Fyi below. My patience and "we'll work with them" approach has run its course. Bottom line... this is an important public sidewalk and we need it reopened. I intend to have Rob Jacques and Ethan Kroger meet with Thom Shrader tomorrow afternoon and give him a date certain when the city requires him to reopen the sidewalk, no exceptions. Then it becomes the contractor's job to figure out a way to finish the project without the sidewalk closure.

Below is a bullet point from my April 2, 2021 CM Newsletter.

- Jessup Wealth Management: Construction on the Jessup Wealth Management building at 35 Park Avenue began at the beginning of February, and will last for about eight more weeks. The contractor closed a section of the sidewalk in front of the building yesterday. This closure is needed to facilitate what will be a major remodel of the building frontage. The closure is expected to last about 5-6 weeks, weather permitting. Enclosed are documents showing the closure area and sidewalk signage. Representatives from Jessup visited the businesses in the immediate area to explain the need for the sidewalk closure. This project represents a \$518,000 investment in the office building.

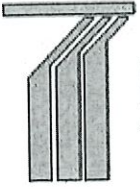

Hello Ethan,

Just a quick review and install schedule for the Jessup project. As of Friday 7-23 the stone pilasters and the Rainscreen facade covering were completed. This week the mason cleaned his work, completed the parging on the planters and removed his extra material. The limestone caps and stair treads were measured and ordered about 2 weeks ago with a lead time of 2 to 3 weeks. We were notified this week of an additional 2 week delay because of equipment breakdown at the quarry. This will delay our EFIS install until after the stone work is complete. The upside is that we may have our windows in that same time frame. We will have the awnings installed and the railings installed after the fence is removed. At this time the fence should come down the week of August 23.

 - Klopsch suggested we reach out to membership to see if they would develop a project.

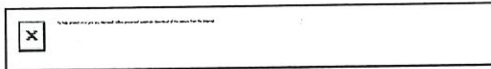

OML UPDATE AT-A-GLANCE

Here are the top three things you need to know from this past week:

• The League has the initial results from the survey we sent to our members to gauge how many municipalities are applying for American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds and how those municipalities plan to use those funds in their local communities. The League is collecting as much information as possible on how these dollars are being used in our communities so we can develop examples and “best practices” that other cities and villages across the state can access. • We want to remind our members that non-entitlement units of local government (NEUs) only have until **Saturday, September 4** to apply for their American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) allocation. The Ohio Office of Budget and Management (OBM) is reporting that more than \$140 million in payments have already gone out to applicants that were processed and approved. However, NEUs that fail to respond before the September 4 deadline will not receive their allocation and will not be eligible to apply for funding from the second tranche of ARPA funds next year. RESULTS AVAILABLE FROM LEAGUE SURVEY ON AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDS

The League has the initial results from the survey we sent to our members to gauge how many municipalities are applying for American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds and how those municipalities plan to use those funds in their local communities.

The League is seeking to collect as much information as possible on how these dollars are being used in our communities so we can develop examples and “best practices” that other cities and villages across the state can access. This will help ensure that this critical funding can be used in the most effective and responsible manner.

According to the survey data:

- 97.8% of respondents said their municipality would be applying for ARPA funds, while 2% said they would not.

Respondents indicated their ARPA funds would be allocated for the following expenses:

- 43% - water and sewer infrastructure
- 20% - capital infrastructure (new projects or improvements)
- 12% - undecided
- 11% - revenue replacement
- 9% - employee wages
- 5% - broadband

Other expenses included:

- Assistance for small businesses and 510(c)(3) organizations
- Fire, police and EMS equipment
- Cleaning supplies and expenses
- Mortgage and rental assistance
- Municipal utility bill assistance to residents

- Food assistance
- Income tax software, other software and Wi-Fi
- Police MARCS radios
- Ventilation projects
- Public health
- Resident and community assistance

We want to thank everyone who participated in the survey thus far. This data will help us understand the challenges that Ohio's cities and villages are facing in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic and how federal coronavirus relief funds are being used by municipalities to meet the needs of their community. We will continue to connect our members with webinars and other resources on ARPA local fiscal relief funds.

UPDATE ON ONEOHIO OPIOID SETTLEMENT

The League received an Opioid Settlement update yesterday. The proposed settlement is with three of the largest pharmaceutical companies. Johnson & Johnson has yet to settle. If Ohio settles, it is going to either be the first or second to settle. Both the Ohio Attorney General and the Governor are recommending the settlement. Time is of the essence with an August 13 deadline for the Attorneys to receive consents from municipalities, townships and counties over 10,000 in population.

The proposed settlement amount is approximately \$804,000,000 divided among all municipalities, townships and counties including those under 10,000 in population, paid over 18 years according to a complicated formula. The guaranteed settlement amount is 55% of the gross settlement amount. If benchmarks are met, it can reach 100% of the settlement amount.

Municipalities, townships, and counties receive distribution in two ways—individually and on a regional basis. Counties may also distribute its moneys for the benefit of municipal programs. OML/OMAA General Counsel, Garry Hunter is recommending the settlement. As soon as the OML receives the participation agreement, settlement summary which shows the projected amount your municipality will receive directly, OneOhio form, OneOhio MOU, Case Management Order, FAQ, and draft Ordinance, it will be sent to you.

Garry Hunter is recommending the signing of the participation agreement be authorized by council action. Since time is of the essence, it is recommended you call a special council meeting next week and adopted the authorizing resolution with an emergency under suspension of the rules. Further information will be forth coming by Monday, August 2.

OHIO OFFICE OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT (OBM) RELEASES UPDATE ON ONGOING NON-ENTITLEMENT UNITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT (NEU) ALLOCATIONS

The Ohio Office of Budget and Management (OBM) has released updated information on the allocation of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to non-entitlement units of local government (NEUs).

OBM has released a spreadsheet, which you can access [HERE](#), showing which NEUs have applied for their allocation of ARPA dollars thus far. More than \$140 million in payments have already gone out to applicants that were processed and approved. OBM is working with a small number of applicants that had missing or incorrect information in the portal to correct those mistakes so their payments can be processed. Additionally, no NEU that has already applied has hit the 75% of budget threshold that would require OBM to reduce their allocation.

As a reminder, the U.S. Treasury mandates a window of 60 days for the application process. NEU's have until **Saturday, September 4** to apply for ARPA funds. OBM has released a flow chart, which you can access [HERE](#), that shows what happens to the funds if NEU's decline funding or are unresponsive.

OBM will continue to provide updates as NEUs continue to apply for and receive their ARPA allocations.

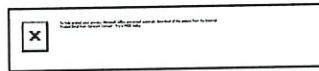
