5	inform	nation.
6	A:	Gotcha.
7	Q:	I have a little bit of a sematic, schematic that isn't particularly to scale or anything like
8	that. B	ut hopefully it kinda orients us a little bit.
9	A:	Of course.
10	Q:	Have you had an opportunity to look at the body worn camera that you were wearing that
11	day?	
12	A:	Yes, I have.
13	Q:	Right, and a question that one of his colleagues asked on the last interview, which is a
14	good o	question, have you looked at any other video through media sources, TV news, anything
15	like th	at?
16	A:	Yes, I have.
17	Q:	Alright, so you've looked at a couple things?
18	A:	I have.
19	Q:	Is that. So, go ahead just, you know, kind of take us through what you know about what
20	happer	ned last night and what your role was.
21	A:	Okay. Well I was on duty. I'm a trainer. Had a recruit. We were two blocks away when
22	we hea	ard a midnight unit come over the air, our pic radio, and say that they were getting flagged
23	down	by a victim whose Spanish speaking regarding a robbery - including a with a firearm. So,
24	I'm a S	Spanish speaking officer with the department, a qualified bi-lingual certified with the
25	depart	ment to do translations. So I respond to the scene to help with the victim. When I arrive on

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scene, the primary unit, or actually while we were in route, the primary unit says, they have on viewed a vehicle with that suspect, a robbery suspect, believed to have a firearm. When, as we were arriving, there was another vehicle, another black and white, simultaneously arriving at the same time. There were two black and whites already parked. One was directly behind the suspect vehicle and there was one to the left of that primary patrol car. I could see that there was someone sitting.

- Q: You're talking about that-
- A: Yeah.
- Q: Yeah, that helps you a little bit?
- A: Exactly.
- 11 || Q: Yeah.
- 12 | A: So these two cars were already there.
- 13 | Q: Okay.
- 14 | A: I could see that there was um, a male in the back of this car.
 - Q: Okay.

A: There was, there were, excuse me, there were citizens here on the sidewalk. You know, some were videotaping, some were communicating. What I observed was the two Latin males in the group very quiet, kinda sullen, and they started to walk away. So I asked them what their involvement was. He said, the one victim that I contacted said, I was the one that was robbed. He says, there was a gun pointed to my chest. He says, I gave them money. He asked me for money. I gave him my money. And then he left. Talking about suspect leaving. So, the victim in my, from my understanding, he was the only victim. But the guy standing next to him says, he also witnessed it. I didn't know that he's also a victim, but he was with the primary victim. So, in that moment, this is all within less than a minute, the, there's another Spanish speaking officer also a field training officer, that arrives on scene with his recruit to assist with translation. I ask him to

take care of the victims because I could hear someone requesting a Spanish speaking officer to give commands to the occupants inside this vehicle. So, he decide, the other FTO, that's Roman, he decided to stay. My recruit and I Andaluz and I, went over to the suspect vehicle, toward the suspect vehicle. So I, I at that point approach the primary patrol car on the passenger side which would be this car. And the passenger door is already open. I see that there's an officer with a rifle already on target. There are several officers as I'm, as I'm running toward this primary unit, I see several officers with their handguns already out. My focus, at this point, is just to provide instruction, in Spanish, to the occupants in this car. So I didn't remove my firearm from its holster. I tap the guy that had his rifle out to tell him on the passenger side, that, that it's me. I'm right here. I'm just gonna do translation. So, I was searching for the PA, get the PA. I finally started giving commands. So, I could hear another office trying to provide verbal commands in Spanish. I, it sounded like Officer Santana's voice to me and he was shouting similar commands

to the occupant.

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- A: Without the PA, to the occupant in the car. There were also officers in English trying to give instruction in English. So, what I'm now observing, as I'm standing in the doorframe, between you know, the car and this officer with his rifle out.
- Q: Go ahead. Just kinda.
- A: The passenger door is open.
- Q: Do me a favor, just kind of mark your position, if you remember. Best you can.
- 21 | A: I will. I sure will. The door was open here.
 - Q: Right.
 - A: The officer with his rifle was here. And this is off, you know, not to scale obviously.

 - A: But, I was standing right next to him.

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Q: Do me a favor, just kind of initial it.

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I sure will.

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Thank you. Alright, I'm sorry, I don't mean to break up your, your.

A: It's okay. Yeah, I was standing in between the officer with the rifle and the vehicle instructing with the PA. I was crouched down using the door as a cover. But because everybody

had firearms and rifles out, including less lethal.

You were covered pretty well.

A: I was covered had confidence, and I still have confidence in my, you know, colleagues'

skills.

A: So I didn't remove my firearm. I began to give instruction. I saw the suspect's body

position was angled where his feet were hanging out of the trunk. His head, his shoulders, and

his torso, and his upper thigh area were mainly in the rear, you know, the compartment of the

trunk. He was manipulating the - the hood of the trunk with his right hand. And he maintained

his left-hand extended. And you could see him, he would make eye contact with me, and well,

not necessarily with me, but in my direction. But he was looking toward us. And you could see

all these emotions that he was experiencing. At one point, it looked like he was crying. And this

is all within less than a minute. He's almost crying, then he's -- he like switched to where he's

like blank stare. Then I instruct him that, you know, if he doesn't show his hand, he's going to

get hit with the less lethal. He gets hit with the less lethal and at that point his facial expression is

rage. He's angry. I see that he contorts his body toward, as if he's gonna exit, but he lifts, it's like

a simultaneous movement where he's lifting up the trunk and he's kinda bringing out his arm. I could see that he had something, but I can't tell you that it was a gun for sure. I assumed it was a

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than a full car length from the rear trunk of the suspect vehicle. We were in very close proximity. And that's about it. Then, somebody instructed, I think it was the sergeant on scene, instructed us to try to remove him from the trunk after we cleared the car and handcuff him. And the, we didn't even, I didn't know that there was still somebody in the car at that point. A head pops up in the rear compartment and I start giving commands in Spanish. And she's shouting, that I don't understand Spanish so then I started speaking English to her. And she said she couldn't move. I said, just step out of you can, just leave your hands up. And she said, I can't move. So, I thought that she must have been hit, but she wasn't. I think she was just paralyzed in fear.

- Let me ask you this, so, the first time you encountered the victims, you were responding to assist
- with the translation with the victims. But the first time you encounter them was when they were
- part of a crowd that was watching what was going on with the, with the traffic stop or the felony
- stop, or what have you. Is that, is that fair to say?
- A: That's fair to say.
- Q: That you didn't interact with them prior to the, the vehicle being stopped?
- A: Correct.
- Q: Right, and you just noticed them because they started walking away.
- A: At well, I think there was an officer.

1 Q: Directing them? 2 I don't know who, directing people to, to move away from the cars. A: 3 O: I gotcha. Right. So you had a brief. 4 A: And so-5 Q: I'm sorry. 6 A: They just started walking and I don't know, can't say who exactly it was but I think there 7 was somebody instructing people to walk so they just all started walking. And I was like, wait a 8 minute. 9 Q: Yeah, find out what's going on? 10 A: Yeah. 11 Is your car depicted here if you know, if you remember? Q: 12 A: I was right here. 13 Q: That was our radio car? 14 This would be 095. A: 15 O: And just go ahead and just put your initials on that one as well. And about where was this 16 victim, these victims I should say? 17 A: Um, when, well, when we pulled up, there's a parking lot. 18 Q: Right. 19 A: I think the parking lot exit is here or here. 20 Q: Right. 21 And they were standing, they were standing one car length away from that driveway. A: 22 Q: Okay. 23 A: So, I, I would say probably about here, the citizens were.

