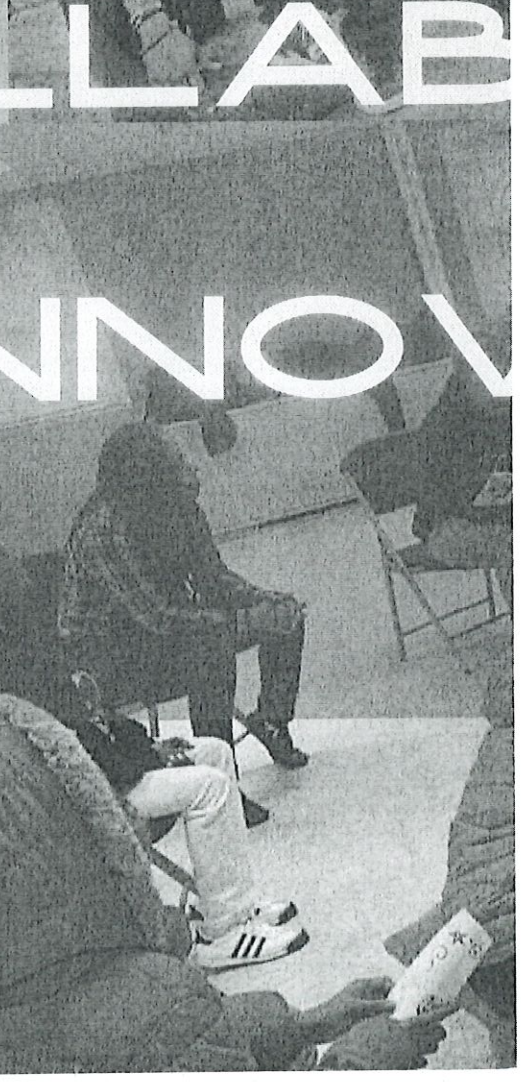

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE OIC:

Q: What's the ~~real~~ purpose of the OIC?

A: ~~It's to~~ foster an inclusive community through education, development of programs and projects, and communication initiatives. Its mission is to study, promote, and celebrate inclusiveness.

Q: Is the OIC a political organization?

A: The OIC is a non-profit organization. It does not seek to influence, modify, or suspend city, school, or library legislation or policies. It does not seek to intervene in support any political campaign on behalf of any candidate or issue put to a public vote nor seek to influence, modify, or suspend city, school, or library legislation or policies.

Q: ~~Does being involved with the OIC require that I hold liberal political and social views?~~

A: ~~No, that wouldn't be inclusive. Besides, it would mean only half of Oakwood residents could participate. OIC leadership is committed to involving residents who hold views across the social spectrum so that inclusiveness can be achieved and its impact felt.~~

Another rendering to the above question:

Q: Does being involved with the OIC require that I hold particular political and social views?

A: No, that wouldn't be inclusive! The OIC leadership is committed to involving involve residents who hold views across the social spectrum so that authentic inclusiveness can be achieved and its impact felt.

Q: Who started the OIC?

A: Oakwood residents and city, school, and library officials, faith, ethnic and cultural leaders, and representatives from the business and media communities who see human dignity expressed differently in each person's religion, race, ethnicity, physical ability, sexual orientation, social-economic status, and age, and seek to promote civility in all human interactions. ~~The effort, citizen-driven, aims to address issues relating to diversity affecting Oakwood and cities throughout America.~~

Q: How is the OIC supported?

A: Volunteer officers manage the organization and receive no compensation. Private donations and public grants are welcome and will support specific OIC endeavors. Donations are tax deductible to the extend allowed by law.

Q: How can I get involved? (See my note about using the word "involved")

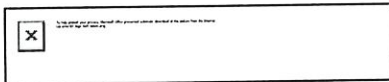

This response is from Robert Jacques, Law Director for the city of Oakwood. I understand that you sent a similar request for public records to Wright Memorial Library. I do not represent the library but have been authorized to send this initial response on behalf of both the city and library, acknowledging receipt of your request to both entities.

