






GENERAL ORDER

Rev. 10/04/95

USE OF FORCE

The purpose of this order is to set forth the circumstances under which officers may resort to the use of force. The order also outlines procedures for reporting and evaluating incidents involving the use of force.

I. POLICY

- A. It is the policy of the San Francisco Police Department to accomplish the police mission as effectively as possible with the highest regard for the dignity of all persons and with minimal reliance upon the use of physical force. The use of physical force shall be restricted to circumstances authorized by law and to the degree minimally necessary to accomplish a lawful police task.
- B. Officers are frequently confronted with situations where control must be exercised to effect arrests and to protect the public safety. Control may be achieved through advice, warnings, and persuasion, or by the use of physical force. While the use of reasonable physical force may be necessary in situations that cannot be otherwise controlled, force may not be resorted to unless other reasonable alternatives have been exhausted or would clearly be ineffective under the particular circumstances.
- C. Officers are permitted to use whatever force is reasonable and necessary to protect others or themselves, but no more. The purpose of this policy is not to restrict officers from using sufficient force to protect themselves or others, but to provide general guidelines under which force may be used. If exceptional circumstances occur which are not contemplated by this order, officers should use any force reasonably necessary to protect themselves or others; however, they must be able to articulate the reasons for employing such force.

D. CATEGORIES OF FORCE TO EMPLOY (IN ASCENDING ORDER OF GRAVITY)

- 1. When the use of force is necessary and appropriate, officers shall, to the extent possible, utilize an escalating scale of options and not employ more forceful measures unless it is determined that a lower level of force would not be adequate, or such a level of force is attempted and actually found to be inadequate. The scale of options, in order of increasing severity, is set forth below:
 - a. Verbal Persuasion
 - Physical Control (e.g., passive resister, bent wrist control, excluding the carotid restraint)
 - c. Liquid Chemical Agent (Mace/Oleoresin Capsicum)
 - d. Carotid Restraint
 - e. Department-issued Baton
 - f. Firearm
- 2. It is not the intent of the order to require officers to try each of the options before escalating to the next. Clearly, good judgment and the circumstances of each situation will dictate the level at which an officer will start. Officers using any type of force are accountable for its use.

E. REASONABLE FORCE

1. Officers must frequently employ the use of force to effect arrests and ensure the public safety. It is not intended that any suspect should ever be allowed to be the first to exercise force, thus gaining an advantage in a physical confrontation. Nothing in this order should be interpreted to mean that an officer is required to engage in prolonged hand-to-hand combat with all its risks before resorting to the use of force that will more quickly, humanely and safely bring an arrestee under physical control.

2. Penal Code Section 835 a provides that, "Any peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance of the person being arrested; nor shall such officer be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her right to self defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest, or to prevent escape, or to overcome resistance."

F. CIRCUMSTANCES JUSTIFYING THE USE OF FORCE

- Officers may use force in the performance of their duties in the following circumstances:
 - a. To prevent the commission of a public offense.
 - b. To prevent a person from injuring himself/herself.
 - c. To effect the lawful arrest/detention of persons resisting or attempting to evade that arrest/detention.
 - d. In self-defense or in the defense of another person.
- 2. Before using force, the officer should consider these questions:
 - a. What actions on the part of the suspect justify the use of force?
 - b. What crime is being or has been committed?
 - c. Does the situation require the immediate use of force?

G. VERBAL PERSUASION AS A MEANS OF EFFECTING CUSTODY

 The practice of courtesy in all public contact encourages understanding and cooperation; lack of courtesy arouses resentment and often physical resistance. Simple directions which are complied with while you merely accompany the subject are by far the most desirable method of dealing with an arrest situation. Control may be achieved through advice, persuasion and warnings before resorting to actual physical force. The above should not be construed to suggest that you should ever relax and lose control of a situation, thus endangering your personal safety or the safety of others. Officers are permitted to use that force which is reasonable and necessary to protect themselves from bodily harm.

H. USE OF PHYSICAL CONTROL TO ACCOMPLISH CUSTODY

- Frequently, subjects are reluctant to be taken into custody and offer some degree of physical resistance. Normally all that is required to overcome the resistance is physical strength and skill in defensive tactics, e.g., passive resister, bent wrist control.
- 2. Defensive tactics are techniques intended for use when weapons are not available or their use is inadvisable or unreasonable under the circumstances. You must, however, ensure that you are capable of utilizing physical skills to subdue a person. Good judgement is extremely important in deciding which tactics to use and how much force to apply. The force used must be necessary.
- When confronted with a situation that may necessitate the use of physical control, consideration should be given to calling for additional cover officers prior to the contact.
- 4. In encountering physical resistance and/or assault, an officer's primary goal is to control the situation. The level of force encountered determines what form of defense should be exercised. When conditions permit, the best means of controlling a subject is by the imposition of manual restraint according to methods taught in Department training courses.
 - a. Choking by means of pressure on the subject's trachea is a prohibited practice.
 - b. Rendering a subject unconscious by applying pressure to the carotid artery is permissible only when lesser types of restraint would be ineffective (see Section I., J.).

I. USE OF LIQUID CHEMICAL AGENT (MACE/OLEORESIN CAPSICUM) TO ACCOMPLISH CUSTODY

- Liquid chemical agent is a non-lethal device designed to subdue a person by projecting a specially formulated liquid onto the face. It is not designed to replace the police revolver or baton. Liquid chemical agent is a defensive weapon intended for use when attempting to subdue an unarmed attacker or to overcome resistance likely to result in injury to either the suspect or the officer.
- In most instances, liquid chemical agent will reduce or eliminate the
 necessity for greater physical force to effect the arrest. Every officer should
 be equipped with liquid chemical agent and, when practical to do so,
 should use it rather than the baton or carotid restraint.
- 3. MEDICAL TREATMENT. Persons who have had Mace or O.C. sprayed on their faces shall have their faces washed and their eyes flushed with clean water at the scene or as soon as possible. Medical evaluation shall occur:
 - a. Prior to booking and as soon as practicable.
 - b. If the person is recovering normally, request an ambulance (Code 2) to the scene or arrange to have paramedics meet you at another location to medically assess the individual.
 - c. If the ambulance is unavailable or the delay will be excessive, transport the exposed subject to SFGH for medical evaluation.
 - d. If the sprayed suspect looses consciousness or has difficulty breathing, summon an ambulance Code 3.
- 4. TRANSPORTATION. Persons who have been sprayed with Mace or O.C. must be transported in an upright position by two officers. The passenger officer shall closely monitor the subject for any signs of distress which would require medical evaluation and/or treatment. Hobble cords or similar types of restraints shall only be used to secure a subject's legs together. They shall not be used to connect the subject's legs to his/her waist or hands in a "trussed" position.

- MONITORING SUBJECTS. Supervisors shall ensure that any person who has been sprayed with Mace or O.C. is kept under direct visual observation until he/she has been medically evaluated. If the person appears to be having difficulty breathing, an ambulance shall be summoned immediately.
- BOOKING FORM. Persons who have been sprayed with liquid chemical agent shall have that noted on the booking form.

J. USE OF CAROTID RESTRAINT TO ACCOMPLISH CUSTODY

- The carotid restraint, when properly applied, is a very effective means of subduing a violent subject; however, caution must be used in its application. The officer applying the hold must attempt to ensure the hold does not slip into a bar arm trachea choke.
- 2. The carotid restraint is an acceptable use of force in the following situations:
 - a. The officer is physically attacked.
 - b. To stop a physical attack on another person.
 - c. The officer has attempted a lesser level of force and found it to be inadequate.
 - d. In the officer's best judgement, having evaluated the particular circumstances, a lesser level of force would be inadequate.
- 3. MEDICAL TREATMENT. Officers finding it necessary to apply the carotid restraint must monitor the subject's vital signs closely. Additionally, if the subject has difficulty breathing or does not immediately regain consciousness, the arresting officer shall immediately call paramedics to the scene. In all cases where the carotid restraint is used, the subject shall be medically evaluated.
 - BOOKING FORM. Persons who have been the subject of a carotid restraint shall have that noted on the booking form.

