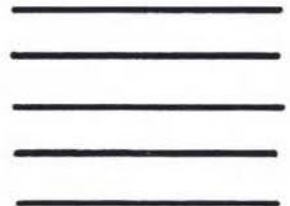

On July 17th 2012 Tuesday I was at home with my boyfriend named [REDACTED] and My Dog. We were both getting ready to start our day; I was on my way to work. While we were both getting ready, we can both hear outside a lot of commotion going on in the parking lot. We both stuck our heads out the window, to only see several Police officials banging on my door. I was immediately frightened by the Police aggressiveness on forcing themselves into my house, and threaten me to open the door. I asked, "What did they want?" Officer Sanders replied, "Someone they were chasing ran in my house, Open the Door or else we're going to kick it down!" I assure them that no one entered my house at all, and that if they didn't have a search warrant they could not enter, one of the Officers said, "they had one it was on its way". I didn't have on any clothes and try to grab something to cover myself so that I could hurry to get to the door. When I opened the door, Officer Sanders kept yelling [REDACTED] I told him no one by that name lives here nor did anyone by that name enter my house. Within seconds I was pulled out by several officers in my Panties and my Bra, and they rushed in. My boyfriend was already coming down the stairs to figure out what was going on as well, he was also trying to get dress. Before he had a chance to say who he was the police grabbed him swung him around the stairs, he was slammed on top of kitchen table where there was a glass cup at, and the entire cup was broken into his chest. I screamed and cried out for them to stop! They were punching him and forcing his arms to his back. He didn't do anything that would make the police feel threaten, I even seen a police officer in my living room draw his gun down on my boyfriend, While he was on the ground cuffed. I asked the police officers why they were doing this. Four officers guarded my front door preventing me to enter my house to at least put some clothes on; my neighbor came down to give me some sweat pants. 16 SFPD officers searched my house [REDACTED] for a suspect they thought ran into my house. When they realized he was never in my house. SFPD cont. to treat us like criminals they finally asked us both our identity and ran our names. My boyfriend was on the kitchen floor bleeding out; He was cut really bad with a lot of glass in his chest. The SFPD called the Ambulance for medical treatment for him. After the officers ran our names they cited us off, and wrote my boyfriend a ticket for resisting, which is not true. The officers were getting ready to leave and left by telling me this was just one big misunderstanding.

I couldn't believe what just happened to me and my boyfriend. I was scared.. My boyfriend sat in San Francisco General Hospital for 6hours. They had to give him a CT scan to make sure his Jaw wasn't broken because it was swollen and he couldn't bite down. The doctor also requested for him to have an X-ray exam to make sure he didn't have any broken glass inside his chest. When we got to the final stages of treating [REDACTED] his diagnosis was a laceration to his chest wall, He was giving several stitches and prescribed pain medication because of the pain he was in. He did not deserve this nor did myself. I was Humiliated outside in front of all my neighbors, exposing myself to the public. I am scared to look at anyone I know that seen me outside like that, it is very embarrassing and just makes me feel shameful of myself. I don't agree with the SFPD actions, and I want to file a complaint against all the Officers who entered my home. The following will list the Names and Badge numbers:

NARRATIVE

on July 17, 2012 at approximately 1539hrs, (5V64) Ofc. Dejesus #247, (5V27) Ofc. Jackson #4093 were assigned to the Violence Reduction Team and I were on patrol in the area of Watchman Way/ Missouri Street (Potrero Hill Housing Complex). We were driving an unmarked radio car and wearing plainclothes. It should be mentioned that numerous gang related crimes have occurred in this area including shooting, robberies, and homicides.

I observed a black male later identified as (C-1) [REDACTED] wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt and dark jeans walking down the stair from the second floor balcony. [REDACTED] and I made direct eye contact and he immediately said "Oh Shit! The Police." [REDACTED] grabbed the front of his waist band area and ran back up the stairs and directly into [REDACTED]. From my training and experience I recognized this behavior of [REDACTED] grabbing the front of his waist band area as to possibly having an concealed firearm. I exited our radio car and observed the gate close to [REDACTED]. I called for additional units to respond to the scene. Numerous Bayview Units responded to the scene.

I knocked on the front door to [REDACTED] and (D1) [REDACTED] was already looking out of the second floor window yelling at the numerous Police Officers at the scene from her window. I asked [REDACTED] to come down stairs and speak with me. [REDACTED] continued to yell that "Ain't nobody here but me. I ain't opening my fucking door." I observed [REDACTED] stick his head out of the same window that [REDACTED] was yelling out of, for several seconds [REDACTED] repeated herself several times prior to coming downstairs to open the front door. [REDACTED] was upset and demanded to see a warrant and would not abide commands to move out of the way. [REDACTED] began to walk out up the stairs. (5O13) Insp. Silver #4238 crossed the threshold, grasped [REDACTED] by the arm, pulled her out of the premise along with her black dog, for her safety and the safety of the other Officers.

At this time, [REDACTED] came down the stairs and immediately attempted to push pass Officers and walk out of the front door. It should be mentioned that [REDACTED] was now shirtless during this time. Numerous Officers attempted to detain [REDACTED] in handcuffs, but [REDACTED] resisted their efforts by pushing officers and refusing to follow verbal orders to stop resisting. (3C72) Ofc. Reynoso #854 and I searched upstairs for additional suspects to no avail. A search of the second floor bedroom for any illegal firearm in plain view was conducted with negative results. [REDACTED] grey sweatshirt was located downstairs in the livingroom.

I returned downstairs and observed [REDACTED] had a cut on the left side of his chest. I was informed that a struggle ensued and a small group of Officers and [REDACTED] fell onto the kitchen table where a drinking glass was broken. [REDACTED] and the Officers went onto the ground and were almost bitten by the black dog. [REDACTED] was later subdued and handcuffed. I was informed that medical aide was summoned for [REDACTED]. (3C170) Sgt. Hall #567 responded to the scene and was informed of the above information and notified of the use of force.

Medic #82 responded to the scene and treated [REDACTED] for the cut to his left chest area. Ofc. Jackson #4093 took (E-3) five photos of the scene and of [REDACTED] cut. [REDACTED] was released per 849(b)pc at the scene and [REDACTED] was issued cite [REDACTED] for 148(a)(1) pc at the scene and released.

Ofc. Dejesus #247 completed a written statement regarding his use of force. See Ofc. Dejesus' written statement. Insp. Silver #4238 completed a written statement and book it into evidence. (3C12C) Ofc. Abi-Chahine #4251 completed a written statement as well and booked it into evidence. A copy of the photos and Ofc. Dejesus's #247 written statement was booked into evidence at Southern Station. Sgt. Hall #567 entered the Use of Force into the Use of Force Log at Bayview Station.

