SUBJECT: OFFICER JACK WITTER SHOOTING INVESTIGATION

COMPLAINT #17-009

During the early morning hours of June 12, 2017, Officer Jack Witter, along with his training officer, responded, to a radio call of an "In-progress" burglary at the BevMo store, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. Shortly after their arrival, Officer Witter discharged his duty weapon, one time, at the suspect's vehicle, as it drove towards him. The driver and other occupants of the vehicle were not struck and fled the area; however, they were later apprehended, by other officers, in the City of Los Angeles.

A criminal investigation was conducted and the Los Angeles County District Attorney filed charges against all three suspects that included assault with a deadly weapon upon a peace officer and attempt murder.

I conducted a thorough administrative investigation for possible policy violations that included, "Shooting at, or from a moving vehicle" and "Unreasonable and Unwarranted Force to a Person Encountered or a Person Under arrest." My findings for both allegations were, "Not-Sustained."

Based on the totality of the circumstances surrounding this incident, including my investigative findings, I believe Officer Witter would be best served by attending additional training in firearms, tactics and use of force options and decision making.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

- A. It is alleged that Officer Jack Witter violated Culver City Policy Department Policy Manual Section 300.4.1, "Shooting at or From a Moving Vehicle." Based on my investigation, the allegation that Officer Witter violated the above policy is: NOT SUSTAINED
- B. It is alleged that Officer Jack Witter violated Culver City Policy Department Policy Manual Section 322.5.4(b), "Unreasonable and Unwarranted Force to a Person Encountered or a Person Under arrest." Based on my investigation, the allegation that Officer Witter violated the above policy is: NOT SUSTAINED

INTRODUCTION AND SYNOPSIS

On June 12, 2017 at approximately 0205 hours, I received notification from Assistant Chief Iizuka that a "Non-hit" Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) occurred earlier in the evening. Assistant Chief Iizuka told me that, Officer Vince Michel #1036 and his partner, Officer Jack Witter #1153, responded to a burglary alarm call at BevMo, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard, Culver City. Officers Michel and Witter took a position to the rear of the location while Officer Mitch Weissman #861 responded to the front of the location. While Officers Michel and Witter were at the rear, a van appeared from the loading dock area and drove towards Officer Witter. Officer Witter fired one shot at the van, from his department issued duty weapon (.45 caliber Glock 21SF) that did not strike any of the suspect(s) inside the van. No one was injured as result of Officer Witter discharging his duty weapon. After the van drove past Officer Witter it continued out of the parking lot and onto southbound Hannum Avenue where other CCPD units pursued the vehicle to its final destination in the city of Los Angeles. At that location three male suspects were taken in custody for numerous violations P.C. 459 and P.C. 245(c).

Assistant Chief Iizuka advised me to respond to the station and conduct the administrative investigation.

INVESTIGATION

REVIEW OF CCPD REPORTS

CCPD Detective Ryan Thompson provided me with a copy of all of the reports related to this incident (CCPD DR# 2017-9590). I reviewed the report, which contained an initial crime report taken by Officer Mitch Weissman on the day of the incident (June 12, 2017). The report also contains Detective Thompson's follow-up investigation that included statements from Officers Steven Armenta #1131, Officer Weissman #861, Officer Michel #1036 and Officer Witter #1153. See Detective Thompson's attached report (See Attachments "A" for further).

PHOTOGRAPHS

On June 12, 2017, Forensic Technician Nicole Muller #644, responded to BevMo (5634 Sepulveda Boulevard and took photographs of the scene; including photographs of the police vehicle 1590, which Officers Michel and Witter used when this incident occurred.

At the time Forensic Technician Muller took the photographs of unit 1590 it was not in the original position it was when Officers Michel and Witter first arrived at the location. After Officer Witter fired the shot, the suspect vehicle fled the area with Officers Michel and Witter in pursuit of them. Officers Michel and Witter returned to the location and parked their vehicle near the position it was when they first arrived.

Upon reviewing the photographs Forensic Technician Muller took, I saw pictures depicting the suspect's vehicle; Depicted in those pictures I saw pieces of glass on the front passenger seat and floorboard of the van. Later that same day, I responded to the location and also took photographs of the scene. (See Attachment "B," DVD, for further).

REVIEW OF THE SCENE

This incident occurred at the rear of BevMo, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. BevMo is one of several businesses within a large lot surrounded by adjacent and adjoining businesses. Playa Street runs east/west along the north side of the lot, Hannum Avenue runs north/south along the east side, Slauson Avenue runs east/west along the south side and Sepulveda Boulevard runs north/south along the west side of the lot.

The front entrance of the business has west facing glass doors with numerous partitioned panes of glass surrounding the doors.

The rear (east side) of the business has a long driveway that runs south into the north side of the business and leads to a loading dock area that is hidden from the east side, by a large block wall. Also, within this area is a loading dock for Office Depot and a service door for BevMo.

East of BevMo's loading dock is a loading dock for Sprout's Market, which has its own block wall that separates it from BevMo's loading area. BevMo and Sprouts are adjoining businesses and east of Sprouts is Hooman Chevrolet's dealership service center. Adjacent to the loading docks and service center (north) is an area that Hooman Chevrolet parks vehicles waiting for service. See below photographs for further.

NOTICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE

Based on the seriousness of the incident that Officer Jack Witter was involved in, the decision was made to place him on paid administrative leave. On June 12, 2017, I presented Officer Witter with a "Notice of paid Administrative Leave and Related Orders," that he read and signed. (See Attachment "C" for further).

REVIEW OF SOUTH BAY REGIONAL PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS AUTHORITY CAD REPORT AND RADIO TRANSMISSIONS

On June 12, 2017, I received a copy of the CAD report and a DVD containing the radio transmissions from the South Bay Regional Public Communications Authority, also known as the "RCC." The times listed are approximates and taken from the CAD report.

Upon reviewing the report and listening to the radio transmissions, I learned that on June 12, 2017 at 00:27:27 hours Officer Weissman (4L4M) and Officers Steven Armenta and Steve Badour (4A2M) were assigned a radio call of a "459 audible at BevMo, 5640 Sepulveda Boulevard." The alarm covered the, "Right front motion, left front motion, receiving motion and receiving hall motion." At 00:28:38 Officer Weissman advised he arrived at the location. At 00:29:05 Officers Armenta and Badour advised they were responding from Washington Boulevard and Zanja Avenue. At 00:29:21 Officer Witter advised he and Officer Michel were in route from Centinela and Culver.

At 00:30:39 Officer Weissman advised a front window of the location was smashed and that the address was actually 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. At 00:30:57 Officer Witter advised they were responding Code 3 from Centinela Avenue and Jefferson Boulevard. At 00:31:20 Sergeant Bellante acknowledged the Code 3 response by Officers Michel and Witter and advised that he would also be responding to the location with an arrival time of approximately one minute.

At this point of the RCC recording there are a lot of unintelligible radio transmissions. This may have been caused by the officers talking over each other (Stepping on each other) and trying to transmit at the same time. Additionally the radio transmissions made by the officers that are on the DVD do not appear to occur in the same order as they are listed on the CAD report. This discrepancy is most likely due the fact that a dispatcher inputs the radio transmissions into the CAD system when they are able to and not always as it occurs.

At 00:31:50 Officer Weissman coordinated the call and requested one unit to respond to Hannum Avenue and take a position at the rear of the location. He also requested another unit to respond northbound Sepulveda Boulevard and cover the south side of the location.

Officer Michel advised he had arrived in the area and confirmed with Officer Weissman that he wanted him to take the rear position. At 00:31:35 Officers Gamboa and Umutyan (4A1M) advised they were in the area.

Officers Armenta and Badour advised they arrived in the area and asked Officers Michel and Witter if they should take the rear. Shortly thereafter a voice is heard, possibly Officer Michel's, advising a vehicle fled southbound. Officer Badour then advised a vehicle fled the area and they were behind the suspects who were in a westbound on the 90 freeway. Officer Michel advised that his partner fired one shot at the vehicle and that they were okay. He further advised they were in the pursuit on the westbound 90 freeway getting ready to transition to the northbound 405 freeway.

I later learned during my interview with Officer Michel, that after they were involved in the pursuit for several minutes, Officer Michel gave his cell phone to Officer Witter. He told him to call Lieutenant Lopez to find out if he wanted them to leave the pursuit and return to BevMo, which they did.

The remainder of the recording mainly consists of a lot of periods of silence and radio transmissions related to the pursuit. (See Attachments "D & E," CAD report and DVD for further details).

REVIEW OF MAV RECORDING

FILE NAME: C17-008

On June 12, 2017, I received a copy of the Mobile Audio/Video (MAV) recording from unit 1590. The entire recording is 98 minutes and 27 seconds in duration. I reviewed the recording and saw Officers Michel and Witter (4A3M) begin to respond Code 3 to the location from Centinela Avenue and Jefferson Boulevard at approximately 00:30:21 hours. They continued eastbound Jefferson Boulevard to Hannum Avenue then south on Hannum Avenue to the rear driveway of Hooman Chevrolet. There they drove west to the rear of the location (BevMo) and parked their vehicle, facing west, at approximately 00:31:45 hours.

At approximately 00:31:46 hours I could hear, what I believe were the sounds of their vehicle being placed in "Park" and the front doors of their vehicle opening. At approximately 00:31:47 I saw the suspect's vehicle drive out from the direction of the loading dock area that is concealed behind a large concrete wall and towards the officer's vehicle. At approximately 00:31:49 hours, I heard the voice of Officer Witter yell, "Stop, Stop, Stop!" At approximately 00:31:51 hours, I heard the sound of one gunshot being fired. At Approximately 00:31:52 hours, the suspect's vehicle passed by the officer's vehicle and is out of view of the MAV. At approximately 00:31:54 hours, I heard Officer Michel broadcast over the radio, "Shots fired, suspect vehicle just went, ah." At approximately 00:31:58 hours, Officer Michel began to drive out of the lot and in pursuit of the suspect vehicle.

Based on this time frame of the above described actions, approximately six seconds elapsed from the time the officers arrived on scene to the time Officer Witter discharged his duty weapon. From approximately 00:31:58 hours until 00:51:49 hours (approximately 20 minutes), Officers Michel and Witter were involved in the vehicle pursuit of the suspect. When they first returned back to BevMo at approximately 00:51:50 hours, I saw Officer Michel exit their vehicle and walk towards BevMo. I saw him look towards Officer Witter and heard him say, "Hey, get your fucking head in the game, okay, Shit." Shortly thereafter, I heard Officer Michel ask Officer Witter, "You see something? Hold on." I then heard the sound of something metal bouncing on the pavement. After that I heard Officer Michel tell Officer Witter, "You want to preserve that, okay."