Please be advised that both the city of Oakwood and the Wright Memorial Library are unable to identify responsive records without additional information from the requester. Specifically, the request we received is vague, overbroad, and identifies records in a different manner than the manner in which they are stored or indexed. A public office may deny a public records request if it cannot reasonably identify what public records are being requested. (State ex rel. Thomas v. Ohio State Univ. (1994), 71 Ohio St.3d 245; State ex rel. Oriana House Inc., v. Betty D. Montgomery, 2005 Ohio 3377 (Tenth Dist., 2005); and State ex rel. Evans v. City of Parma, 2003 Ohio 1159 (Eight Dist., 2003).) Also, a public records custodian who uses an indexing system that is different than, and inconsistent with, a public records request has no duty to respond to a request that does not comport with the indexing system, as such request is invalid. (State ex rel. Zauderer v. Joseph, 62 Ohio App.3d 752 (10th Dist, 1989); State ex rel. Evans v. City of Parma, supra.)

Specific issues with your request include the following, with requests for clarification as appropriate:

1. Your request identifies the sender and recipient of certain emails by name, rather than by email address. It is possible that some named individuals may have more than one email address, which we would not know. It is also possible that emails have been sent or received with an email address but without a name, and searching via name will not retrieve those emails. We are unable to identify all responsive records unless you indicate the specific email addresses you would like us to search.
2. Your request references "Collaboration with OIC" in the subject line, and I note that the named individuals are all involved with OIC in some capacity. However, nothing in your request limits the scope to OIC-related emails, and employees of the city, library, and local schools regularly correspond about many subjects of mutual concern. In other words, if you are merely seeking OIC-related emails, there is likely to be a lot of unnecessary correspondence captured by your request, all of which will take time to review for legally-required redactions. If you can narrow the scope of your request in this regard, it would likely be beneficial to you as the requester and to us as we work to identify responsive documents.
3. Your request is limited to responsive emails sent or received "within the last 5 months." However, no specific date range was given. Unless you instruct us otherwise, we intend to identify responsive records using the 5 month period from February 28, 2021, to July 29, 2021.
4. Although not required, please provide a telephone number for the requester if you are willing to do so, or feel free to contact me at (937) 298-0600 to discuss your request. We can likely clarify the scope of the request more quickly with a brief phone call, rather than sending back-and-forth emails through an online portal system.

This week's numbers were just released:

Montgomery County: 128.3 (up from 80.7)
Statewide Average: 77.4 (up from 45.8)

Cases continue to spike, without a corresponding spike of hospitalizations and deaths. Over the past several weeks, Montgomery County has seen less than 10 hospitalizations-per-day (currently about 1-4 per day). The last time we had more than 10 hospitalizations in a single day was May 11, 2021.

Hello Ethan,

Just a quick review and install schedule for the Jessup project. As of Friday 7-23 the stone pilasters and the Rainscreen facade covering were completed. This week the mason cleaned his work, completed the parging on the planters and removed his extra material. The limestone caps and stair treads were measured and ordered about 2 weeks ago with a lead time of 2 to 3 weeks. We were notified this week of an additional 2 week delay because of equipment breakdown at the quarry. This will delay our EFIS install until after the stone work is complete. The upside is that we may have our windows in that same time frame. We will have the awnings installed and the railings installed after the fence is removed. At this time the fence should come down the week of August 23.

