INVESTIGATOR ELLEN DOLESE: This interview is regarding DPA case number 0081-19. The time now is approximately 3:30 p.m. Conducting this interview is DPA Investigator Ellen Dolese. I work for the Department of Police Accountability and I have been designated by the Police Commission to conduct this investigation. The member being interviewed is Officer Nicolas Nagai, star number 2017, who is a named officer in this matter. And representing Officer Nagai is POA representative Kevin Martin. And Officer Nagai, have you read the DPA form, the 293 Complaint form and the Allegation form regarding the allegations of misconduct in this matter?

Administrative Interview Advisements form, which you and your

be stored in the DPA file for this case. And then with these
Advisements in mind, is there any reason you cannot go forward

20	DOLESE: Okay. And- just because we have a number they use
21	in that department.
22	NAGAI: Sure.
23	DOLESE: And can you just describe just basically in your
24	own words what led up to your contact with that
25	day?
26	NAGAI: Yeah. So, we were working as uniformed patrol in
27	the area of Market and Castro specifically at Jane Warner Plaza.
28	We're the foot beat officers in the area so we're well aware of

the different transients and the different people that have 1 outstanding warrants. Um, we hadn't seen in quite some time but uh, Officer Santana initially spotted him and then 3 he believed that he had an outstanding parole-parole warrant. 4 So, before making contact, 5 6 8 9 So, we pretty much just uh, parked the vehicle. Officer 10 Santana made initial contact. Called out- called out- he had 11 12 his- he was congregated in a group of known transients in the area in the Plaza. 13 Is that the triangular corner there? 14 NAGAI: Yeah. So, there is the F-line Muni turnaround. 15 DOLESE: Right. 16 NAGAI: And then it's right across the street from Orphan 17 Andy's. And then there's a few tables and then some planter at 18 19 the corner of Market and Castro. is having- he had his face- his back toward us so as soon as my partner, 20 Officer Santana, taps him on the shoulder and says, you know, 21 He turns around and as soon as he notices our 22 police presence because we're walking up in uniform, he- I see 23 his face turn from, you know, flat affect to shock and then he 24 pushed uh, Bryan away and then he started running away from him 25 as an F-line train is actively moving to, you know, go inbound 26 27 toward downtown. So, there was very little ah- little time for anything to really, I guess de-escalate because we hadn't evenother than him calling out his name and turning around and seeing us, that was the only pretty much words prior to us, ah, you know, start wrestling.

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DOLESE: Okay. And then-then what happened? After you-you said you got into a-

So, yeah, so after that, after he started running, NAGAI: ah, we grabbed him- I grabbed ahold of his right arm and I believe Bryan grabbed, you know, another part of his body and we're trying to, you know, get ahold of him but he's- he's flexing his limbs which most people do when they're trying to resist arrest. And ah, you know, just trying, you know, get out of our grasps. As the F-line is- we're feet away from the moving like train. I remember looking to my left and I see like the huge metal wheels kinda just spinning like this is not good. So, but we're able to get him away from the train and then we kind of all trip over like this ah, push-truck filled with ah, transient debris and trash, soiled blankets. By that time, I believe our Body Worn Cameras had been knocked off our uniforms. I think on the ground they were somehow activated but they were already in the buffering mode prior to our contact with And then I remember that my mic was dangling so it was hard for me to initially grab it and you know, yell out 148, which is someone's actively resisting arrest as did Bryan's. at one point- after we had all been, you know, remember on the ground, I actually just grabbed Bryan's mic and called out for the 148 and that's when other Mission units arrives on scene. I was able to grab ahold of-think it was right wrist, handcuffed it, and then by the time other Mission

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units showed up, I was pretty exhausted and out of gas and then
   that's when other Mission units took over to completely handcuff
   him. So, that was pretty much the short and sweet of it.

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NAGAI: We - we had one other incident where- and also, he decided it was a good idea to run. Someone reported- I forget how the call initially went but someone reported him like breaking into a car but after we had made contact with him- we were just gonna initially detain him but then as he- we were calling out for him to, you know, stop, he decided to run in the middle of the street down the 400 block of Castro. So, by doing that obviously we thought something was wrong or he committed a crime. So, after we detain him and then ah, have this wrestling match in the middle of the street with incoming and outcoming traffic, um, the guy whose car that was actually gave him permission to- I don't know- just to be hangin' out in his car or whatever. So, it looked weird and this was called in by a third party but, yeah, we had a prior incident with him and that's how we learned who was.

DOLESE: Okay. And so, based on your prior- this prior experience with also known as , um, you would tend to think that he had- you believe he has a history of possibly being resistive?

NAGAI: Correct.

DOLESE: Resisting arrest.