From approximately 00:51:49 hours until approximately 01:23:12, when both officers' microphones stopped operating, I heard them occasionally talk to each other, saw them hold a perimeter position and walk around the rear of the location as they performed their duties. From approximately 00:52:00 hours until 01:12:10 hours both officers held a perimeter position at the northeast corner of BevMo while Officer Weissman and Officers from LAPD cleared the interior of the location. At approximately 00:57:50 hours, while holding the perimeter position with Officer Witter next to him, I heard Officer Michel tell someone, possibly over his portable radio or cell phone, that Officer Witter fired one shot at the back of the suspect's vehicle. Officer Witter said words to the effect of, "I shot at the front window, front or front passenger window." Officer Michel then relayed that information to who he was talking to on his radio.

At approximately 01:02:57 hours, while both officers were still holding their perimeter position, Officer Michel asked Officer Witter, "Did it look like you made contact with anyone in the car?" Officer Witter appeared to only shrug his shoulders and tilt his head to his right and say, "I'd like to know if I did though." At approximately 01:12:10 hours I heard an officer broadcast over the radio that the interior of BevMo was "Clear."

From approximately 01:12:10 hours I heard Officers Michel, Witter and Weissman talk about setting up crime scene tape and shutting down the area. At approximately 01:23:12 hours Officers Michel and Witter's microphones stop recording and there is no more sound on the MAV recording. At 02:08:16 the recording ends.

REVIEW OF HOOMAN CHEVROLET SURVEILLANCE VIDEO

On June 12, 2017, Detective Ivan Hernandez provided me with a DVD copy of the Hooman Chevrolet surveillance video recording. I reviewed the recording, which showed two camera angles. The first angle (Back Lot Entrance) showed a rear angle view of the incident as it occurred. At approximately 00:17 hours, a can be seen as it traveled westbound, through the lot.

The then backed into the BevMo loading dock and is momentarily out of view. The then traveled (North) out from the loading dock and (West) towards the front of the business. The gets parked in a space adjacent the front of BevMo and a person can be seen exiting the van and walking towards to the front doors of the business. A few moments later (00:26) the backed into the loading dock again, and is out of view.

At approximately 00:31:47 hours, Officers Michel and Witter can be seen as they first arrived to the rear of BevMo. They drove in from Hannum Avenue and traveled west through the lot and stopped. A few seconds later (00:31:53, I saw the front driver's side and passenger doors of their police vehicle open and Officer Witter exit the car. As this occurred, I saw the van begin to drive out from the loading dock and towards Officer Witter. I saw Officer Witter step to his right and away from their vehicle, while facing the His arms were extended out, away from his chest, and he appeared to be holding his duty weapon in both hands. The driver of the drove towards and past Officer Witter. The passed between the officer's police vehicle and a chain and pole that was set up adjacent the parked cars, near the north side of the lot. Officer Witter appeared to take a couple steps back and move to his right and out of the path of the Officer Witter continued to track the van, with his arms extended out and weapon drawn, as it drove out of the lot and onto southbound Hannum Avenue (00:31:58).

Officer Witter can be seen getting back into their police car with Officer Michel driving out of the lot and after the van.

The second angle (Back Lot PTZ) provides an overhead view of the incident. While reviewing the incident from this angle I could basically see the same actions by both officers, but just from an overhead perspective. (See Hooman DVD for further).

Later during my interview with Officer Witter, I showed him both angles of this surveillance video and asked him at what point he discharged his duty weapon, and he said he did not know. (See Attachment "G," DVD, for further)

INTERVIEWS

Officer J Witter's CCPD Criminal Investigation Interview

On June 13, 2017 at approximately 1618 hours, Detective Ryan Thompson interviewed Officer Witter. This is a summary what he said:

On June 12, 2017 at approximately 0030 hours, Officer Witter, along with his training officer, Officer Michel, responded to a radio call of "Confirmed" burglary at BevMo, 5643 Sepulveda Boulevard. Upon their arrival to the location, Officer Michel parked their vehicle to the rear of the location. Officer Witter exited their vehicle and shortly thereafter saw a (Suspect's vehicle) begin to drive towards him. Officer Witter believed he had nowhere to go to get out of the vehicle's path to avoid being run over.

Officer Witter gave several commands for the driver to stop the to avail. In fear for his life, Officer Witter fired one shot at the driver of the vehicle, at some point when it drove towards him. Officer Witter was unsure if he struck the driver or the with the shot he fired. After the eff the lot, he got back into the front passenger seat of their police vehicle and Officer Michel went in pursuit of the (See Attachment "A" for further).

Officer Jack Witter's Internal Interview

On June 12, 2017, I met with Officer Witter and his attorney, Kimberly Riley and served him with a Letter of Intent to Interview, which he signed in my presence (See Attachment "H" for further).

On June 13, 2017 at approximately 1330 hours, I and Lieutenant Manuel Cid interviewed Officer Witter in the Administrative Conference Room located on the second floor of the police station. Officer Witter was accompanied by his legal representative, Kimberly Riley, who was present for the entire interview. I completed the Personnel Investigation Checklist with Officer Witter (See Attachment "I" for further). The interview was recorded (audio) and the following is a summary of what was said:

Officer Witter graduated the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Academy Class #420, on May 5, 2017. He had been assigned to the Operations Bureau as a patrol officer for approximately three weeks when this incident occurred and his field training officer was Officer Vince Michel.

On Sunday June 11, 2017, Officer Witter worked his scheduled morning watch shift with Officer Michel, who was also worked his scheduled morning watch shift. They were assigned to district three and their unit designation was 4A3M. (See Attachment "J," Line up for further).

Officer Witter remembered, at approximately 00:30 hours, responding to a radio call of a "Confirmed" burglary at BevMo, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. He said that Officer Weissman (4L4M) arrived at the location first and they were second on scene. Officer Weissman directed them to take a position to the rear of BevMo. He said having the information that the situation was a "Confirmed" burglary heightened his sense of awareness and elevated the severity of the circumstances.

Officer Witter said within seconds of their arrival to the location, he exited their vehicle and saw a drive out from behind the BevMo loading dock area. He said the drove directly towards him and Officer Michel.

As Officer Witter explained this part of the incident and what occurred he became very emotional and began to cry.

Officer Witter said he was standing directly in front of the said as it drove towards him, and he loudly yelled, "Stop" three or four times. He hoped that the would stop, but it did not, but instead sped up. He hoped that his commands would have worked, but they didn't. It was at that moment, when the driver of the failed to yield to his commands that he believed his safety was threatened.

He believed he was in a "Tight" position and knew he couldn't move backward, because their police vehicle was behind him and he couldn't move further to the right, because that would've put him further in the path of the and he would've gotten hit. Officer Witter believed he exhausted all of his options to escape and he had nowhere to go, so he aimed his duty weapon at the driver of the and fired one shot at him. He said he discharged his duty weapon with the intent to stop the driver of the his own life. He did not know exactly when he discharged his duty weapon or if he struck anything, because everything happened so quickly. After Officer Witter discharged his duty weapon the fled out of the lot. He got back into their police vehicle and Officer Michel went in pursuit of the along with other police units. He said for the next five to ten minutes he just sat in the passenger seat, scared, and didn't say much. He thought about the severity of the incident he just experienced and was thankful that he was still alive. He knew there was a lot going on. but with everything that just happened he was shaking. After a short period of time Officers Michel and Witter were called to respond back to BeyMo to help secure the location with Officer Weissman who was still on scene. Shortly after they arrived back at BevMo, other officers (LAPD) arrived and cleared the inside of the location while he and Officer Michel held a position on the perimeter. Officer Witter said after the business was cleared Lieutenant Lopez arrived and he provided a public safety statement to him. Lieutenant Lopez also checked his duty weapon and counted how many rounds he had left in his magazines. Officer Witter believed he first saw the saw as he exited their police vehicle, and that the entire incident lasted approximately five to ten seconds. He remembered that his weapon was already drawn, because of the severity of the situation. He said based on his academy training he learned that burglaries are violent, dangerous crimes, and that suspects are often armed. He said he was holding his duty weapon because he wanted to be ready in case armed suspects appeared and tried to assault them. Officer Witter could not remember how many people were in the but could say they were "African American." He believed the occupants of the were probably the burglary suspects based on the manner in which they drove at him with the intent to kill him. He believed the van was approximately "Three car lengths" out in front of him and that he was approximately one arm's length away from his police vehicle when the at him. He was not sure how far away from the he was as it drove past him. Officer Witter estimated that the was traveling at approximately thirty miles per hour when it began to drive towards him and estimated that approximately two to seven seconds elapsed from the time he first saw the until it was within close proximity to

Officer Witter said he knew the policy section on shooting at vehicles before this incident occurred and was comfortable with his knowledge of the policy. He basically explained that the policy stated it was discouraged to shoot at or from a moving vehicle because it was ineffective.

And that other options should be considered before discharging a firearm at a vehicle or its occupants and that an officer should never shoot to disable a vehicle.

I then showed Officer Witter a copy of policy section 300.4.1, "Shooting at or from moving vehicles," which he read aloud (See Attachment "K" for details). He was then asked while having the policy in mind, if he believed his actions were within the policy, when he discharged his duty weapon given the circumstances he was confronted with and if so, why.

Officer Witter basically said he believed his actions were within policy because everything happened so fast and that he did not have any other way to get out of the path of the van. He was in fear for his life and believed he had no other option, but to discharge his duty weapon at the driver of the

Using a laptop computer, we showed Officer Witter the MAV recording taken from the vehicle (1590) he and Officer Michel used that night. This would be the second time he viewed the video; the first time he saw it was on the day of the incident.

The recording basically begins with Officer Michel driving Code 3 to BevMo. Officer Witter said he had no recollection of responding Code 3 or the route they took to the location. As the recording continued Officer Witter recognized the rear of BevMo and remembered the surroundings and where the drove at him from. He recognized the sound of his voice and the command, "Stop," that he yelled at the driver of the

While playing back the MAV recording on the laptop, the sound and video were out of sync with each other. After several unsuccessful attempts at trying to get the recording in sync, we stopped playing the MAV recording and moved on to the Hooman Chevrolet surveillance video recording.