And then they started being directed to, to exit that way?

And they were getting directed to, to walk to walk North on Capp Street toward 21st.

1	Q:	And I, I apologize, I know this is a little repetitious but it's a significant detail so.
2	A:	Absolutely.
3	Q:	Just kinda tell us one more time that you spoke to at least one of the victims, both of
4	them.	
5	A:	Uh-hum.
6	Q:	And, kind of talk us through as to what they were experienced with, with these people
7	and, le	et me ask you this, did they ever indicate to you while you're talking to them, like, that's
8	the car	? I mean, did they say, hey you guys got the right car? Anything like that is what I'm
9	saying	. I know you mentioned something about how they'd been robbed, and they had a gun.
10	Was it	clear to you that they were referring to the car that the police had stopped or what, does it
11	didn't	really get that far in terms of the conversation?
12	A:	In terms of the conversation initial?
13	Q:	Yeah.
14	A:	No.
15	Q:	Okay.
16	A:	That, that wasn't, that wasn't very clear.
L7	Q:	Okay.
18	A:	What was clear was that they flagged down the officers and pointed in the direction of
19	where	the officers did this traffic stop to who robbed them, ran in that direction. So, they, they
20	were v	very consistent with, I flagged down the officer. I told him, you know, I got robbed at
21	gunpo	int in broken English. The, the main victim that I spoke with is only Spanish speaking. His
22	friend,	broken English. So I think he was the instrument with letting the officers know.
23	Q:	Sure.
24	A:	That this robbery just occurred. And from what I understand is, that the officers, they,
25	when 1	they were rolling into the intersection of 21 st and Capp, that it was immediately after the

1	incident. They didn't interrupt the robbery. The victims were already robbed, and they see the
2	patrol car and they run toward the patrol car, flagged the officers down and point in the direction
3	of where the suspect fled on foot.
4	Q: But that wasn't your experience with them? Your interaction was, was after the fact.
5	They didn't point out that vehicle to you.
6	A: They did not point that vehicle out to me, no.
7	Q: Did it seem pretty clear to you that this was gonna be the car that they pointed out or you
8	really weren't sure at that point when you were talking to them?
9	A: When I was talking to them, it wasn't clear.
10	Q: I gotcha. And that was the extent of your interaction was, you know, we got robbed, then
11	was a gun, and we flagged down the cops. And then you took it upon yourself, I think if I
12	understood you correctly, you kinda took a look behind you and you saw all this, somebody was
13	asking for somebody to give commands in Spanish and you took the initiative to, to walk over
14	radio car and start issuing those commands. Is that fair?
15	A: That's fair.
16	Q: Okay. And then you know with, obviously, you've seen your BWC and you've seen
17	some of the media portrayals on TV, so that's a pretty accurate portrayal of what you're the
18	commands you were giving in Spanish?
19	A: Yes.
20	Q: I mean, it sounds pretty clear you were asking all kinds of things.
21	A: Uh-hum.
22	Q: Were you aware, besides the individual in the trunk that you described, that there were
23	other occupants in the vehicle?
24	A: Not until after, not until after there were shots fired.

Okay, so you didn't know that there was anybody else in the car at that point?

1	A:	No.
2	Q:	And when you first take up your position here to start issuing commands in Spanish, you
3	lookin	g at the car. It's immediately apparent to you and again, I'm not trying to put words in
4	your n	nouth, it's the way I heard it.
5	A:	Of course.
6	Q:	That the trunk is, is ajar and there is an individual in that, that that, that vehicle.
7	A:	Yes.
8	Q:	Yes. And was his head pointed in, and you know, if I understand this is gonna be the wes
9	side ea	ast side, was he oriented in his trunk with his head towards the east side of the street or to
10	the we	est side or could you even tell?
11	A:	I could tell.
12	Q:	Okay.
13	A:	His head was here. And his feet were here.
14	Q:	I got you.
15	A:	So his body was kinda angled sideways.
16	Q:	I got it. Actually, you describe it really well about his body movements.
17	A:	And, and his left arm, he was holding the, the trunk open to where you could see his
18	entire	body, his facial expressions, everything, but he wouldn't show his left hand and as he was
19	as he's	s being given the commands initially, I could see just these emotional expressions on his
20	face.	
21	Q:	Right.
22	A:	As if he's having this psychotic episode and wasn't, it's like, he was trying to decide
23	what t	o do.
24	Q:	Cycling through.
25	A:	Cycling, should I just give up? Should I do something.

1	Q:	Just decision makings. I get you.
2	A:	I don't know.
3	Q:	What was your take, I mean, and honestly Inspector with the District Attorney's Office,
4	we ac	tually interviewed the two individuals that came out of the car. And we're still, it's still a
5	myste	ry to us as to how the trunk comes into this whole scenario. So, based on your experience,
6	and yo	ou've been a police officer a long time, does it look like he had jumped himself into the
7	trunk	or when you saw him he was trying to jump out of the trunk? Or I mean, could you make
8	out w	hat exactly he had some kind of plan here, or, you know. Was it clear to you that he had
9	just go	otten into the trunk or was trying to get out of the trunk when the police arrived? Or could
10	you te	211?
11	A:	It didn't appear to me that he was trying to get out of the trunk.
12	Q:	Okay.
13	A:	It appeared to me that the officers may have stopped this vehicle as he was getting into
14	the tru	ınk.
15	Q:	I see. I see.
16	A:	Or, that he was already in the trunk and the car wasn't gonna take off until that trunk was
17	closed	l.
18	Q:	So he's stuck.
19	A:	So that he would fall out, right?
20	Q:	Yeah.
21	A:	That's how it appeared.
22	Q:	Right.
23	A:	I, I don't know, when I arrived, you know, before I arrived, what chain of events
24	occuri	red.
25	Q:	Sure.

1	A: If they had stationed this vehicle away from the victims knowing that the suspect was	
2	gonna run back to the trunk, leaving the trunk open or not.	
3	Q: Yeah, your just, years of experience and-	
4	A: But this is, yes.	
5	Q: You know, dealing with these kind of crimes in the past.	
6	A: Absolutely.	
7	Q: Right.	
8	A: So, you know in, it's not uncommon in robberies that people you know, have more than	
9	one person with them when they commit these.	
10	Q: Involved in a crime, sure.	
11	A: Whether they're sitting in a car waiting. Or, you know, there's two people in the car	
12	waiting, someone hops out. There's three or four people in the car, they all get out. But generally	
13	there's someone that stays in that driver seat as somebody else will get out so that they can	
14	quickly flee.	
15	Q: And you weren't aware at that point, if I remember what you said, that whether there wa	
16	a driver in the car or any other occupants in the car at that point.	
17	A: From my understanding the, the male that was in the rear compartment of the patrol car,	
18	that he was the driver that they had already removed from the car.	
19	Q: But you didn't see that?	
20	A: I didn't see that.	
21	Q: And you weren't aware of that?	
22	A: No, I saw him, as I arrived on scene, I saw that he was in the back of that patrol car.	
23	Q: Oh, okay. Were you able to surmise that that was the guy that had been in the car	
24	previously or you had no idea what his role was?	
25	A: I, I made the assumption that he must have been the driver.	

