common mental health diagnoses among people ages 16 to 24 increased from 2009 to 2014, according to PHDMC.

Three of them — attention deficit disorder, anxiety disorders and Schizophrenia — jumped by more than 20%.

The number of mental health cases Oakwood handles in a given time period is difficult to quantify, Hill said in an email.

"I could have an officer talking with someone right now," he said. "That person could be exhibiting signs of suffering from a mental condition.

"But as long as they show the ability to care for themselves, not showing signs of wanting to harm themselves or others, and do not present in a manic state, the officer's initial observations may never be documented in an official report," Hill added. "Therefore, no real way for me to tell you frequency during service calls."

Oakwood's training will include a 40-hour crisis intervention training certification course for all first-line supervisors, and all sworn safety department personnel will complete mental health

first aid, according to a news release from the city.

A session on suicide intervention was led by Dr. Sallie Wilson Luther, a member of the Oakwood Board of Health, and Leigh Ann Fulford, a certified trainer.

Luther said the "Oakwood community has been at the forefront of suicide preven-

tion" the past several years.

Officers will also receive de-escalation training that will provide "tools and tactics to achieve the most desirable outcome when dealing with an individual in crisis," according to the city.

RE: *Impact of Sub.H.B. 110 on the Oakwood Board of Health*

Sub.H.B. 110, which is the biennial budget bill just adopted by the 134th General Assembly, was signed into law by Governor DeWine on June 30, 2021. As enacted, key provisions affecting the Oakwood Board of Health include the following amendments to Ohio Revised Code Sec. 3709.012:

1. **"Efficiency and effectiveness" study required.** Cities with a population of less than 50,000 are required to complete a study of the "efficiency and effectiveness" of merging with the general county health district.
 - a. Criteria for the study will be developed by the Ohio Director of Health and the State Auditor, which "may include accreditation standards."
 - b. The Ohio Director of Health is also responsible for "oversee(ing) any efficiency and effectiveness study conducted."
2. **Mandatory merger if study so indicates.** Merger with the county health district is required by law if the study indicates that doing so would be "efficient and effective."
3. **Timing.** Timing for completing the study, and for completing a merger if so indicated, is linked to "the official announcement of the result of a federal decennial census taken in a particular census year, including the 2020 census." (Note that unlike previous versions of Sub. H.B. 110, this language is not limited to the 2020 census only. In other words, the study and possible merger are not a one-time endeavor; they must be repeated after every decennial census.)
 - a. The study must be completed within 18 months after that official announcement.
 - b. If merger is indicated, the merger must be completed within 30 months after that official announcement.
4. **Exceptions.** For cities having a population of less than 50,000, there are only two exceptions to the study and merger requirements:
 - a. If a city's health district is already accredited, and accreditation is maintained, the study and potential merger are not required; or
 - b. If a city's health district was already in the process of applying for accreditation as of the effective date of Sub. H.B. 110 (September 30, 2021), and accreditation is received by December 31, 2025 and maintained thereafter, the study and potential merger are not required.

RE: *Functional changes to the Oakwood Board of Health if the State of Ohio eliminates local health districts*

(2021 biennial budget bill, Sub. H.B. 110, 134th General Assembly)

Provisions have been included in the state's pending biennial budget bill that will eliminate small local health districts, forcing them to merge with larger county health districts. The bill is currently in conference committee, but is anticipated to pass in the next two weeks.

Oakwood's Board of Health is created by the City Charter, which means the bill would not eliminate the board itself. Instead, Oakwood would no longer constitute its own health district, and the bill would strip away "all the power and authority conferred upon city boards of health by State law and such other duties as may be imposed upon it by the State sanitary code," leaving a body whose duties are imposed by city ordinances only. (*See Charter, Sec. 7.03.*) City ordinances would need to be adjusted to ensure that they are not inconsistent with state law pertaining to health districts.

Under this arrangement, the following table lists functions currently performed by the Board that would cease, as well as functions that may continue or begin. (Note that Public Health Dayton-Montgomery County will take over responsibility for functions that cease at the local level. Also, PHDMC's fees for inspections and licenses will be somewhat higher than what Oakwood has historically charged, but that is beyond the city's control.)

Functions that must cease	Functions that may continue or begin
Providing for prompt diagnosis and control of communicable diseases	Advising Council on legislation that may impact public health
Studying and recording the prevalence of disease	Advising city staff on policies and facility rules that may impact public health
State-mandated inspections (restaurants/food service, pools, school facilities, salons, barber shops, tattoo/piercing, jails, etc.)	Advising the Oakwood City School District on general health matters not addressed by the county health district
Issuing licenses and approvals (restaurants/food service, pools, school facilities, salons, barber shops, tattoo/piercing, jails, etc.)	Serving as a liaison between the county health district and city staff, as well as other Oakwood stakeholders (<i>i.e.</i> , schools, library)