On the above date and time Officer Sanders # 4191, Jackson # 4093 , and I were near [REDACTED] in the Potrero Hill Housing Projects. This area of the Bayview district has recently been plagued by gang related violence. There have been numerous gang related shooting incidents in this area.

Officer Sanders alerted me to a subject who was on the balcony located at [REDACTED]. As I was exiting our vehicle, Officer Sanders alerted me that the subject ran to the back door of [REDACTED]. It should be noted that I am familiar with this residence. I have had prior contact with a subject who lives at the address.

I ran to the back balcony of [REDACTED] and stood by the back door. A short while later Officer Sanders opened the back door and I entered the residence and responded to the front door where Officer Sanders was speaking with D [REDACTED]. She appeared upset and was screaming and using vulgarity. After a few moments C/ [REDACTED] began to walk down the stairs, and was confrontational. He refused to follow directions or commands to place his hands in the air. When he reached the bottom of the stairs he attempted to shove past Officers at the bottom of the stairs shouting "don't fucking touch me" and "get the fuck off me". [REDACTED] then began to struggle with the Officers. I attempted to take control of [REDACTED] shoulders and he rushed into me, forcing me backwards. I began to yell for his to stop resisting. He ignored my commands and began to struggle with us. He grabbed onto my left leg with his right hand and began to attempt to wrestle with me. We fell forward onto a table when I heard a glass break. After several moments [REDACTED] was taken into custody. I noticed a cut to his left chest area. I can only assume that the cut came from the above described broken glass.

Sgt. Hall arrived and took control of the scene. I notified him of the cut to [REDACTED] chest. An ambulance was summoned and [REDACTED] was treated for the cut to his chest.

On 7/17/2012, at approximately 1530 hours, I was in full police uniform and marked patrol vehicle when I arrived at [REDACTED] to assist Officers requesting additional units.

Upon arrival I saw Officers in plain clothes and police uniforms attempting to take a subject into custody. The subject was later identified as [REDACTED] was pulling his hands away from Officers and not complying with orders to put his hands behind his back. I grabbed [REDACTED] left leg and assisted other Officers in taking him to the ground.

When the suspect was on the ground Officers were unable to place him in handcuffs and it appeared the subject was attempting to stand back up. I feared for the safety of other officers and myself since we were in a kitchen. I believed that the suspect was desperate in attempting to escape and might reach for weapons (such as knives) if he was allowed to stand up.

While holding on to the subject's left leg with my left hand, I punched him in the lower back with my right hand one time. Officers were then able to take control of the subject's hands and place him into custody without further incident.

I notified Sgt. Hall #567, who was already on scene, of the incident at approximately 1555 hours and he said he would make the Use of Force Entry.

For additional information see Officer Sanders' #4191 initial report.

I booked the original copy of this statement at Bayview Station.

On today's date at 1539 hours I was on foot in the Potrero Hill housing development in response to recent gang violence. I heard Officer Sanders of the Violence Reduction Team request assistance in the area of [REDACTED]. I went to that area, where I saw Officer Sanders, Officer Jackson and Officer DeJesus at a residence I knew was the probation address of [REDACTED]. I further knew that [REDACTED] was on probation with a 4th Amendment waiver.

Officer Jackson called down to me that a black male subject had run from them into [REDACTED]. I went to the front door where I saw Officer Sanders arguing with a female subject, later found to be [D] [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] demanded to see a warrant and would not abide commands to move out of the way, in light of hot pursuit. I told [REDACTED] that this was [REDACTED] residence, that he was on probation, and demanded that she move out of the way. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] wasn't there. She did not move. A black dog was behind [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] eventually turned and began walking up the stairs. For her safety and that of the now numerous officers present, I crossed the threshold, grasped her by the shirt and then arm, and pulled her outside of the premise. I then took control of the dog by its collar and officers made entry into the residence to look for the person who had fled.

I held the dog in the kitchen area and saw a black male subject, later identified as [C] [REDACTED] come down the stairs and then immediately push officers back and pulled his arms away from them as they attempted to detain him in handcuffs. A struggle ensued. I saw officers pull [REDACTED] off the stairs into the kitchen. Officers surrounded [REDACTED] ordering him to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back. [REDACTED] did not seem to comply. Soon, the group of officers and [REDACTED] seemed to fall as a pile onto the kitchen table and I heard glass break. [REDACTED] and officers went to the ground and the dog growled and nipped at officers closest to me so I held it close so that it would not bite anyone or be hurt.

After [REDACTED] was in custody, I saw that he was bleeding and an officer summoned an ambulance for him. I also saw broken glass on the floor, and it seemed that [REDACTED] was cut by said glass.

I ran [REDACTED] for for warrants and probation/parole status. [REDACTED] was not subject of a search condition or wanted. The premise was not searched beyond a protective sweep because of this. [REDACTED] was not present, but still seemed to have personal property in the residence.

