Norb,

I saw your e-mail about the Jessup project delay. Yes, I support you and your staff in whatever ultimatum you think appropriate.

But, the suggestion in my note to all of you from June 24th (below), in which I asked that we discuss (at our August 2 meeting) alternate routes in anticipation of a delay, is where my thoughts have been.

We DO have control over the suggested safe route to Harman (as authors) and how the Public Safety Department employees are trained to execute it (as their employer). Harman School communicates regularly with parents, and a temporary change to the school commute is not unprecedented.

I have tried the alternate route to Harman on foot and on my bike several times this week, and it does not take more than a few extra steps or a few extra minutes to cross at Patterson instead of Park. This is how we did it when I was at Harman (1969!).

I am concerned that the area will not be safe whether or not the sidewalk "opens" on August 16 or August 23, if they seem so unsure about completion dates.

The bullet below is in tomorrow's CM newsletter. Attached are the meeting minutes from October and December 2017.

- Traffic Concerns: Enclosed is a *Register* letter to the editor. After the October 2017 council meeting, the Public Safety Department conducted a series of site enforcements and traffic analysis evaluations. Chief Hill reported at the December 11, 2017 council meeting that vehicles speed

patterns were within an acceptable range. Also enclosed are minutes from the October 2, 2017 and December 11, 2017 council meetings. Our speed monitoring device is currently set up on Hathaway between Harman and Greenmount capturing northbound traffic.

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Funny you ask about the Jessup project. I will forward an email exchange I had with Ethan Kroger this morning. I assure you that the sidewalk will be reopened well before school starts. I am increasingly frustrated with the length of time that the project is taking, but do understand the realities of the construction market these days. As you'll see in Ethan's email, the sidewalk should be opened by some time around the third week in July.

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control in residential areas and, in many cases, have the opposite effect. I am not promoting any change in her area of concern, but her letter made me wonder:

(1) Can we have the two speed data tools in use at all times? (Maybe we already do?) I was so impressed with the output from the Telford study. Do we pay a fee for tool use or for the reports? (I noticed "radarsign" on the report headers) I bet among the 6 of us, we would come up with twenty different locations if asked for the scariest traffic spots in Oakwood (the variation coming from our different schedules, addresses, friends, etc.) It would be nice to get data on all of those locations

(2) Abbey mentioned a "new safe route to school" (again, she was talking about Smith School, about which I know very little), and I wondered if we could add to our August 2nd work session agenda the possibility of a temporary change to the safe route for Harman, if Jessup's Park Avenue project is delayed. This is the area which has generated more complaints than any in all of my years here. I know it is not our project or our fault. Norb's April 1st note to us said the estimated time frame for sidewalk closure is 5 - 6 weeks from April 1st. The complaints relate to school kids walking in the street on Park Avenue. Below is the current route (provided to the community by the schools and City). There are probably several temporary logistical workarounds, and I will defer to the experts on that, but I would like to be ready.

Subject: Stop Sign Proposal for Delaine & Hathaway at Telford & Aberdeen

Mayor Duncan, Vice Mayor Byington, and Members of Council,

Good afternoon! My name is Abbey Urbas, I live at 406 Greenmount Blvd. and spoke this past Monday evening in response to the traffic issue that was brought to the floor.

First off, I want to thank you for your time, for listening to the concerns of your residents and agreeing to discuss the situation. I have no doubt that the safety of the community and our children is your top priority!

I am writing to reiterate my specific request for the addition of stop signs on the north / south streets of Hathaway and Delaine at the Telford and Aberdeen intersections. As mentioned the other evening, these are the two roads that the many of the Smith School students east of Hathaway funnel to walking to / from school. See the attached visual for reference.

Yes, speeding is an issue, but for me these intersections are more about the volume of traffic on these roads. I often have to wait several minutes for an opportunity to cross. And I can tell you from three years so far of walking my eldest daughter to school that the frequency has not increased exponentially due to the Shroyer Road project, it is a long-standing situation.

Additionally there are usually cars parked very near the corner on these north / south streets creating a dangerous blind spot. I have had to teach my daughter how to ease out around the parked car, anticipating on-coming traffic and how to react.

My proposal is that by adding stop signs in these locations, cars will be forced to stop, and naturally allow children waiting to cross the opportunity to do so before they proceed through the intersection. Additionally, with the 30 ft. parking restriction surrounding a stop sign, the blind spot will be eliminated. Furthermore, with the recent addition of the crosswalk on Shroyer Road, and the two existing traffic light crosswalks on Telford and Aberdeen out front of Smith Elementary, there is an entire line of safe passage to school for our walking community.

Thank you again for your time and consideration. I would love to discuss with anyone further if you'd like. And if possible, I would like to be informed of the next council meeting where this will be discussed again so I may attend.

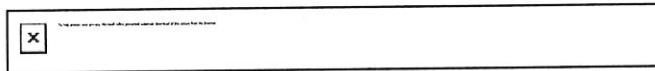


Project update - What you need to know about using the library next week
