

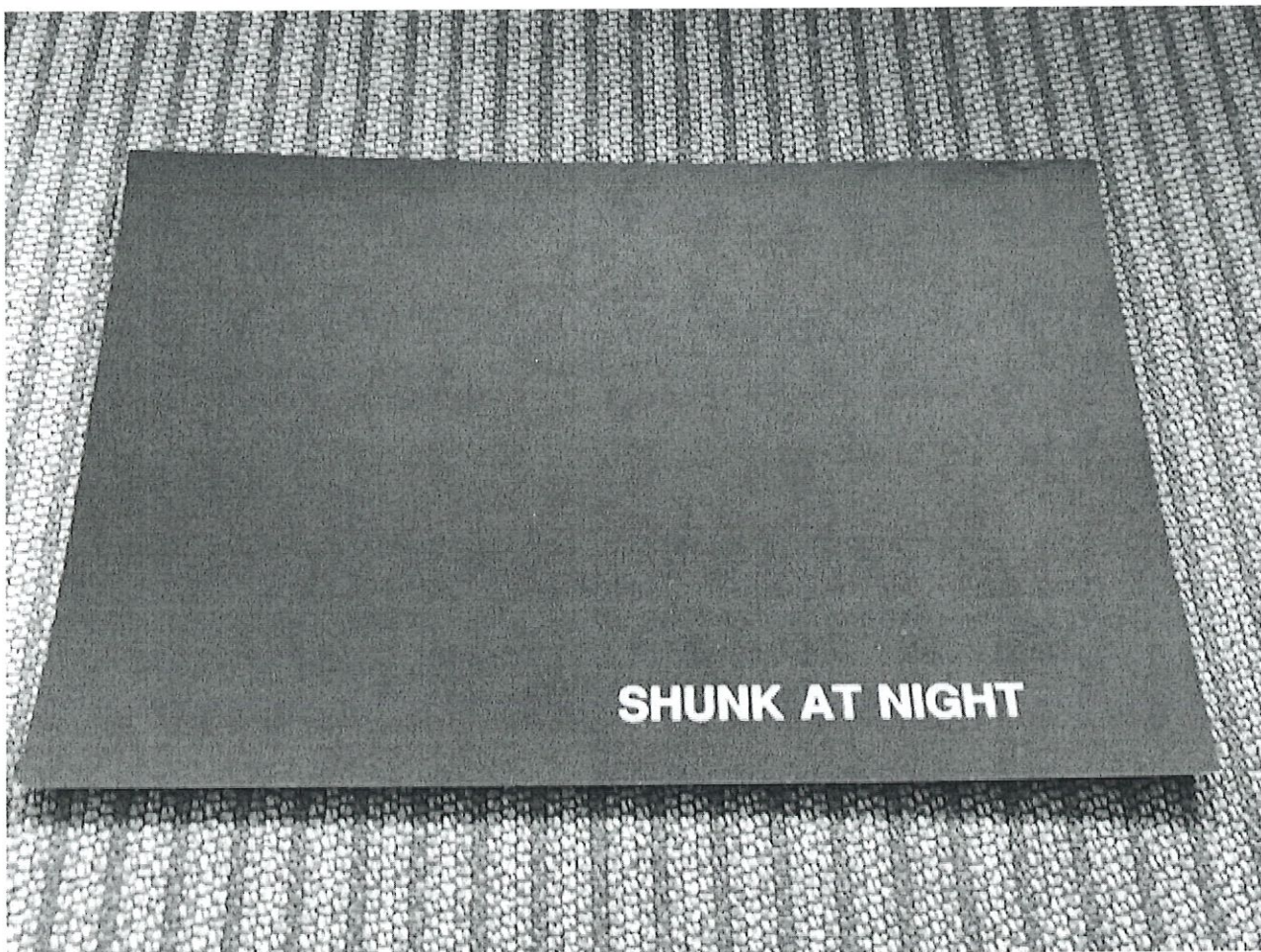

Dear Code Enforcer:

I am in receipt of your notification admonishing me for a debris pile in the street, apparently in violation of the city code. My wife and I have resided at 106 Peach Orchard Road since 1974 and at 416 Monterey Avenue for five years prior to 1974. During that entire 52 year period we have observed yard clippings routinely placed along the curbside all over the city. I am unaware of any incidents of accidents resulting from this practice. Further, I question if safety is in fact a major concern with regard to the yard debris issue, since the city has done nothing to eliminate or reduce the many instances of shrubbery and bushes overgrowing sidewalks to such an extent that it is necessary to sometimes walk in the street because the sidewalk is so overgrown.