Quarantining, containment, and closure orders	Advising city staff in public nuisance abatement matters
All vital statistics functions	Recommending and/or conducting public education events, community health-related activities, etc.
State-mandated reporting, audits, etc.	Collaboration with Safety Dept medical director to ensure best EMS practices

Dear Code Enforcer:

I am in receipt of your notification admonishing me for a debris pile in the street, apparently in violation of the city code. My wife and I have resided at 106 Peach Orchard Road since 1974 and at 416 Monterey Avenue for five years prior to 1974. During that entire 52 year period we have observed yard clippings routinely placed along the curbside all over the city. I am unaware of any incidents of accidents resulting from this practice. Further, I question if safety is in fact a major concern with regard to the yard debris issue, since the city has done nothing to eliminate or reduce the many instances of shrubbery and bushes overgrowing sidewalks to such an extent that it is necessary to sometimes walk in the street because the sidewalk is so overgrown.

Insofar as representing an interference to the flow of traffic, I submit that any such interference is miniscule compared to the obstruction posed by allowing curbside parking on both sides of the narrow streets east of Shafor Boulevard. This practice results in a complete shutdown of traffic whenever a delivery vehicle must stop in mid-street to deliver packages or goods to a home. Additionally, although it may not constitute an Oakwood code violation, I and many others feel this represents a much more unsafe situation than a small pile of yard debris. Children or adults frequently dart from between parked cars or suddenly open a side car door.

My wife and I make it a practice to not place yard debris along the curb until one or two days prior to a scheduled pickup. Additionally, I make it a regular practice to trim the debris so that the pile does not extend more than about two feet from the curb. I know that not everyone does this extra trimming and their yard debris piles frequently extend much further into the right of way.

One problem, much more frequent this summer than in previous years, is that the scheduled pickup seldom occurs on schedule. In one recent case it was a week and a half later than scheduled. The pickup on our street scheduled for July 16 did not occur until July 20. If residents would not put their debris into the street until no more than two days prior to scheduled pickups, limited the pile size to no more than two or three feet from the curb, and the pickups occurred on schedule, the problem would be significantly reduced.

I deduce from your notification that an exception is made for leaf piles in the fall. My observation is that leaf piles are routinely much larger than yard debris piles and in some cases extend almost to mid-street. I would like to know why the yard debris piles represent more of a problem than the leaf piles.

As to your suggestions for disposing of yard waste:

- I am eighty years old and do not own a pickup truck with which to transport yard debris to the Public Works Center or the Creager Field dumpster. I'm sure this is a problem for many other residents who do not own pickup trucks.

- Calling for a dumpster delivery to my home for the usually very small pile of yard debris which we have seems to be like killing an ant with a shotgun. Where would the dumpster be placed? It could not be in our driveway as we park in the garage (not along the curb) and use the driveway every day. Along the curb, where it would be a much bigger obstruction and safety issue than a small pile of Yard debris?
- Placing the pile on our lawn rather than along the curb? We have done this in the past whenever the pile is unusually large. Every time the result has been that the lawn has been gouged and grass torn out. The debris collectors could avoid this if they would use a simple garden rake to pull the debris into the street for the front loader to pick up rather than expecting the front loader to surgically remove the debris from a lawn without damage. Additionally, if the pickups cannot be relied on to occur on schedule, placing the piles on our lawns would have a adverse effect on the lawns most residents try to maintain so as not to be a negative impact on the appearance of our Oakwood neighborhoods.

I recognize that the city code prohibits placing yard debris in the street. I submit however that this practice has been neither a safety or traffic flow problem in the past except for the cases in which large piles have actually reached well into the right of way. Considering that the alternatives suggested in your letter each has their own shortcomings, I suggest that the city consider modifying the code to permit yard debris piles in the street so long as the pile does not extend more than 30 inches from the curb. This could be enforced just as easily as the current means of detecting yard debris in the street - by driving the streets to detect violations.

Finally, let me close by adding that my wife and I have spent considerable effort and money maintaining our property through the past fifty plus years so that our house and yard do not look unsightly.

It was very good to see the Oakwood Inclusion Coalition reported, finally, in the most recent publication of the Oakwood Scene. As well, in brief, in the Oakwood Register a while back.

However, it is with disappointment and dismay that I have not seen any reference to the coalition's efforts and reach to the graphic design program and its majors in the Department of Art and Design at the University of Dayton.

We dedicated an entire semester of curriculum development to establishing a visual identity for the OIC. As far as I know, the organization selected a logo design and identity from one of the student groups, with the understanding that the OIC would follow through on the UD student's recommendation.

Since then, I have received emails that do not follow the logo design and or its correct typographic application. While that is disappointing, I find it even more discouraging that there is no mention or visual respect for the OIC to report on the fact that UD students were involved in the process of creating an identity and being on board with the efforts of the OIC.

I fear you have missed an opportunity to connect to our young adults by way of the University of Dayton. Thank you for the opportunity, for sure, and we wish you well in your efforts. Please keep going.