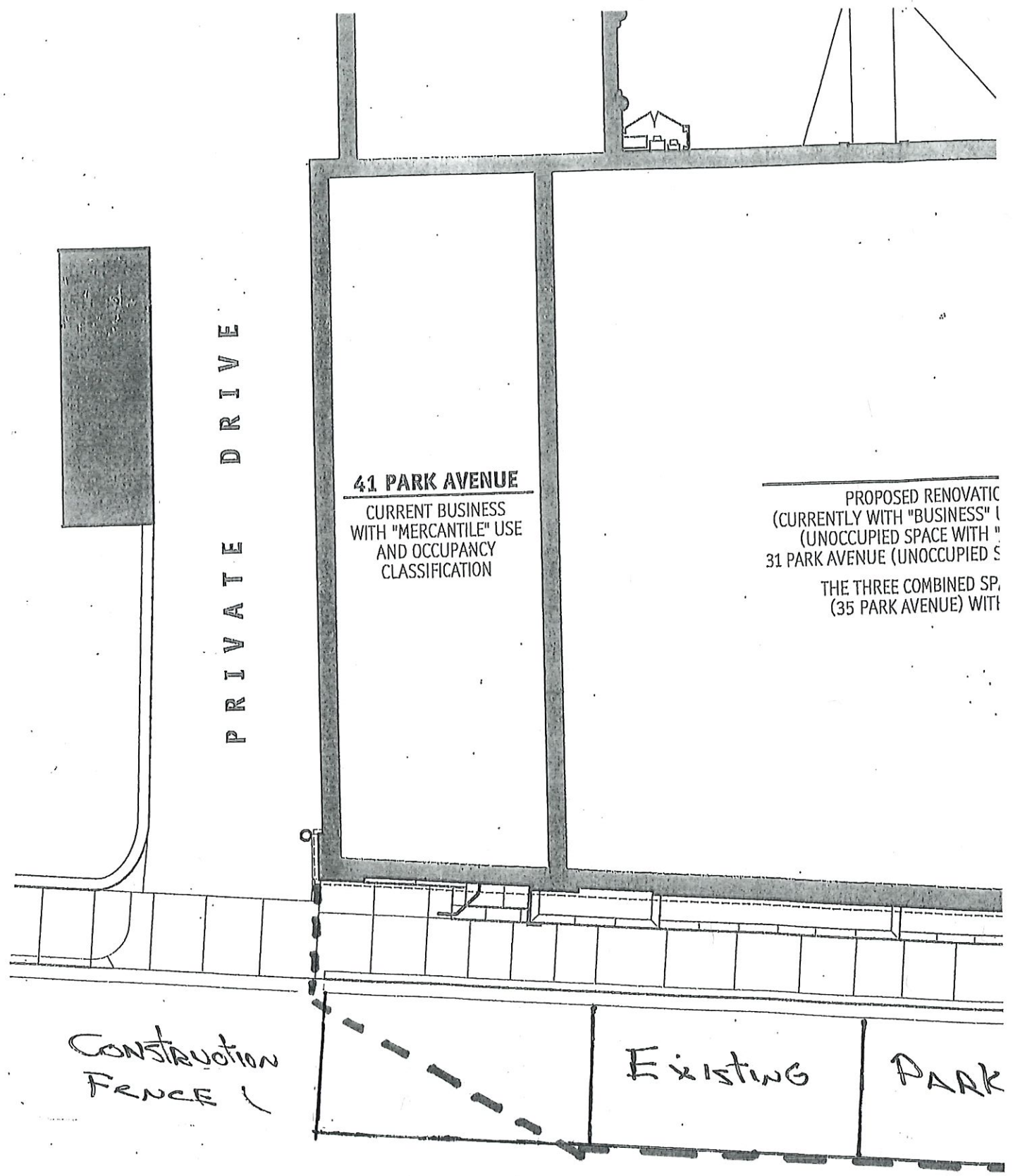

Here is the article from the 4/2/21 CM newsletter, including the enclosures (attached).