- K. USE OF BATON TO ACCOMPLISH CUSTODY. The baton in the hands of an officer trained in its use is a very formidable weapon. If we are to obtain effective results, avoid unnecessary injury to suspects, and minimize criticism of the Department, the baton must be used properly and judiciously.
 - 1. The baton must be carried properly in the officer's baton ring. A baton left in the car is of no use to an officer in a confrontation.
 - Officers are not to slap the palm of their hand with the baton or poke the baton at people as an intimidation technique.
 - 3. The baton, when properly used, is capable of delivering extremely powerful blows to stun and incapacitate an aggressive opponent. It is also capable of delivering lethal or permanently disabling blows. Blows to the head, throat, side of the neck, or armpit must be avoided whenever possible.
 - 4. To properly control and therefore maximize its effectiveness, the baton should normally never be raised above the head to strike a blow. The use of the baton as a club is generally prohibited.
 - 5. Striking a handcuffed prisoner with a baton is expressly prohibited (except as allowed for in Section I., C., of this order).
 - 6. Officers will carry only batons issued by the Department.
- L. USE OF FIREARM TO ACCOMPLISH CUSTODY. See DGO 5.02, Use of Firearms.

M. UNNECESSARY FORCE (DEFINED)

- Unnecessary force occurs when it is apparent that the type or degree of force employed was neither necessary nor appropriate. When any degree of force is utilized as summary punishment or for vengeance, it is clearly improper and unlawful.
- Malicious assaults and batteries committed by officers constitute gross and unlawful misconduct. Penal Code Section 149 provides criminal penalties for every public officer who under the color of authority, without lawful necessity, assaults or beats any person.

DGO 5.01 Rev. 10/04/95

- 3. When the use of force is applied indiscriminately, the officer will face civil and criminal liability and Department disciplinary action.
- 4. Justification for the use of force is limited to what is reasonably known or perceived by you at the time. Facts discovered after the event, no matter how compelling, cannot be considered in determining whether the force was justified.

- N. REPORTING AND INVESTIGATING THE USE OF FORCE

- TYPES OF INCIDENTS REQUIRING REPORTING. Officers must report the use of the following types of force:
 - a. Physical control, when the person is injured or claims to be injured.
 - b. Liquid chemical agent, when sprayed on or at the person.
 - c. Department-issued baton, when the person is struck or jabbed.
 - d. When the officer finds it necessary to strike a suspect with his/her fist, a flashlight, or any other object.
 - e. Carotid restraint.
 - f. Firearm (also see DGO 5.02, Use of Firearms).
- NOTIFICATION/INCIDENT REPORT. In all cases in which an officer is required to report the use of force, the officer using the force shall immediately notify his/her supervisor, and:
 - a. When the officer using force is also the reporting officer, prepare an incident report containing the following information:
 - (1) The type of force used (e.g., carotid restraint, struck with fist).
 - (2) Reason for the use of force (e.g., subject resisted arrest).
 - (3) The supervisor's name, rank, star number and time notified. If applicable, the supervisor's reason for not responding to the scene shall also be included.

- b. In the event that the officer using force is not the officer preparing the incident report, the officer using the force shall:
 - (1) Ensure that he/she is clearly identified in the incident report.
 - (2) Ensure that the incident report includes:
 - The type of force used (e.g., carotid restraint, struck with fist).
 - · Reason for the use of force (e.g., subject resisted arrest).
 - The supervisor's name, rank, star number and time notified.
 - (3) Or prepare a supplemental report or a statement form with the above information.
- 3. SUPERVISORY OFFICER'S RESPONSIBILITIES. When notified of the use of force, supervisors shall determine whether anyone (including the officer) has sustained an injury and its severity. If an injury has been sustained which is serious enough to require immediate medical treatment, the supervisor shall immediately respond to the scene of the incident unless a response is impracticable, poses a danger, or where officers' continued presence creates a risk. Response is optional in other reportable use of force incidents. Upon arrival, the supervisor shall do the following (when more than one supervisor responds, the responsibility shall fall on the senior supervisor):
 - a. Ensure that witnesses (including officers) to the criminal incident and also the reportable use of force incident are identified, interviewed, and that this information is included in the incident report. Hostile situations or number of witnesses may preclude identification and interview of all witnesses.
 - b. Conduct observations of the scene and injured subjects or officers.
 - c. Conduct a supervisorial evaluation to determine whether the force used appears reasonable and within the provisions of this order.
 - d. When appropriate, cause photographs of injuries or other evidence connected to the case to be taken and booked as evidence.

- e. Review the officer's incident report.
- f. Record the incident in the Use of Force Log (see below). The supervisor who is notified of the reportable use of force is responsible for recording the incident in the Use of Force Log.
- 4. UNNECESSARY OR EXCESSIVE FORCE/REPORTING AND INVESTIGATIVE RESPONSIBILITIES. Should the supervisorial evaluation conclude possible misconduct involved in the use of force, the supervisor shall:
 - a. Immediately notify his/her superior.
 - b. Make arrangements for any interviews that may have to be conducted.
 - c. Prepare a memorandum of observations, evaluation and actions taken.
- 5. SUPERIOR OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES. After being notified of possible misconduct involved in the use of force, the superior officer shall:
 - Conduct an investigation.
 - b. Officers suspected of misconduct shall be advised of rights described in DGO 2.08, Peace Officers' Rights, and be given the opportunity to have a representative present before any administrative interviews.
 - c. If a criminal investigator is assigned the case, the superior officer should confer with the investigator to coordinate the criminal and administrative interviews and Miranda warning.
 - d. Make the required notifications to O.C.C. if a citizen complaint is made (see DGO 2.04, Citizen Complaints Against Officers). Notify the officer's commanding officer when required (see DGO 1.06, Duties of Superior Officers).
 - e. Prepare a report containing results of investigation, preliminary findings, conclusions and recommendations if appropriate.

- 6. RECORDING PROCEDURES/USE OF FORCE LOG/TRAINING DIVISION USE OF FORCE REPORT. Every unit of the Department whose officers normally perform street duty (e.g., district stations, Narcotics, Vice Crimes, Traffic, Special Operations Division, etc.) shall maintain a Use of Force Log (SFPD 128). Other units (e.g., administrative, investigative, etc.) need not maintain a Use of Force Log; however, commanding officers of these units are responsible to ensure compliance with all other provisions of this order along with the following recording procedures:
 - a. On each occasion that an officer reports the use of force in an incident report, he/she shall verbally notify the supervisor reviewing the report if different than the supervisor notified that the report contains reportable use of force. The supervisor reviewing this report shall ensure the necessary information is placed in the Use of Force Log. Two copies of the incident report shall be attached to the log.
 - b. On the 1st and 15th of each month, commanding officers shall sign the log and send it, along with one copy of each of the incident reports, to their respective deputy chief. The deputy chief will review the log and route it to the Management Control Division. Commanding officers shall forward a copy of the log and one copy of each incident report to the Commanding Officer of the Training Division.
 - c. The Commanding Officer of the Management Control Division will maintain controls that assure all unit logs are received and shall review completed forms to ascertain if any officer appears to be having problems with the use of force. If so, he/she shall notify the appropriate command personnel (also see DGO 3.18, Performance Improvement Program and Performance Improvement Program, A Supervisor's Guide, DM-06).
 - d. The Commanding Officer of the Training Division will maintain controls that assure all unit logs and reports are received, and shall perform a non-punitive review of completed logs and incident reports to ascertain the number, types, proper application and effectiveness of uses of force reported by members of this Department. The information developed shall be used to identify training needs. The Commanding Officer of the Training Division shall report to the Chief of Police quarterly on the use of force by members of the Department.

USE OF FIREARMS

This order establishes policies and reporting procedures regarding the use of firearms.

I. POLICY

A. GENERAL. It is the policy of the San Francisco Police Department that officers exhaust all reasonable means of apprehension and control before resorting to the use of firearms. Officers, however, shall not unnecessarily or unreasonably endanger themselves in applying the policies and procedures contained in this order in actual situations.