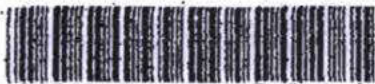

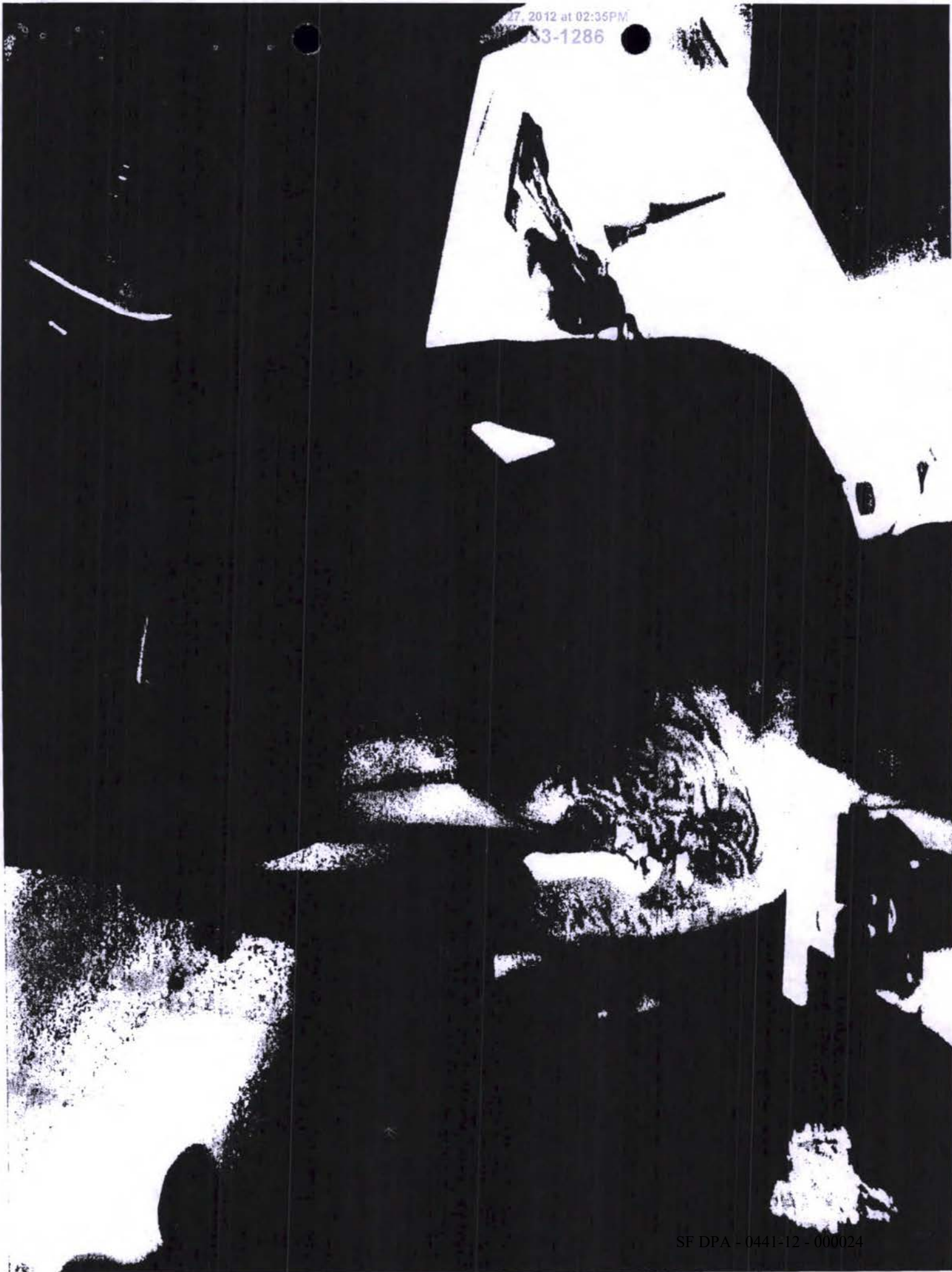

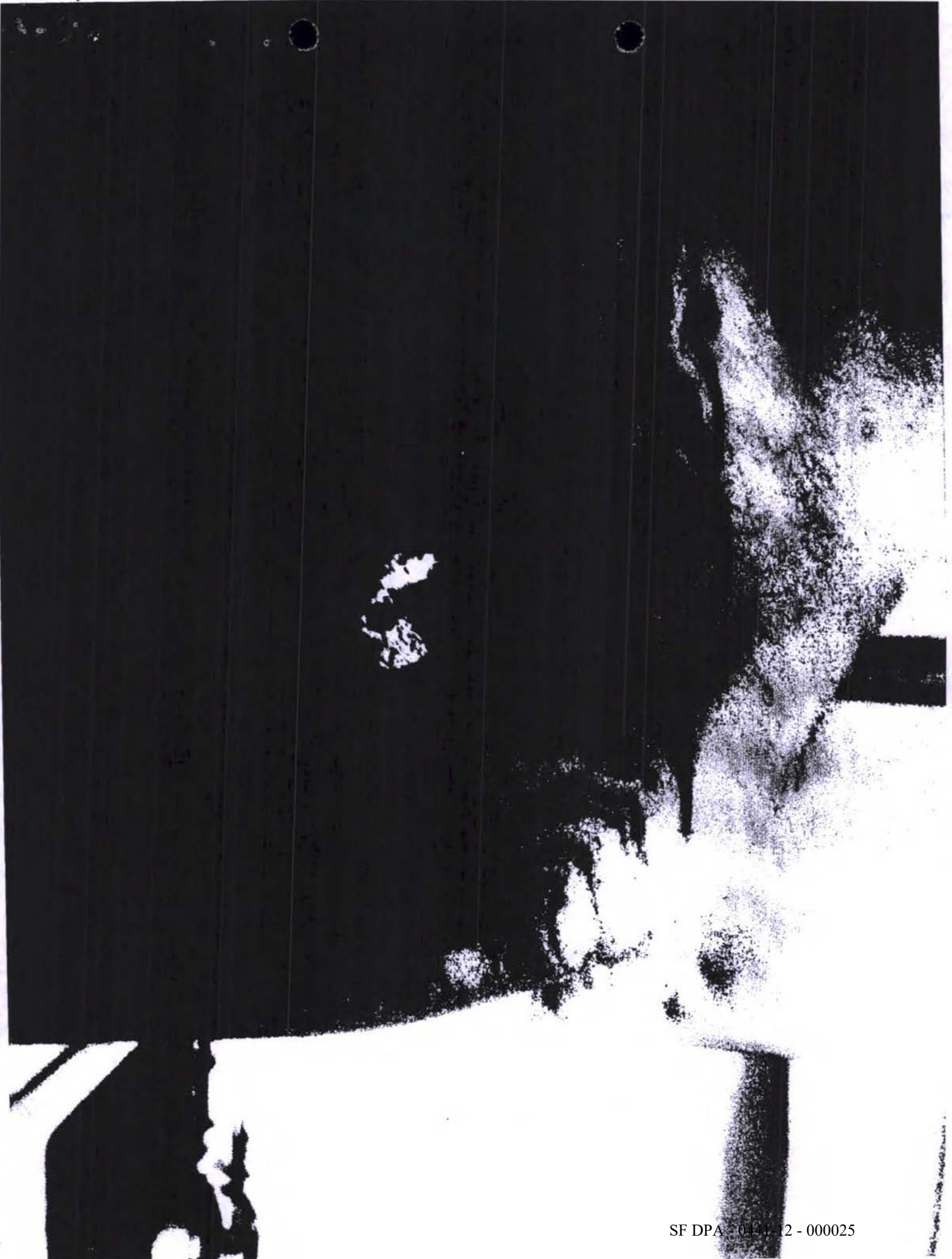

Entering Residences (Houses, Apartments, Hotels, including SRO Hotels)

The United States Supreme Court recently explained the limitations the Fourth Amendment imposes on law enforcement officers' authority to enter a residence when they do not have a warrant and no exigency exists: "When law enforcement officers who are not armed with a warrant knock on a door, they may do no more than any private citizen might do. And whether the person who knocks on the door and requests the opportunity to speak is a police officer or a private citizen, the occupant has no obligation to open the door to speak." *Kentucky v. King*, 131 S.Ct. 1849, 1862 (2011).