- Jessup Wealth Management: Construction on the Jessup Wealth Management building at 35 Park Avenue began at the beginning of February, and will last for about eight more weeks. The contractor closed a section of the sidewalk in front of the building yesterday. This closure is needed to facilitate what will be a major remodel of the building frontage. The closure is expected to last about 5-6 weeks, weather permitting. Enclosed are documents showing the closure area and sidewalk signage. 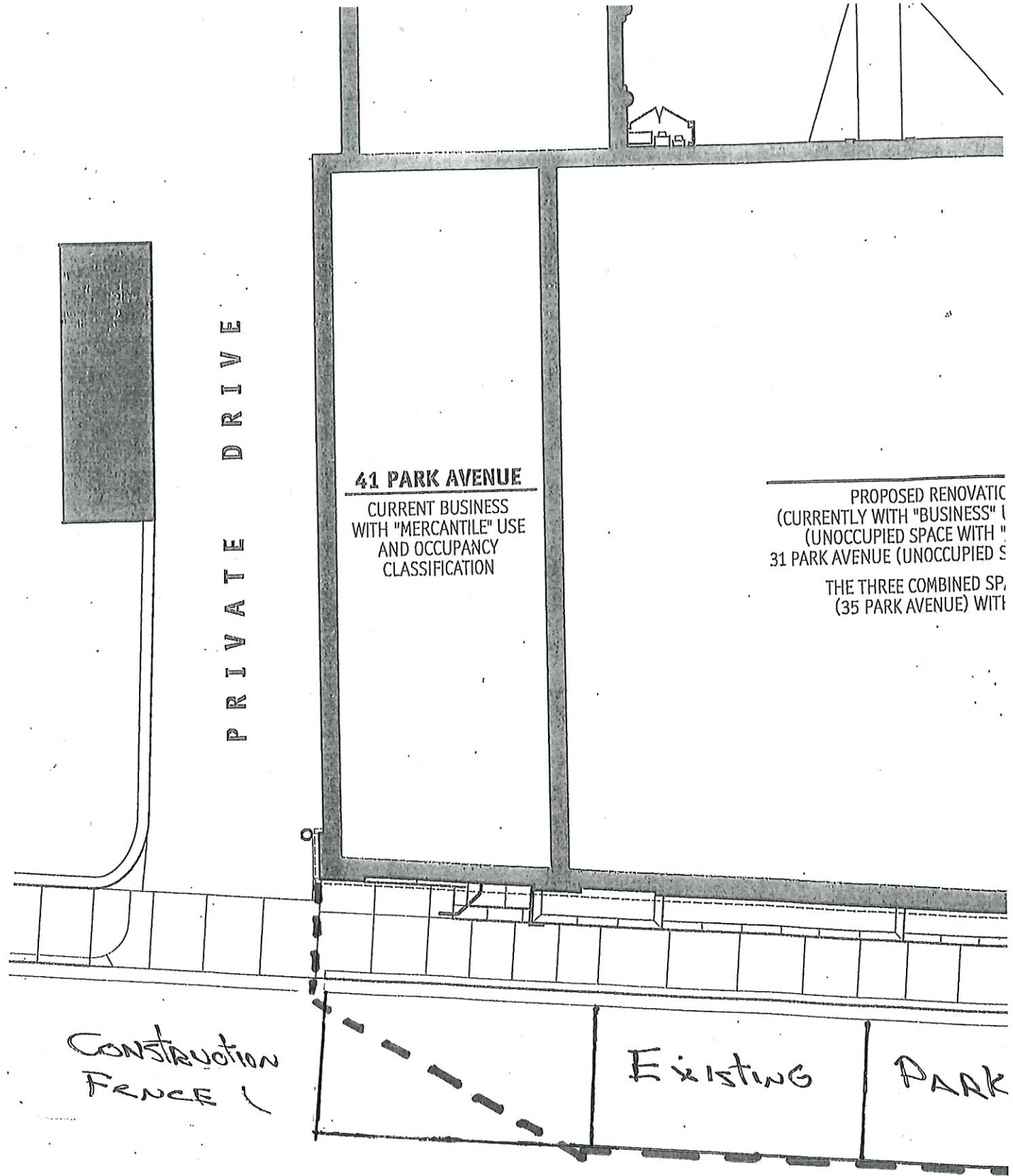

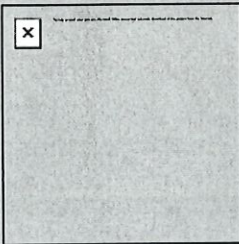

The truth is that no mitzvah can ever be considered insignificant; if G-d commanded us to do something then it is important, no matter how much greater another commandment seems.

