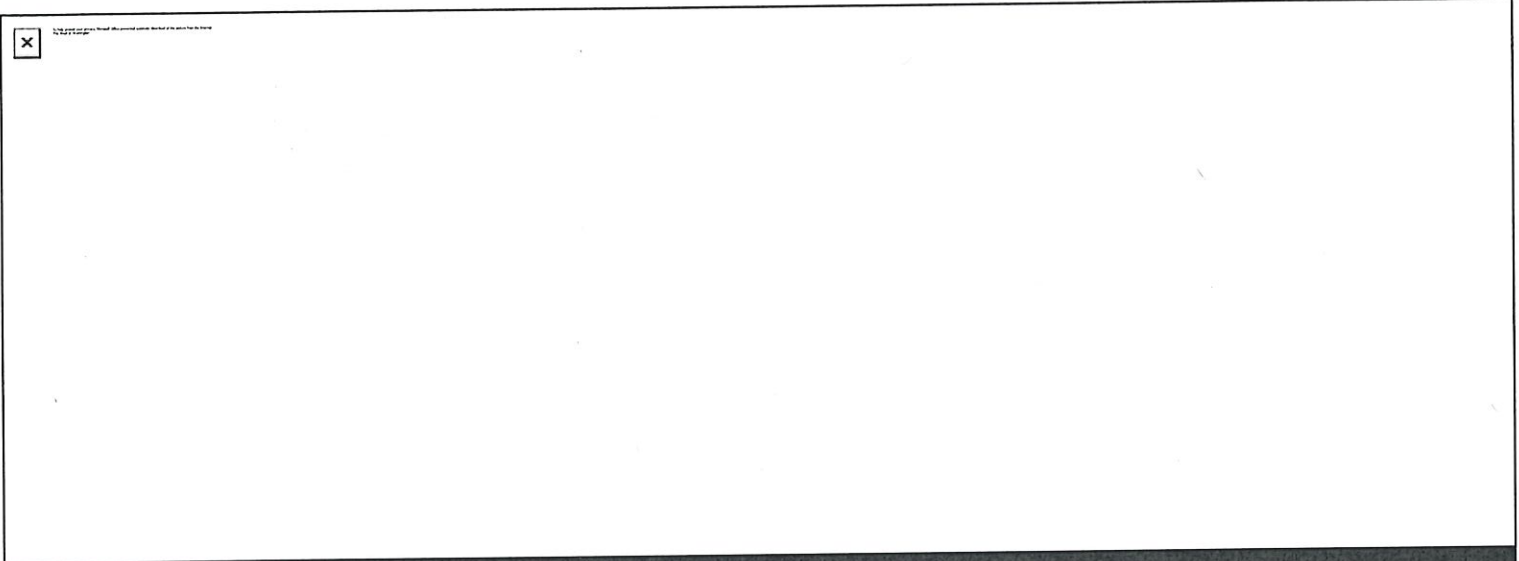

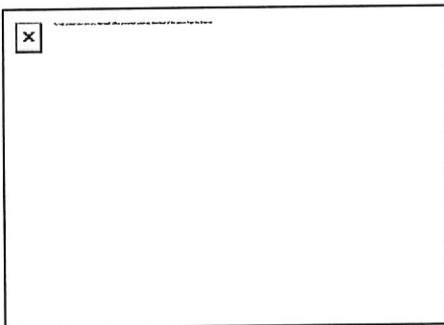

Bipartisan Infrastructure Package Cleared for Take Off

The Senate's bipartisan infrastructure bill made headway this week, with Senators in the negotiating group agreeing to a final package. Shortly after the bipartisan group announced an agreement, the Senate voted once again on a motion to proceed to debate. Unlike last week, the vote on Wednesday passed by a margin of 67-32, with 17 Republicans joining Democrats.

Released this morning, [here is the bill text](#). The final deal follows the same framework that had been reached with the White House a month ago. Some notable changes include the addition of funding for dam safety programs, which ASCE has been aggressively advocating for, as well as a \$10 billion cut for transit compared to the initial framework.