Members are reminded that individuals have an expectation of privacy in their residences. Tenants of hotels, including single room occupancy hotels, possess the same constitutional rights and protections related to law enforcement entry into their hotel room.


When entering a person's residence, officers shall comply with the Constitutional mandates of search and seizure law. Under the Constitution, law enforcement officers may enter a residence only if one or more of the following conditions is present prior to entry:

- A resident or person with actual or apparent authority over the residence requests that the officers enter.
- A resident or person with actual or apparent authority over the residence consents to the officers entering.
- The officers have an objective reasonable basis for believing that a resident has a search condition as a condition of his/her active parole or probation.
- The officers have a valid search warrant for the residence.
- The officers have a valid arrest warrant for a resident of the premises.
- There are exigent circumstances that warrant immediate entry, such as the need to respond to an imminent threat to the safety of officers or other persons, or to prevent the imminent destruction of evidence (this "destruction of evidence" condition does not apply to infractions).
- Officers have an objectively reasonable basis for believing that someone in the residence needs medical assistance.
- The officers are in fresh pursuit or hot pursuit of a suspect.
- The residence is a crime scene.

PASS KEYS: Officers shall not enter apartments or hotel rooms with a pass key unless one or more of the above conditions are met.

PROPERTY MANAGERS: Officers may not ask a property manager or other building representative to use a pass key to provide officers entry to an apartment or hotel room unless one of the above conditions is met. Further, a property manager or other building representative may not request or give consent on behalf of a resident for officers to enter that resident's lawfully occupied apartment or hotel room.

SEARCHES: Any search based on consent must comply with Department Bulletin 11-134.

On July 17th 2012 Tuesday I was at home with my boyfriend named [REDACTED] and My Dog. We were both getting ready to start our day; I was on my way to work. While we were both getting ready, we can both hear outside a lot of commotion going on in the parking lot. We both stuck our heads out the window, to only see several Police officials banging on my door. I was immediately frightened by the Police aggressiveness on forcing themselves into my house, and threaten me to open the door. I asked, "What did they want?" Officer Sanders replied, "Someone they were chasing ran in my house, Open the Door or else we're going to kick it down!" I assure them that no one entered my house at all, and that if they didn't have a search warrant they could not enter, one of the Officers said, "they had one it was on its way". I didn't have on any clothes and try to grab something to cover myself so that I could hurry to get to the door. When I opened the door, Officer Sanders kept yelling [REDACTED] I told him no one by that name lives here nor did anyone by that name enter my house. Within seconds I was pulled out by several officers in my Panties and my Bra, and they rushed in. My boyfriend was already coming down the stairs to figure out what was going on as well, he was also trying to get dress. Before he had a chance to say who he was the police grabbed him swung him around the stairs, he was slammed on top of kitchen table where there was a glass cup at, and the entire cup was broken into his chest. I screamed and cried out for them to stop! They were punching him and forcing his arms to his back. He didn't do anything that would make the police feel threaten, I even seen a police officer in my living room draw his gun down on my boyfriend, While he was on the ground cuffed. I asked the police officers why they were doing this. Four officers guarded my front door preventing me to enter my house to at least put some clothes on; my neighbor came down to give me some sweat pants. 16 SFPD officers searched my house [REDACTED] for a suspect they thought ran into my house. When they realized he was never in my house. SFPD cont. to treat us like criminals they finally asked us both our identity and ran our names. My boyfriend was on the kitchen floor bleeding out; He was cut really bad with a lot of glass in his chest. The SFPD called the Ambulance for medical treatment for him. After the officers ran our names they cited us off, and wrote my boyfriend a ticket for resisting, which is not true. The officers were getting ready to leave and left by telling me this was just one big misunderstanding.

I couldn't believe what just happened to me and my boyfriend. I was scared.. My boyfriend sat in San Francisco General Hospital for 6hours. They had to give him a CT scan to make sure his Jaw wasn't broken because it was swollen and he couldn't bite down. The doctor also requested for him to have an X-ray exam to make sure he didn't have any broken glass inside his chest. When we got to the final stages of treating [REDACTED] his diagnosis was a laceration to his chest wall, He was giving several stitches and prescribed pain medication because of the pain he was in. He did not deserve this nor did myself. I was Humiliated outside in front of all my neighbors, exposing myself to the public. I am scared to look at anyone I know that seen me outside like that, it is very embarrassing and just makes me feel shameful of myself. I don't agree with the SFPD actions, and I want to file a complaint against all the Officers who entered my home. The following will list the Names and Badge numbers:

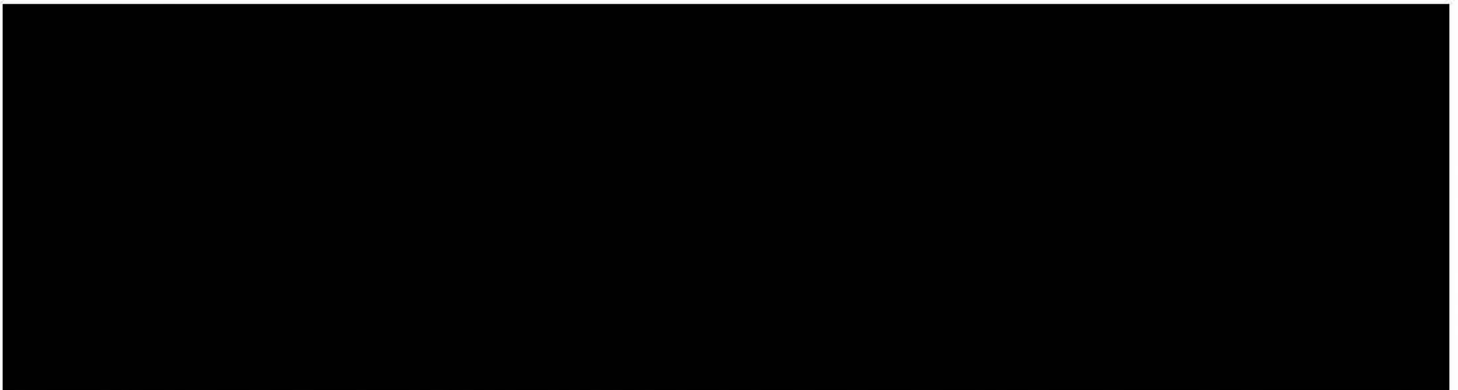
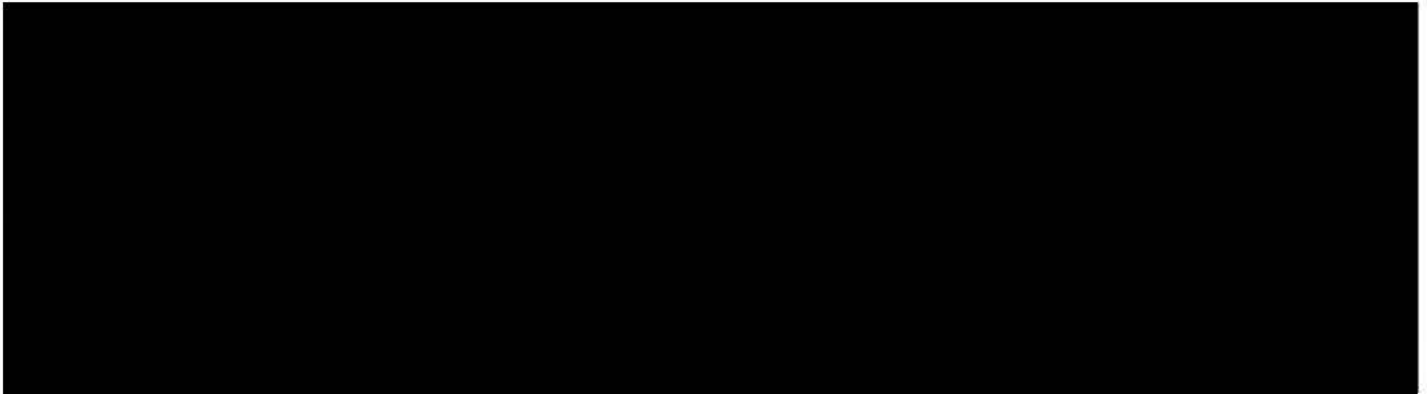
FINDINGS OF FACT: The complainant stated that officers entered her home and grabbed her boyfriend. They threw her boyfriend onto a glass that was on a table. The glass shattered and cut her boyfriend on the chest. His jaw was also injured. The officers stated that they attempted to detain the complainant's boyfriend but he resisted arrest. It took several officers to control him and at one point they all fell onto the table. The boyfriend's injuries were noted and logged in the police report and use of force log. There was insufficient evidence to either prove or disprove the allegations made in the complaint.

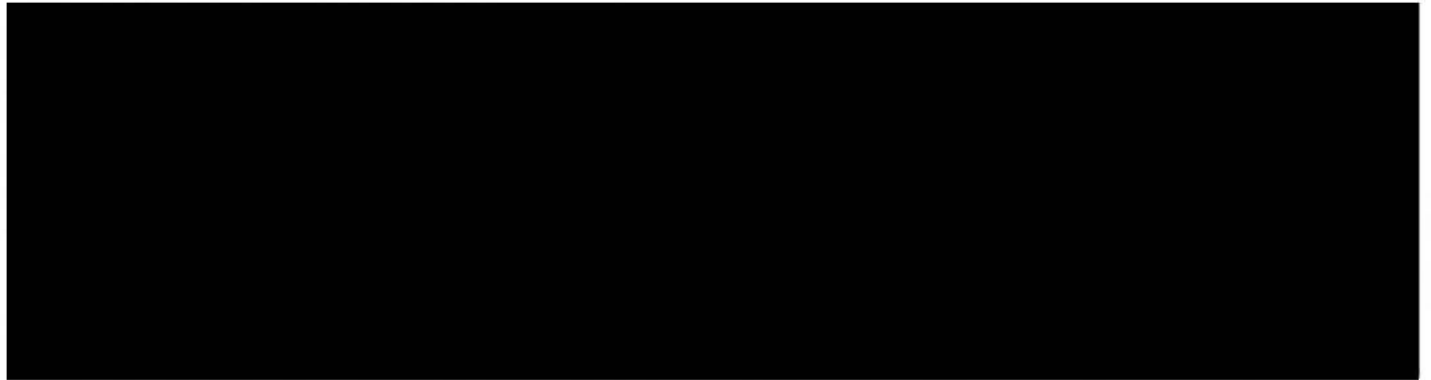

SUMMARY OF INTERVIEW:

On July 17, the comp was at home with her boyfriend [REDACTED] and her dog. The comp was getting ready to go to work. While they were both getting ready, they heard a lot of commotion going on outside in the parking lot. They both stuck their heads out the window to see several Police officials banging on the door to the apartment.

The comp was frightened by the aggressiveness. Police officers made several threats to get the comp to open the door. The comp asked, "What did they want?" [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]

The comp didn't have on any clothes and tried to grab something to cover herself and get to the door. When she opened the door, [REDACTED] The comp told him no one by that name lives here nor did anyone by that name enter her home. She had the door barely open with her head peeking out.

Within seconds she was pulled out by officers in her panties and bra and a shirt which she had just put on. One officer reached past the threshold of the residence and grabbed her shirt and arm to get her out.

After she was taken outside in full view of several neighbors, police rushed in to her home. Her boyfriend [REDACTED] was already coming down the stairs to figure out what was going on. He was also not fully dressed. Before he had a chance to say who he was the police grabbed him and swung him around the stairs. He was slammed on top of kitchen table where there was a glass cup. The glass broke into his chest. The comp screamed and cried out for the officers to stop. They were punching him and forcing his arms to his back.

One police officer in the comp's living room drew his gun and pointed it at the comp's boyfriend while he was on the ground cuffed. The comp described him as blond, skinny and relatively short compared to the other officers.

The comp asked the police officers why they were doing this. Four officers guarded the comp's front door preventing her from entering her house to at least put some clothes on. The comp's neighbor came down to give her some sweat pants.

At least 16 SFPD officers searched the comp's home for a suspect they thought ran into her house. A neighbor wrote down several of their star numbers: F.Abi Chine #4251, M.Goldsborough #413, R.Santiago #1942, T.Ly #793, Right Mire K #1965, S. Hildrebrand #1934, J. Ortiz #1131, Dejesus #247, J. Kavanaugh #2133, M. Pashby #1575, R. Reynoso #854, Sergeant Hugh Hall #567, K. Sanders #4191. At least three neighbors witnessed what happened outside: [REDACTED] Comp will provide contact info.