The Hooman Chevrolet video recording has two camera angles of footage. We first had Officer Witter view the overhead camera angle, marked, "12. Back Lot PTZ." As Officer Witter viewed the video he identified himself and said at the point when he exited their police vehicle is when he first he saw the suspect's He knew this because the light on his duty weapon was illuminated. We slowly played the recording (frame by frame) and back and forth several times. Within the time frame of, 12:31:56, but more towards the end of that one second time frame, is when Officer Witter believed is the point when he discharged his duty weapon at the suspect's vehicle.

During the above-mentioned, one second time frame (12:31:56), when Officer Witter described that he believed is when he discharged his duty weapon, his body is facing the window of the front passenger side door.

We then showed Officer Witter the rear camera angle marked, "10. Back Lot Entrance." Officer Witter identified himself within this recording and again basically said that at approximately the point when he exited his police vehicle is about when he first saw the suspect's Based on the angle of this video recording, Officer Witter was unable to describe his actions. He saw the suspect's vehicle drive at him, and said he had no other options available to him except to discharge his duty weapon to prevent from being struck by the suspect's vehicle.

I basically concluded the interview by asking Officer Witter if there was anything he would've done differently if he had the opportunity to respond to the same situation all over again and he said he would do everything the same.

Officer Vince Michel #1036

On Monday June 19, 2017 at approximately 0500 hours, I interviewed Officer Vince Michel in my office. Because Officer Michel was Officer Witter's training officer and involved with the incident, I read him the Department Investigation Checklist, but only advised him of the Lybarger Warning and not the Miranda Warning. Officer Michel said he understood the checklist and signed it in my presence (See attachment #11). I audio recorded the interview and this is a summary of what was said:

Officer Michel has been a police officer for approximately nine and one half years. He has been assigned to the Operations Bureau as a patrol officer, the Investigations Division as a Crime Impact Team Detective, a member of the Gang Intelligence Unit as well as a field training officer (FTO) on two occasions. He is currently assigned to the Operations Bureau as a field training officer and has been assigned as such for approximately six to eight months.

On June 11, 2017, Officer Michel was assigned to train Officer Jack Witter and had been doing so for approximately three weeks when this incident occurred. Their shift started on Sunday June 11, 2017 at 1900 hours and was scheduled to end at 0730 hours on June 12th. They were assigned to district three as 4A3M and used a marked black and white police vehicle (Unit 1590), which Officer Michel drove during the shift. At approximately 0030 hours Officer Michel heard a radio call being assigned to Officer Weissman (4L4M) to respond to BevMo, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. He said the coverage included the front glass break and several other activations inside the business. Officer Weissman was the primary unit assigned to the call, but Officer Michel started to respond to BevMo once he heard all of the alarm activations. Due to all of the alarm activations at the location, Officer Michel believed the business had been burglarized. He was aware that a BevMo in Manhattan Beach had been burglarized in May 2017 and the Watch was since asked to extra patrol the Culver City location.

They (4A3M) initially responded from Centinela Avenue and Washington Place, but upgraded their response to Code 3 at Centinela Avenue and Jefferson Boulevard when Officer Weissman advised that the front window of the location was broken. Officer Michel drove Code 3 to approximately Sepulveda Boulevard and Playa Street and turned off all of his vehicle's lights and siren (blacked out) and asked Officer Weissman where he wanted them to respond to on the perimeter. Officer Weissman told them to take a position to the rear of the location. Officer Michel knew where the rear door was and was familiar with the business because he had previously responded there for alarms calls in the past.

He drove down Hannum Avenue, entered the lot from the Hannum Avenue entrance, shut down his vehicle, put his keys on his belt and began to remove his patrol rifle from its rack; all while still seated in the vehicle. Their vehicle was facing towards Sepulveda Boulevard (west) and they were approximately 20 - 30 feet away from BevMo's loading dock concrete wall. Officer Michel stopped there to provide concealment and cover as they exited their vehicle.

I asked Officer Michel if while in route to the location if he gave Officer Witter any direction on what he should do upon their arrival or if he talked to him about tactical considerations before arriving, and he said he didn't recall. Officer Michel said after he turned off their vehicle. Officer Witter exited the car and began to walk towards the loading dock area. He said Officer Witter left his door open and walked to about where the vehicle's front bumper was (approximately 4 feet), while holding his duty weapon in his hands. Officer Michel said while he was trying to remove his rifle from the rack, he drive out from behind the loading dock area and directly suddenly saw a towards them. Officer Michel believed he yelled at Officer Witter to get back in their car and heard the suspect's vehicle begin to accelerate. Officer Michel believed there were only a few feet for the to pass by them and thought the was going to hit their car or run over Officer Witter. He knew that Officer Witter was standing somewhere between their vehicle's front bumper and the front passenger door of their vehicle. He heard Officer Witter yell, "Stop, police, stop," as he backed up and then heard the sound of a gunshot. He estimated the suspect drove the past them at approximately 20-40miles per hour. Officer Michel made eye contact with the driver of the and described him as a male Black with light complexion, but he could not remember if anyone else was in the Officer Michel did not see Officer Witter discharge his duty weapon, but believed he fired the shot at the when it was next to their police vehicle, or as it was almost past their vehicle. Officer Michel estimated that approximately 10 seconds passed from the time they arrived to the rear of the location until he heard Officer Witter discharge his duty weapon.

Once the passed them, Officer Michel asked Officer Witter if he was okay and told him to get in the car so they could pursue the Officer Michel said Officer Witter told him he was okay and that he thought the was going to hit him. Officer Michel saw that Officer Witter was visibly shaken and they did not say much to each other while they were in the pursuit. They stayed in the pursuit for several minutes until they were told by Lieutenant Lopez (via cellphone) to return to BevMo preserve the crime scene with Officer Weissman.

Officer Michel believed they were gone from BevMo for approximately 8-10 minutes until they arrived back at the scene. Upon their return to BevMo, Officer Witter exited their vehicle and accidently kicked the expended shell casing that was left on the ground from when he discharged his duty weapon at the the took a perimeter position at the northeast corner of the business until other officers cleared the interior of the

location. Once the inside was clear, they set up crime scene tape and waited to be relieved from their position.

At this point in my interview with Officer Michel I turned off my audio recorder and we drove to BevMo to conduct a walk-through of area.

Upon our arrival to the rear of BevMo, Officer Michel attempted to park his vehicle in the same position it was on the night of the incident. I measured (9 paces) approximately 27 feet from the front of the police vehicle to the edge of the brick loading dock wall where the suspect vehicle was seen driving from. Officer Michel said the drove out from behind the wall at an "Arch" towards their vehicle. He remembered poles connected to a chain on the opposite side of their vehicle as well as cars from the automobile dealership parked in the lot. I measured (approximately 3 paces) approximately nine to ten feet of space between their car, the poles with chains and the dealership vehicles that were parked in the same area on the night of the incident. I took several photographs of the scene while I was there. (See Attachment "M," DVD, for further).

Officer Michel showed me where he stood on the perimeter (northeast corner of BevMo) and where Officer Weissman stood (northwest corner of BevMo). He told me that while they were out there he and Officer Weissman spoke on their cellphones, because the radio traffic was very busy.

Officer Michel then re-positioned his vehicle to show me where he believed he parked it when he returned to the area after being in the pursuit. This time he parked his vehicle further away (east) from the BevMo loading dock wall and closer (south) to the entrance gate of Hooman Chevrolet service department. At this point I concluded the walk-through of the scene and we returned to the station.

Once back in my office I asked Officer Michel if there was anything else he could tell me that would help me with my investigation. Officer Michel added that Officer Witter was really shaken up and that everything happened so quickly. I reminded Officer Michel not talk to anyone about my interview with him and then concluded my interview with him. (See Attachment "N," DVD for further).

Lieutenant Leon Lopez # 879

On Tuesday June 20, 2017 at approximately 0645 hours, I interviewed Lieutenant Leon Lopez in my office. I recorded the interview and this is a summary of what was said:

Lieutenant Lopez said he was working his morning watch patrol shift on June 11, 2017. He remembered sometime during the shift hearing a radio call broadcasted for Officer Weissman (4L4M) to respond to a burglary alarm call, with multiple sensor activations, at BevMo, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. He said Officer Weissman was close by and arrived first at the location and approached from the front.

Officer Weissman quickly advised that he saw a broken window at the front of the business and began to set up a perimeter. The next unit on scene was Officers Michel and Witter (4A3M) who approached from the business from the rear. As other officers were responding to the location, Officer Michel advised that a vehicle was fleeing the area and a gunshot had been fired. At that point the other responding officers went in pursuit of the fleeing vehicle.

Lieutenant Lopez responded to BevMo approximately forty-five minutes to one hour after Officer Michel stated a shot had been fired. Lieutenant Lopez spoke to Officers Michel and Witter and learned that Officer Witter had discharged his duty weapon at the suspect's vehicle. He obtained a "Public Safety" statement from Officer Witter and inspected his duty weapon, to confirm that he only fired his weapon one time.

Per my request on June 12, 2017, Lieutenant Lopez completed an Interdepartmental Correspondence (IDC) detailing his contact with Officer Witter after this incident occurred (See Attachment "O" for details).

Lieutenant Lopez directed the officers to start preserving the scene by marking the location of the expended shell casing. He then transported Officer Witter to the police station and left Officer Michel behind to assist with maintaining security of the scene.

I asked Lieutenant Lopez to describe Officer Witter's demeanor and how he was while he talked to him. Lieutenant Lopez described him as being, "In shock" and 'Out of sorts." He said Officer Witter was able to answer his "Public Safety" related questions without much of a problem and that he (Officer Witter) had a lot of questions about the subsequent investigative process that was going to occur.

Once at the station Lieutenant Lopez made notifications to members of the Command Staff and called surrounding police agencies for assistance with searching BevMo and answering radio calls for service.

I asked Lieutenant Lopez if there was anything else he could tell me that would help me with my investigation and he said there was not. I concluded my interview with Lieutenant Lopez by advising him not to talk to anyone about this interview. (See Attachment "P," DVD, for further)

Officer Mitch Weissman #861

On June 21, 2017 at approximately 0600 hours, I interviewed Officer Mitch Weissman #861 in my office, regarding this incident. I recorded the interview and this is a summary of what was said:

At the time of incident, Officer Weissman was assigned to the Operations Bureau as a patrol officer on the morning watch shift. On June 11, 2017 Officer Weissman worked his scheduled shift from 1900 to 0730 hours and was assigned to district three, with a call

sign of 4L3M. During that shift he received a radio call of a burglary alarm, with multiple activations, at BevMo, 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard. He was originally the only unit assigned the call and responded from the area of Berryman Avenue and Segrell Way. He arrived to the front of BevMo within approximately one minute of receiving the call and upon his arrival saw that the front window of the business was smashed. He advised his observations to dispatch (RCC) and requested additional officers to respond and set up a perimeter. Officers Michel and Witter (4A3M) arrived in the area within approximately one minute after he said that the front window was smashed. They were the first unit in the area and officer Weissman requested they take a position to the rear (east side) of the location. Shortly after Officers Michel and Witter's arrival to the rear of the location, Officer Weissman heard Officer Witter yell, "Stop," a couple of times and the sounds of screeching tires, "like a car peeling out real quick." He then heard the sound of a gunshot and Officer Michel's radio transmission stating that a shot had been fired and that they were in pursuit.