The bill is expected to be taken up next week, with a final vote by Thursday. ASCE will develop a comprehensive memo on the legislation once bill text is made available. A White House summary can be found [here](#). ASCE released a [statement](#) shortly after the deal was announced, applauding negotiators for their continued leadership, and urging swift passage of the package in the coming days.



ASCE Members Mobilizing for Federal Infrastructure

House Passes Slate of FY22 Spending Bills

This week the House [debated and passed by a vote of 219-208](#), its first fiscal year (FY) 2022 infrastructure spending included under a combination of [seven separate appropriation bills](#) (Agriculture; Energy and Water; Financial Services; Interior-Environment, Labor, Health and Human Services; Military Construction and Veteran Affairs; and Transportation, Housing and Urban Development). Overall [H.R. 4502](#) is a \$600 billion spending package and includes increases across all [categories of infrastructure](#) including \$1.9 billion for the Department of Transportation, \$8.6 billion for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and \$9.6 billion for the National Science Foundation (NSF). ASCE applauds the House in providing these much-needed investments and urges Senate Appropriators to act quickly to ensure we avoid a government shutdown before the September 30 deadline.

House Panel Advances Research and Development Bills

The House Science, Space, and Technology Committee added [five more bills](#) to its efforts to enhance and expand the nation's research enterprises. The five bills are in addition to legislation previously passed in the House, including the [National Science Foundation for the Future Act](#) and the [Department of Energy for the Future Act](#), to form a comprehensive research package that will need to be conferenced with the Senate passed bill. The Senate bill, the U.S. Innovation and Competition Act, passed last month and represents a sprawling R&D package. ASCE has expressed support of the efforts in both the House and the Senate and has urged Congress to work together to enact legislation to strengthen our nation's research enterprise. Eno Report Analyzes How to Make Smarter Transit Investments

The [Eno Center for Transportation](#) has released a [new report](#) on the nation's transit systems. The report, *Saving Time and Making Cents: A Blueprint for Building Transit Better*, analyzes current and historical trends to understand the drivers behind mass transit construction, cost, and delivery in the United States and abroad. The report includes a comprehensive database comparing investments between U.S. cities and peers in Western Europe to understand why transit projects in the U.S. are costing more and taking longer to deliver. The report hopes to assist in finding ways to build transit in a timely and more cost-effective way to ensure that local communities are

investing in transit networks that can grow their communities, reduce emissions, and connect people to opportunity.

Report Illustrates How Infrastructure Investment Creates Manufacturing Jobs

A new report from the Association of Equipment Manufacturers shows that the current bipartisan Senate infrastructure package, combined with a five-year surface transportation reauthorization, could create as many as 500,000 new manufacturing jobs in the upcoming year and bring in nearly \$2.3 billion in new federal, state, and local tax revenue from the equipment manufacturing industry. The report comes as the manufacturing industry continues to experience slow job growth, with many companies struggling to find workers.

Spotlight: Once in a Lifetime Historic Investment Warrants Longer-Lasting Materials

Michael McDonagh, Vice President, Engineering & Projects at Steelike, explores how ultra-high-performance concrete (UHPC) gained a foothold in transportation infrastructure and notes where other infrastructure owners and systems might replicate transportation's successes. Mr. McDonagh's analysis is particularly timely as Congress debates a major infrastructure package. UHPC has been found to extend the lifespan of not only new construction, but also can be used during repair and rehabilitation to extend the lifespan of existing assets. As lawmakers consider a fix it first approach to addressing our deficient infrastructure systems, UHPC utilization can serve as a strategy for doing so. Read the full blog here.