1 Q: I get it. So you knew somebody had been in the car, yeah. 2 A: But I-3 YS: Did you hear a radio broadcast that, that, you know, where they're making the felony 4 stop, hey we have one in custody and, on the truck, did you hear anything on the radio? 5 A: No because initially when I arrived on scene my focus was directed to the victims and the 6 crowd that was on the right-hand side. 7 YS: Okay. 8 Or, on the west side of the street. So I, I, I kinda, not that I tuned it out, but I wasn't A: 9 focused on the radio transmissions for the stop. 10 O: I get ya. I get ya. So, if, again, I'm just, my memory's not that great but you never saw 11 this individual with an actual gun in his hand as far as you remember? 12 A: The? 13 Q: The guy in the trunk. 14 A: No. The guy in trunk, I didn't. 15 0: Never saw the gun? 16 A: I never saw the gun. 17 Q: Right, but you assumed he had a gun based on the circumstances? 18 A: Correct. 19 O: Right. Did he, could you describe him? I mean was he a young guy, old guy, I mean? 20 A: No, he was a young guy. 21 Q: Okay. 22 A: He looked, he looked like a light complected Latin male. 23 Q: Right. 24 Maybe 25, 26 years old. He didn't look any taller than maybe 5'6". Thin build. He was 25 wearing jeans, a black like, windbreaker style jacket. And he had dark hair. He had dark hair.

1	Q:	Now you said that he kinda looked in your direction and, and you almost, the assumption
2	was m	haybe he was even looking directly at you. Did he say anything to you? Did you hear him
3	talking	g at all?
4	A:	After he was struck with the less lethal beanbag, he became upset and it looked like he
5	yelled	something, but I couldn't make it out. But it was, I'm sorry, it almost sounded like some
6	warrio	or-like, you know, when they take off in movies before they're gonna fight.
7	Q:	Right.
8	A:	It was almost like that. Like he was just like, ah, like angry.
9	Q:	Right.
10	A:	And just like made his decision like no, this is what I'm gonna do and and decided to l
11	guess	pull a gun.
12	Q:	And that was his reaction to the beanbag?
13	A:	That was his reaction to the beanbag, after being struck with that.
14	Q:	And how quickly after that did, did the shooting ensue? I mean, did, is, you mentioned
15	somet	hing that, he looked like he was actually trying to get out of the trunk after he was struck
16	by the	beanbag. Or, had contorted his body in that situate.
17	A:	He had contorted his body as if he was gonna get out.
18	Q:	That's what you interpreted it to be?
19	A:	And - and get into a gunfight.
20	Q:	I got you.
21	A:	Yeah.
22	Q:	But you didn't see the gun, right?
23	A:	I didn't.
24	Q:	And, in, just to.
25	A:	Because I had ducked down.

1	Q:	Oh, fair enough. I was gonna ask if you were watching the guy. Cause it totally makes
2	sense.	
3	A:	Yeah. Absolutely. So.
4	Q:	And you ducked down because of the beanbag?
5	A:	I was already crouched down.
6	Q:	Right.
7	A:	I was already crouched down.
8	Q:	Right.
9	A:	You know, behind the, the passenger door.
10	Q:	Right.
11	A:	To the patrol car. And that's why in my body worn camera footage, cuz we wear it.
12	Q:	Right.
13	A:	To the center that.
14	Q:	Sure.
15	A:	You know, you're seeing.
16	Q:	A door panel?
17	A:	A door panel.
18	Q:	I gotcha. So was.
19	A:	Because I'm looking up here.
20	Q:	Alright, you did a good job.
21	A:	Yeah, okay.
22	Q:	Was his, his physicality what he was doing is what made you duck down. You figured
23	this is	gonna jump off now, is that?
24	A:	Yes.
25	Q:	Is that fair to say?

1	A:	That is fair to say.
2	Q:	So that's why you kinda took your eyes off him cuz you were seeing to your cover at that
3	point?	
4	A:	Yes.
5	Q:	And then, kinda describe the shots if you don't mind. I mean if you can. I mean was it,
6	was the	ere one shot and then a whole bunch of shots? Or a series of shots strung out? Or, I mean
7	just, if	you have, you know.
8	A:	It sounded like fireworks.
9	Q:	Yeah? Was there any break in it though?
10	A:	Nonstop.
11	Q:	Just, it just all took off in one continuous?
12	A:	In, in one continuous.
13	Q:	You couldn't distinguish one particular shot?
14	A:	I couldn't distinguish whether it was the suspect shooting at us or us shooting at him. I
15	couldn	't distinguish.
16	Q:	Right. You know I don't know if you know the crime scene.
17	A:	In my mind, I was thinking, he was shooting at us.
18	Q:	I don't know if you know the crime scene. We took a look at it. It looks like this radio
19	car, if	I remember my recollection. This radio car it, it was struck at least by one round,
20	potenti	ally even two or three. Any awareness of that? Did you hear anything, you know, any
21	metal s	strikes, anything like that? That you could, that you specifically like, whoa, something just
22	hit the	car or anything like that?
23	A:	No, not with the gunfire going off. I couldn't hear. It was, it's so loud.
24	Q:	Is it, was the rifle guy right next to you?
25	A:	The rifle guy's right next to me.

1	Q: Was he, was he firing rounds?	
2	A: Uh-hum.	
3	Q: Okay, so you were probably.	
4	A: It was loud.	
5	Q: Yeah. I can imagine. Let's see there's a lot of questions to ask I'm sure, I'm sure you wil	
6	have a few too. So, so afterwards, he, what do you see? You, when you finally get back and re-	
7	establish a site picture on him, what's going on with him in the trunk?	
8	A: At one point, his body twitches.	
9	Q: Okay.	
10	A: Looks as if he's moving. So I began to verbally give him commands to show his hands. I	
11	becomes clearer, maybe a few seconds later, that he's not moving. Suddenly a, a head pops up in	
12	the rear compartment of the car, it's a female. She's shaking. Her hands are trembling and she's	
13	crying.	
14	Q: Right.

They were trying to get her out of the car and telling her to keep her hands up. Banegas was giving her the commands. She was saying some stuff which I didn't hear but, she was saying something about how she can't move. So eventually they'd said, well if you can't move just keep your hands up. And then so she stayed there in the window with her hands up. And then uh, they got a couple shields and the officers moved up with the shields.

Our objective that day was just to look for 852 suspects or basically plain clothes operations within the Mission District. As we were on South Van Ness, I think, believe around 17th Street, 16th, in that area, we, I heard a call come out over the air from another unit saying that they had – they -contacting a suspicious vehicle occupied with a subjects in it. And there, there was mention over the air about a gun. So we drove on over to that location. I parked my car at 20th and Capp. We walked, I walked to where we saw numerous patrol vehicles with lights on. And just as we get there, I heard over the air that a felony stop on a particular vehicle that was parked on 20th Street. Just south, sorry, parked on Capp Street just south of 20th. As I arrived, I noticed, there was a black colored vehicle uh that was positioned facing Southbound on Capp Street, kind of closer towards the west side of the curb line. And there was multiple vehicles, patrol vehicles, parked

1 right behind it with multiple officers with their guns drawn at the vehicle. When I was looking 2 closer at the car, I noticed that the rear trunk was, was, was partially opened and there was a 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12

person in the rear trunk of the vehicle. At that time, I positioned myself of cover. Being a plain clothes officer, we're trained not to be at the front line just due to safety reasons, in case someone identifies us as a threat. So I position myself uh, a place of cover on the west side sidewalk. I'm sorry, the east side sidewalk of Capp Street, next to an officer and, who, who was right in front of me to the left. And then I remembered there was a patrol car to my right with a person in the back seat of the patrol car. At that time, I remember that Officer Banegas was on the intercom speaking Spanish and I believe what she was doing was trying to get compliance of the subject that was in the trunk of the car. At that time, there was some people down at the end of the block that basically could have been in line of fire. I remember an officer running down there telling them to get out. And the car that I was standing right next to, there was a person in the driver's seat of that vehicle. I told Sergeant Perez, hey there's a person in this car. I believe he's not involved in this thing whatsoever. We just need to get him out of here just to safety. So, got him out of the car, went to safety. I positioned myself behind a patrol car and that's when I hear shots ring out. And I look towards the officer in the vehicle and I saw officers shooting southbound towards the black vehicle that was, that I initially saw where the, the person was in back of the car.