22 NAGAI: Yeah.

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DOLESE: Okay. And so, was this-this case any different?

NAGAI: Ah, no. I mean as soon as we made contact with him, he decided to run. I guess from prior contact, uh, I guess we should have known but we didn't come in hot, you know. I think we came in very- what's- you know, it was just have a chat. We didn't say like, stop, you're under arrest. He just

called out to his name then as soon as he saw us then he ran. 1 2 So, when you and Officer Santana decided to approach him, was it your intent at that time to arrest 3 4 NAGAI: 5 We weren't intending to have a full-on 6 7 wrestling match with him. DOLESE: Okay. 8 We were just like, hey look, you know let's just 9 NAGAI: get this- you know, it's how we usually come if we do have, you 10 know. A lot of the transients in the Castro, they do have 11 12 warrants here and there after running them so many times. And usually we just go up to them and hey, look. You got a warrant. 13 Let's just go get it taken care of and usually that's that. 14 it might be a little bit tough getting someone into cuffs but 15 not like a full kinda melee of what happened during this 16 17 incident. DOLESE: Okay. Do you happen to know if name 18 showed there's a list that they- I think they post at the 19 station or if they keep some sort of a list of 20 I know there's- usually, there's somebody at the 21 station that sort of coordinates the- I think the Lieutenants 22 get a list with the names of the in the 23 district. 24 We do have different boards of different people at 25 our station but not like a wanted 26 27 DOLESE: Okay. We- we just ran him because I think a week or two 28 NAGAI:

circle back around we had lost him. So, that's what sparked our interest to initially run him. So, we had the knowledge that he 3 was wanted for this parole hit. 4 DOLESE: Okay. 5 So, when we saw him on this particular day, okay, 6 let's just- there he is. Let's just reconfirm it. It was still good so that's when we made contact. 8 DOLESE: Got it. Thank you. So, in your report in the 9 narrative you mentioned that Officer Santana called out to 10 by his street name, when you were 11 12 approaching him. Is that - is that what he said? He called him 13 Did you ever hear Officer Santana call him bу ? 14 Um, I don't recall. I believe he called him 15 NAGAI: 16 17 DOLESE: Okay. I just thought because you took the time to document that so I thought was a note that he called him by his 18 19 street name and not-Yeah, I think I wrote down, "called out to 20 NAGAI: 21 by his street name DOLESE: Right. That's what I'm referring to. 22 NAGAI: Yeah, yeah. 23 Okay. And um, did you say that you- did you never 24 DOLESE: had an opportunity to identify yourselves as police officers 25 although you were in uniform, correct? 26 27 NAGAI: Yeah. Other than, you know, being in full uniform, we didn't- we didn't say it like, stop. Police. We didn't

prior, we saw him walking in the area but by the time we could

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really have time to even- we weren't even going that route 1 because doing, you know- stop, Police, he's already got his back towards us. He doesn't know- might not know who, you know, that 3 we're trying to really draw his attention. 4 DOLESE: Okay. 5 And we weren't trying to come in hot because once 6 we're up here, then it brings people to a heightened- it's hard to bring people back down so, no. We were just trying to come 8 in very, you know, even keeled and you know, just-let's just 9 take you in and get this taken care and then that's when he 10 started to run so. 11 12 DOLESE: Okay. And did you have time to give him any commands? 13 NAGAT: 14 No. DOLESE: Like as soon as he- -he just ran. 15 So, his response would you say was almost immediate? 16 17 NAGAI: Exactly. DOLESE: Okay and that was when the Officer Santana touched 18 him on the shoulder? 19 NAGAI: Yeah. 20 Okay. And was it more of a touch or did he grab 21 his shoulder or do you recall? 22 I think it was probably just like-like-23 DOLESE: Like hey. 24 25 NAGAI: Hey. Yeah. pushed And um, and then what about after DOLESE: 26 27 Officer Santana? Did you have an opportunity to- we know he

turned and he ran, did you have any opportunity to give him any

commands at that point? 1 No. I was actually shocked that he just started 2 taking off too. I was like, whoa. 3 DOLESE: Okay. So, you just basically had to go after him 4 at that point? 5 NAGAI: Yeah, exactly. 6 DOLESE: Okay. And can you describe actions when he was- was he actively resisting? 8 Yes. Yes. I mean the fact that he's running away NAGAI: 9 from us, uh, that he's not allowing an easy route for us to 10 handcuff him or place him under arrest. What a lot of people do 11 12 when they are resisting, is tensing their limbs and their body. They try to bring everything to their core. So, as we're trying 13 to, you know, grab ahold of an arm, he's trying to you know, 14 like rip it away from us. It was hard too because I think Bryan 15 was trying to pull one way and I was trying to pull another way 16 17 to like gain a- so, that also made it a little bit of a hard time. If you're not moving, Muni rail is not gonna stop ah, so 18 it doesn't allow for a lot of easy egress from the situation. 19 And then, you know, a volatile situation with a bunch of his 20 homeless buddies that we kinda have our backs to, you know, I 21 don't know if they're gonna jump in and help 22 they're just gonna- luckily, they just kinda just sat back and 23 then-but. 24 Can you um, at the time- so, when 25 um, he's- you're basically wrangling with him, now both of you-26 27 Officer Santana and yourself are both like full-on with him.