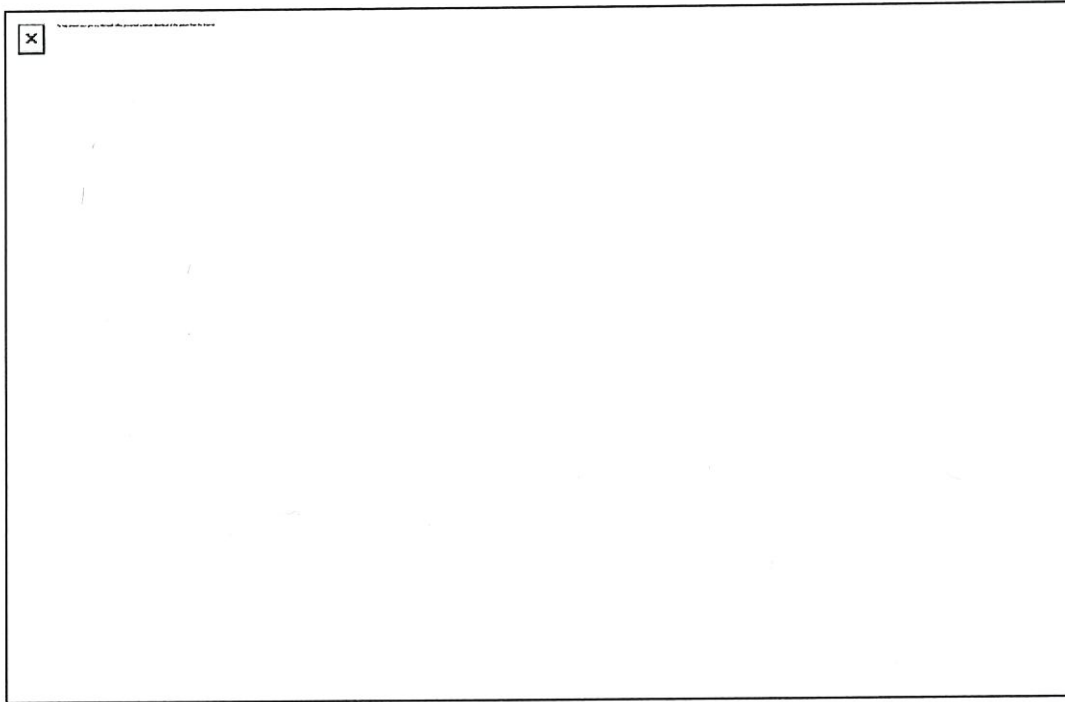

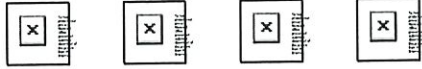

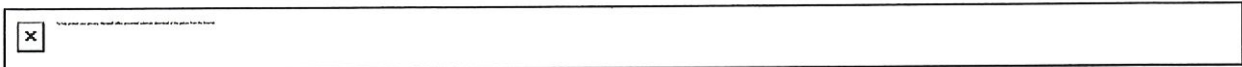

Visitors to Dayton International Airport will notice a short detour beginning Aug. 2 as the U.S. Rt. 40 improvements project continues. The following will be closed through Oct. 1:

- Access ramp from southbound Airport Terminal Drive to U.S. Rt. 40 (National Road)
- Access ramp from U.S. Rt. 40 (National Road) to northbound Airport Terminal Drive

The detour will involve Concorde Drive, Freight Drive, Cargo Road, Boeing Drive and Terminal Drive. It will be clearly marked and is expected to add less than five minutes of travel time to or from the airport.

Drivers approaching the airport via the Airport Access Road (from I-70) will not be affected by the ramp closures or detour.

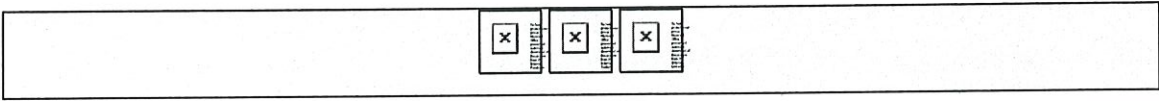
The temporary ramp closures will allow the project to be completed in a shortened time frame. The U.S. Rt. 40 improvements project will widen a portion of U.S. 40, which will create a better traffic flow to and from the airport. The project will also upgrade traffic signals and provide new, modernized ramps at the U.S. 40 airport access point.