14	Q:	The member being interviewed is Officer Nicholas Nagai, star number 217 who is a
15	named	d officer in this matter. Representing Officer Nagai is?
16	TB:	Tony Brass of 3223 Webster Street San Francisco 94123.
17	Q:	Officer Nagai, have you read the DPA form 293 and the allegation form regarding the
18	allega	tions of misconduct?
19	A:	Yes.
20	Q:	Officer Nagai, because there may be criminal culpability on your part, I want to be
21	certain	n that you understand the following rights. You have the right to remain silent. Anything
22	you sa	y may be used against you in court. You have the right to an attorney before and after
23	questi	oning. Do you understand each of these rights that I've explained to you?
24	A:	Yes.

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1	Q: With these rights in mind would you like to answer my questions now?
2	A: No.
3	Q: Officer Nagai, while you have the right to remain silent criminally, it is a condition of
4	your employment that you answer my questions in this administrative investigation. I work for
5	the Department of Police Accountability of the San Francisco Police Commission. I've been
6	designated by the Police Commission to conduct this investigation. I'm therefore ordering you,
7	on behalf of the Commission to answer my questions in this administrative investigation. If you
8	refuse to answer my questions, your silence my be deemed insubordination and result in
9	administrative discipline including and up to termination of employment. Any statement that yo
10	make under threat of such discipline will you be used for administrative purposes only. It cannot
11	be used against you criminally unless you choose to testify in such a criminal case. Do you
12	understand this order?
13	A: Yes.
14	Q: Officer Nagai, will you answer my questions as ordered at this time?
15	A: Yes.
16	Q: Officer Nagai, earlier I provided you with the DPA administrative interview advisements
17	form which you have signed and returned to me. I will be placing this back into the DPA file.
18	With these advisements in mind is there any reason you can't go forward with the interview at
19	this time?
20	A: No.
21	Q: Tony is there anything you want to add before we start?
22	TB: No, thank you.
23	Q: So this interview is regarding an incident regarding a person with a gun that occurred on
24	March 6, 2018 starting around 10:36 PM at 20 th and Capp Street. The subjects involved in the
25	incident are Mr. Jesus Delgado, who is the decedent, Mr. W.

A: So my partner and I, Officer Santana, were at the Mission Station around that time because midnights usually takes over and we were doing administrative paperwork and checking emails and stuff of that nature. We heard kind of, well I heard kind of excited radio traffic from the 13 Edward, a midnight unit. Just the tone of their voice and the in fluctuation of their voice just made my ears perk up. I did remember hearing them say something about getting waved down about a 211 regarding a possible 221, meaning a robbery involving a person with a gun. And then he called for a code 33. And then, when he called for a code 33, it's a police code meaning give me the air or meaning, no one else talk, I want talk over the air. And then at that point Officer Santana and I sprinted to our department vehicle and activated lights and sirens to where they were at the intersection of 20th and Capp. By the time we got there we parked our vehicle I believe near the intersection of 21st and Capp. Activated our – I activated my BWC. By that time I noticed several officers on scene already with their department issued firearm already drawn out to the point meaning pointing to the possible threat conducting what looked like a pretty standard felony stop. I did notice I believe it was, the driver of the Honda Civic already getting placed into handcuffs and getting put back into a patrol vehicle. And then I did notice that the trunk of the vehicle was already ajar. That there was a suspect inside the vehicle and that's who we were pointing our firearms at. When we were pointing our firearms, I could see, I couldn't see Delgado's face, but you could definitely see his profile of the face and his body. You can also see him holding the latch down or the hood of, hood of the vehicle down with this right arm. And then also his left arm intermittently fishing for something we thought could've been, which in fact was a firearm. The scene was illuminated by streetlamps. I'm

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assuming spotlights and headlights of different patrol vehicles on the scene. There were several officers on scene including myself asking and really yelling at him to show us both of his hands cuz obviously we can see the right hand we couldn't see the left, to no avail. Because the stop was in the Mission four car, which is heavily Hispanic populated, we asked for, someone asked for a Spanish interpreter. Officer Banegas who is a certified Spanish interpreter got on the loudspeaker or the PA and began giving the same commands of "show us your left hand, show us your left hand, show us your hands," to which he was not responding. During that time he was still intermittently fiddling with something with his left hand, which made me feel extremely uneasy because a lot of times when we go to 221 calls they're actually no merit, no gun was seen or there is actually no gun. However, because he's not following commands and the nature of the call I think it made everyone on scene feel super uneasy that there was a imminent danger that could be inside that trunk. So from my independent recollection because he wasn't showing us his hands, there was a beanbag ERIW round that was deployed once that hit the suspect, I think in the right arm region. And then maybe I want to say maybe ten seconds maybe elapsed and the suspect punched out and then fired at least one round to mine and the officers, our direction, to which we returned fire. And then after I think all of us reassessed the situation and saw that the initial threat was over, there was a female – we noticed a female in the backseat of the vehicle who popped her head up. who was hysterically crying and a lot of unintelligible – I couldn't decipher what she was saying. We ordered her out. And then we, I think it was O'Rourke that got a ballistic shield and then I followed behind him. We cleared the trunk. There was no one else in the trunk. And then someone handcuffed the female in the backseat. And then there was also a Pitbull puppy in the backseat as well. But prior to the actual exchange of gunfire, we had no idea that there was a female occupant in the backseat. And then after that I'd say – I noticed that 3 David 113 and the David 105, Sergeants Caldera and Perez were also on scene. And then the David, I believe it was the 203 retired Lieutenant Banta also took charge of the situation.