When the officers realized that the person they were looking for was not at the house, SFPD continued to treat the two like criminals. They asked both for their identification and ran their names. The comp's boyfriend was on the kitchen floor bleeding. He was cut severely with a lot of glass in his chest. SFPD called an ambulance for medical treatment for him.

After the officers ran their names, they cited the comp's boyfriend for obstruction of justice. As the officers were getting ready to leave, they told the comp that this was just one big misunderstanding.

The comp couldn't believe what just happened to her and her boyfriend. She was scared and had to take her boyfriend to San Francisco General Hospital. SFGH had to give him a CT scan to make sure his jaw wasn't broken because it was swollen and he couldn't bite down. The doctor also requested for him to have an X-ray exam to make sure he didn't have any broken glass inside his chest. He was given several stitches and prescribed pain medication because of the pain he was in.

The comp took pictures with her phone and showed them during the intake interview. There is significant blood. She will email the photos for the file and will have her boyfriend sign the HIPAA form.

The comp was humiliated in front of all her neighbors because she was half dressed in public. She is scared to look at anyone she knows that saw her like that. While outside officers

In addition to the officers listed above by star number and name plate, there were four other narcotic officers who work alongside Officer Sanders whose badges were not visible. She would like to make a complaint to them as well. These officers showed the comp and her boyfriend no respect when they entered her home.

During and after the incident, [REDACTED] spoke with the comp in an attempt to calm her down. He said something to the effect of, "Calm down Momma." He also told her not to worry about the

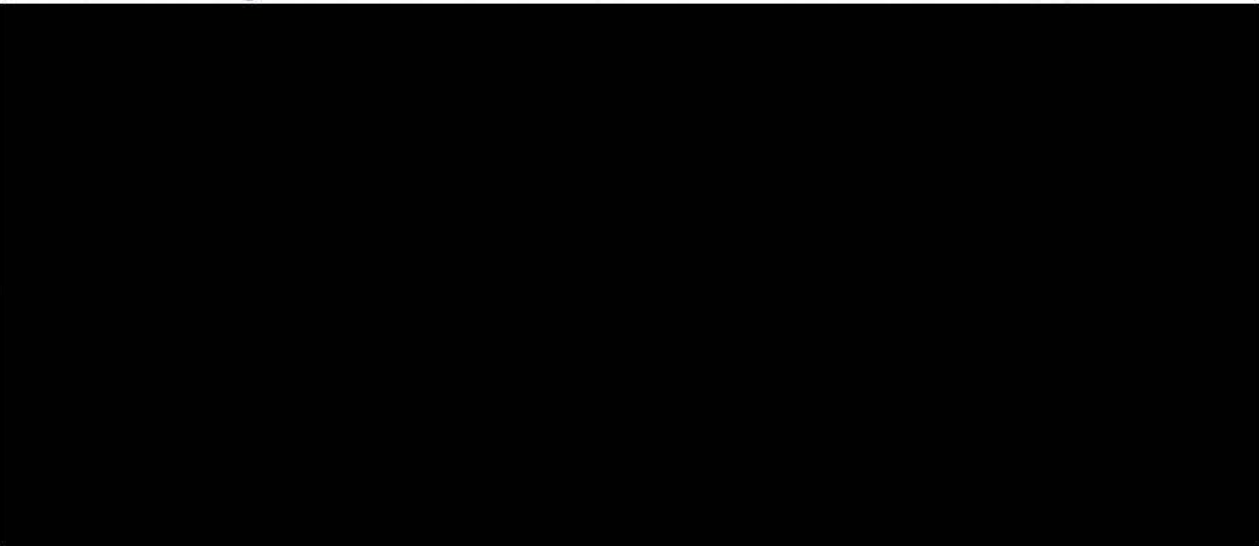

threat that she would be evicted because the officers never said that.

Later, the comp went to Bayview Station to file a complaint. She left a message with the woman at the front desk who told her she would put the message on the lieutenant's desk. After a while she received a call from [REDACTED] who asked her if she wanted him to take her complaint. She told him no and [REDACTED] gave her the OCC website to file with the OCC.

SUMMARY OF IR: Reporting officer is Kelvin Sanders #4191 of the Violence Reduction Team. Incident occurred on 7/17/12 at 15:39 at [REDACTED]. Sanders is also listed as the reporting party along with Luis DeJesus #247. Police detained [REDACTED] and cited [REDACTED] (In [REDACTED] QALL it shows she was detained for resisting arrest).

NARRATIVE OF SANDERS #4191:

Sanders, Ofc. DeJesus #247, (5V27) and Ofc. Jackson #4093 were assigned to the Violence Reduction Team. They were on patrol in the area of Watchman Way and Missouri Street at Potrero Hill Housing Complex. They were driving an unmarked radio car and wearing plainclothes. Numerous gang related crimes had occurred in this area including shooting, robberies, and homicides.

Sanders observed a black male later identified as [REDACTED] wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt and dark jeans walking down the stairs from the second floor balcony. [REDACTED] made direct eye contact with Sanders and he immediately said, "Oh Shit! The Police." [REDACTED] grabbed the front of his waistband area and ran back up the stairs and directly into [REDACTED]. From his training and experience, Sanders recognized this behavior of [REDACTED] grabbing the front of his waistband area as to possibly having a concealed firearm. X

Sanders exited the radio car and observed the gate close to [REDACTED]. Sanders called for additional units to respond to the scene. Numerous Bayview Units responded to the scene.

Sanders knocked on the front door to [REDACTED] and the comp was already looking out of the second floor window yelling at the numerous Police Officers at the scene from her window. Sanders asked [REDACTED] to come down stairs and speak with me. [REDACTED] continued to yell that "Ain't nobody here but me. I ain't opening my fucking door." Sanders observed [REDACTED] stick his head out of the same window that [REDACTED] was yelling out of for several seconds. [REDACTED] repeated herself several times prior to coming downstairs to open the front door. [REDACTED] was upset and demanded to see a warrant and would not abide commands to move out of the way. [REDACTED] began to walk out up the stairs.

At that point, Insp. Silver #4238 crossed the threshold, grasped [REDACTED] by the arm, pulled her out of the premise along with her black dog, for her safety and the safety of the other Officers. At this time, [REDACTED] came down the stairs and immediately attempted to push pass Officers and walk out of the front door. [REDACTED] was now shirtless during this time.