Officer Weissman maintained his position at the front of the location in case there were still suspects inside.

He waited there until officers from the Los Angeles Police Department arrived and for Officers Michel and Witter to return; so he could assist with clearing the inside of the business.

Officer Weisman did not see Officer Witter discharge his duty weapon, but believed he (Officer Witter) did because of what Officer Michel said over the radio about a shot being fired.

After the inside of the business was cleared; Officer Weissman briefly spoke to Officer Witter while he (Officer Weissman) and Officer Michel set up crime scene tape. Officer Weissman saw that Officer Witter paced around a lot and that he seemed, "Antsy" and appeared visibly concerned and nervous. Shortly thereafter, Lieutenant Lopez arrived at the scene and transported Officer Witter to the police station.

I concluded my interview with Officer Weissman by ordering him to not talk about the interview with anyone. (See Attachment "Q," DVD, for further).

CRIMINAL CHARGES FILED AGAINST SUSPECTS

On June 14, 2017 Detective Ryan Thompson presented this case against suspects, Sheon James, David Banks and Tyrone Woods to the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office, for consideration of charges to be filed against them. The district attorney filed the following charges:

- 1. A violation of penal code section 245(c), assault upon a peace officer (Officer Witter). (Sheon Banks only)
- 2. A violation of vehicle code section 2800.2, felony evading of a peace officer.
- 3. A violation of penal code section 459, in the second degree.

- 4. A violation penal code 487(a), grand theft.
- 5. A violation of penal code section 1489a) (1), delaying, resisting a peace officer.
- 6. On June 28, 2017 a violation of penal code 664/187(a), attempt murder was added to all four of the suspect's charges. (No filing sheet available for this new charge) (See attachment "R" for details)

CONCLUSION

Based on my investigation, there is insufficient evidence that Officer Jack Witter committed violations of the Department's policies pertaining to shooting at or from a moving vehicle and use of excessive force, for the following reasons:

Officer Witter and his training officer, Officer Michel responded, Code 3, to what Officer Witter believed was a "Confirmed" burglary that just occurred. Officer Witter believed he was responding to a dangerous situation with possible armed suspects still at the location. His sense of awareness and emotions were heightened by the circumstances surrounding the call, coupled with the Code 3 response. I believe given Officer Witter's tenure in the field training program up to that date, that his tactics and actions were reasonable for the circumstances he was confronted with at the time.

Based on the MAV recording and Hooman Chevrolet surveillance footage, coupled with Officer Witter's statement, it is unclear exactly when Officer Witter discharged his duty weapon at the suspect's vehicle. Within approximately two seconds from the time he arrived at the location he saw the suspect vehicle begin to drive towards him, causing him to fear for his life. Within approximately four more seconds, the driver of the failed to yield to Officer Witter's commands to stop. This caused Officer Witter to experience greater concern and fear for his safety, as well as for the safety of Officer Michel.

When Officer Witter stepped to his right, he was stepping to get around the open door of his police vehicle. He was going to start approaching the rear of the business and his actions were not with the intent of putting himself in front of the moving van. It just happened that as Officer Witter was stepping around the open door of his vehicle that the suspect's vehicle appeared at the same time and the driver began driving at him.

The fear that Officer Witter described he experienced, along with the fact that he believed he had nowhere to escape from the van that was moving towards him with the intent to kill him, forced him to discharge his duty weapon at the driver in order to save his life. Officer Witter's state of mind was such that he feared for his life and the safety of Officer Michel, and he discharged his duty weapon with the intent to stop the driver from killing him and possibly Officer Michel.

NARRATIVE

On 06/12/2017 at approximately 0027 hours, I (Officer Weissman # 861) received a radio call of a 459 audible alarm, with multiple motion activations at BEVMO, located at 5634 Sepulveda Blvd.

I arrived on scene approximately one minute after the call was dispatched. As I approached the front of the store, I observed a front window, adjacent to left side of the front door, approximately 3ft in length and 2ft in width had been broken. I immediately notified dispatch of the glass break and began setting up a perimeter.

I had 4A3M (Officer's Michele # 1036 and Witter #1153 enter off of Hannum Ave to observe the rear of the location. It was at that time I heard, what appeared to be Officer Michele ye Iling commands to stop and then tires screeching. I then heard, what appeared to be a single gunshot. Officers then went in pursuit of the suspect vehicle while I secured the front of the location.

At approximately 0055 hours, LAPD SGT Kasbean #34871 (Pacific Division) arrived on scene with additional LAPD Officers to assist in clearing and securing the business without incident.

NARRATIVE

FOLLOW UP INVESTIGATION / DET. THOMPSON #870

On 06/12/17 at approximately 0125 hours, I (Det. Thompson #870) received a phone call at home from Lt. Lopez, who requested I respond to CCPD to investigate a an officer involved shooting, which took place following a burglary at Bevmo, located at 5634 Sepulveda Blvd, along with a lengthy police pursuit.

I arrived at CCPD at approximately 0240 hours, and met with Lt. Lopez, who told me that three suspects had been arrested following the pursuit which terminated in the area of 2914 Jefferson Blvd, Los Angeles.

Lt. Lopez told me that CCPD Officers had received a radio call of a burglary alarm at Bevmo. Upon arriving at Bevmo, the suspect vehicle drove toward a CCPD Officer (Ofc. Witter), almost striking him with the vehicle when an officer involved shooting occurred resulting in no one being struck. Following the shooting, CCPD pursued the suspect vehicle for about seventeen miles, until the pursuit terminated in the area of 2914 Jefferson Blvd, Los Angeles (LAPD Jurisdiction).

OFC. ARMENTA - VEHICLE PURSUIT / ARREST

At approximately 0030 hours, Officer Armenta #1131 and Officer Badour #1147 arrived in the area of Bevmo. As they approached the rear of Hooman Chevrolet (6101 Slauson Avenue) they observed a traveling at a high rate of speed from behind Bevmo, onto southbound Hannum Avenue. Believing that the vehicle was involved in the aforementioned burglary, Officer Armenta maneuvered his vehicle behind the aforementioned The proceeded southbound on Hannum Avenue and made an eastbound turn onto Slauson Avenue through a stale red light, a violation of VC 21453(a). At this time Officer Armenta who was driving a marked black and white police vehicle activated his overhead rotating lights and siren (which remained activated for the duration of the pursuit).

The vehicle continued eastbound on Slauson Avenue making a right hand turn onto the SR-90 West freeway. The vehicle traveled westbound on the SR-90 in the number two lane at approximately 95 MPH and then veered right onto the I-405 N on ramp, still traveling approximately 95 MPH. The vehicle continued northbound on the I-405 at a speed of approximately 115 MPH in the number four lane of traffic as it approached the Culver Boulevard off ramp. The vehicle veered right onto the Culver Boulevard off ramp, weaving across traffic at speeds of approximately 120 MPH, a violation of VC 22350(a), unsafe speed.

The vehicle continued on the northbound off ramp and proceeded through the intersection of the off ramp and Culver Boulevard at approximately 80 MPH against a stale red light, a violation of CVC 21453(a). The vehicle then reentered the I-405 N on ramp and merged into the number four lane of traffic at approximately 90 MPH. At the time of the pursuit there were several vehicles traveling northbound on the I-405 at the legal posted speed limit. The vehicle merged right onto the Venice Boulevard/ Washington Boulevard off ramp at approximately 95 MPH. As the vehicle approached Sepulveda Boulevard, it made a right hand turn onto southbound Sepulveda Boulevard at approximately 50 MPH, failing to stop for the stale red

light. The vehicle continued southbound on Sepulveda Boulevard and began traveling southbound at approximately 60 MPH, in the northbound lanes of oncoming traffic as it continued southbound passed Washington Boulevard, a violation of VC21650. As the vehicle approached a stale red light at the intersection of Sepulveda Boulevard and Culver Boulevard it proceeded through the intersection and made an eastbound turn onto Culver Boulevard at approximately 54 MPH. At this time Sergeant Bellante #886 joined the pursuit and broadcasted it for its duration.

The vehicle continued eastbound on Culver Boulevard and made a southbound turn onto Coombs Avenue at approximately 45 MPH. The vehicle continued southbound on Coombs Avenue at approximately 55 MPH through a posted stop sign at Wagner Street without making any attempt to slow at the intersection. As the vehicle continued southbound at approximately 55 MPH, it once again proceeded through a posted stop sign, a violation of CVC 24250(a), at Barman Avenue, without slowing at the intersection. The vehicle failed to stop at several posted stop signs it passed through the intersections of Braddock Drive, Garfield Avenue, and Franklin Avenue.

The vehicle made a right hand turn onto Farragut Avenue through the stop sign without stopping and continued westbound on Farragut Avenue towards Elenda Street at approximately 45 MPH. The vehicle turned northbound onto Elenda Street without stopping at the posted stop sign at approximately 45 MPH. As the vehicle continued northbound on Elenda Avenue at approximately 45 MPH, it drove through the posted stop sign at Braddock Drive. The vehicle continued northbound through a solid red light at Culver Boulevard at approximately 45 MPH.

The vehicle made an eastbound turn onto Culver Boulevard from Elenda Street at approximately 40 MPH through a stale red light. The vehicle made an immediate left turn onto Girard Avenue and proceeded through a posted stop sign at the intersection of Matteson Avenue at approximately 40 MPH without slowing or stopping. As the vehicle approached the intersection at Venice Boulevard at approximately 50 MPH, it continued through a stale red traffic light, nearly colliding with two pedestrians on the north crosswalk of Venice Boulevard. The vehicle continued northbound on Midvale Avenue at approximately 45 MPH and made an eastbound turn onto Charnock Avenue at approximately 45 MPH. The vehicle continued through the stale red light at Overland Avenue and made a northbound turn onto Overland Avenue, and accelerated northbound at approximately 85 MPH. The vehicle continued northbound through the intersection of National Boulevard and made a right turn onto the I-10 E on ramp at approximately 50 MPH.