7	Q:	Do you carry a backup weapon?	
8	A:	No.	
9	Q:	Was your gun full loaded?	
10	A:	Yes.	
11	Q:	How many bullets did you have on you when you started your shift?	
12	A:	So there's three magazines, 12 rounds each. And then one in the chamber so 37.	
13	Q:	Okay and were you carrying any extra magazines.	
14	A:	No.	
15	Q;	Were you in a vehicle that day of the incident?	
16	A:	Yes.	
17	Q:	What was that type of vehicle?	
18	A:	It's a police wagon number 599.	
19	Q:	Now were you the driver or the passenger of that vehicle?	
20	A:	Passenger.	
21	Q:	And where was Officer Santana's position in that vehicle?	
22	A:	Driver.	
23	Q:	What equipment did you have in that vehicle?	
24	A:	Just us really.	
25	TT:	Any department issued shotguns or anything that you or Officer Santana-	
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1	A:	No, there's no racks for that in a police wagon.
2	Q:	Okay and other than what we just talked about the ERIW, were there any other less lethal
3	options in that vehicle?	
4	A:	No.
5	Q:	Who was your supervisor during this incident?
6	A:	The PC that night was Lieutenant Banta.
7	TT:	What does that mean, PC?
8	A:	Platoon Commander
9	Q:	In regards to your training and experience, what type of training have you received
10	regarding felony traffic stops?	
11	A:	Training in the SF Police Academy.
12	Q:	What training have you received regarding barricaded suspects?
13	A:	Same kind of training in the police academy
14	Q:	Have you received any training regarding suspects in trunks?
15	A:	Uh-
16	Q:	Like any scenarios at any point. Maybe in Academy anything like that?
17	A:	I mean when we are told to deal with routine traffic stops we always kind of well we're
18	taught to touch and then kind of tug on the trunk prior to making contact with the driver.	
19	Q:	Again, what is the purpose of doing that?
20	A:	One, it puts our fingerprints on the actual car itself. In case, you know, things go array
21	and they take off, or if I get injured because of that car, or if they shoot at me as I'm at the	
22	windo	w, my fingerprints are on that car and again to make sure that no one else is gonna pop out
23	and-	
24	TB:	I never heard that.
25	TT:	I know.
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1	Q:	Again, what type of training have you received regarding armed suspects?
2	A:	Whatever they teach us in the police academy.
3	Q:	And what type of training have you received regarding tactical considerations and patrol
4	techni	ques?
5	A:	Police academy.
6	Q:	And what type of training had you received regarding tactical considerations in crimes
7	involving several subjects that may require multiple contact officers and cover officers.	
8	A:	Police academy.
9	Q:	Do you speak any other languages?
10	A:	Yeah.
11	Q:	What do you speak?
12	A:	Spanish
13	Q:	Are you DHR certified?
14	A:	Yes.
15	Q:	Now at the range what firearms are you certified to use?
16	A:	My department issued firearm, shotgun and ERIW.
17	Q:	What about the rifle?
18	A:	No.
19	Q:	Okay. And have you received CIT training?
20	A:	Yes.
21	Q:	Do you remember when that was?
22	A:	Critical Incident Training?
23	Q:	Yeah. Oh do you remember when that was?
24	A:	Oh I think when we – it was either before or after FTO, but it was shortly after we either
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1 graduated or fully completed our training process after graduating the academy. So that was 2 either late 2015 or early 2016. 3 TT: But before this incident? 4 A: Before the incident, correct. 5 Q: Have you received advanced officer training? 6 A: Yes. 7 O: Do you remember when that was? 8 A: No. 9 O: Have you received de-escalation training? 10 A: Not to my recollection. If that was a part of CIT which it could've been maybe, but I 11 don't know. 12 0: Okay have you received any training on crisis negotiation? 13 A: Uh, no. 14 Okay so I'm gonna show you a couple of pictures here. So first I want to show this to you O: so if you could do me a favor and put your today's date, which is the 30th, your name and star 15 16 number in the lower left-hand corner. That might be easier. So if you can with this, I just want 17 you to show me and I'm not sure if it's going to be indicated on here, but could you show me I 18 guess where your vehicle was during this incident that you arrived on scene in. 19 TT: So just circle-20 O: If it's on there just circle it. 21 I mean I think we were more – I think we kind of blocked traffic. A: 22 O: Uh-huh. 23 A: So I would say it's probably somewhere over here. 24 O: Okay could you indicate that with a circle where you estimate it could be and then put 25 your initials by it.

1	Q:	All right thank you very much. Do you need to snap a picture?	
2	TB:	TB: Oh yeah I guess I can.	
3	Q:	Q: For consistency.	
4	TB:	Thanks.	
5	Q:	Officer Nagai, you were talking about earlier but again just to clarify, what were you	
6	doing prior to your response to the area of 20 th and Capp Street?		
7	A:	Administration paperwork.	
8	Q:	And again why did you respond to 20th and Capp Street?	
9	A:	Just because another unit pretty much on-viewed, or someone waved them down	
LO	regarding a robbery regarding a possible gun. And the fact that they called a code 33 kind of		
11	alerted me that something emergent was unfolding pretty rapidly.		
12	Q:	Okay and what information did you receive prior to responding to that call?	
13	A:	Whatever dispatch was putting out. I didn't get on there – we didn't get on the air just	
L4	because we wanted to leave the air open for the unit that pretty much on-viewed what was going		
15	on.		
16	Q:	Did you guys discuss any tactics or plans with any other officers before you got on	
17	scene?		
18	A:	No.	
19	Q:	So were you one of the first officers to arrive on scene?	
20	A:	No. Well, I mean, there was plenty of officers there. I mean there wasn't any other	
21	districts coming but I mean after the shooting there was a ton of cops that obviously came. So in		
22	that sense yeah, but there was, from Mission we were one of the last people.		
23	Q:	Okay so when you rolled up on scene, do you remember who was there?	
24	A:	Not everyone, no.	
25	Q:	Okay.	

1	TT:	To the best of your recollection what officers did you recognize upon your arrival at the
2	scene.	
3	A:	Ishida was to my right. I believe Cody was to his right. And then I did see Tupper at the
4	vehicle	e, the one, then Banegas who was giving commands. But other than that I wasn't really my
5	focus a	at the time.
6	Q:	Now who was the highest-ranking officer on scene at the time?
7	A:	Probably, I mean either, both of the sergeants Caldera or Perez.
8	TT:	Prior to the shooting?
9	A:	I'd say Perez or Caldera. I'm not sure when they actually got to the scene, if it was before
LO	or after the shooting.	
11	TT:	Okay.
12	Q:	Not when you arrived on scene were you concerned about cover or lack of cover?
13	A:	At that time no. In retrospect, yes.
14	Q:	And who was providing lethal cover at that time?
15	A:	Pretty much every officer that was, had their firearms pointing at the suspect.
16	Q:	Can you recall which officers specifically?
17	A:	No.
18	Q:	And how would you describe your role during this whole incident?
19	A:	Just as any, everyone else that had their firearms drawn. Just making sure I don't die, or
20	my co-workers die.	
21	TT:	Okay and going back you said in retrospect you would be concerned about the lack of
22	cover.	Can you explain that a little bit?
23	A:	I mean looking back on things I didn't have I was the cover I guess you could say.
24	Which	is not a really good feeling to have I guess but I think my – my train of thought with that
25	is whe	re I set up is where I set up and I didn't wanna turn my attention away from that trunk with

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let Banegas and whoever else was taking lead to give out commands, so it wasn't just everyone,
too many chefs in the kitchen type situation where everyone is just yelling. It just would get
overwhelming. I just wanted Banegas to be the one giving commands in English and in Spanish.

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Q: Now at what point did you draw your handgun?

So it would be very clear, very concise and that was that.

A: Pretty much when I got on scene and then realized that everyone else had their firearms already drewn or drawn out. And that, when I noticed that this was being conducted like a felony stop.

Q: Okay. Now where was Mr. when you arrived on scene?