B. DRAWING FIREARMS

- 1. PUBLIC PLACES. An officer shall not draw a firearm in any public place, except in the line of duty or for inspection by a superior.
- 2. OFFICER/PUBLIC SAFETY. Nothing in this policy shall prohibit the drawing or exhibiting of a firearm in the line of duty when an officer reasonably believes it necessary for his/her own safety or for the safety of others. Officers may also draw and be ready to use a firearm anytime they have reasonable cause to believe that they or another person may be in immediate danger of death or great bodily injury. Officers shall not cock their firearms in these instances.
- JUSTIFICATION. Any officer drawing a weapon in public must be able to articulate the reasons consistent with this order and any other current order regarding the subject. Firearms shall not be displayed without justifiable cause.
- 4. HOLSTERING WEAPONS. When an officer determines that the danger is eliminated, the handgun shall be holstered or the shoulder weapon held in a port arms position away from the person. If the person is not arrested, the officer should tell the individual the reason the weapon was pointed at him/her if the circumstances permit.
- COCKING OF FIREARMS. An officer shall not carry a firearm in the cocked position at any time.

C. DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS

- 1. REASONABLE METHODS OF APPREHENSION. Officers shall not discharge a firearm in the performance of their duties except in the circumstances described below in Section I. C. 2., and only after all other reasonable methods and procedures of apprehension and control have failed. "Other reasonable methods and procedures of apprehension and control" shall be based upon the officer's capabilities at the time of the discharge, the nature and immediacy of the threat, the extent of the threat to innocent persons, the nature of the crime, and the suspect's reputation for violence.
- 2. PERMISSIBLE CIRCUMSTANCES. Officers may discharge a firearm in any of the following circumstances:
 - a. In the necessary defense of himself/herself when the officer has reasonable cause to believe that he/she is in imminent danger of death or serious bodily injury.
 - b. In the necessary defense of another person when the officer has reasonable cause to believe that the person is in imminent danger of death or serious bodily injury.
 - c. To make an arrest when:
 - (1) The officer has reasonable cause to believe that the suspect has committed or attempted to commit a felony involving the use or threatened use of deadly force; and
 - (2) The officer has reasonable cause to believe that a substantial risk exists that the person to be arrested will cause death or serious bodily injury if his/her apprehension is delayed; and
 - (3) After all other reasonable means of apprehension and control have been exhausted.
 - d. To kill a dangerous animal or one that is so badly injured that humanity requires its removal from further suffering, and where other alternatives are impractical.

- e. To give an alarm or to call for help for an urgent purpose when no other means can be used.
- VERBAL WARNING. If feasible, and if to do so would not increase the danger to the officer or others, a verbal warning to submit to the authority of the officer shall be given prior to the use of deadly force.
- 4. ENDANGERING THE PUBLIC/RECKLESS DISCHARGE. Officers shall take extreme care when discharging their weapons so as not to endanger innocent persons or jeopardize property. The discharging of firearms in a reckless and irresponsible manner, or while under the influence of any substance likely to impair physical or mental processes, is prohibited and subject to disciplinary action by the Department, whether the incident occurs within or outside the City and County limits.
- 5. PROHIBITED CIRCUMSTANCES. Officers shall not discharge firearms under any of the following circumstances:
 - a. As a warning.
 - b. At or from a moving vehicle unless the circumstances come within the provisions as set forth in Section I., C., 2., a., b., c. of this order.
 - c. In misdemeanor cases, except if the circumstances come within the provisions as set forth in Section I., C., 2., a., b. of this order.
 - d. In circumstances that do not require police action.
 - e. At a moving vehicle with the intent to disable it.
- D. REPORTING DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS (also see DGO 8.11, Officer-Involved Shootings). Except while at an approved range, an officer who discharges a firearm, either on or off duty, shall report the incident according to the procedures in this order. This includes an intentional or accidental discharge, either within or outside the City and County of San Francisco.

GENERAL ORDER

08/03/94

JUVENILE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

The purpose of this order is to set policy and procedures regarding arrest, detention and diversion of juveniles.

I. POLICY

A. DEFINITIONS

TUVENILE:

Any person under 18 years of age.

CHILD:

Any person under 14 years of age.

INFANT:

Any person under 2 years of age.

DEPENDENT:

Any person under the age of 21 who is under the jurisdiction

of the juvenile court due to his parent's abuse, neglect, or

abandonment.

B. DETENTION, ARRESTS AND SECURITY (206 W & I et seq.)

- 300 WELFARE & INSTITUTIONS CODE (SHELTER). A juvenile who is a victim
 of neglect, mistreatment, or is in need of protective custody, may be
 detained per Section 300 of the W & I Code. Detention shall not be in a
 secure facility.
- 601 WELFARE & INSTITUTIONS CODE (RUNAWAY, BEYOND PARENTAL CONTROL). A juvenile may be detained or arrested for violating Section 601 W & I Code. If arrested, the juvenile shall not be held in a secure facility.
- 602 WELFARE & INSTITUTION CODE (VIOLATION OF CRIMINAL LAW). A
 juvenile arrested for violating Section 602 W & I Code may be held in a
 secure facility.

- C. EMERGENCY OR TEMPORARY SHELTER (300 W & I). All juveniles detained for emergency or temporary shelter are to be taken to the Children's Protective Service, SFGH, Ward 80, 995 Potrero Avenue for medical screening and placement. Detention is proper when any of the following conditions exist:
 - 1. The juvenile is in immediate need of medical care (305 W & I).
 - The juvenile's physical environment or the fact that the child is left unattended poses an immediate threat to the child's health or safety (305 W & I).
 - The juvenile is in immediate danger of physical or sexual abuse (305 W & I).
 - 4. The juvenile is a dependent child or ordered temporarily removed from his parents by the juvenile court and the officer has reasonable cause for believing the minor has left a court-ordered placement (305 W & I).
 - Because the conditions above involve children who are not accused of violating any laws, they may not be held in a secure facility.
- D. 601 & 602 W & I CODE OPTIONS. When taking a juvenile into temporary custody for violating Sections 601 or 602 W & I Code, an officer shall have the following options:
 - ADMONISHMENT. If circumstances do not warrant diverting, citing or booking, the juvenile may be admonished at the scene or in the presence of a parent or guardian. Juveniles should only be admonished when they have no prior police contacts and their involvement in the crime is minimal. When admonishing a juvenile, complete a Field Interview (SFPD 297).

- DIVERSION. When admonishment is insufficient, but circumstances do not warrant citing or booking, the officer may divert the juvenile.
 - a. 601 W & I VIOLATION. A juvenile may be diverted for a 601 W & I violation (runaway, beyond parental control) to the Youth Advocates/ Huckleberry House, 1292 Page Street. A member of the Probation Department will be on duty to process the offender. An incident report and an admission form must be prepared.
 - b. 602 W & I VIOLATION. A juvenile arrested for a <u>non-violent</u> offense may be diverted provided he/she has little or no criminal record. To be eligible for diversion, all the following criteria must be present:
 - (1) The juvenile resides in San Francisco.
 - (2) The current offense is a misdemeanor or a non-violent felony. (Non-violent means no threats or use of force.)
 - (3) The juvenile is not in possession of a firearm or narcotics (except small amounts of marijuana), did not resist arrest, is not wanted pursuant to an arrest warrant, and did not commit any traffic violation.
 - (4) The value of property stolen or damaged is less than \$400.00. (Includes the value of stolen autos only to the extent they are damaged/stripped.)
 - (5) The juvenile has no prior felony arrest and not more than two (2) misdemeanor arrests.
 - (6) The juvenile is not currently on probation and has no cases pending in Juvenile Court.
 - (7) The juvenile has not previously been diverted. (Juvenile who successfully complete Youth Court would be eligible for diversion again.)
 - (8) The juvenile admits his/her involvement in the crime and appears to be a good candidate for diversion. (Juvenile's statement should be documented in the incident report after he/she is Mirandized.)

(9) The juvenile's parent (s) or guardian agrees to diversion.

A juvenile who does not meet all the diversion criteria may still be diverted if the officer feels there are extenuating circumstances which indicate diversion is advisable.

- 3. CITATIONS. Juveniles may be cited for felonies under Section 602, Welfare and Institution Code (see DGO 5.06, Citation Release). Whenever possible, officers should cite juveniles and release them to their parent, guardian or responsible relative. When a violation should be brought to the attention of the Juvenile Court, but booking the juvenile is not necessary, the juvenile shall be cited.
- 4. BOOKING. If admonishing, diverting or citing is not satisfactory, the juvenile shall be booked. A juvenile shall be booked when any of the following conditions exists:
 - The gravity of the offense is such that release of the juvenile will prove dangerous to the public welfare.
 - The juvenile is arrested pursuant to a warrant.
 - The enile is in possession of a firearm.
 - a. Because the above constitute violations of 602 Section W & I, the juvenile may be held in a secure facility.
 - b. Pursuant to a memorandum of understanding between the Department of Social Services and the Juvenile Probation Department, children under the age of eleven (11) booked for 602 W & I offenses shall be booked at Children's Protective Services rather than the Youth Guidance Center.