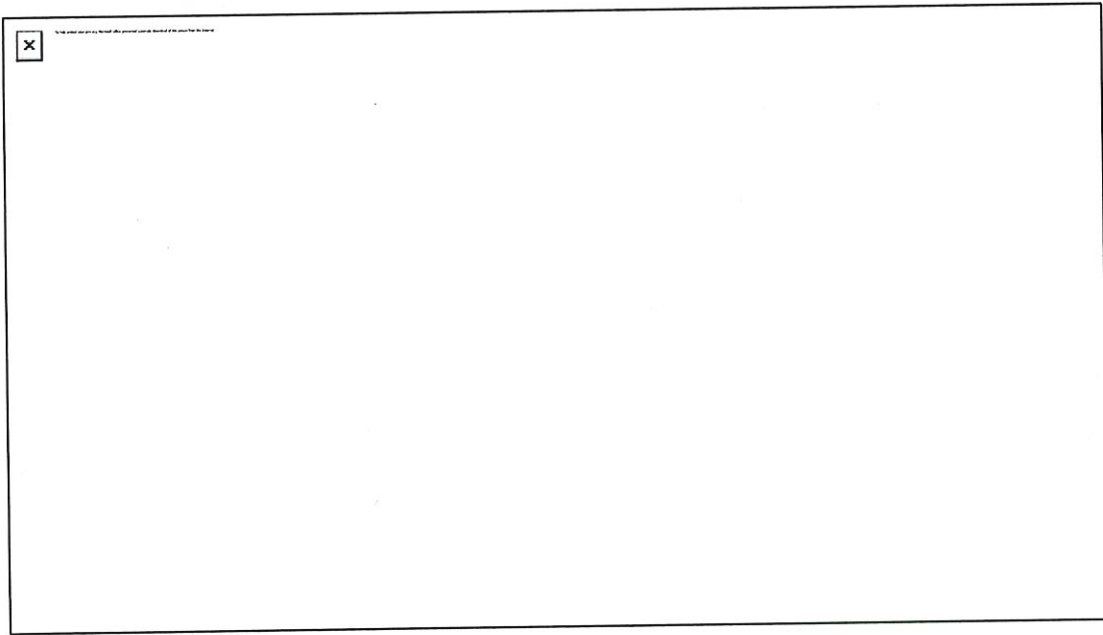
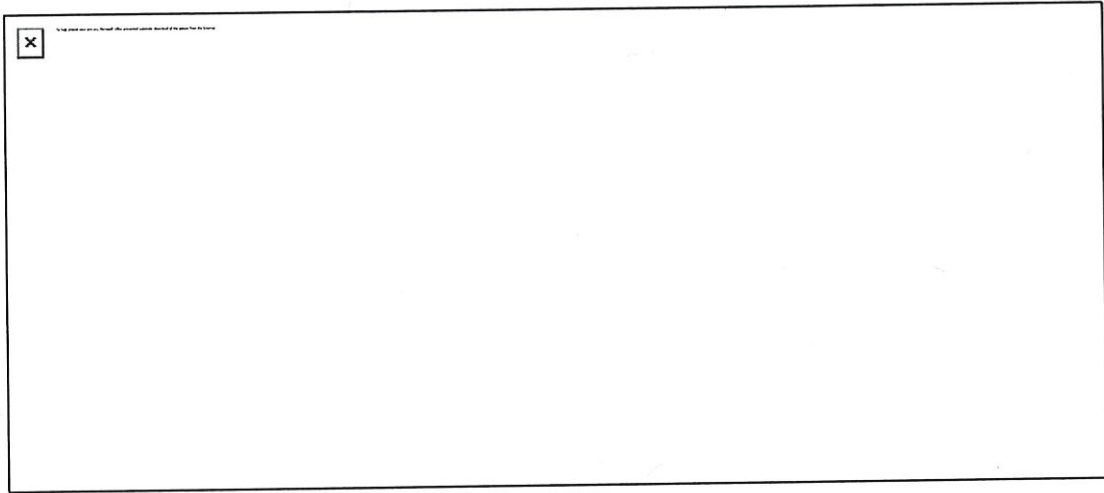
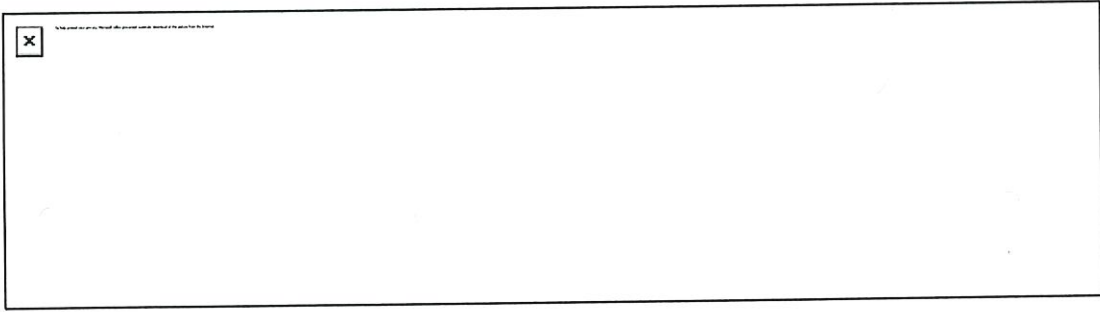