Insofar as representing an interference to the flow of traffic, I submit that any such interference is miniscule compared to the obstruction posed by allowing curbside parking on both sides of the narrow streets east of Shafor Boulevard. This practice results in a complete shutdown of traffic whenever a delivery vehicle must stop in mid-street to deliver packages or goods to a home. Additionally, although it may not constitute an Oakwood code violation, I and many others feel this represents a much more unsafe situation than a small pile of yard debris. Children or adults frequently dart from between parked cars or suddenly open a side car door.

My wife and I make it a practice to not place yard debris along the curb until one or two days prior to a scheduled pickup. Additionally, I make it a regular practice to trim the debris so that the pile does not extend more than about two feet from the curb. I know that not everyone does this extra trimming and their yard debris piles frequently extend much further into the right of way.

One problem, much more frequent this summer than in previous years, is that the scheduled pickup seldom occurs on schedule. In one recent case it was a week and a half later than scheduled. The pickup on our street scheduled for July 16 did not occur until July 20. If residents would not put their debris into the street until no more than two days prior to scheduled pickups, limited the pile size to no more than two or three feet from the curb, and the pickups occurred on schedule, the problem would be significantly reduced.

I deduce from your notification that an exception is made for leaf piles in the fall. My observation is that leaf piles are routinely much larger than yard debris piles and in some cases extend almost to mid-street. I would like to know why the yard debris piles represent more of a problem than the leaf piles.

As to your suggestions for disposing of yard waste:

- I am eighty years old and do not own a pickup truck with which to transport yard debris to the Public Works Center or the Creager Field dumpster. I'm sure this is a problem for many other residents who do not own pickup trucks.

- Calling for a dumpster delivery to my home for the usually very small pile of yard debris which we have seems to be like killing an ant with a shotgun. Where would the dumpster be placed? It could not be in our driveway as we park in the garage (not along the curb) and use the driveway every day. Along the curb, where it would be a much bigger obstruction and safety issue than a small pile of Yard debris?
- Placing the pile on our lawn rather than along the curb? We have done this in the past whenever the pile is unusually large. Every time the result has been that the lawn has been gouged and grass torn out. The debris collectors could avoid this if they would use a simple garden rake to pull the debris into the street for the front loader to pick up rather than expecting the front loader to surgically remove the debris from a lawn without damage. Additionally, if the pickups cannot be relied on to occur on schedule, placing the piles on our lawns would have a adverse effect on the lawns most residents try to maintain so as not to be a negative impact on the appearance of our Oakwood neighborhoods.

I recognize that the city code prohibits placing yard debris in the street. I submit however that this practice has been neither a safety or traffic flow problem in the past except for the cases in which large piles have actually reached well into the right of way. Considering that the alternatives suggested in your letter each has their own shortcomings, I suggest that the city consider modifying the code to permit yard debris piles in the street so long as the pile does not extend more than 30 inches from the curb. This could be enforced just as easily as the current means of detecting yard debris in the street - by driving the streets to detect violations.

Finally, let me close by adding that my wife and I have spent considerable effort and money maintaining our property through the past fifty plus years so that our house and yard do not look unsightly.

Items of note:

1. Recording was finalized for the Aberdeen and Telford R/W plats. Kristi Hale and Kyle Ramey are both aware. I have 1 hard copy of the recorded plats and the PDFs will be available later this week when the county gets them scanned.
2. Drew Proffitt from Keller North America (210 retaining wall) has ***verbally*** assured me that they intended the escalation clause for material quantities, not pricing, as long as we are going forward in the next 45-60 days. This is because they won't know how much material is needed until after soil boring has been done.

I've continued to have some difficulty communicating with them, but I think it's resolved now. Drew Proffitt seems to be the most reliable contact. I am expecting an updated contract document today that includes signature lines for both parties and a clearer version of the escalation clause.

Todd,

The short answer is that this is a matter for Spectrum and AT&T. The city of Oakwood has no power or control over these private companies and how they plan/execute their business operations. I can imagine that it is quite challenging for these internet service providers to keep up with demand. I can also imagine that there are many households in Oakwood that have high service demand, as your family obviously does.

Below are contacts for people at Spectrum and AT&T. I believe that these two gentlemen can talk to you about any plans that the two companies may have to improve services in the area.

Spectrum:

AT&T:

The city does not have the power to refuse to allow a company to improve their internet service. The contact from AT&T should be able to specifically address this with you.

That all said, a third internet service provider (Point Broadband) is making plans to build a fiber optic network in several communities around the Dayton area, including Oakwood. It is expected to take 2-3 years to complete the project. This obviously does not help you in the

short term, but should make a difference down the road when we have three companies competing for the business.

We have 2 younger kids who play video games and also did online school / learning last year.

My work lets me work from home often as well.