The vehicle traveled eastbound at approximately 80 MPH in the number two lane. As the vehicle approached the Robertson Boulevard it began swerving through lanes of traffic, passed eastbound traffic at approximately 110 MPH. The vehicle continued eastbound and continued swerving through lanes of traffic at approximately 100 MPH. As the vehicle traveled eastbound, approaching the La Brea Avenue off ramp, it was traveling approximately 115 MPH. The vehicle continued swerving through lanes of traffic and exited the freeway at the Crenshaw Boulevard off ramp at approximately 95 MPH. The vehicle continued through the solid red light at Crenshaw Boulevard at approximately 50 MPH (nearly rear ending vehicles stopped at the red light) and reentered the I-10 E on ramp. The vehicle continued eastbound on the I10 freeway at approximately 100 MPH in the number four lane.

As the vehicle approached the Arlington Avenue off ramp, it changed lanes and went around vehicles in the number four and number three lanes. The vehicle then merged back into the number five lane of traffic and exited the freeway at Arlington Avenue at approximately 80 MPH. The vehicle made a northbound turn onto Arlington Avenue through a stale red light at approximately 55 MPH. The vehicle continued northbound on Arlington Avenue at approximately 60 MPH and made a westbound turn onto 17^{th} Street. The vehicle continued westbound through a posted stop sign at the intersection of 4^{th} avenue at approximately 50 MPH without stopping or slowing. The vehicle continued through an additional posted stop sign at 6^{th} Avenue at

approximately 40 MPH, without slowing or stopping. The vehicle made southbound turn onto 7th Street through the posted stop sign without stopping or slowing at approximately 40 MPH. The vehicle continued southbound on 7th Street and continued through the stop sign at the intersection Washington Boulevard before making an eastbound turn onto Washington Boulevard at approximately 40 MPH. The vehicle made a southbound turn onto 6th Avenue at approximately 45 MPH.

As the vehicle continued southbound on 6th Avenue, the rear occupant began throwing what appeared to be glass bottles out of the rear door of the van. The vehicle continued southbound through the posted stop sign at the intersection of 25th Street at approximately 60 MPH.

The vehicle continued southbound on 6th Avenue and proceeded through a stale red light at Adams Boulevard. The vehicle made a right turn onto Adams Boulevard and then an immediate southbound turn onto 7th Avenue. As the vehicle approached Montclair Street at 40 MPH, it made a westbound turn onto Montclair Street without stopping or slowing at the posted stop sign at the intersection. The vehicle continued westbound on Montclair Avenue at approximately 45 MPH and made a southbound turn onto 10th Avenue at approximately 35 MPH through the posted stop sign without slowing or stopping. As the vehicle continued southbound at 35 MPH, it made a westbound turn onto 30th Street through the posted stop sign without slowing or stopping. The vehicle continued to travel through the surrounding residential neighborhood at speeds of approximately 40 MPH without slowing at intersections or stopping for posted stop signs. As the vehicle traveled southbound on 9th street, it made a westbound turn onto Jefferson Boulevard and drove into the driveway of an apartment building located at 2910 Jefferson Boulevard. Officer Armenta followed the vehicle into the driveway and collided with the rear end of the vehicle at approximately 10 MPH as the vehicle came to a stop. Officer Armenta and Officer Badour observed three male black subjects flee from the vehicle and run westbound away from the vehicle.

Officer Armenta observed one subject (later identified as Sheon James) exit the driver seat of the vehicle and jump a wrought iron fence which is adjacent to 2914 Jefferson Boulevard. James was wearing a black ski mask, a black shirt and dark colored pants. Sergeant Bellante (who was positioned west of the location) observed James jump on top a trailer and then onto the roof of the 2914 Jefferson Boulevard. James was later located on the roof of that business by LAPD Air-3. LAPD Air-3 ordered James to exit the roof and he was taken into custody without incident.

Officers Gamboa and Umutyan conducted an article search on top of the roof James was located at. Under an air conditioning vent, Officers Umutyan and Gamboa located the following items:

- -Black ski mask
- -(1) pair of black gloves
- -Black wallet containing: CDL card in the name of Sheon James (#A9858814) and other miscellaneous credit/debit cards and \$31 in U.S. currency
- -Head band Flash light
- -Bluetooth earpiece

At CCPD Officers Umutyan and Gamboa booked the above listed items into property as evidence.

It should be noted that one of the suspect's seen burglarizing Bevmo wore what appeared to be a black ski mask and gloves covering both hands.

While the Officers were preparing to contact Sheon on the roof, LAPD Air-3 notified CCPD units that they located a third subject lying on the ground between two nearby buildings. Officer Armenta, Officer Umutyan, Officer Gamboa and Sergeant Bellante contacted the subject (later identified as David Banks) and ordered him to exit the location. Banks was subsequently taken into custody without incident.

The entire vehicle pursuit lasted approximately seventeen minutes and traveled a distance of about fifteen miles. The pursuit in its entirety was captured on Officer Armenta's MAV system.

TYRONE WOODS USE OF FORCE/ARREST


After the termination of the pursuit, Officers Umutyan #1110, and Gamboa #1083 located a subject (later identified as Tyrone Woods DOB: 3/5/76) hiding inside of a large trash bin to the rear 2910 W Jefferson Blvd. Officers Gamboa, Umutyan, and Badour # 1147, ordered Woods out of the trash bin, however he did not comply.

Upon opening the trash bin Officers saw Woods facing down inside the trash can and upon seeing the Officers, Woods began reaching into his waistband. It should be noted that during the vehicle pursuit, information was broadcasted that a gun shot was possibly discharged from the suspect vehicle. Fearing that Woods was possibly armed with a firearm, Officer Umutyan delivered approximately five strikes to Woods' upper torso. Again, they continued to give Woods multiple commands to remove his hands from his waistband and place his hands up, however he did not comply. Officer Gamboa then delivered approximately 5 strikes to Woods' back torso. Officers Gamboa, Umutyan, and Badour then used their combined strength to remove Woods from the trash bin and onto the ground.

Woods then turned onto his stomach as Officer Badour attempted to grab Woods' arm and place it behind his back. Woods continued to tense up his arms and would bring them down towards his waistband area. Fearing that Woods was still attempting to arm himself with a firearm Officer Umutyan delivered approximately four knees to Woods' upper right torso.

At that time Woods finally stopped resisting and Officers Gamboa and Umutyan were able to take control of Woods' hands and place them behind his back, where he was handcuffed without further incident. While conducting a search of Woods' person Officer Umutyan removed a White Samsung (Unknown IMEI) from his front right pocket. Officer Umutyan later provided me with the white Samsung cell phone.

DETECTIVE OBSERVATIONS



When I arrived at 2914 Jefferson Blvd, Woods and Banks were both seated in the backseat of Ofc. Umutyan and Ofc. Gamboa's police vehicle. Banks was transported to CCPD where he was booked for PC 459, with the approval of Lt. Lopez.

Woods asked Ofc. Armenta if he had located his phone, when Ofc. Armenta showed him the white Samsung cell phone which had been recovered from his person. Woods identified the phone as belonging to him and asked me if Icould get some numbers out of it for him. Woods then spontaneously stated, "Man I can't believe he did that." Woods went on to tell me that he was high on drugs and down on his luck because of his recent drug use.

WOODS ON SCENE INTERVIEW

I advised Woods of the Miranda Warning and asked him if he understood his rights to which he replied, "Yes." Woods said the "bigger bald headed dude" was driving the suspect vehicle. Woods said he knew the guy as

"Sheon," and said he did not know the guy in the back seat with him (Banks). Woods said, "They came together." Woods said, "They pretty much talked me into it." Woods said this was the first time he had done something like this.

Woods said he was, "Just kind of standing by, just kind of looking." Woods said, "I was pretty much just a watch out," and denied entering the business.

Woods identified "Sheon" as having a nickname of "Country." Woods said he had been using drugs for the last three years or know.

I asked Woods if he had Sheon's phone stored in his phone, and he said he had his number stored in his phone as "Country."

I believed my audio recorder was working the entire time, however about a minute or so of the beginning portion of the interview was not recorded as I received a phone call which interrupted the recording. I also received another phone call which interrupted the last few seconds of the audio recording of the interview.

BEVMO SURVEILLANCE

At approximately 0340 hours, Detective Hernandez #1077 responded to the BevMo store located at 5634 Sepulveda Boulevard and met with store manager,

downloaded the surveillance footage via e-mail which was sent to him from BevMo Loss Prevention Manager, from BevMo headquarters located in Concord, CA. The surveillance footage was downloaded onto a flash drive and subsequently downloaded onto a DVD at CCPD.

was also able to provide Detective Hernandez with an initial estimate of the property loss. Lara estimated the loss at approximately \$7,252; however, he had yet to include the alcohol taken from the rear storage room.

WOODS CCPD INTERVIEW

At approximately 0450 hours, I met with Woods inside the CCPD jail interview room. Due to the fact the first Miranda Warning was not recorded, I once again advised Woods of the Miranda Warning. I asked Woods if he understood his rights to which he replied, 'Yeah," as he nodded his head up and down in the affirmative.

Woods told me the vehicle they were in was a rental vehicle he rented from Hertz a day and a half before. Woods told me that he was talked into what the other suspects did. Woods told me that he met up with the other two suspects, and together they went to eat at Norm's.

CRIME SCENES PROCESSED

Forensic Technician Muller responded to Bevmo to process the scene where the shooting occurred, and processed the crime scene. Forensic Technician Muller located one expended shell casing from the rear parking lot (see her supplemental report for further) which was attributed to being fired from Ofc. Witter's firearm.

Lt. Lopez told me he had inspected Ofc. Witter's firearm following the shooting, and found his twelve round magazine had eleven rounds, indicating one round was fired during the shooting.

Forensic Technicians Mendoza and Gonzalez responded to 2914 Jefferson Blvd, Los Angeles, where the suspect vehicle was located at the termination of the pursuit (see supplemental report for further).

JAMES BAIL INCREASE

Upon reviewing James' arrest history (CII 08762332), I learned that James had two previous felony strikes

(Case # VA030939602 for PC 211/ Case # 00WF1524 for PC 211). Based on Woods' statements that James was the driver of the suspect vehicle, coupled with Ofc. Armenta's seeing him exit the driver's seat of the suspect vehicle, James was booked for PC 245(c), Assault with a Deadly Weapon on a Peace Officer, and his bail was increased to \$1,000,000 based on his two previous felony strikes.

