The above immate suffered an injury during his arrest a few weeks ago. He was taken to SFGH and examined. He was told that if he had any problems with his eyesight it could mean the he had a detached retina and should be brought back to SFGH immediately. On June 19th he contacted our office and claimed that he was having trouble seeing and his medical requests were not being met. I contacted Lt. Butler at CJ3 and she informed me that he was set to go back to SFGH in the beginning of the week. Contacted me again on June 26th and informed me that he was not yet taken to the hospital. I called Lt. Butler again and was informed that he was actually scheduled to go to SFGH the beginning of this week. She apologized for the misunderstanding.

Today called me and told me that his eyesight is getting worse by the day and when he went to SFGH he sat there from 9:30am till after 5:00pm and was not seen. Upon his return he was rehoused at CJ7.

Chris, please see if there is any way in which we can facilitate immedical in receiving appropriate medical attention as it is my understanding that a detached retina is a serious matter and he may lose sight in the affected eye.

THE SIGN BEAD HIT IT HERE JR! FOR KEN GRIFFEY JR. IVAS: The one that was holding me and kicking the feet 15 from underneath me, he was approximately Mister Donohue's size-16 17 McMahon, I'm sorry. INV. IVAS: Uh-huh. 18 Wearing glasses, a baseball hat. 19 INV. IVAS: And was he wearing a uniform or not wearing a 20 uniform? 21 He wasn't wearing a uniform. 22 INV. This is in 18 reference to police case number 980 732 262. 19 tell me what you saw earlier tonight. 20 At about 9:50 p.m., I was in the area 21 of section 23, lower. I heard a verbal altercation going on. I 22 left to see what was occurring and observed a Latin male in dark 23 clothing confronting two police officers. At that point, he 24 violently shoved an officer, who was later told to me to be 25 Officer Moser. He violently shoved Officer Moser into a cement 26 column, and the officer struck the back of his head on the cement 27 column. At that point, he fell without reflex, without trying to

catch himself. He appeared to be possibly stunned or unconscious 1 at that point, and he fell and struck his head on the metal side of a seat in section 23. 3 I then approached the suspect and the officer, who later was 4 told to be Officer Cheung, and assisted Officer Cheung, along 5 with my partner, [unintelligible]. 6 SERGEANT: Sure. [I'll grab paper]. [Unintelligible conversation.] 8 Okay, yeah. 9 Okay, go ahead. SERGEANT: 10 , and we assisted 11 12 Officer Cheung in handcuffing the suspect at that point. 13 SERGEANT: Okay. But I also do know that alcohol is unfortunately, very prevalent, and used, and in consumption, out at the ballpark. And as pleasant as things can be out there, it can be just as ugly sometimes, especially, like I said, a team that is in strong contention for a first-place with the Giants; a team like the Dodgers. I do know that the officers are easily outnumbered by several hundred to a couple of thousand to one, and that the officers are sometimes at the mercy of the crowd, depending on the mood of the crowd. For the most part, people do come to our aid or our assistance when it's necessary or required, as in this case.

The severity of the injury to the officer was, I'm sure, on the mind of the officers at that time, especially that Ian has worked with Officer Moser for a few years at Southern Station, so they have maybe a closer relationship than other officers at the scene that day, not that they're any less concerned, but Ian and Bobby worked together for a while. Based on that relationship, I can see where things are not as clear as they would have liked them to be for Officer Furminger on that occasion. So, I just wanted to indicate that point, and I appreciate the time to say that.

INV. IVAS: And just for the purposes of the tape,
Officer Furminger's hair is distinctly not red, it's dark brown,
and has it always been dark brown?

OFC. FURMINGER: Yes.