- E. TEMPORARY CUSTODY OF 601 & 602 W & I OFFENSES. Generally, officers should not bring juveniles in temporary custody into any facility containing a lockup for adults. This includes district stations. In a situation requiring an officer to bring a juvenile to a district station for the purpose of investigation, facilitating release or arranging transfer, the following policies shall be strictly complied with:
 - JUVENILES BOOKED FOR 601 W & I OFFENSES. Juveniles booked for 601 W & I
 offenses may be brought to a district station while the officer attempts to
 contact the juvenile's parents. The following policies shall be followed:
 - a. The juvenile shall not be held in a locked room or a secured facility.
 - b. The juvenile shall not be handcuffed to himself or any fixed object.
 - c. The juvenile must not have any contact with any adult or juvenile prisoner.
 - d. The juvenile shall be under constant personal observation.

If the officer is unable to reach the juvenile's parents or the juvenile and his/her parents are unable to resolve their differences, the officer shall bring the juvenile to Youth Advocates/Huckleberry House immediately. The juvenile shall not remain at the district station while repeated attempts are made to contact the parents.

- 2. JUVENILES DETAINED FOR 602 W & I OFFENSES
 - a. NON-SECURE CUSTODY (207.1 W & I Code). Juveniles under age 14 (regardless of the offense), and juveniles age 14 and over who are not serious security risks or do not pose a risk of harm to themselves or others, shall be held in non-secure custody. The following policies shall apply:
 - (1) The juvenile shall not be held in a locked room.
 - (2) The juvenile shall not be handcuffed to any fixed object (cuffing rail, chair, etc.).

- (3) The juvenile must not have contact (visual or audible) with any adult prisoner.
- (4) The juvenile shall be under constant personal observation.
- (5) The juvenile shall not be held longer than 6 hours at the facility.
- b. SECURE DETENTION. Juveniles age 14 and over who are serious security risks or pose a risk of harm to themselves or others, may be held in secure detention. The following policies shall apply:
 - (1) The juvenile must be informed of the purpose, expected detention time and of the 6 hour maximum.
 - (2) The juvenile may be cuffed to a stationary object for a maximum of 30 minutes.
 - (3) There must be adequate supervision to assure restricted contact with adult prisoners.
 - (4) Entry must be made in a log, indicating the offense, reasons and circumstances for the secure detention, starting and ending times of detention, and the officer's name.
- c. ACCESS TO BASIC AMENITIES. Whether being held in non-secure custody or secure detention, the following shall be available to juveniles:
 - (1) Reasonable access to toilets and washing facilities.
 - (2) A snack if the juvenile has not eaten within 4 hours.
 - (3) Reasonable access to drinking water.
 - (4) Privacy during visits with family, guardian and/or lawyer.
 - (5) Reasonable access to a telephone.

- d. WELL BEING/DISCIPLINE. Arresting officers are responsible for the security, safety and well-being of juveniles they take into custody; however, officers shall not discipline (punish) juveniles in temporary custody.
- e. SUICIDE RISK AND PREVENTION. Any juvenile who appears suicidal shall be kept under constant personal observation by the arresting officer while in temporary custody. Also see DGO 7.02, Psychological Evaluation of Juveniles.
- f. USE OF RESTRAINTS. Juveniles may be handcuffed to themselves whenever they present a threat to themselves or others, or to prevent escape.
- g. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE AND SERVICES. Injured or ill juveniles shall be examined at MEH prior to being booked. If immediate emergency medical attention is required, treatment shall be administered at the nearest emergency hospital. Also see DGO 5.09, Absentia Bookings and Prisoner Security.

F. NOTIFICATION OF PARENT OR GUARDIAN

- LOCAL. Whenever a juvenile is taken to or arrives at a district station or
 other law enforcement facility, the arresting officer is responsible for
 notifying the juvenile's parent, guardian or responsible relative.
 Notification may be made by telephone, in person, by leaving a note, or
 transportation to the juvenile's home, as appropriate.
- OUT OF TOWN. If the juvenile resides outside the city, a collect telephone
 call shall be placed to the parent, guardian or responsible relative. If
 notification cannot be made by telephone, arrange for notification through
 the local law enforcement agency.
- DOCUMENTING NOTIFICATION. Officers shall include in their incident reports whether notifications were made or whether other actions were taken to notify parents or guardians.

- G. SEARCHING JUVENILES. Juvenile arrestees shall be searched immediately for weapons, contraband and items of evidence. Searches shall be conducted only by an officer of the same sex as the juvenile.
 - EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES. If an officer has knowledge or reasonably believes that a juvenile of the opposite sex has a dangerous weapon concealed upon him/her, the juvenile may be restrained (handcuffed) until a search can be made by an officer of the same sex as the juvenile. If there is a life-threatening situation, an officer may search a juvenile of the opposite sex.

H. TRANSPORTING JUVENILES

- 1. WITH ADULTS. Officers shall not knowingly transport juveniles with adult arrestees.
- 2. FEMALE JUVENILES. Female juveniles shall, when possible, be transported by female officers. If a female officer is unavailable, two male officers shall transport. The officers must first notify the Communications Division of their destination and the vehicle's starting mileage. Upon arrival officers must give the vehicle's ending mileage.
- 3. USE OF SEATBELTS. See DGO 9.04, Seat Belt Policy.

II. PROCEDURES

- A. TEMPORARY CUSTODY. When taking a juvenile into temporary custody under Sections 601 or 602 W & I Code, follow these procedures:
 - 1. Search the juvenile for weapons, evidence or contraband.
 - 2. Read the juvenile the Miranda advisement [625 (c) W & I Code].
 - Immediately notify the juvenile's parent, guardian or responsible relative.
 Leave a note if necessary.
 - 4. Take the juvenile to a place of confinement (e.g., YGC). If possible, avoid taking the juvenile to the district station.

- Except where physically impossible, but no later than one hour after the juvenile has been taken into custody, allow him/her to make two telephone calls (627 (b) W & I Code).
- B. DIVERSION. When diverting a juvenile for a criminal offense (602 W & I), follow these procedures:
 - Notify the juvenile's parent or guardian and get his/her consent. Inform the parent/guardian that a Diversion Officer will contact him/her.
 - Complete the Juvenile Diversion Checklist (SFPD 245) and forward it to the Juvenile Division with a copy of the incident report.
 - Submit your incident report (with a copy of SFPD 245) in the normal manner. Enter "X" in the subject code for the juvenile being diverted and list the offense(s) committed. (A juvenile may be diverted in the same incident where others are cited or booked.)
- 4. Book any evidence in the normal manner. A polaroid photo of the evidence should be forwarded to the Juvenile Division.
 - 5. Do not process the juvenile or obtain a "J" number.

C. CITATIONS

- 1. CRIMINAL CITATIONS (602 W & I). See DGO 5.06, Citation Release.
- 2. TRAFFIC INFRACTION CITATIONS. See DGO 9.01, Traffic Enforcement.
- D. BOOKING. When booking a juvenile, complete an admissions form. Describe the offense i.e., all elements of the crime, and provide a complete narrative of the events leading to the arrest. For example:
 - 1. 300 W & I Code shelter.
 - 2. 601 W & I Code beyond parental control.
 - 602 W & I Code 211 PC (robbery).

E. JUVENILE NUMBERS AND PROCESSING

- JUVENILE NUMBERS. A juvenile number ("J" number) must be obtained when formal action is taken against a juvenile under Section 601 or 602 W & I Code, or when enroute to the Immigration and Naturalization Service. "J" numbers, however, are not required for admonishments, diversion, or shelter (300 W & I Code) contacts.
- 2. PROCESSING. Processing (photographs and fingerprints) of juveniles may be required depending on the nature of the offense and when the juvenile was last processed. Processing is normally required whenever a juvenile's identity cannot be ascertained. Methods to confirm identity include CDL, DMV identification card, student body ID card with a photograph, identification by parents, teachers, counselors, prior contacts, etc. When contacting the Identification Section to obtain a "J" number, ask if processing is necessary.
 - a. In cases where you are booking a juvenile for 601 or 602 W & I Code, and it is not necessary to process the juvenile, affix the juvenile's right thumb print on the back of the Police Liaison copy (goldenrod) of the admission form (see Section E.2.). Also list in your incident report the method used to confirm the juvenile's identity.