Numerous Officers attempted to detain [REDACTED] in handcuffs, but [REDACTED] resisted their efforts by pushing officers and refusing to follow verbal orders to stop resisting. Ofc. Reynoso #854 and Sanders searched upstairs for additional suspects to no avail. A search of the second floor bedroom for any illegal firearm in plain view was conducted with negative results. [REDACTED] grey sweatshirt was located downstairs in the living room.

Sanders returned downstairs and observed [REDACTED] had a cut on the left side of his chest. Sanders was informed that a struggle ensued and a small group of Officers and [REDACTED] fell onto the kitchen table where a drinking glass was broken. [REDACTED] and the Officers went onto the ground and were almost bitten by the black dog. [REDACTED] was later subdued and handcuffed.

Sanders was informed that medical aide was summoned for [REDACTED]. Sgt. Hall #567 responded to the scene and was informed of the above information and notified of the use of force. Medic #82 responded to the scene and treated [REDACTED] for the cut to his left chest area. Ofc. Jackson #4093 took five photos of the scene and of [REDACTED] cut. [REDACTED] was released per 849(b)pc at the scene and [REDACTED] was issued citation [REDACTED] pc at the scene and released.

A copy of the photos and Ofc. DeJesus's #247 written statement was booked into evidence at Southern Station. Sgt. Hall #567 entered the Use of Force into the Use of Force Log at Bayview Station.

NARRATIVE OF DEJESUS:

On the above date and time Officer Sanders #4191, Jackson #4093 and DeJesus were near [REDACTED] in the Potrero Hill Housing Projects. This area of the Bayview district has recently been plagued by gang related violence. There have been numerous gang related shooting incidents in this area.

Sanders alerted DeJesus to a subject who was on the balcony located at [REDACTED]. As DeJesus was exiting the vehicle, Sanders alerted him that the subject ran to the back door of [REDACTED]. DeJesus is familiar with this residence because he has had prior contact with a subject who lives at the address. DeJesus ran to the back balcony of [REDACTED] and stood by the back door.

"A short while later Officer Sanders opened the back door and I entered the residence and responded to the front door where Officer Sanders was speaking with [REDACTED]. DeJesus wrote.

[REDACTED] appeared upset and was screaming and using vulgarity. After a few moments [REDACTED] began to walk down the stairs, and was confrontational. He refused to follow directions or commands to place his hands in the air. When he reached the bottom of the

stairs he attempted to shove past Officers at the bottom of the stairs shouting "don't fucking touch me" and "get the fuck off me."

[REDACTED] then began to struggle with the Officers. DeJesus attempted to take control of [REDACTED] shoulders and he rushed into him, forcing him backwards. DeJesus began to yell for [REDACTED] to stop resisting. He ignored DeJesus' commands and began to struggle with the officers. [REDACTED] grabbed onto DeJesus' left leg with his right hand and began to attempt to wrestle with DeJesus.

They fell forward onto a table and DeJesus heard a glass break. After several moments, [REDACTED] was taken into custody. DeJesus noticed a cut to his left chest area. DeJesus assumes that the cut came from the above described broken glass. Sgt. Hall arrived and took control of the scene. DeJesus notified him of the cut to [REDACTED] chest. An ambulance was summoned and [REDACTED] was treated for the cut to his chest.

NARRATIVE OF ABI-CHAHINE:

On 7/17/2012, at approximately 1530 hours, Abi-Chahine was in full police uniform and in a marked patrol vehicle when he arrived at [REDACTED] to assist Officers requesting additional units.

Upon arrival Abi-Chahine saw Officers in plain clothes and police uniforms attempting to take a subject into custody. The subject was later identified as [REDACTED] was pulling his hands away from Officers and not complying with orders to put his hands behind his back.

Abi-Chahine grabbed [REDACTED] left leg and assisted other Officers in taking him to the ground. When the suspect was on the ground Officers were unable to place him in handcuffs and it appeared the subject was attempting to stand back up. Abi-Chahine feared for the safety of other officers and himself since they were in a kitchen. He believed that the suspect was desperate in attempting to escape and he might reach for weapons such as knives if he was allowed to stand up.

While holding on to the subject's left leg with his left hand, Abi-Chahine punched him in the lower back with his right hand one time. Officers were then able to take control of the subject's hands and place him into custody without further incident.

Abi-Chahine notified Sgt. Hall #567, who was already on scene, of the incident at approximately 15:55 hours and he said he would make the Use of Force Entry.

NARRATIVE OF INSP. SILVER #4238:

On today's date at 1539 hours, Silver was on foot in the Potrero Hill housing development in response to recent gang violence. He heard Officer Sanders of the Violence Reduction Team request assistance in the area of [REDACTED]. He went to that area, where he saw Officer Sanders, Officer Jackson and Officer DeJesus at a residence I knew was the probation address of [REDACTED].

Silver further knew that [REDACTED] was on probation with a 4th Amendment waiver. Officer Jackson called down to Silver that a black male subject had run from them into [REDACTED]. Silver went to the front door where he saw Officer Sanders arguing with a female subject, later found to be the comp. The comp demanded to see a warrant and would not abide commands to move out of the way, in light of hot pursuit.

Silver told [REDACTED] that this was [REDACTED] residence, that he was on probation, and demanded that she move out of the way. The comp said that [REDACTED] wasn't there. She did not move. A black dog was behind the comp. The comp eventually turned and began walking up the stairs.

For her safety and that of the now numerous officers present, Silver crossed the threshold, grasped her by the shirt and then arm, and pulled her outside of the premise. Silver then took control of the dog by its collar and officers made entry into the residence to look for the person who had fled.

Silver held the dog in the kitchen area and saw a black male subject, later identified as [REDACTED] come down the stairs and then immediately push officers back and pulled his arms away from them as they attempted to detain him in handcuffs. A struggle ensued.

Silver saw officers pull [REDACTED] off the stairs into the kitchen. Officers surrounded [REDACTED] ordering him to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back. [REDACTED] did not seem to comply. Soon, the group of officers and [REDACTED] seemed to fall as a pile onto the kitchen table and Silver heard glass break. [REDACTED] and officers went to the ground and the dog growled and nipped at officers closest to me so Silver held it close so that it would not bite anyone or be hurt.

After [REDACTED] was in custody, Silver saw that he was bleeding and an officer summoned an ambulance for him. I also saw broken glass on the floor, and it seemed that [REDACTED] was cut by said glass.

Silver ran [REDACTED] for warrants and probation/parole status. [REDACTED] was not subject of a search condition or wanted. The premises was not searched beyond a protective sweep because of this.

[REDACTED] was not present, but still seemed to have personal property in the residence.