1	A:	He was already getting walked back to a patrol car.
2	Q:	Now where was Mr. Duarte?
3	A:	Is that Adolfo?
4	Q:	That's the decedent, yeah.
5	A:	Okay he was in the trunk.
6	Q:	And what's he doing during, at this point?
7	A:	Holding the trunk lid down with his right arm and then fishing for something with his left
8	that he	e was not revealing to everyone on scene.
9	Q:	Now can you just describe how his body was positioned in that trunk?
10	A:	He was in a, kind of like a hunched position on his back to where the right side of his
11	body was closest to us.	
12	Q:	What direction is his head pointing? If you 're looking at -
13	A:	Eastbound.
14	Q:	Okay.
15	TT:	If we can go back, what does it me an to be a cover officer?
16	A:	So I guess when you know we go deal with I guess let's say a person with a knife, they
17	will be less lethal cover hopefully with the beanbag round. And then a lethal cover officer. We	
18	want to send I guess the less lethal first and then always have a lethal cover in case the person, if	
19	we deploy a ERIW round and that person still charges at the officer with the less lethal round	
20	already drawn up and is about to you know cause great bodily injury to one of my co-workers,	
21	then that lethal cover will have to use a higher gravity of force.	
22	TT:	So what are you covering and who are you covering basically?
23	A:	I wasn't really considering myself as like – I wasn't really playing, that wasn't really like
24	my thought process when I was on scene. My thought process was this guy is making everyone	
25	on scene nervous. We got called on scene regarding someone with a gun. And it is being treated	

1 as such. I don't have anything else on my body. I'm not gonna throw my baton at someone with 2 someone possibly having a gun. So my firearm is pointed at him because he in fact had a gun. 3 TT: And what is a felony stop? 4 A: Just a term that we use I guess in the department but it's a widely I guess known police 5 term used. If -- let's say we run a vehicle and the computer return turns up that the vehicle is 6 wanted or involved in "felony" they will conduct a traffic stop but we'll probably also ask for 7 back up. And we will treat it as if that person is armed and dangerous. So we will routinely point 8 our firearms at the individuals inside the vehicle and take everyone into custody until we could 9 deem either it's no merit or if indeed there's actually contraband weapons or paraphernalia in the 10 car that person shouldn't be having. 11 O: Okay could you describe the lighting conditions during this incident? 12 A: Yeah it was nighttime. So it was streetlamps, headlights from the patrol vehicles and 13 spotlights. 14 TT: Weather conditions if you recall? 15 A: Not raining. There's no fog. It was pretty unobstructed. 16 O: What about any lighting in the suspect vehicle. I'm not sure what the correct term - is it 17 dome light. It's the light inside your car, was that on? 18 A: In our vehicle? 19 O: No, in the suspect's vehicle 20 A: I don't know. 21 Q: What about any lighting inside the trunk of the vehicle? Other than the artificial light. 22 I don't recall. A: 23 Q: Okay. And how was your visibility of this vehicle? 24 A: Unobstructed.

1	1 Q; Were you able to see the color make	and the model of the vehicle?
2	2 A: Black Honda Civic.	
3	³ Q: Mr. Duarte, how would you describe	e his attitude or demeanor during this incident?
4	4 A: I couldn't see his face so I can't real	ly, I can't speak on that.
5	Did he speak at any point during this	s incident?
6	6 A: I mean after I watched the video you	can hear him as he's punching out he says, "fuck
7	you" and then lets off a round, at least one.	
8	8 TT: And to you what was the tone of his	voice when he said, "fuck you"?
9	9 A: Like angry. That he wanted to kill on	r cause anyone harm that was dealing with him.
10	Q: Okay and you touched on his before	looking at those exhibits but again, just want to
11	make sure that we are clear. Approximately	how far away were you from Mr. Duarte?
12	12 A: I'd say 15 to 20 feet.	
13	Q: Now can you just describe the environment	onment for me where this whole incident happened?
14	What's going on in the background, where	are you? Things like that.
15	A: Parked cars on either side of the stre	et. Capp Street is a pretty narrow residential street.
16	Heavily Hispanic populated. So I did notice	that you know if you lived on that street and if you
17	live on a second story apartment building an	nd if your window faces the street, you have a pretty
18	unobstructed front row seat of what was occ	curring,
19	\mathbb{Q} : Okay what about, was there any, wh	at about pedestrian foot traffic during that area that
20	night?	
21	A: I do remember like people walking u	up to the scene and then officers yelling at them like
22	get out of here. This is not – this is not a go	od situation.
23	Q: And do you remember how many un	nits were on scene during this incident?
24	24 A: No.	

There's various defensive tactics I guess that we learn in the police academy.

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A:

- Q: Okay and what are some of those for example?
- A: To take people out of vehicles.
- Q: Yeah non-compliant vehicles.
- A: We don't, it's usually not that kind of a scenario but it's usually kind of, if we're face to face type combat but not particularly extracting people in vehicles.
 - Q: Okay now what are you trained to do when you're at a location of disadvantage in relation to the suspect?
- A: Sorry, can you repeat that?
- Q: Yeah what are you trained to do when you are at a location of disadvantage in relation to the suspect?
- A: Usually, find a better place of cover.
- Q: What are you trained to do when a suspect is in a trunk or more general a confined space?
- A: I would say we didn't receive training on per se people in trunks. However, we're dealt with, we're trained on how to deal with suspects during felony stops and to go through our escalation of the use of force scale. And I think everyone on scene, we attempted to use verbal commands and that didn't get us anywhere. We're too out of range for OC spray to reach anything. Because the nature of the call was someone with a gun we created some sort of ample distance or bubble between us and the vehicle. And we're not gonna send someone up with a baton to try and use physical blows to try and get this guy into custody. So in a sense we're trained to handle each situation as the same situation, however this guy just ended up being in a trunk. So I guess to weirdly answer your question, we don't receive training regarding people in trunks. However, we're we just have to, it's like dealing with someone in a narrow hallway in the SRO or something and you gotta deal with what you're dealt with so —

Yeah, so did you discuss any tactics or plans with other offices when Mr. Duarte was

3	Q:	Okay. Again you touched on it earlier but again just want to make sure we're clear. Wer
4	verbal	commands given to Mr. Duarte?

7	A:	Many officers on scene including myself.
8	Q:	Okay. Do you remember what those specific commands were?
9	A:	Show us your hands. Stop reaching. And then, excuse me, I could hear Santana on the
LO	other s	side saying like "open the trunk, open the trunk. Show us your hands. Show us your left
11	hand."	Then that was the same with Officer Banegas.
12	TT:	Are you giving your commands in English or Spanish?
13	A:	English.
14	Q:	Now as these commands are being given to Mr. Duarte, how is he responding?
15	A:	I mean I couldn't see facial expressions but-
16	TB:	You couldn't see facial?
17	A:	No.
18	TB:	Okay.
19	A:	I, other than him not showing us his left hand that was I guess the only response I could
20	see.	
21	TT:	Now how much time has passed from when you first arrived to when you started giving
22	comm	ands Mr. Duarte in the trunk, if you recall?
23	A:	I don't recall. I mean as soon as I – as soon as I saw that right hand I'm like okay well
24	that's	one safe because in the academy we're taught that hands can kill. Because when people
25	are, yo	ou know got their hands in their waistband or their hoodie pocket. Like they could possibly

1	have something that they won't show then they're usually is a reason for that. So when he wasn't			
2	showi	showing us that left hand that was, that's when it was making us feel uneasy and I was yelling at		
3	him "	him "Stop reaching, Stop reaching." And it was probably two or three times that that at least		
4	happe	ned		
5	TT:	So would you say it was like less than 15 minutes you were on scene? Less than 10? Five		
6	minut	es just if you can recall?		
7	A:	I mean it's probably less than 15 minutes.		
8	Q:	Where were you positioned when you gave Mr. Duarte verbal commands?		
9	A:	Where was I positioned?		
10	Q:	Yeah where were you positioned?		
11	A:	Where I marked on the paper.		
12	Q:	And did you know that there was someone in the backseat of that vehicle?		
13	A:	No.		
14	Q:	When did you become aware that someone was in the backseat of that vehicle?		
15	A:	After the initial firing.		
16	Q:	And did someone inform you of that?		
17	A:	No, I saw her head pop up from the backseat.		
18	Q:	Now how long into the incident until you realized there was a person in the backseat of		
19	that vehicle?			
20	A:	After the threat was eliminated.		
21	Q:	And if you can approximate in regards to time.		
22	A:	I'd say less than a minute.		
23	Q:	Did you inform any other officers that there was female in the backseat of the vehicle?		
24	A:	No.		
25				