F. CHANGE OF CUSTODY

- If a person is taken into custody for an adult warrant, and prior to booking
 it is discovered that the person is a juvenile, process the person as a
 juvenile and book him/her at YGC. Notify CJ #1 and have a booking
 form completed with a notation that the person is a juvenile being held at
 YGC.
- If a person booked at CJ #1 is found to be a juvenile, processing and transportation to YGC shall be made by a Company B unit. A wagon may be used if the juvenile is violent.
- 3. When a person over 18 years of age is arrested for a juvenile warrant, he/she shall be booked at YGC if the warrant is the only charge. If there are other charges committed as an adult, notify YGC, book him/her at CJ #1 and place a hold for the Juvenile Court.

- G. CONSENSUAL SHELTER AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES. Section 25.9 of the Civil Code allows a minor age twelve and over to obtain shelter services and/or mental health services without parental consent when he/she is alleged to be the victim of child abuse or incest, or when he/she would present a danger of serious physical or mental harm to self or others. The law requires the shelter to make efforts to notify the parent; however, when mental health services are provided, the professional in charge of treating the minor may determine that it is not appropriate. In summary, the law allows many runaways to legally stay at shelters without parental consent.
- H. UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL, DRUGS OR NARCOTICS. Juveniles under the influence of alcohol, drugs or narcotics shall be taken to MEH for medical examination prior to being booked at YGC. If the juvenile must remain in the hospital and booking is required, an admission form must be completed and forwarded to YGC, and a police hold shall be placed on the juvenile. When released, the juvenile shall be transported to YGC by a Company D unit. A wagon may be used to transfer if the juvenile is violent.
- PSYCHIATRIC CASES. The policies and procedures regarding mentally disturbed juveniles are found in DGO 7.02, Psychological Evaluation of Juveniles.
- J. MISSING JUVENILES. See DGO 6.10, Missing Persons.
- K. SEXUAL ASSAULTS. See DGO 6.16, Sexual Assaults.

On 1/18/2006, at 1703 Hours, 3H16D Officers Campos#89 and Silver#4238 were in the area of Mansell and Persia Sts when they heard what sounded like two gunshots. They immediately notified communications of the shots fired. Officers Campos and Silver responded to Brazil St and La Grande st where Brazil St. dead ends. At 1706 hours, Officer Campos and Silver heard another shot fired coming from behind Officers Campos and Silver exited their vehicle and entered McClaren Park on foot. Due to the nature of this call, Officer Campos took the department issued shotgun and Officer Silver drew his service revolver. At the time, multiple Ingleside and Bayview units were responding to the area to assist in this call. Officer Campos and Silver continued walking in a S/E direction through the Park behind the school when they heard a fourth shot go off, which they believed was approximately 50 feet from where they were standing. There were approximately 10 juveniles in close proximity to where the shots were being fired playing basketball on an outdoor court in the school yard. Officers Campos and Silver continued through the park when they came upon six asian males. Officer Silver observed one of the the asian males holding a dull grey semi automatic handgun in his right hand. The subject then pointed the handgun in the direction of the Sunnydale Housing Projects.

Officer Campos and Silver raised their weapons towards the group of six subjects. Officer Silver yelled out the command, "POLICE, Get down on the ground." The subject with the handgun turned quickly towards the officers and pointed the handgun at them. Officer Silver told me due to hearing multiple rounds fired, locating a subject with a firearm who had negligently been discharging the firearm, a subject not obeying his commands to get down, and pointing a firearm at two officers in uniform, he feared that he was about to be fired upon. Officer Silver then fired one round in self defense at the subject holding the firearm. The six subjects at this time began running N/B through the park towards the school.

Officer Silver and Campos began a foot pursuit which entered the school grounds with a group if juveniles playing basketball and Officer Silver yelled for the juveniles to get down as he was unsure where the handgun the subjects were carrying was at this time. Officer Campos and Silver continued following the subjects through the school when Officer Silver spotted under a staircase of the school with his hands in his pockets. Officer Silver told me that he felt was the same subject who pointed the handgun at him and Officer Campos. was breathing heavily and had a look of surprise when Officer Silver located him under the staircase. Officer Campos continued on foot through the school grounds pursuing the five other subjects. Officer Silver, pointed his weapon at and ordered him to the ground again refused Officer Silver's verbal commands. Officer Silver, still unsure if was armed, attempted to take to the ground with a shove from his left hand and a leg sweep. Officer Silver told me he kept his weapon in his right hand during this incident. began to fall with the leg sweep, but was held up by a wall behind him. tried to regain his balance and stand up. Officer Silver told me as he realized he was now in a physical confrontation with the need to get the second as soon as possible. Officer Silver attempted to shove by the head to the ground with his right hand. At this time, the butt end of Officer Silver's weapon struck on the top of the head. This caused a small gash on the top of head. fell to the ground and Officer Silver took into custody. Officer Silver then walked down to the street and handed him over to Officer Thompson#4223.

Officer Campos continued chasing the other subjects on foot. Officer Campos observed and break from the group and cut across a small walkway which connects Persia St. and the dead end of S/B La Grande St. A radio communication was broadcast that and possibly had jumped a fence into a back yard S/W corner of La Grande and Russia Sts. Sgt. Plyer#1489 at this time began directing multiple units in setting up a perimeter in this area. Sgt Plyer was going

S/B La Grande when and exited the back yard and began running W/B Russia St. Officer Howard and Campos, who were now on high ground just east of La Grande, broadcast this information. and then ran onto southbound Dublin St. where ran into Officer Thompson grabbed in a bear hug and placed him on the pavement. was taken into custody by other Ingleside units. It appeared during this his arrest. componed an existing abrasion on his left elbow. Officers Goldsborough#413 and Petiti#1841 of Bayview Station transported to Ingleside Station. Officer Fegan#4194 transported to Ingleside Station. Medic 43 arrived and transported to SFGH for treatment to his head wound. Officer Thompson rode in the

Sgt. Plyer#1489 responded to Persia and Sunnydale Sts. and set up a command post . Sgt. Plyer#1489 set up a perimeter around La Grande, Russia, Persia, and Dublin streets as the outstanding subjects were last seen running into the area, Lt. Melxner#1117 arrived at the command post and assumed command. I notified Lt. Meixner#1117 at this time that Officer Silver had discharged his weapon and Operations Center was notified. Lt. Meixner#1117 notified Capt. Chignell, Commanding Officer of Ingleside Station. After a thorough search of the area, the command post was shut down. No other subjects were located.Officers Altamirano#337 began a Crime Scene Log and was completed by Officer Trail#921. I had communications notify SFGH, St. Lukes and Seton Hospital to check for any gunshot wound patients. Officer Valiquette also notified all surround hospitals in San Francisco to be on the lookout for any gunshot wound patients.

Inspector Mark Hawthorne#21 of the Crime Scene Investigation unit responded out to SFGH and did a Gunshot Residue test on Sgt Greg Mar#547 responded to Ingleside Station and performed the Gunshot Residue test on B. and B/ Officer Thompson took photos of abrasion on his left elbow. I observed the injury and it appear to be an pre existing injury as it had a partial scab on it. It appeared part of the scab was removed while he was being taken into custody. The responsibles for and were notified by station personnel between the hours of 1840 and 1930 hours and responded to Ingleside Station.

The San Francisco Fire Department was called and was requested to bring out portable lighting could illuminate the original crime scene. Officers Trail#921, Androvich#893, and McMahan#1797 were searching the area with CSI Sgt. Mar547. Officer McMahan was using his flashlight when he located a blue steel semi automatic handgun. Spent shell casings were also located.Sgt. Mar was immediately notified. Sqt. Mar took custody of the firearm. The firearm was a Deutsche Sgt. Mar is going to book the gun and found shell casings into evidence. responded to the crime scene and observed two bottles that had been placed on a tree. It appeared the subjects were using the bottles as targets.