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NAGAI:

Yeah.

DOLESE: Based on what I saw on the Body Worn Camera and the surveillance video. Um, did you-could you recall did ever say anything at that point? Could you remember

him saying anything and if so, what did he say?

NAGAI: Not from my individual recollection. As we reconvened at the station after everything was all over and done with, um, Santana did say that yelled at him, like, go with me. Don't make me hurt you. I'll hurt you. And he's not a- he's not like, a small- I mean Officer Santana and I, we're not like the biggest cops in the Department for sure. And he's not really a small guy either. He's five-nine, one-eighty. I'm five-seven, one-fifty. He's got kind of a muscular kind of a build. He's not- he's not a small, small dude.

DOLESE: Do you think- I'm sorry. Didn't mean to interrupt.

NAGAI: No, go ahead.

DOLESE: Okay. Did you have any reason to believe that he might be under the influence of something?

NAGAI: He does appear like- I mean I- I didn't see him using any narcotic that day; however, that particular area of Market and Castro, there is a lot of drug dealing, um, specifically heroin and methamphetamines. So, I mean we see it all the time. So, during that time I don't know if he was on any sort of narcotic, but it could be a high likely possibility.

DOLESE: Okay. And the reason I ask is because in some of the Body Worn Camera footage you can hear in the audio- and I can't tell whose making the comments, but it sounds like it was one or more officers making reference to meth and then I think

somebody mentioned something about tweaking or really- that he 1 2 was pretty amped up or something. NAGAI: Yeah. I mean we-3 I just wanted to try to confirm. DOLESE: 4 Yeah. I mean we- in the street we call it, you NAGAT: 5 know a tweaker's dream for lack of a better term, I guess. 6 DOLESE: Right. So, from your perspective, I mean is it usually when people are using narcotics such as meth-8 Yeah, or especially amphetamines. 9 In this case, ah, he did- 'cause usually when people are on heroin, it's more 10 of a downer and they're just more mellowed out but when you're 11 12 on amphetamines, it's more you get a lot of heightened sensitivity and more like super hero type strength so it makes 13 up for uh, part of the fight, I guess. 14 DOLESE: Okay. Which I was just trying to- wondering- but 15 that would explain why he was reacting the way that he did. 16 17 NAGAI: Possibly, yeah. DOLESE: Okay. So. 18 MARTIN: But I mean-19 DOLESE: Go ahead Kevin. 20 I don't mean to interrupt but to that end, there 21 MARTIN: was no charge for a 647(f)-drugs. 22 DOLESE: Correct. 23 Or alcohol. MARTIN: 24 Right, yeah. Understood. 25 DOLESE: Thank you. MARTIN: 26 27 DOLESE: Yeah, I just was asking because I just wondered if

there was anything about, you know, that would explain why he

reacted the way that he did. And why he put up such a fight.

NAGAI: Yeah. I mean quite possibly but-

DOLESE: Yeah, because it seemed like initially it was gonna just be a pretty kind of typical encounter and it just sort of escalated-

NAGAI: Exactly.

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DOLESE: Very quickly. And so, it did become necessary at some point for you to use um, some force options or to deploy some force options during your contact with him. So, can you explain um, what you- what you did in response to Mr. actions?

Yes. So, I grabbed ahold of his right arm initially and then as- when I saw to my left that the train was, you know, peeling around us, I'm like God, it didn't make me feel good so, I did use a closed right and left fist-strikes to the head. It's not something that's necessarily taught in the Academy, but you know, when we're fighting with someone then, you know, you're throwing a train in the middle of it, we're- I want myself and my partner to go home safely. So, we were able to wrestle him away from the train. Um, but then we were- we got- we tripped over this- this stroller type thing and then uh, he was able to gain access to his feet again and I was trying to use an Arm Bar take down. But I think he built kind of a wide base so it was kind of tough to get him to the ground. used some sort of uh, take down to where he was finally able to get him to the ground.