Heavenly Hunger

"Man does not live on bread alone, but by the utterance of G-d's mouth does man live" (Devarim 8:3).

This is a verse from this week's Torah portion, Parshas Eikev, spoken regarding the Maan, the heavenly bread that Hashem provided the Jewish people during their sojourn in the desert. The people complained of hunger although they received more than enough bread to physically satiate every member of the congregation. What were the Jewish people actually hungry for?

One interpretation of our Sages is that the hunger of the Jewish people was metaphoric in nature, that our spiritual intake, or "heavenly bread," doesn't satisfy but rather feeds the flame of the G-dly soul, leaving us yearning for greater spiritual awareness.

Parshah in a Nutshell

Parshat Eikev

In the Parshah of **Eikev** (“Because”), **Moses** continues his closing address to the children of Israel, promising them that if they will fulfill the commandments (**mitzvot**) of the **Torah**, they will prosper in the **Land** they are about to conquer and settle in keeping with G-d’s promise to their forefathers.

Moses also rebukes them for their failings in their first generation as a people, recalling their worship of the **Golden Calf**, the rebellion of **Korach**, the sin of the **spies**, their angering of **G-d** at Taveirah, Massah and Kivrot Hataavah (“The Graves of Lust”). “You have been rebellious against G-d,” he says to them, “since the day I knew you.” But he also speaks of G-d’s **forgiveness** of their sins, and the **Second Tablets** which G-d inscribed and gave to them following their repentance.

Their forty years in the desert, says Moses to the people, during which G-d sustained them with daily **manna** from heaven, was to teach them “that man does not live on bread alone, but by the utterance of G-d’s mouth does man live.”

Moses describes the land they are about to enter as “flowing with **milk and honey**,” blessed with the “**seven kinds**” (wheat,

barley, grapevines, figs, pomegranates, olive oil and dates), and as the place that is the focus of G-d's providence of His world. He commands them to destroy the idols of the land's former masters, and to beware lest they become haughty and begin to believe that "my power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth."

A key passage in our Parshah is the second chapter of the Shema, which repeats the fundamental mitzvot enumerated in the Shema's first chapter, and describes the rewards of fulfilling G-d's commandments and the adverse results (famine and exile) of their neglect. It is also the source of the precept of prayer, and includes a reference to the resurrection of the dead in the messianic age.