Inspectors Morley#2237 and Velarde#2209 of the General Work Detail arrived and interviewed and . The subjects refused to talk to the inspectors at this time. Inspector Morley was given the original crime scene log at Ingleside Station by me. CARC was notified by Officer Cavanaugh of this incident . Officer Cavanaugh was informed by CARC that and and were to be booked at YGC. and booked per above

At approximately 1800 hours, Officer Silver informed me of his use of force in this incident. Officer Silver told me he dischared his weapon and used a physical control technique in his arrest of a suspect. Officer silver told me he feared for his life and his partners life and fired once at a suspect who pointed a semi automatic gun at them. It should also be noted that multiple gunshots were fired prior to the officers making contact with the suspect.

In the second use of force, after a foot chase, Officer Silver attempted to take the same individula

Officier Silver, with his strong had still hold his department weapon, pushed the suspect by the head, in an attempt to take the suspect to the ground. The butt of Officer Silver's weapon inadvertently struck the suspect on top of the head, causing a small gash. The suspect was taken into custody without further incident.

At 1940 hours, Officer Thompson told me while taking a suspect into custody, he placed the suspect in a bear hug and placed him gently on the pavement. This caused a pre-existing scab on the suspect's left forearm to become partially removed. This caused some minor bleeding.

In conducted a Supervisorial Investigation into these uses of force. I deteremined the uses to be reasonable and within the provisions of General Order 5.01. Lt. Meixner#1117 and I then entered the information into the Use of Force log at Ingleside Station with two copies attached.

On 01/18/06, at about 1703 hours, Ofc. Campos #89 and I were in full police uniform. We were assisting Ofc. Yin #4109 with a vehicle stop on John F. Shelly Drive, on the S/E side of McLaren Park. McLaren park has been the scene for homloides, shootings, robberies, rapes, auto thefts, arson, narcotics use and sales, firearms sales and a myriad of other crimes. It was approaching dusk and not raining at the time. The noted officers and I heard, what we believed to be, two gunshots ring out nearby. I began to walk East through the park to investigate the matter further. About 100ft into the park, I heard another shot. I asked Ofc. Campos if he would deploy the shotgun and assist me in the search. He was already doing so.

Ofc. Campos and I began to walk to the area where we heard the shots coming from. As we walked, we heard several more shots. I asked dispatch to keep the air clear and informed responding units of the general area where I believed the shots were coming from. Ofc. Campos and I continued S/E, through the park. We crossed the closed portion of Brazil Ave, which runs through the park. We then heard more shots, very close by. Ofc. Campos and I relayed this information and I drew my department issued sidearm, as I was now certain that we were, in fact, hearing gunshots.

Ofc. Campos and I walked the length of an approximately five foot fence, which I believed indicated the outmost border of the fence-line. We heard another gunshot, which we estimated were coming from less than fifty feet away from us, judging by the volume. We cautiously approached the area. As we cleared a thicket of trees and brush, we suddenly saw a group of approximately five or six, unknown, Asian males. These subjects were about thirty feet away from Ofc. Campos and I, on the other side of the fence. All of these subjects seemed to be in their late teens to early twenties. One of these subjects, an Asian male (who I recall as being in his late teens or twenties, having short, black hair and wearing a dark jacket) was holding a dull gray, semi-automatic, handgun in his right hand. He was pointing it in a Southern direction, towards the general area of the Sunnydale Housing Projects. I did not know who or what this subject was shooting at. He then lowered the gun slightly, brought it in closer to his body and turned towards the group, laughing.

Ofc. Campos and I raised our weapons towards the group and I yelled "Police! Get down on the ground!" As I did this, the subject holding the gun quickly turned directly at me. The suspect still had the gun in his hand and it was pointing at me. Several other members of the group began to turn away, I believed to flee from us. I feared that the suspect was going to open fire on our position as he had already demonstrated a reckless and wanton negligence in discharging a firearm in a City Park, near a Middle School and in a direction that placed the line of fire to a busy street. I also feared that the armed suspect(s) would run into the nearby school and harm, kill or take

hildren and/or staff members hostage. If school was still in session.

Seeing the suspect's gun pointing at me, I believed that I was in great danger of death or serious odily injury. I was afraid for my life. I fired one shot from my department issued firearm, in selflefense. As I did this, the armed suspect turned and N/B, with the other suspects, towards the Middle School. I do not know if I struck the suspect.

I surmounted the fence and gave chase, N/B towards the playground of I was horrified to see that the group of suspects were running towards the basketball courts in the school. There were numerous children in the lower basketball courts and one or more adults. As I pursued the suspects through a small hole in the fence (which took me several moments to find) I mixed radio broadcasts with calls for the noted children to "get down or get inside." I saw one unknown Asian male (who I estimated to be around eighteen, 5'07, 160lbs, wearing a black puffy jacket and gray sweat-pants) climb a fence and run towards Brazil Ave. I saw that this subject had a rip or hole in his lacket. I imagined this was from the fence but I was not sure.

I decided to stay with the bulk of the group and continued to chase the group to the lower basketball courts. As I made the bottom of the stairs, I recognized that an unknown Asian male (about nineteen years old, with short black hair, wearing a black, long-sleeve jacket and blue jeans). later identified as [B] was standing under the staircase with his hands in his pockets. I believed that was the same subject who had pointed the gun at me and who I had fired at. was breathing heavily and had a wide-eyed look of surprise on his face when he saw me.

I raised my gun, leveled it at (as I suspected he may have been armed), and ordered him to the ground. and did not comply and, instead, stood there and looked at me. I was keenly aware of the screaming mass of children running for cover, to my rear. I feared that, as hands were still in his pockets, he would fire at me and kill me or the innocents behind me. I felt I needed to take decisive action, quickly. Yet, I did not see a gun so I was forced to physically engage the suspect to take him into custody.

It was not an option to holster my weapon because of my suspicion that was armed. I moved forward and pushed back with my free, left, hand. I attempted to leg-sweep to also showed resistance to my the ground but the wall behind him stopped his descent. efforts to take him down and seemed to be trying to regain his balance. As I needed to act quickly, I used my right hand (in which I was holding my sidearm) and pushed the suspect to the ground by the top of his head. In the process, I struck on his head with my firearm. went to the ground, I came down on top of him and I handcuffed him.

was now bleeding from his head. I yelled at him, "where's the gun!?!" I asked this, outside of Miranda, because there was no time to waste. I feared the gun may have been hidden in the area and accessible to the myriad of children around me. answered "I don't got it, I don't got it."

I trotted the suspect to the front of Luthor Burbank MS, where Sgt. Plyer #1489 and Ofc. Thompson #4323 had detained a group of juveniles (after seeing them run out of the playground area, where I had last seen the suspects running). I saw that the noted group of juveniles were not members of the group that I was chasing. Ofc. Thompson took control of As he did this, we both saw two of the suspects I had been previously chasing running across Sunnydale Ave. towards the rear of the houses on Dublin Street. They were about 75-100 yards away and had emerged from the trees and brush which is bordered by Sunnydale Ave and Persia Ave. I then sprinted to that location in an attempt to keep a visual on these subjects but they ran out of my sight, into more trees and brush. I then broadcast the last location that I had seen the suspects at. Once in the area, I heard a dog barking in the noted row of, fenced, backyards. As the suspects may have been in one of these backyards. I held my position and began to attempt to coordinate a perimeter for responding units. I also performed a tactical-reload of my service weapon.