The issue is the fact that we cannot get a stronger web/wifi/internet speed at our address.

We tried the most expensive package with Spectrum and it was terrible.
We currently have ATT and it is better but not good.

In investigating how and why our speeds are so poor, I came across ATT Fiber. I tried to upgrade to this level of service and was told it was not available at my address. Apparently it is available for parts of Oakwood but not my house. So I wanted to check this out and eventually someone told me that only part of Oakwood can get Fiber because the city refused to allow it.

Now, I am smart enough to take that with a grain of salt but I would love to hear why in 2021, in an affluent city that has very high property taxes and great schools - I can't seem to get high speed fiber internet for my family.

Can you please provide your thoughts on this situation? Is it an Oakwood issue? Is it an AT&T issue? Little of both?

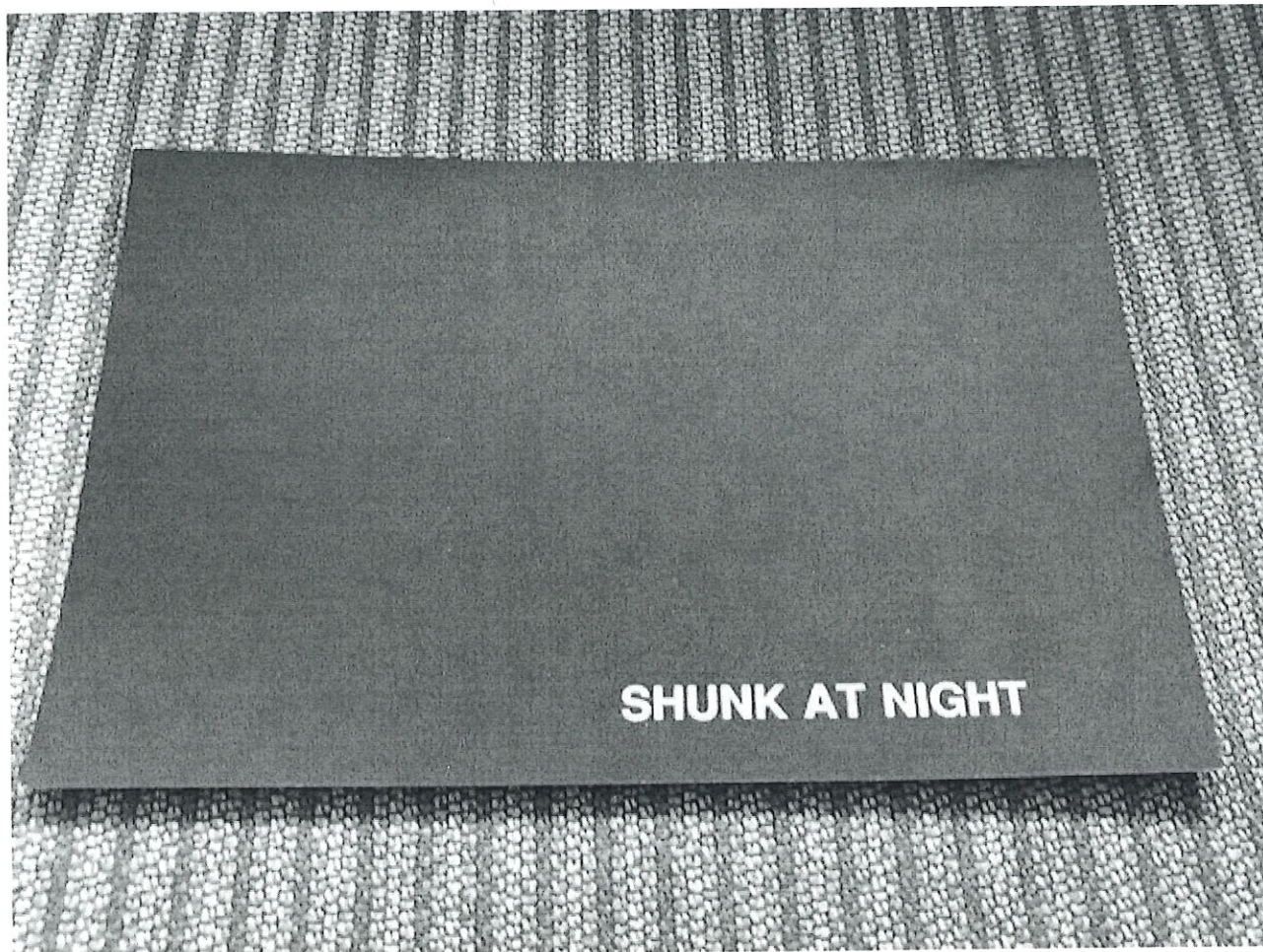