EVIDENCE RECOVERY FROM JAIL

At 0550 hours, Detective Hernandez responded to the CCPD Jail and collected the following items from the following suspect's personal property:

- Black hooded sweatshirt from the personal property of Sheon James.
- Black zip up hooded sweatshirt from personal property of David Banks.
- \$657.00 in US Currency (5 x \$100, 6 x \$20, 1 x \$10, 3 x \$5, 12 x \$1) from the personal property of Tyrone Woods.

All the above listed items were booked into CCPP Property as evidence by Detective Hernandez.

OFC. WEISSMAN STATEMENT

On 06/12/17 at approximately 0630 hours, I spoke with Ofc. Weissman who told me the following:

Upon arriving on scene and discovering the front window pane was smashed, Ofc. Weissman began setting up a perimeter and specifically requested a police unit respond to the rear of the business. When Officer Witter and Michel (4A3M) arrived on scene, he could not see them as he was standing in the front of the business. Seconds later, Ofc. Weissman heard Ofc. Witter yelling commands to "stop," followed by the sounds of tires screeching followed by the sound of one gun shot.

Ofc. Weissman continued to stand in the front of the business and did not see the suspect vehicle flee the area.

HOOMAN CHEVROLET SURVEILLANCE

At approximately 0850 hours, Detective Hernandez responded to Hooman Chevrolet which is the neighboring business located southeast of the BevMo loading docks.

Detective Hernandez met with Hooman Ch recovering surveillance footage. Motevosia monitored by a third party alarm company,	n advised him that the dea

The DVD's containing the surveillance footage from both BevMo and Hooman Chevrolet were booked into CCPOD Property as evidence by Detective Hernandez.

I viewed the footage, which showed two different camera angles.

The footage showed the suspect vehicle quickly make the right (eastbound) turn out of the loading dock area and drive straight toward Ofc. Witter who had just exited the passenger side of his police vehicle. The suspect

vehicle continued veering further right, almost colliding with Ofc. Witter who is standing in front of the suspect vehicle with his gun drawn. Ofc. Witter is forced to take two large steps back (south) toward his police vehicle to prevent from being struck by the suspect vehicle which accelerates right past the place where Ofc. Witter was previously standing (see incorporated video for further).

OFC. MICHEL STATEMENT

On 06/12/17 at approximately 0945 hours, I met with Ofc. Michel, along with Union Attorney Kim Riley. Ofc. Michel told me the following:

Ofc. Michel is the Training Officer of Ofc. Witter, who he has worked with for the last three weeks. After hearing Ofc. Weissman request additional units and confirming a window had been smashed, Ofc. Michel drove to the rear of the business, east of Bevmo, north of Hooman Chevrolet. Ofc. Michel knew the rear doors to the business were located on the north side of the building near the delivery dock.

After parking and turning off the ignition to his vehicle, Ofc. Michel began trying to remove his M-6 in order to prepare clearing the building. From his peripheral, Ofc. Michel noticed a vehicle driving extremely fast out of the loading dock area associated with Bevmo and out toward the rear (north parking lot). Ofc. Michel noticed that Ofc. Witter had already exited the vehicle and was standing somewhere along the passenger side (north) of their police vehicle. Ofc. Michel heard the sound of the suspect vehicle accelerating toward Ofc. Witter and their police vehicle when he yelled for Ofc. Witter to get back in the vehicle.

Ofc. Michel said the suspect vehicle accelerated toward them, and he believed the suspect was going to ram their police vehicle. Ofc. Michel heard Ofc. Witter yell, "Stop police," as the suspect vehicle continued driving eastbound toward their vehicle and Ofc. Witter. Ofc. Michel said after hearing Ofc. Witter's commands, he heard a gunshot, and did not know who had shot, and was unsure if the suspect's had shot at their vehicle or Ofc. Witter had shot at the suspect vehicle.

Ofc. Michel said he asked Ofc. Witter if he was okay and if he was hit, and Ofc. Witter told him he was not hit. Ofc. Michel immediately broadcast that shots were fired, and got in his vehicle and began pursuing the suspect vehicle. Ofc. Michel was involved in the pursuit, before returning back to the rear parking lot of Beymo.

MAV FOOTAGE REVIEW / OFC. ARMENTA

I reviewed MAV footage from Ofc. Armenta's vehicle (Unit # 1777), in an attempt to see if footage showed the suspects exiting the suspect vehicle at the termination of the pursuit. When I reviewed the footage, which showed the suspect vehicle colliding with a parked vehicle at approximately 00:46:25 hours, the video angle does not capture footage of the suspects exiting the vehicle.

It appears at times during the pursuit as though the suspects in the rear of the vehicle were discarding bottles of liquor while being pursued by CCPD Units.

Ofc. Armenta's MAV footage captured the pursuit.

MAV FOOTAGE REVIEW / OFC. MICHEL & OFC. WITTER

I reviewed MAV footage from Police Unit (#1590) which was the vehicle associated with Ofc. Michel and Ofc. Witter. Upon review of the footage, it appeared as though the suspect vehicle quickly accelerated northbound from the loading dock area of Bevmo into the rear (north) parking lot. The suspect vehicle then makes a right turn and drives east accelerating toward the police vehicle and Ofc. Witter who is out of footage view. Ofc. Witter can be heard yelling, "Hey, stop, stop, stop," in a very loud voice, as the vehicle continues accelerating toward the passenger side of the police vehicle. The suspect vehicle continues driving east along the passenger side of Unit #1590, while neither Ofc. Michel or Ofc. Witter is seen within the footage. As the suspect vehicle

passes the police vehicle along the passenger side (out of MAV footage view) a single gunshot is heard. Both Officers get back into the vehicle, and they begin pursuing the suspect vehicle (see video for further).

SCENE DESCRIPTION

The shooting occurred in the rear parking lot of the Bevmo store, located at 5634 Sepulveda Blvd, Culver City. The parking lot is accessible from Hannum Ave to the east, and another larger main parking lot to the west. A loading dock with an accompanying long driveway is located along the north side of Bevmo, but view of the loading dock is blocked by a large cinder block wall from the east. The main loading dock driveway is also blocked from view from the west, as it runs south from the main building Bevmo building.

Directly east of the loading dock for Bevmo, is a loading dock for Sprout's. There is a large cinder block wall which separates each of the loading docks for Bevmo and Sprout's.

Directly east of the loading dock for Sprouts, is a large building associated with Hooman Chevrolet.

Hooman Chevrolet keeps several vehicles parked in the rear parking lot area where the incident occurred involving the suspect vehicle and CCPD Officers.

Upon reviewing the MAV footage of Unit #1590 and believing the single gunshot was likely fired in a northern direction, an area check was conducted of the numerous parked Hooman vehicles in an attempt to locate the fired round with negative results.

SEARCH WARRANT

On 06/12/17 at approximately 0830 hours, I obtained a search warrant for the suspect vehicle, the white Samsung cell phone recovered from Woods, in addition to any cell phones recovered from the suspect vehicle; the search warrant was signed by the Honorable Judge Andrew Cooper.

At approximately 1100 hours, Forensic Technicians Mendoza and Gonzalez took numerous photos of the suspect vehicle and items found inside.

I recovered the following items as evidence from the suspect vehicle:

SUSPECT VEHICLE SEARCH

A search of the suspect vehicle revealed seven intact cases of various liquors, along with more than 100 bottles of various champagnes and liquors. Bevmo employee responded to CCPD and the bottles of liquor and champagne were released to him (see below photos).





I also recovered the following items from the suspect vehicle which were booked into CCPD property as Evidence by Ofc. Kutylo:

FROM SIDE COMPARTMENT FROM BLACK BAG

- -Tom Tom GPS unit, S/N # GU4262A05782
- -Garmin GPS unit, S/N # 3898349940

LEFT REAR PASSENGER SEAT

-LG cell phone, IMEI # 357588088655819

REAR FLOORBOARD

- -Black flashlight with wrist strap
- -Orange handled bolt cutters

We attempted to check the front passenger window for evidence of the bullet striking the window but the front window would not roll up. There were broken shards of glass found on the front passenger seat and front passenger floorboard. It should be noted that the driver side rear sliding door was completely removed from the suspect vehicle, as the door was found on the north sidewalk west of 2914 Jefferson Blvd.

SUSPECT CLOTHING PHOTOS - CCPD JAIL

Det. Hernandez responded to the jail with Forensic Technician Mendoza and Gonzalez. Photos were taken of each of the suspects in their respective clothing, along with their respective sweatshirts which were placed in their property bags.

Woods was wearing a black t-shirt, blue jeans, and black and white shoes.

Banks was wearing a black zippered hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans, and multi colored shoes.

James was wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, and black jeans (ripped).


I created two documents showing the clothing worn by both Banks and James, compared to the surveillance footage of the two suspects who entered Bevmo. It should be noted that the clothing worn by Banks and James was the same clothing worn by the suspects inside Bevmo who committed the burglary.

The clothing worn by Banks and James further corroborates Woods previous statement to me that he was a "watchout," and never entered Bevmo.

BANKS INTERVIEW

On 06/12/17 at approximately 1135 hours, I attempted to speak with Banks inside the CCPD jail and he refused an interview.

JAMES INTERVIEW

On 06/12/17 at approximately 1140 hours, Det. Hernandez and I met with James inside the CCPD jail interview room.

I advised James of the Miranda Warning and asked him if he understood his rights to which he replied, "Yeah."

I asked James if he knew why he was in jail and he said he did. When I asked him why he was in jail he said, "I don't know, we was in a high speed chase." James said he was seated in the front passenger seat in the vehicle during the pursuit.

I told James that the evidence we obtained showed (as a ruse) that he was the driver of the vehicle. James said, "I wasn't driving the car." I asked James how he knew the other suspects in the vehicle and he said, "They're old friends, but I'm just gonna wait til my lawyer gets here to talk with y'all."

I told James not to say another word, as he had just invoked his right to an attorney.

I told James that surveillance footage showed him driving the vehicle which drove toward CCPD Officers, and leading them on a lengthy pursuit.

Our interview of James ended and no further questions were asked.

WOODS PHONE CALL

On 06/13/17 at approximately 0815 hours, I received a phone call from Tyrone Woods. The entire phone call

was audio recorded.

Woods told me that he was wondering what happened to his house keys, which were on his person when he was arrested. Woods told me that he also wanted to know what he could to get his money returned, which he indicated was money he made from his job which he had proof of.