Ofc. Martinez #1102 quickly came to my aid to hold the perimeter. A short time later, Ofc. Howard #1813, Ofc. Campos and Sqt. Plyer were involved in another foot-pursuit of two suspects, about one and a half blocks from my location. The two suspects were taken into custody. I later responded to their location and determined that the two suspects who were detained were the same who I had been chasing from the scene of the shooting. They were also the same who I had seen running across Sunnydale Ave towards the back-yards on Dublin Street

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At the request of Officers Tillan #331 and Morrow #1196, I traveled back to the make sure none of the students (who were still inside the school for safety reasons) were members of the suspect group. Once there, I spoke with [R/W]
pops coming from behind the school. Stated that, at first, he thought these were fireworks. As they continued, began to look towards the source of the noise. Told me that he was surprised to see an unknown Asian male, who he stated was the same subject I had taken into custody in the basketball courts, emerge into sight while holding a handgun. This subject then pointed the handgun into the sky at, what he thought was, birds. began to back away and stated that the suspect then lowered the gun in such a manner that it pointed (or swept) across the other students in the basketball courts. The suspect then walked back into the woods, out of sight. Stated that, a very short time later, he heard more shots and began to run after hearing his teacher prompting them to do so. Said that he ran to the front of the school and was ordered to stop by some unknown officers. Complied and moments later saw me escorting the (now handcuffed and bleeding) suspect (Man), who he had previously seen with the gun, to the front of the school.
I then spoke with a number of students, when he began to hear what he thought may have been gunshots. then stated he began to hear unknown objects striking the concrete nearby. Fearing that these were bullets, began herd the children indoors. More shots rang out during the process. then heard yelling. looked towards the source of the noise and was surprised to see a group of unknown Asian males running towards the basketball courts.

On today's date Officer Silver and I were in the area of John F. Shelly and Mansell. We had responded to backup a unit on John F. Shelly when we heard what I recognized as two distinctive, slow, methodical gunshots. We believed the shots were being fired near the area of Brazil and Mansell, which is located behind

Officer Silver and I made our approach on foot and made our way to Brazil, which is a closed street between Dublin and Mansell. As we were initially going downhill from where we heard the first two shots we heard another distinctive shot being fired. We relayed this information that the shots were coming from behind the school. We cut across Brazil and started to climb a small embankment, which was fenced off with chain link fence behind the school. As we crested the embankment we heard another distinctive shot being fired from in front of us.

Officer Silver and I went to the edge of the chain link fence, which was facing S/B Mansell and Geneva. At this time we were located approx. 200 yards behind the school. We again heard another shot being fired directly W/B of our location and it sounded like we were right on top of the possible shooter/shooters. We walked along the chain link fence W/B where our vision was blocked for approx. 15 feet by a small burm which was to our right, on the other side of the chain link fence. At the end of the 15 feet of burm, we saw a group of approx. 5-6 Asian males wearing black jackets, white t-shirts and gray sweatpants or pants approx. 30 feet from us.

The group was huddled close together and, upon our approach, we had our department issued handgun and shotgun locked and loaded. We identified ourselves as SFPD and ordered the entire group to the ground. As the group turned toward us, one Asian male (wearing a black jacket, approx. 16-18 years old) had a small, dark colored, semi-automatic handgun in his right hand. This Asian male appeared to make eye contact with us and pointed the gun at us. I feared he was going to shoot myself or Officer Silver, killing or injuring us. As the gun was turned on us, Officer Silver stayed close to the chain link fence while I went wide to his left. I did not have a clear shot at the suspect. I saw Officer Silver fire one round from his handgun at the Asian male holding and pointing the gun at us.

The group scattered when Officer Silver fired his handgun and they turned away from us and tried to scatter in all directions (they looked like the "Keystone Cops," as they shoved and pushed each other). Unable to scatter because of the foliage, the group again turned away from us and ran N/B down a small path to the basketball courts, located behind the school. Officer Silver and I gave chase and split up as the group split up into different directions (see attached Officer Silver's statement).

I saw two of the Asian males (who I later identified as [B] and [B] break off from the group and run from Mansell Street onto Persia Ave. I gave chase and was approx. 50 yards behind them when I saw them both cut across the small walkway which connects Persia and the dead-end of S/B Le Grand. As I approached the same location, I was informed via PIC radio that the suspects had jumped a fence into a closed yard located at the S/W corner of Russia and Le Grande. As I approached, Officer Howard and I observed the same Asian males I was chasing jump the fence and start running W/B Russia Street, where they turned left onto S/B Dublin. After a very brief chase, we were able take both of them into custody in front of Dublin. I confirmed the identity of both Asian males, via their clothing and faces (which I observed as I chased them) as the ones from the top of the hill, where the initial shooting Incident took place.

While on uniform patrol with Officer Martinez #1102, we responded to the area of Mansell and Persia on a report of shots fired, heard by 3H16D, Officers Campos and Silver. As we were coming into the area west on Sunnydale Ave., 3H16D broadcast that they were chasing the shooting suspects towards the back of Officer Martinez and I then saw two possible suspects sprinting north along the front of the school. Officer Martinez called out to the two possible suspects to stop and they complied when they reached the front door. As we ran towards those two, 7 other young males came running around the corner of the school towards us. Not knowing if these were the suspects being chased towards us, Officer Martinez and I instructed everybody to get down and don't move. Other units responded to the area to assist. The nine young males were pat searched. I instructed all of the young males to sit together along the footpath in front of the school. I saw Officer Silver come out from the back of the building where the nine that we had detained had come from. Officer Silver had a suspect in handcuffs. He told me that none of the detained young males was a suspect.

Then it was broadcast that two of the original shooting suspects were seen running south on Sunnydale and into the trees. Adults from the school had now arrived. The officers on scene took off after the other two suspects. I instructed Officer Tillan to get all of the names of the detained young men (see Officer Tillan's statement).

The two suspects were subsequently arrested as they attempted to run away south on Dublin (see Officer Campos' statement). I set up a command post at Persia and Sunnydale. I set a perimeter around the homes and backyards on the east side of Dublin, from Persia to Russia. The following units responded to establish a perimeter; 3H2C, Officer Coles #712, 3I13D Officers Keesor #1506 and Alvis #4206, 3C14D, Officer Goldsborough #413 and Petiti #1841. The following tactical units responded to coordinate a search of the backyards and surrounding area. 4T190 Sgt. Tsujimoto #1283, 4T91 Officer Mariona #1625, 4T92 Officer Alemam #778, 4T94 Brunner #820, 4T95 officer Bozin #814, 4T96 Byrne #828 and officer Cole #850. No other suspects were found at that time.

ON WEDNESDAY, JANUARY, 18, 2006 MY PARTNER OFFICER MORROW #1196 AND I WERE ON DUTY, IN FULL UNIFORM, AND DRIVING A MARKED POLICE VEHICLE. AT APPROXIMATELY 1709 HOURS, 3H16D OFFICER'S CAMPOS AND SILVER, BROADCASTED OVER "PICK" RADIO" SHOTS FIRED IN THE AREA OF MANSELL AND BRAZIL. MY PARTNER AND I, ALONG WITH OTHER INGLESIDE UNITS RESPONDED TO THE AREA TO INVESTIGATE.

WITHIN MINUTES, 3H16D CALLED A CODE-33, ADVISING DISPATCH THAT THEY HAD FOUR TO SIX SUSPECTS RUNNING ASIAN MALES RUNNING IN VARIOUS DIRECTIONS, JUST UP THE HILL FROM LUTHER BURBANK SCHOOL. 3H16D FURTHER ADVISED THAT ONE THE SUSPECTS WAS IN POSSESSION OF A SEMI-AUTO WEAPON.

WHEN WE ARRIVED IN FRONT OF OBSERVED NUMEROUS BLACK MALE JUVENILE SUBJECTS, ACCOMPANIED BY ONE OR TWO LATINO MALES, AND ONE SAMOAN MALE RUNNING OUT FROM BEHIND THE SCHOOL, W/B, TOWARDS THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL, WHICH LEADS TO DUBLIN ST.

WE ASSISTED OTHER OFFICERS ALREADY AT THE SCENE IN DETAINING THE NINE MALE JUVENILES FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION. WITH THE HELP OF SCHOOL STAFF, MY PARTNER AND I WERE ABLE TO RELOCATE THE NINE JUVENILES INTO THE SCHOOLS ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE WHICH WAS A MUCH SAFER VENUE.