1	Q:	Were verbal commands given to Ms.
2	A:	Yes.
3	Q:	What were they?
4	A:	I think they were given in both English and in Spanish and then I think she ended up
5	finally	saying I don't speak Spanish. So then she was given commands in English to just always
6	- show	w us your hands. I think she came up like this and she was crying. I couldn't understand
7	what s	she was saying but yeah.
8	Q:	When were those commands given?
9	A:	as soon as we, I think, I don't think anyone on scene realized that there was a female in
10	the ba	ckseat. So when she popped up that was – put us on edge again like does she have a gun
11	too. So we just wanted to make sure that she was brought out in compliance.	
12	Q:	Were those specific commands as they're related to her, were they given before shots
13	were fired or were they given after shots were fired?	
14	A:	After.
15	Q:	Okay and did you specifically give any commands to her?
16	A:	No.
17	Q:	Now you touched on it earlier, now you said if I'm understanding correctly that many of
18	the of	ficers on scene didn't realize that she was in the back of the vehicle. Did I understand you
19	correctly?	
20	A:	From what it seemed like I don't think anyone realized that – I mean I don't want to
21	speak on behalf of my co-workers.	
22	Q:	Right, right.
23	A:	But I don't think anyone was allotted an angle to visually see the backseat.
24	Q:	Okay and why is that?
25	A:	That just wouldn't be tactically sound.

1	Q:	Okay.
2	A:	Yeah.
3	TT:	Why?
4	A:	Just because the initial threat that we could see that was alerting all of us on scene was in
5	that tru	ank. So if you're further up on the vehicle you're not able to see what is actually
6	happer	ning in the trunk.
7	Q:	Now you touched on it earlier but again just to clarify, when you're providing cover how
8	close a	are you to the suspect vehicle?
9	A:	15-20 feet away I guess.
LO	Q:	And who was next to you, anyone?
11	A:	Officer Ishida.
12	Q:	And where are they, on your left on your right?
13	A:	I believe it was on my right.
14	Q:	Okay. Anyone else you can recall to your direct left or right?
15	A:	Retrospect it was Cody, I think.
16	Q:	Where are they positioned? Where are they located at?
17	A:	I think he was to the right of Ishida.
18	Q:	Okay now when Officer Banegas is on the bullhorn giving commands, how did Mr.
19	Duarte respond to that?	
20	A:	I don't know. Other than not showing us both of his hands.
21	Q:	Now at any point during this incident did you change position?
22	A:	After I shot I think I went to a knee for some reason. I don't - I don't tactically I don't
23	know	why but I think it was more instinctually.

1	Q:	Now again as commands are giving are being given in Spanish is your firearm drawn at
2	that po	pint?
3	A:	Yes.
4	Q:	And did you retrieve an ERIW from your vehicle?
5	A:	No.
6	Q:	And why is that?
7	A:	We didn't have one.
8	TT:	How is your firearm positioned when you had it drawn?
9	A:	Pointed directly at the trunk.
10	Q:	How close were you to Mr. Duarte when Officer Santana fired the ERIW?
11	A:	I didn't move position from where I shot from.
12	Q:	Were any warnings given by Officer Santana before he fired the ERIW?
13	A:	I don't remember.
14	Q:	Did any other officers give Mr. Duarte a warning that they were going to use the ERIW
15	A:	I mean I did hear Santana yell out red light, red light less lethal. But it's a standard
16	command that we were trained to use when the ERIW is about to be deployed	
17	Q:	What is the purpose of doing that? What is the purpose of saying that?
18	A:	That it's out and ready so let's exhaust this type of force before anything else goes
19	further.	
20	TT:	Now as you're pointing your gun at the suspect in the trunk, who you believe to be the
21	suspect, is your finger on the trigger and then when you hear the ERIW commands does your	
22	positio	on of your weapon change as well?
23	A:	I don't know if my finger was already on the trigger the whole time. It was probably on
24	the fra	me of the pistol.
25		

1	TT:	And is that how you're trained?
2	A:	Yeah. I mean it's – it's cuz I mean you know you could hear backfire of a car and a loud
3	noise	and just kinda get excited and pull the trigger if your trigger is already behind the trigger
4	guard.	I'm not sure when I actually – if it was before that my finger was already -
5	Q:	Now how many ERIW rounds did Officer Santana fire at Mr. Duarte?
6	A:	I believe it was just one.
7	Q:	How did Mr. Duarte respond after being shot with the ERIW?
8	A:	From his response I don't think he liked it very much. I did see it make contact. I think it
9	was hi	is right upper arm region, but it only took maybe I would say 10 to 20 seconds after that for
10	him to	o fire at us. So –
11	Q:	Okay now did he communicate verbally after being shot with the ERIW?
12	A:	The only the fuck you was what I could distinguish.
13	TT:	Did you see Mr. Duarte's body move in any way when he was shot with the ERIW?
14	A:	I, I mean any natural response of getting hit with something like that was kind of like, his
15	body just took it. And-	
16	TB:	Flinch or twitch or something?
17	A:	Yeah like, I mean a big flinch because those things they don't feel good.
18	TT:	And did you hear him make a sound or anything like that?
19	A:	Not to, I can't recall.
20	TT:	Okay.
21	Q:	Now from what you recall of the officers that were on scene, who was closer to Mr.,
22	Duarte	e?
23	A:	From the officers on scene?
24	Q:	Yeah from you can remember which of the officers on scene?
25	A:	I don't. I don't know.

	Q:	Did you move prior to Mr. Duarte being shot with the ERIW?
2	A:	No. Where I set up I didn't move from that location.
3	Q:	Okay. And did you view Mr. Duarte prior to and after he was shot with the ERIW?
4	A:	Uh Did I view him?
5	Q:	Yeah, so like are your eyes on him the entire time?
6	A:	Yeah, yeah.
7	Q:	You know what I'm saying?
8	A:	Yes.
9	Q;	Okay. Can you just describe what you saw when verbal commands were given to Mr.
10	Duarte?	
11	A:	I mean same things I described earlier. I didn't see, I couldn't see his face. So I couldn't

20	independent recollection I don't remember seeing like a muzzle flash or anything.	
21	TT:	What made you believe that the gun was being pointed in your direction?
22	A:	I mean I didn't think that it was pointed at me, but I mean being in something like that I
23	know	that it was coming toward, it wasn't coming from, to my left or my right. It was coming
24	from d	lownrange coming at us so-
25		

1	TT:	And who do you mean by us?
2	A:	The police.
3	TT:	And the ones that were in the front with you or the ones that you know to be next yo you?
4	A:	Correct yeah correct.
5	Q:	Now was your handgun double action mode?
6	A:	Yes.
7	Q:	Was your firearm in the cocked position?
8	A:	No.
9	Q:	Okay do you remember which officers fired their handguns?
10	A:	No.
11	TT:	What is double action mode?
12	A:	So there's a – our pistols are double to single action. So the first shot it is a harder trigger
13	pull just to in a sense I think it's manufactured that way to make sure you want to shoot	
14	whate	ver your about to shoot. And then every other round after that the trigger pull is single
15	action	, meaning that the trigger pull is going to be a lot lighter. And to then give you easier
16	access to eliminate whatever threat you're trying to terminate.	
17	Q:	Did you see any other officers fire their handguns?
18	A:	I wasn't paying attention to that but yes there were other officers that fired.
19	TT:	So at the time that you're firing your weapon, your focus is on?
20	A:	The trunk.
21	TT:	The trunk. So you don't actually – do you see anyone else at that time firing their gun?
22	A:	No.
23	TT:	Do you know hear gunshots though as you're firing your weapon?
24	A:	Yes.
25		

1	Q:	Now was your view ever obstructed when you fired your handgun?
2	A:	No.
3	Q:	Now, did you hear gunfire prior to seeing gunfire?
4	A:	Yeah his firing at us.
5	Q:	Okay and how did you respond when you heard the gun fire?
6	A:	Immediately returned fire.
7	Q:	And when did you stop firing your weapon?
8	A:	When I noticed that there was no more firing coming from the trunk and it appeared that
9	the thr	eat was over.
10	TT:	How long did you hear gunfire?