I asked Woods again about the fact he told us James was driving the vehicle. James told me that he was too high to drive to the car, and definitely was not driving. I told James that surveillance footage corroborated his statement that he did not enter the Bevmo. James told me that he was in the front passenger seat of the suspect vehicle when the other two went inside Bevmo. James said he was also inside the front passenger seat "when he almost lost his life" and added "that woke me up."

I asked Woods if he was referring to when the Officer shot at the vehicle. I asked Woods what James said, if anything, while driving toward the Officer standing in front of him. Woods said that James just hopped in the car and said, "Let's go, let's go." Woods said he was so under the influence he was not fully aware, until the shot was fired which went thru the front passenger window which broke. Woods said he was arguing with James to "pull the fuck over."

I asked Woods from his view, did it look like James almost hit the Officer and he replied, "Not from what I seen, you know I was just really nervous to be honest with you." I told Woods that there was footage of their suspect vehicle almost colliding into the Officer and he replied, "Oh wow." I told Woods that I was trying to get a better understanding of what was going on in the suspect vehicle when the incident occurred.

I asked Woods who was throwing the bottles of booze out of the van while they were driving down the 10 freeway. Woods replied, "His friend (referring to Banks)," and again said he was in the front passenger seat when the pursuit occurred.

Woods claimed that Officers beat him up, and added that "When people are on drugs they make bad decisions, and I just need help."

I told Woods that he could provide my information to regarding the rental vehicle which was involved and impounded.

I downloaded my audio recorded interview of Woods.

Following my interview, I tracked down Woods' keys which were mistakenly booked into the personal property bag of Banks. Det. Gamboa recovered the keys and provided them to me. I called Woods (

OFC. WITTER STATEMENT

On 06/13/17 at approximately 1618 hours, I met with Ofc. Witter who told me the following:

On 06/12/17 at approximately 0030 hours, Ofc. Witter responded to a radio call of a confirmed burglary at BevMo (5634 Sepulveda Blvd) with his partner Ofc. Michel (his Field Training Officer).

When they arrived at Bevmo, Ofc. Michel parked in the rear position behind the business. Ofc. Witter exited his vehicle and shortly after exiting his vehicle noticed the suspect vehicle accelerating toward him, making no attempt to stop or slow down. Ofc. Witter recognized that he had nowhere to go to avoid a collision as his police vehicle was parked to his left (south) giving him no avenue of escape. Ofc. Witter gave several loud verbal commands for the driver to stop, and the driver made no attempt to stop or slow down following Ofc.

Witter's verbal commands. Ofc. Witter who was in fear for his life from the suspect vehicle which was driving directly toward him, fired one shot at the suspect. Ofc. Witter was unsure of where or if his shot struck the suspect or vehicle.

Immediately following the suspect vehicle nearly colliding with him, Ofc. Witter got back into his police vehicle with Ofc. Michel, and they pursued the suspect vehicle.

STOLEN MERCHANDISE INVENTORY

On 06/13/17, BevMo employee emailed Det. Hernandez an inventory list of all items stolen from the Burglary on the morning of 06/12/17. The inventory list indicated that the suspects stole and damaged \$16,049.55 worth of Bevmo merchandise (see below inventory list for further).

- 7. During your paid administrative leave status, you're assigned to your residence during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, from 0900 to 1700 hours. Additionally, you will provide a phone number where you may be reached during this time. To leave for any reason will require approval by either the Watch Commander or the Assistant Chief of Police.

YOUR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ANY OF THE ABOVE ORDERS SHALL IN AND OF ITSELF RESULT IN A DISCIPLINABLE ACT OF INSUBORDINATION.

Use of Force

300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, every member of this [department/office] is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial and reasonable manner.

300.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Definitions related to this policy include:

Deadly force - Force reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.

Force - The application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents or weapons to another person, or other P.O.S.T. cerified defense tactic techniques. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed or restrained.

300.2 POLICY

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concern, both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Officers are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied interactions and, when warranted, may use reasonable force in carrying out their duties.

Officers must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, their authority and limitations. This is especially true with respect to overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of law enforcement duties.

The [Department/Office] recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting officers with the authority to use reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation and a careful balancing of all interests.

300.2.1 DUTY TO INTERCEDE

Any officer present and observing another officer using force that is clearly beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances shall, when in a position to do so, intercede to prevent the use of unreasonable force. An officer who observes another employee use force that exceeds the degree of force permitted by law should promptly report these observations to a supervisor.

300.3 USE OF FORCE

Officers shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably

appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter, officers are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the [Department/Office]. Officers may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires an officer to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force.

300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

Any peace officer may use reasonable force to effect an arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance on the part of the person being arrested; nor shall an officer be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest, prevent escape or to overcome resistance (Penal Code § 835a).

300.3.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether an officer has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Immediacy and severity of the threat to officers or others.
- (b) The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the officer at the time.
- (c) Officer/subject factors (age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, the number of officers available vs. subjects).
- (d) The effects of drugs or alcohol.
- (e) Subject's mental state or capacity.
- (f) Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices.
- (g) The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained.
- (h) The availability of other options and their possible effectiveness.

- (i) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
- (j) Training and experience of the officer.
- (k) Potential for injury to officers, suspects and others.
- (I) Whether the person appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight or is attacking the officer.
- (m) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.
- (n) The apparent need for immediate control of the subject or a prompt resolution of the situation.
- (o) Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the officer or others.
- (p) Prior contacts with the subject or awareness of any propensity for violence.
- (q) Any other exigent circumstances.

300.3.3 PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES

Pain compliance techniques may be effective in controlling a physically or actively resisting individual. Officers may only apply those pain compliance techniques for which they have successfully completed [department/office]-approved training. Officers utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider:

- (a) The degree to which the application of the technique may be controlled given the level of resistance.
- (b) Whether the person can comply with the direction or orders of the officer.
- (c) Whether the person has been given sufficient opportunity to comply.

The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the officer determines that compliance has been achieved.

300.3.4 CAROTID CONTROL HOLD

The proper application of the carotid control hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the carotid control hold is subject to the following:

- (a) The officer shall have successfully completed [department/office]-approved training in the use and application of the carotid control hold.
- (b) The carotid control hold may only be used when circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a person in any of the following circumstances:
 - 1. The subject is violent or physically resisting.

- 2. The subject, by words or actions, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and reasonably appears to have the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.
- (c) The application of a carotid control hold on the following individuals should generally be avoided unless the totality of the circumstances indicates that other available options reasonably appear ineffective, or would present a greater danger to the officer, the subject or others, and the officer reasonably believes that the need to control the individual outweighs the risk of applying a carotid control hold:
 - 1. Females who are known to be pregnant
 - 2. Elderly individuals
 - 3. Obvious juveniles
 - 4. Individuals who appear to have Down syndrome or who appear to have obvious neck deformities or malformations, or visible neck injuries
- (d) Any individual who has had the carotid control hold applied, regardless of whether he/ she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until examined by paramedics or other appropriate medical personnel.
- (e) The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the carotid control hold and whether the subject lost consciousness as a result.
- (f) Any officer attempting or applying the carotid control hold shall promptly notify a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such hold.
- (g) The use or attempted use of the carotid control hold shall be thoroughly documented by the officer in any related reports.

300.3.5 USE OF FORCE TO SEIZE EVIDENCE

In general, officers may use reasonable force to lawfully seize evidence and to prevent the destruction of evidence. However, officers are discouraged from using force solely to prevent a person from swallowing evidence or contraband. In the instance when force is used, officers should not intentionally use any technique that restricts blood flow to the head, restricts respiration or which creates a reasonable likelihood that blood flow to the head or respiration would be restricted. Officers are encouraged to use techniques and methods taught by the Culver City Police Department for this specific purpose.

300.4 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances:

(a) An officer may use deadly force to protect him/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.

(b) An officer may use deadly force to stop a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the subject is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes any of the following:

- 1. The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the officer or another.
- 2. The person is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death without a weapon and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to do so.

300.4.1 SHOOTING AT OR FROM MOVING VEHICLES

Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle are rarely effective. Officers should move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants. An officer should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the officer reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the officer or others.

Officers should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle.

300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of force by a member of this [department/office] shall be documented promptly, completely and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances. To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis and related purposes, the [Department/Office] may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in [department/office] policy, procedure or law.

300.5.1 NOTIFICATION TO SUPERVISORS

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force as defined in Section 300.1.1.

300.5.2 REPORTING TO CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

Statistical data regarding all officer-involved shootings and incidents involving use of force resulting in serious bodily injury is to be reported to the California Department of Justice as required by Government Code § 12525.2. See the Records Section policy.

300.6 MEDICAL CONSIDERATION

Prior to booking or release, medical assistance shall be obtained for any person who exhibits signs of physical distress, who has sustained visible injury, expresses a complaint of injury or continuing

pain, or who was rendered unconscious. Any individual exhibiting signs of physical distress after an encounter should be continuously monitored until he/she can be medically assessed.

Based upon the officer's initial assessment of the nature and extent of the subject's injuries, medical assistance may consist of examination by fire personnel, paramedics, hospital staff or medical staff at the jail. If any such individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practicable, should be witnessed by another officer and/or medical personnel. If a recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included in the recording, if possible.

The on-scene supervisor or, if the on-scene supervisor is not available, the primary handling officer shall ensure that any person providing medical care or receiving custody of a person following any use of force is informed that the person was subjected to force. This notification shall include a description of the force used and any other circumstances the officer reasonably believes would be potential safety or medical risks to the subject (e.g., prolonged struggle, extreme agitation, impaired respiration).

Persons who exhibit extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond their physical characteristics and imperviousness to pain (sometimes called "excited delirium"), or who require a protracted physical encounter with multiple officers to be brought under control, may be at an increased risk of sudden death. Calls involving these persons should be considered medical emergencies. Officers who reasonably suspect a medical emergency should request medical assistance as soon as practicable and have medical personnel stage away if appropriate.

300.7 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY

When a supervisor is able to respond to an incident in which there has been a reported application of force, the supervisor is expected to:

- (a) Obtain the basic facts from the involved officers. Absent an allegation of misconduct or excessive force, this will be considered a routine contact in the normal course of duties.
- (b) Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated.
- (c) When possible, separately obtain a recorded interview with the subject upon whom force was applied. If this interview is conducted without the person having voluntarily waived his/ her *Miranda* rights, the following shall apply:
 - 1. The content of the interview should not be summarized or included in any related criminal charges.
 - 2. The fact that a recorded interview was conducted should be documented in a property or other report.
 - 3. The recording of the interview should be distinctly marked for retention until all potential for civil litigation has expired.