DOLESE: Okay. So, Mr. because once you made initial contact-I know it looked like the three of you basically

tripped over the stroller that was there. 1 NAGAI: Yeah. 2 Yeah. DOLESE: And then you all went on the ground. 3 NAGAI: Exactly. 4 And then I see him get back up so he was able to DOLESE: 5 actually get back up on his feet? 6 NAGAI: Yes. 7 DOLESE: Okay. And then he still continued to resist 8 during that time and so then you-like you said, I think you 9 said Officer Santana basically used a different type of take 10 down and was able to get him back onto the ground? 11 12 NAGAI: Yeah. So that would have been the second time you had to 13 take him to the ground. 14 NAGAI: Correct. 15 DOLESE: Okay. And um, it looed like Santana was sort of 16 17 on top of him and-Somehow, I think Bryan ended up being on his back NAGAI: 18 19 at one point. Okay. It was a little chaotic. 20 I think it was during the initial we tripped and 21 NAGAI: then was like on top of him and I was trying to yank 22 him off. 23 DOLESE: Okay. And so, you were attempting to handcuff him 24 at that point? Is that correct? 25 The second time he was on the ground, he was more-NAGAI: 26 27 I believe he was in a prone position face-down.

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DOLESE: Yeah.

And I just grabbed ahold of his uh, right wrist and 1 2 handcuffed him. By that time, I was completely huffing and puffing and that's when another unit was able to take over. 3 So, did- did Officer Santana assist you in DOLESE: 4 handcuffing or was it the other officers that had 5 arrived? I know there were three officers that jumped out of an 6 SUV. 7 It was a patrol unit that ah, showed up and just NAGAI: 8 kind of took over for me and then completed the handcuffing. 9 DOLESE: 10 Okay. NAGAI: Yeah. 11 12 DOLESE: And do you recall how many officers it took to handcuff If you know. 13 I don't recall. 14 NAGAI: DOLESE: Okay. I don't want you to guess. Just only if 15 you remember. And so, do you feel that the force that you had 16 to use with Mr. 17 was reasonable under the circumstances? NAGAI: Yes. 18 Okay. And can you just tell me why you think so? 19 DOLESE: I mean we weren't- we weren't anticipating any type 20 NAGAI: of use of force to begin with. But when he's trying to flee 21 from being captured or to be in custody, then we have to use 22 some sort of physical force at that point to get him into 23 handcuffs and get him into custody. Just because it was very 24 little time to- I had no time to de-escalate the situation 25 because of his volatile nature and behavior, uh, the environment 26 27 of the incident, of a moving Muni train and other bystanders

that we have arrested before and have been volatile in the past,

with our backs-fighting with our backs toward them, hoping that 1 they don't jump in and help and basically lynch him from custody. I think the physical force used was appropriate 3 in this particular incident. 4 DOLESE: Okay. So, do you feel the force- do you feel in 5 any way that it was unnecessary or that it was necessary? 6 NAGAI: I- I believe that it was necessary. DOLESE: Okay. And you believe it was objectively 8 reasonable under the circumstances? 9 NAGAI: Correct, yes. 10 by the back of his head DOLESE: Did you ever take 11 12 and slam his head on the concrete? 13 NAGAI: Negative. DOLESE: And did you ever see Officer Santana slam 14 head on the concrete? 15 NAGAI: No. 16 DOLESE: And did you see a third officer try to slam his 17 head on the concrete? 18 19 NAGAI: No. DOLESE: And do you have any recollection did you ever yank 20 hard on his arm? I know you said you grabbed him by his right 21 arm in order to handcuff him. 22 I mean my purpose wasn't to like damage his arm. 23 Um, control holds and taking someone into custody, it's not a 24 pretty thing so I mean using physical force to apprehend 25 someone, there is a possibility that someone is gonna get hurt-26 27 either the custody or us as well. So, but later on- on scene, didn't have any complaints of pain. When we were at 28

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the station, he was complaining of, you know, arm pain and he

And a complaint of pain- oh, so, yeah, he did have 10 a complaint to his left pinkie I guess on scene. 11 12 DOLESE: That was on scene? Okay. NAGAI: Or maybe- maybe it was at the station, but I don't 13 recall- we would have ordered him an ambulance on the scene if 14 he was complaining of pain but-15 DOLESE: And did a supervisor respond to the scene? 16 17 NAGAI: Yes. DOLESE: And was that Sergeant Russell? 18 19 NAGAI: Yes. Correct. Okay. And was the use of force reported to 20 Sergeant Russell? 21 NAGAI: It was, yes. 22 Okay. And do you know if Sergeant Russell 23 DOLESE: conducted a supervisory use of force evaluation? 24 NAGAI: 25 Yes. Okay. And do you know if an entry was made in the DOLESE: 26 27 use of force log by Sergeant Russell?