15	A:	At the suspect in the trunk.
16	Q:	Did you move while firing your weapon?
17	A:	I'm sorry.
18	Q:	Did you move while firing your weapon?
19	A:	I think I took a couple of – I was firing. I'm not sure if I took the step back during or
20	after. But I did move back a couple of steps and I went to a knee for whatever – I don't know	
21	why but yeah.	
22	Q:	Do you know how many rounds you fired.
23	A:	No.
24	Q:	Do you know how many magazines you used?
25	A:	Whatever was in the round in the firearm.

1 Q: How close were you to Mr. Duarte when you opened fire? 2 A: The same spot that I was at-3 TT: And that would be 15 to 20 feet away approximately? 4 A: Approximately yeah. 5 Q: How would you describe your sequence of fire? Was it pairs, bursts, rapid succession, 6 how would you describe it? 7 A: I don't recall. 8 Q: Did you use a spare weapon? A: No. 10 Q: Did you notice if any other officers when they fired their handguns were moving while 11 they were firing at Mr. Duarte? 12 A: No. 13 Q: Now where there any pedestrians nearby when gunshots were fired? 14 A: I don't know. 15 O: And again how close were you to Mr. Duarte when Officers fired their handguns? 16 A: How close was I? 17 O: Yeah approximately how close were you? 18 A: Same spot. 19 O: And again you said that was 15-20 feet? 20 A: Approximately yeah. 21 Q: And again talk about when you fired your handgun, who was next to you? 22 I believe Officer Ishida. A: 23 Q: Okay anyone else other than Officer Ishida? 24 A: I think Tupper was to my left, but I believe he was using a rifle that day.

1	TT: Do you know if, did you hear any gunshots from behind you?
2	A: No and that's kind of why I didn't wanna move because I didn't know if people were
3	behind me. That's why I where I set up is where I set up and I didn't wanna turn my head or
4	my gaze elsewhere I mean.
5	Q: Okay and what did you do after you stopped firing?
6	A: Assessed the trunk to see if there was still movement coming from the trunk which their
7	wasn't. So I didn't fire anymore.
8	TT: Are you still in your same position 15 to 20 feet away approximately?
9	A: Maybe a couple of steps back after that.
10	Q: Okay.
11	A: Actually, I might've moved a little bit more to the right but -
12	Q: And when the gunshots stopped from other officers what did you do? So you stopped
13	firing, but after the other officers stopped firing what did you do?
14	A: Kind of just checked ourselves, meaning I checked our bodies to make sure that ourselve
15	and our co-workers weren't actually hit because we have so much adrenaline pumping.
16	TT: So you're touching yourself. And do you go and touch other officers or?
17	A: Yeah, I mean I did hear O'Rourke yelling out "Check yourself, check yourself." He's an
18	army ranger so he's – kind of his training kicked in. But yeah so you know just clicked, you
19	good, you good. Make sure no one was injured.
20	Q: Tinetta was talking about hearing gunshots coming from behind. But other than, you
21	know, addressing that do you know where any other gunshots were coming from during this
22	incident?
23	A: Other than us that fired and the trunk, no.

1	Q:	Now how long is this incident from when you arrived on scene till when the shooting
2	happen	ned?
3	A:	I don't know.
4	Q:	Now how would you describe Mr. Duarte's body positioning after the shooting?
5	A:	I believe he was still on his back. Don't remember
6	Q:	Now was a 408 requested?
7	A:	Yes.
8	Q:	Do you know who requested it?
9	A:	No.
10	TT:	What is a 408?
11	A:	An ambulance.
12	Q:	And did you speak to anyone at the scene after the shooting?
13	A:	Yeah. Notified sergeants on scene and then also Lieutenant Banta.
14	Q:	What was the conversation between you and Lieutenant Banta?
15	A:	He was just asking who shot so we all kind of huddled around him. And then he said, he
16	was co	ordinating people to give us rides back to the station and telling us to spread out and don't
17	talk.	
18	Q:	Again, so what happened after Lieutenant Banta arrived on scene?
19	A:	I got driven back to Mission Station. I sat down in the report writing room and waited for
20	further	instruction.
21	Q:	Who took you back to Mission Station?
22	A:	That I don't remember.
23	Q:	Okay. Do you remember was there anyone else with you when you were taken back to
24	Missio	n Station, any other officers involved in this?
25	A:	Yeah.

1	Q:	Who was that?
2	A:	I don't remember.
3	TT:	What's going through your mind as you're on that ride back to Mission station?
4	A:	That lucky to be alive and it was a pretty traumatic experience I'd say. Yeah, I mean it
5	was th	e first time in, at least and the only time since that incident that I've had to be involved in
6	somet	hing like that. So I guess it's not a normal experience for anyone to be in and I was just
7	thankf	ful to leave that scene safe.
8	Q:	Did you provide a public safety statement?
9	A:	I believe I did at Mission Station. With who, I don't remember.
10	Q:	What happened to your weapon?
11	A:	It was taken by one of the armorers from the range.
12	Q:	What happened to your magazines?
13	A:	I believe they were seized as well.
14	Q:	Do you know how many bullets you fired?
15	A:	No.
16	Q:	Were you given a replacement for your Sig Sauer?
17	A:	Yes.
18	TT:	When?
19	Q:	When? Go ahead.
20	A:	I think right after.
21	Q;	Do you remember who gave it to you?
22	A:	I want to say it was Officer Lee who was one of the two armorers for our police range.
23	Q:	Now when you were at Mission Station were you separated and monitored?
24	A:	Yes.
25		

1	Q;	And when you were at Mission Station were you still in possession of your BWC?	
2	A;	Yes.	
3	Q:	Did anyone retrieve that from you at any point?	
4	A:	I think we I think we docked 'em, meaning that we put 'em back to upload.	
5	Q:	Did someone advise you to do that?	
6	A:	I don't remember. I don't know if someone took it and then docked it or I don't	
7	remember.		
8	TT:	And when you're at Mission Station where were you placed or where did they tell you to	
9	wait?		
10	A:	They told us all to, if you see someone go to a different spot. I chose the report writing	
11	room and that was that.		
12	TT:	Is that one the first or second floor?	
13	A:	First floor.	
14	Q:	Were you injured as a result of this incident?

23	A:	I'd say, I mean I don't know exactly maybe a half hour or something.	
24	TT:	And what's going through your mind as you're waiting?	
25	A:	Like my parents are going to freak out.