- (d) Once any initial medical assessment has been completed or first aid has been rendered, ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visible injury or complaint of pain, as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas. These photographs should be retained until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
- (e) Identify any witnesses not already included in related reports.
- (f) Review and approve all related reports.
- (g) Determine if there is any indication that the subject may pursue civil litigation.
 - 1. If there is an indication of potential civil litigation, the supervisor should complete and route a notification of a potential claim through the appropriate channels.
- (h) Evaluate the circumstances surrounding the incident and initiate an administrative investigation if there is a question of policy non-compliance or if for any reason further investigation may be appropriate.

In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit.

300.7.1 WATCH COMMANDER RESPONSIBILITY

The Watch Commander shall review each use of force by any personnel within his/her command to ensure compliance with this policy and to address any training issues.

300.8 TRAINING

Officers will receive periodic training on this policy and demonstrate their knowledge and understanding.



When did 4L4M and 4A3M get assigned the call? 4A3M assisted OTA at 0029 hours

Where did they respond from? They gave responding location of Culver/Centinela

When did they arrive at the location? No on scene time given, but at 0032 4A3M advised – 1 shot fired at suspect vehicle by his partner.

When did 4A3M get involved in the pursuit? When they assisted themselves to the call at 0029 hours and 3 minutes later 4A3m advised OTA that they had fired one shot at the suspect vehicle and officers were okay.

When was 4A3M ordered to get out of the pursuit and return to the BevMo location? Nothing OTA – At 0038 hours 4A3M – Ofcr. Michel came on the ESPD frequency and advised that 4L4M was possibly alone at BevMo because all other units were involved in the pursuit, and asked if they could get him (4L4M) checked on.

When did they arrive back at the BevMo Location? Nothing said OTA until the roll call – at 0053 hours 4A3M advised they were at BevMo. I found no transmissions where he advised he was responding back to the business and no phone calls to dispatch from him advising he was returning to the business.

When did Lt. Lopez (4W8?) meet with 4A3M and where? I was not able to find any radio transmissions on the air, or on the telephone. At 0140 hours 4W8 asked the dispatcher for the address of BevMo and at 0144 he advised he was on scene.

When did 4A3M clear BevMo? At 0059 hours the units at BevMo went to Tac2 for the interior search of the business. At 0111 hours 4L4M advised OTA that the location was clear. At 0114 hours Michel was told to call 5S15's cellphone. I was not able to find any additional radio transmissions from 4A3M advising that he cleared BevMo or was back on the perimeter. And there was no change of locations in his unit history since showing at BevMo at 0053 hours.

Use of Force

300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, every member of this [department/office] is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial and reasonable manner.

300.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Definitions related to this policy include:

Deadly force - Force reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.

Force - The application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents or weapons to another person, or other P.O.S.T. cerified defense tactic techniques. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed or restrained.

300.2 POLICY

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concern, both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Officers are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied interactions and, when warranted, may use reasonable force in carrying out their duties.

Officers must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, their authority and limitations. This is especially true with respect to overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of law enforcement duties.

The [Department/Office] recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting officers with the authority to use reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation and a careful balancing of all interests.

300.2.1 DUTY TO INTERCEDE

Any officer present and observing another officer using force that is clearly beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances shall, when in a position to do so, intercede to prevent the use of unreasonable force. An officer who observes another employee use force that exceeds the degree of force permitted by law should promptly report these observations to a supervisor.

300.3 USE OF FORCE

Officers shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably

appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter, officers are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the [Department/Office]. Officers may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires an officer to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force.

300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

Any peace officer may use reasonable force to effect an arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance on the part of the person being arrested; nor shall an officer be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest, prevent escape or to overcome resistance (Penal Code § 835a).

300.3.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether an officer has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include, but are not limited to:

- Immediacy and severity of the threat to officers or others. (a)
- The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the officer at (b) the time.
- Officer/subject factors (age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, the number of officers available vs. subjects).
- (d) The effects of drugs or alcohol.
- Subject's mental state or capacity. (e)
- Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices. (f)
- The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist (g) despite being restrained.
- The availability of other options and their possible effectiveness. (h)

- (i) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
- (j) Training and experience of the officer.
- (k) Potential for injury to officers, suspects and others.
- (I) Whether the person appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight or is attacking the officer.
- (m) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.
- (n) The apparent need for immediate control of the subject or a prompt resolution of the situation.
- (o) Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the officer or others.
- (p) Prior contacts with the subject or awareness of any propensity for violence.
- (q) Any other exigent circumstances.

300.3.3 PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES

Pain compliance techniques may be effective in controlling a physically or actively resisting individual. Officers may only apply those pain compliance techniques for which they have successfully completed [department/office]-approved training. Officers utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider:

- (a) The degree to which the application of the technique may be controlled given the level of resistance.
- (b) Whether the person can comply with the direction or orders of the officer.
- (c) Whether the person has been given sufficient opportunity to comply.

The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the officer determines that compliance has been achieved.

300.3.4 CAROTID CONTROL HOLD

The proper application of the carotid control hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the carotid control hold is subject to the following:

- (a) The officer shall have successfully completed [department/office]-approved training in the use and application of the carotid control hold.
- (b) The carotid control hold may only be used when circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a person in any of the following circumstances:
 - 1. The subject is violent or physically resisting.

- 2. The subject, by words or actions, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and reasonably appears to have the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.
- The application of a carotid control hold on the following individuals should generally be avoided unless the totality of the circumstances indicates that other available options reasonably appear ineffective, or would present a greater danger to the officer, the subject or others, and the officer reasonably believes that the need to control the individual outweighs the risk of applying a carotid control hold:
 - 1. Females who are known to be pregnant
 - 2. Elderly individuals

- 3. Obvious juveniles
- 4. Individuals who appear to have Down syndrome or who appear to have obvious neck deformities or malformations, or visible neck injuries
- (d) Any individual who has had the carotid control hold applied, regardless of whether he/ she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until examined by paramedics or other appropriate medical personnel.
- The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the carotid control hold and whether the subject lost consciousness as a result.
- Any officer attempting or applying the carotid control hold shall promptly notify a supervisor (f) of the use or attempted use of such hold.
- The use or attempted use of the carotid control hold shall be thoroughly documented by the (g) officer in any related reports.

300.3.5 USE OF FORCE TO SEIZE EVIDENCE

In general, officers may use reasonable force to lawfully seize evidence and to prevent the destruction of evidence. However, officers are discouraged from using force solely to prevent a person from swallowing evidence or contraband. In the instance when force is used, officers should not intentionally use any technique that restricts blood flow to the head, restricts respiration or which creates a reasonable likelihood that blood flow to the head or respiration would be restricted. Officers are encouraged to use techniques and methods taught by the Culver City Police Department for this specific purpose.

300.4 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances:

An officer may use deadly force to protect him/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.

(b) An officer may use deadly force to stop a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the subject is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes any of the following:

- The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the officer or another.
- 2. The person is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death without a weapon and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to do so.

300.4.1 SHOOTING AT OR FROM MOVING VEHICLES

Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle are rarely effective. Officers should move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants. An officer should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the officer reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the officer or others.

Officers should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle.

300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of force by a member of this [department/office] shall be documented promptly, completely and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances. To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis and related purposes, the [Department/Office] may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in [department/office] policy, procedure or law.

300.5.1 NOTIFICATION TO SUPERVISORS

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force as defined in Section 300.1.1.

300.5.2 REPORTING TO CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

Statistical data regarding all officer-involved shootings and incidents involving use of force resulting in serious bodily injury is to be reported to the California Department of Justice as required by Government Code § 12525.2. See the Records Section policy.

300.6 MEDICAL CONSIDERATION

Prior to booking or release, medical assistance shall be obtained for any person who exhibits signs of physical distress, who has sustained visible injury, expresses a complaint of injury or continuing

pain, or who was rendered unconscious. Any individual exhibiting signs of physical distress after an encounter should be continuously monitored until he/she can be medically assessed.

Based upon the officer's initial assessment of the nature and extent of the subject's injuries, medical assistance may consist of examination by fire personnel, paramedics, hospital staff or medical staff at the jail. If any such individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practicable, should be witnessed by another officer and/or medical personnel. If a recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included in the recording, if possible.

The on-scene supervisor or, if the on-scene supervisor is not available, the primary handling officer shall ensure that any person providing medical care or receiving custody of a person following any use of force is informed that the person was subjected to force. This notification shall include a description of the force used and any other circumstances the officer reasonably believes would be potential safety or medical risks to the subject (e.g., prolonged struggle, extreme agitation, impaired respiration).

Persons who exhibit extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond their physical characteristics and imperviousness to pain (sometimes called "excited delirium"), or who require a protracted physical encounter with multiple officers to be brought under control, may be at an increased risk of sudden death. Calls involving these persons should be considered medical emergencies. Officers who reasonably suspect a medical emergency should request medical assistance as soon as practicable and have medical personnel stage away if appropriate.

300.7 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY

When a supervisor is able to respond to an incident in which there has been a reported application of force, the supervisor is expected to:

- (a) Obtain the basic facts from the involved officers. Absent an allegation of misconduct or excessive force, this will be considered a routine contact in the normal course of duties.
- (b) Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated.
- (c) When possible, separately obtain a recorded interview with the subject upon whom force was applied. If this interview is conducted without the person having voluntarily waived his/her *Miranda* rights, the following shall apply:
 - 1. The content of the interview should not be summarized or included in any related criminal charges.
 - 2. The fact that a recorded interview was conducted should be documented in a property or other report.
 - 3. The recording of the interview should be distinctly marked for retention until all potential for civil litigation has expired.

- (d) Once any initial medical assessment has been completed or first aid has been rendered, ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visible injury or complaint of pain, as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas. These photographs should be retained until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
- (e) Identify any witnesses not already included in related reports.
- (f) Review and approve all related reports.
- (g) Determine if there is any indication that the subject may pursue civil litigation.
 - 1. If there is an indication of potential civil litigation, the supervisor should complete and route a notification of a potential claim through the appropriate channels.
- (h) Evaluate the circumstances surrounding the incident and initiate an administrative investigation if there is a question of policy non-compliance or if for any reason further investigation may be appropriate.

In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit.

300.7.1 WATCH COMMANDER RESPONSIBILITY

The Watch Commander shall review each use of force by any personnel within his/her command to ensure compliance with this policy and to address any training issues.

300.8 TRAINING

Officers will receive periodic training on this policy and demonstrate their knowledge and understanding.
