REQUESTS

I request all documents in the possession of the Minnesota Department of Agriculture ("the Agency") in connection with its investigation of the source of the E. coli O157:H7 infection and illness of the individual identified as "Case 5" in the Agency's written summary of its investigation of the April 2018 E. coli O157:H7 outbreak in Minnesota. For your reference in processing this request, I have attached the Agency's written summary of the outbreak investigation.

More specifically, I request to obtain copies of any documents in the Agency's files that meet any of the following criteria:

- 1) All email communications, food menus, and interview notes obtained or created by the Agency's investigators relating to food products containing romaine lettuce that were served at "Residential Facility A" during the month of April 2018.
- 2) All purchasing and delivery records pertaining to any romaine lettuce food products that were delivered to "Residential Facility A" during the month of April 2018.
- 3) All documentation, email communications and interview notes pertaining to the foods which the individual identified as "Case 5" may have consumed during the month of April 2018.
- 4) All records of communication between the Agency's investigators with any romaine lettuce product supplier pertaining to romaine lettuce products that may have been delivered to "Residential Facility A" during the month of April 2018.

Investigation Summary

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) Rapid Response Team (RRT) first became involved in the ongoing national outbreak of *E.* coli O157:H7 associated with consumption of romaine lettuce in late April 2018. No cases of illness had been identified in Minnesota, but the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) requested traceback of a romaine product sourced from C.H. Robinson, a licensed food broker in Eden Prairie, MN. The RRT conducted traceback and confirmed C.H. Robinson was acting as a broker and never had physical control of the product. No additional actions were requested of MDA RRT.

On 5/2/18, Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) Epidemiologist Amy Saupe notified the MDA RRT of two (2) confirmed cases of *E.* coli O157:H7 in Minnesota that matched the national cluster. The cases were suspected to have both consumed romaine lettuce at a residential care facility ("Residential Facility A" - see *Exhibit B*). City of Minneapolis Environmental Health (EH) visited the facility to conduct an environmental assessment. Romaine was used exclusively in the to-go salads (packaged in clamshells) and during two special meals on 4/4/18 and 4/11/18. City of Minneapolis interviewed kitchen staff to ensure no one was working while ill. One staff person stated that they had called their romaine distributor to ensure it was safe, and the distributor stated that the product "had not been recalled" and therefore was not a concern. All romaine lettuce onsite was embargoed by the City of Minneapolis, though inspectors reported the romaine onsite was likely from a later delivery than the suspect romaine.

MDA Inspector Charlene Gruber was assigned sample collection at Residential Facility A. Inspector Gruber visited the facility on 5/3/18 and collected four (4) bags of romaine lettuce for testing and submitted them to the MDA Microbiology Laboratory ("Micro Lab"). All samples were "not found" for *E.* coli. Leftover romaine and iceberg lettuce was disposed of by the facility. Over the next several days, additional cases of *E.* coli O157:H7 were identified by MDH and shared with MDA RRT. Additional cases had a variety of exposures, including two additional residential facilities, a school, and several restaurants. MDA RRT initiated traceback of clear romaine exposures among the new cases. All documentation tracing product outside of Minnesota was shared with FDA (see *Exhibits A-F*).

On 5/8/18, MDH issued a press release describing ten new cases identified in Minnesota and recommending consumers avoid romaine grown in the Yuma growing region, which included areas in Arizona and California. MDH suspected that the original consumer notification issued by FDA and CDC on 4/19/18 was confusing to consumers who assumed only product grown in Arizona was affected.

On 6/1/18, CDC issued an additional notification that romaine lettuce from the Yuma growing region was past shelf life and likely no longer being sold in stores or served in restaurants. CDC also shared publicly the updated number of cases and the two deaths reported among Minnesota cases.

On 6/27/18, FDA shared results from their environmental sample collection in the Yuma growing region. Environmental samples were collected along a two-mile stretch of an irrigation canal near the implicated romaine growing fields. *E.* coli O157:H7 was isolated from the irrigation water and was reported as highly related to the clinical isolates by whole genome sequencing (WGS). CDC also closed out their investigation on 6/28/18 reporting that the outbreak appeared to be over. The RRT closed the investigation.

Root Cause & Contributing Factors

Cases of illness consumed romaine contaminated with E. coli O157:H7.

FDA suspects a contaminated irrigation canal as the root cause for contamination in the Yuma growing region.

Other contributing factors include:

- Confusion among consumers and retail facilities re: CDC and FDA statements whether the product in their possession was safe
- Mixed messages from distributors or retail facilities stating their romaine was safe because it had not been recalled