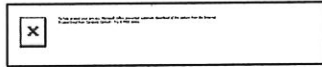

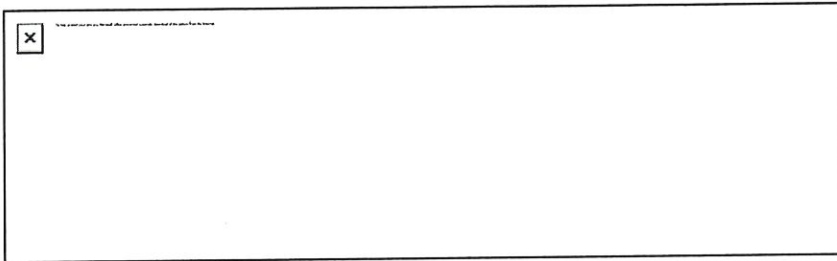

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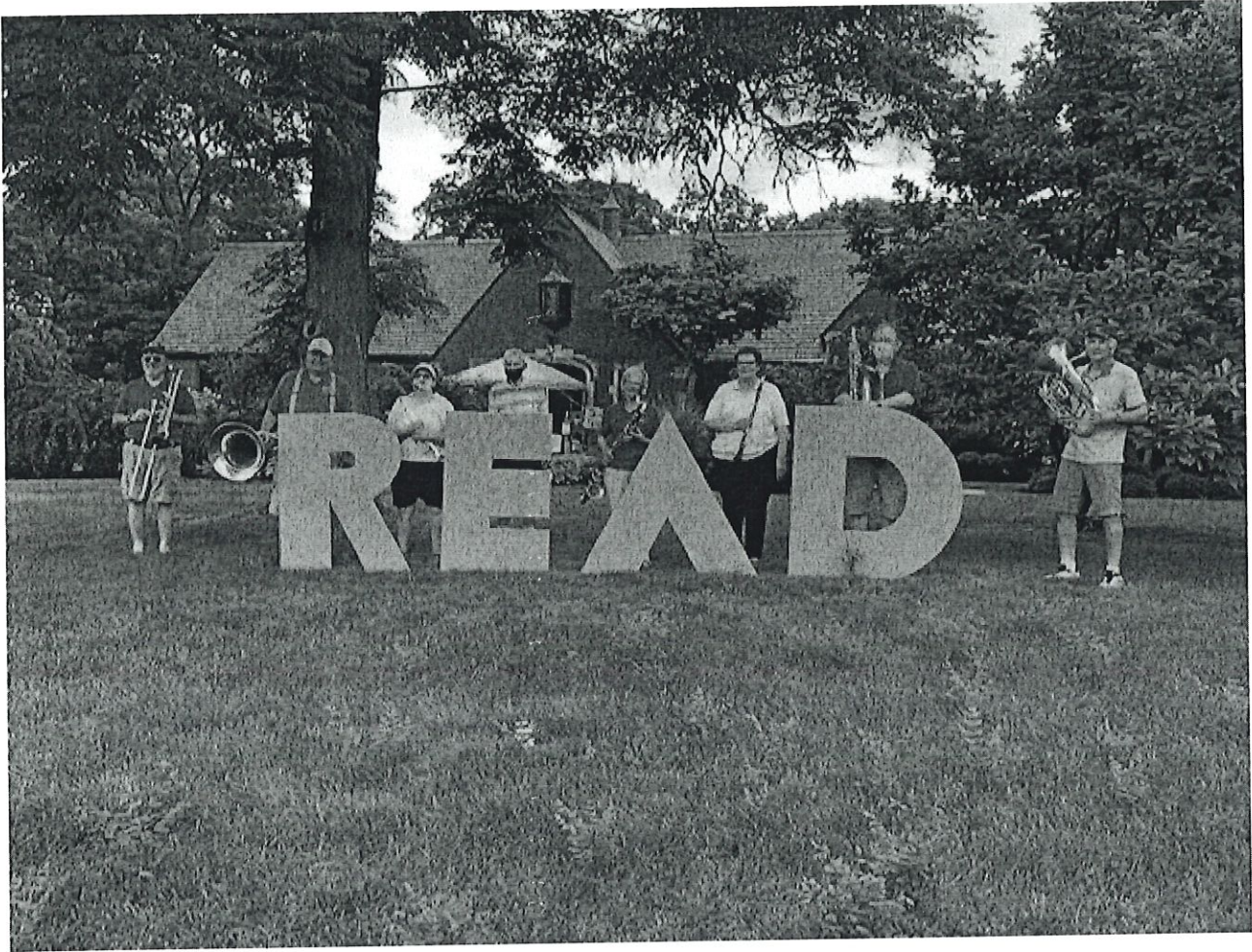