ON TODAYS DATE. SGT PLYER #1489 AND I WERE WORKING THE INGLESIDE CRIME REDUCTION UNIT WHEN 3H16D WITH OFFICER CAMPOS #89 AND SILVER #4238 BEGAN TO TRANSMITT OVER PIC RADIO THAT THEY WERE HEARING SEVERAL SHOTS BEING FIRED IN THE AREA OF MANSELL AND PERSIA. NOT KNOWING IF THE YOUNG JUVENILES WERE ARMED OR NOT AND TAKING THE SAFETY OF THE STUDENTS AND STAFF INTO MIND WE ORDERED THE JUVENILES TO GET DOWN ON THE GROUND AT GUN POINT RIGHT OUTSIDE THE FRONT SCHOOL DOORS. AT ABOUT THIS TIME SEVERAL BLACK AND MIXED RACE JUVENILES CAME RUNING FROM THE BACK OF THE SCHOOL WHERE THE SHOTS WERE BEING FIRED TO THE FRONT WHERE WE WERE LOCATED. 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

18	A:	Well, get down, stay down, get away, you know he was trying to get us all out the way.
19	Q:	And then you said at one point, one of the Asian kids tried to blend in with your group?
20	A:	Yeah. He tried to stay in the yard. He, like there's a gym and the levels pretty high. He
21	jumped	d off the level, I don't know if he hurt himself that he couldn't run no more-
22	Q:	Uh-huh.
23	A:	But he tried to blend in with our kids like he was part of the class and got-
24	Q:	And is this the kids that was taken into custody?

1	A:	Prob, one of them. I don't know how many were actually taken into custody, but that
2	was-	
3	Q:	Do you know if, do you know if this guy was arrested?
4	A:	I don't know.
5	Q:	Oh, you-
6	A:	If he was arrested.
7	Q:	Okay.
8	A:	I know the officer grabbed him, you know and put him in cuffs and walked him
9	somew	here.
10	Q:	Okay. Okay. But you actually saw him get grabbed?
11	A:	Yeah.
12	Q:	Okay. Where was he when he was grabbed?
13	A:	He was right by the exit, right underneath the gym, cuz the, the gym has like a, like a,
14	kind o	f like a boardwalk, like a platform.
15	Q:	Uh-huh.
16	A:	And he was right underneath the platform from when he jumped off the platform onto the
17	flat gro	ound, it was pretty high. So I don't know if he hurt himself and he couldn't run anymore.
18	Q:	This is the gym area?
19	A:	This is outside.
20	Q:	Outside.
21	A:	This is still on the lower yard. The gym is back that way too, but the outside part of the
22	gym is	there. There's some outside back stairs that go to the gym.
23	Q:	And there was a platform there?

1	A: Yeah. And he jumped off. And he must've hurt himself cuz it's pretty far. And he
2	stopped running and he just took his gloves off and put his hands in his pocket and got up against
3	the wall like he wasn't doing anything.

6	Q: And put his hands in the, in his pockets?
7	A: Yeah. He had gloves. A couple of the kids had gloves when they were running down the

18	A: Yeah. Probably about seven or eight left and then the other half were with me.
19	Q: Okay. Oh, how many kids were with you, do you think? Approximately?

21	kids ran when they saw them.

3	that was the first guy he saw. Cuz we were running this way, you know, we were running away	
4	And then this guy was, and, you know he ended up by himself and that's when the officer	
5	grabbe	d him.
6	Q:	And can you describe how the officer grabbed him?
7	A:	He told him to put his hands behind his head and searched him and he had his gun out.
8	Q:	Uh-huh.
9	A:	You know-
10	Q:	Was there any struggle between the two?
11	A:	No. No. No. It wasn't, uh-uh.
12	Q:	But the officer still had his gun in his hand?
13	A:	Yeah.
14	Q:	Do you know if he had it in his left hand or right hand, can you tell?
15	A:	Had them in two hands. You know, he had it, two hands on it.
16	Q:	Okay. All right. And you said, let's see here. Describe, you said he was grabbed, where
17	was he grabbed, the Asian kid? Can you take me step by step how he was taken into custody?	
18	A:	I'm not too sure cuz I was more concerned about you know getting the kids out the way.
19	Q:	Okay.
20	A:	But I know he told him to turn around. He turned him around and searched him, that's a
21	I know. I mean, I didn't really see, I mean I'm sure, I mean I'm sure it was routine. You know,	
22	for, for a, a gun call, you know what I mean?	
23	Q:	Right. Right. But did actually see how this guy was, you mentioned earlier that, you
24	know t	the officer grabbed him. Did, did you actually see him?

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1	A:	I actually seen, no not like grab like that, but I mean when I said he grabbed him, I was	
2	meaning that's when he apprehended him.		
3	Q:	Q: Okay. Okay. What exactly did you see, I know you said you saw him, you saw the Asiar	
4	kid tal	king off his gloves-	
5	A:	Yes.	
6	Q: Putting his hands in the pockets and then shortly there after the officer came, right?		
7	A: Uh-huh		
8	Q:	And then what did you actually see the contact between the officer and the kid?	
9	A:	He just had his gun out and told him to freeze and searched him and cuffed him and	
10	walked him, you know out the gate to I guess where there was other officers.		
11	Q:	Did you hear him issuing any orders or anything like that	
12	A:	No. No. Cuz we're, I mean like I said, the, the schoolyard is pretty big.	
13	Q:	Uh-huh.	
14	A:	So, while that, all that was going on, you know, I mean I have nine kids out there. I'm	
15	just getting them as far away as possible, so I didn't really hear anything that was said.

19	A:	No. We were walking back, so we're farther than that.

23	Q:	Cuz you guys were moving back-	
24	A:	We were moving back, yeah.	
25	Q:	You said, you were 100 feet?	

1	A:	Yeah. At-
2	Q:	Okay. So, you were moving back, and you see the officer and you said it was pretty
3	routine	e?
4	A:	Uh-huh.
5	Q:	You couldn't hear anything?
6	A:	No.
7	Q:	But, did you see the officer actually physically searching this Asian kid?
8	A:	I mean, no, not, I mean, just when, what you know, put his hands behind his back and
9	you know patted him down, make sure he didn't have any weapons.	
LO	Q:	Did you actually see the officer placing him in handcuffs?
11	A:	By the time he walked off, he had handcuffs on. I didn't see the actual, you know, when
12	he connected them on him, but he had handcuffs by the time he, he left the school, the courtyard	
13	Q:	Okay. Is it safe for me to say that you didn't really see how he was taken into custody?
14	A:	No. Yeah. It's very safe to say. I didn't really see that. Uh-uh.
15	Q:	Okay. But you saw him being escorted out.
16	A:	Yeah. He was getting escorted out.
17	Q:	And he, he was already in handcuffs?
18	A:	Yeah.
19	Q:	Okay. Did you see them on the ground at any point, you know whether, at any point
20	when you were witnessing this incident?	
21	A:	The, the one guy, did I ever see him on the ground?
22	Q:	Yeah. Yeah. The two, one of the officers or the Asian kid, did you ever see him on the
23	ground	1?
24	A:	No.
25	Q:	Struggling or anything like that?

1 A: No. Uh-uh. 2 Q: Did you see any struggle between the two? 3 A: No. No. 4 O: Okay. And so, what happened after that? So, you saw this guy. You don't know how he 5 was taken into custody, but you saw him being escorted out? 6 A: He escorted out. We stayed up, in the upper yard and so, you know I have a walkie talkie, 7 until I got the okay that it was safe to come down. 8 Q: Uh-huh. 9 A: Cuz I guess apparently the other half of our class they were laid on the ground because 10 there was officers coming from the other side of the building. 11 Q: Uh-huh. Uh-huh. 12 And you know some of our kids were, you know laid on the ground. You know as 13 potential suspects. 14 Q: Okay. 4	same o	officer who, who was running down the, after them initially? Do you know? You said there
5	was on	e initially you saw the four or five kids running down the hill, there was an officer behind
6	them.	
7	A:	Yeah.
8	Q:	Was that the same officer who took this guy into custody?
9	A:	Yeah. I, I believe so. I think his name was Silver, Silva.
10	Q:	How do you know that?
11	A:	He introduced himself, you know while we were doing, then you know when the police
12	came a	and we were talking, I, I walked up to him. You know, just trying to figure out what
13	happer	ned, and he introduced himself to me. And-

7	Q:	Okay. Okay. And do you have the, well maybe I'll go off record to get the names of the
8	kids. Anything else you want to add to this interview? Did I miss anything that you want to tell	
9	me?	
LO	A:	Well, actually yeah. Now that we're on the subject of that. There was supposed to be an
11	officer	-
12	Q:	Uh-huh.
13	A:	I guess the, the principal is calling, you know, just you know get an apology or explain to
14	the kid	Is what was happening-