SUMMARIES OF INTERVIEWS:

Officer Abi-Chahine:

Abi-Chahine was working in uniform and was in field training at the time of the incident. Officer Maris Gouldsbrough #413 was his FTO.

When Abi-Chahine got to the home, there were several plainclothes and uniformed officers struggling with the man who would later be identified as [REDACTED]. Abi-Chahine went inside the home where the struggle was occurring. [REDACTED] was "flailing around." Abi-Chahine assisted the officers in taking the man to the ground by grabbing [REDACTED] left leg. While on the ground, Abi-Chahine punched [REDACTED] in the lower back area as a distraction because [REDACTED] kept trying to get up. After that, officers were able to get [REDACTED] hands behind his back.

Abi-Chahine saw that a couple of plainclothes officers and some uniformed officers dealing with [REDACTED]. Abi-Chahine didn't know any names because he is new to the department.

Officers put [REDACTED] in handcuffs and Abi-Chahine was ordered to watch the front door because there was a large group of neighbors gathering outside and they didn't want anyone coming in the residence.

The complainant was outside. She was wearing pants and a bra without a shirt on (opposite of what was written in the complaint). The comp was very vocal, saying things to the effect of, "fuck you," "pigs," "I'm going to file an OCC complaint" for about 20 minutes.

Other people such as neighbors are also yelling outside. Abi-Chahine immediately notified Sgt. Hall of the use of force.

The reason Abi-Chahine went into the home is because officers were in danger. He did not do it on the advice of the FTO.

Abi-Chahine filled out the citation given to [REDACTED] on the advice of the FTO.

Inspector Daniel Silver #4328:

Silver was working GTF and was driving by himself on Potrero, checking out stash spots. He was in plainclothes.

Silver got a call from the VRT officers, Sanders, DeJesus and Jackson, in the area to assist at [REDACTED]. Silver went to the unit and recognized it as the home of [REDACTED] a known [REDACTED]. A couple weeks prior, there had been a call at the address.

When he arrived, Silver saw officers at the back door. He asked it was [REDACTED] and they said no. The person of interest had

gone through the back door and was running through the house. On the other side of the home, Officer Sanders was arguing with the comp. She was saying that officers couldn't come in. Silver told her that there was a search waiver on the house because [REDACTED] lived there and was on probation.

The comp turned around at the door and started to walk toward the inside stairs and Silver reached in and grabbed the complainant by the arm/shirt. **Silver was the first officer to cross the threshold of the home.** Silver pulled her to the side and went into the unit to check an area where he had found someone hiding in a previous encounter in the house.

Silver saw a dog in the house and grabbed the dog. While he was there he watched as several officers grabbed a man, later identified as [REDACTED]. All of a sudden, the whole group of officers and [REDACTED] fell in one big pile onto a table. Silver heard glass breaking.

Silver never laid hands on [REDACTED]

Silver had previous contacts at that address. He knew [REDACTED] was the complainant's brother. Silver believed that [REDACTED] was in the house at the time. He also believes that someone running from police in a gang area is a good sign that something illegal is happening.

Silver did not immediately go into the unit because when he arrived, Officer Sanders was communicating with the complainant and Silver wanted to wait for him to try to diplomatically enter the unit in order to not cause distrust in the community.

Officer Luis DeJesus:

DeJesus read the statement he gave in the report in his interview for the record.

DeJesus was with Officer Sanders in the vehicle when they saw [REDACTED]. Sanders told DeJesus that the man later identified as [REDACTED] had a firearm and had ran into the back door of [REDACTED]. Sanders told DeJesus that [REDACTED] was grabbing at his waistband and that was the indicator that [REDACTED] had a firearm. DeJesus did not see [REDACTED] at all.

Sanders got out of the vehicle, DeJesus ran after him. Officer Jackson was also in the vehicle but DeJesus does not know what happened with Jackson.

De Jesus stayed at the back door while all other officers went around to the other side of the building. DeJesus tried the door but it would not open. He waited there until the door was opened by Officer Sanders.

Once in the residence, De Jesus went to the front of the residence and saw several officers, including Sanders and several other uniformed officers who he could not identify.

The officers began struggling with [REDACTED] When [REDACTED] came close to DeJesus, DeJesus grabbed [REDACTED] shoulders and pulled [REDACTED] towards him and the kitchen area. DeJesus did not strike [REDACTED] The group of officers and [REDACTED] fell to the table. DeJesus was not injured. He noticed the injury on [REDACTED] and the paramedics took care of it.

Sergeant Dean Hall:

Hall was patrolling the area of the Potrero Hill housing development. He knew there were several officers in the area because there had been issues involving the [REDACTED]

Hall got a call on the radio about VRT officers in pursuit of someone and the pursuit had ended at [REDACTED] Hall thinks that when he arrived, the comp was already at the front door. Also there was Sanders, Silver, Hildebrand, Correia, Goldsboro, Abi-Chahine.

The comp was in her bra and panties. She was yelling and shouting profanities. He believes that officers had already gone inside. He had already heard that there was something involving guns or drugs.

Hall did not witness the use of force directly. Hall was dealing most directly with the comp outside and not with [REDACTED] but he did talk to [REDACTED] afterward. He also helped get the comp some clothing. A woman who works at the community center got pants for the comp. He knows the woman but not her name.

Abi-Chahine reported to Hall that he used force in the process of detaining [REDACTED]

Hall is saying to the comp, "Calm down," "Can we get you some pants." She tried to get by Hall to get into the residence and Hall briefly laid hands on her to prevent her from going in the house.

[REDACTED]

Hall continued to talk with the comp and also spoke with [REDACTED] after things had calmed down. They both seemed to have also calmed down afterward and Hall believed that he had explained everything in a satisfactory manner in the end.

As far as supervising the scene as the ranking officer, Hall stated that it was his understanding that officers felt there was a significant safety risk of [REDACTED] running into the residence, and in hot pursuit they followed inside and did what they had to do to arrest the man while keeping officers safe. [REDACTED] behavior wasn't the only factor in the way things happened. The way the complainant was acting, officers could reasonably come to

Hall called the entry into the Use of Force of log a "no brainer" based on the UF policy.

Officer Kelvin Sanders:

Sanders was in plainclothes patrolling the Potrero Housing development in an unmarked vehicle with Officers DeJesus and Jackson. As he was driving down [REDACTED] and pulling over, he saw a black man walking down a ramp towards them. He stopped and said, "Oh shit," and then ran back upstairs.

When asked, Sanders stated that his report is probably more accurate, writing that [REDACTED] had said, "Oh shit. The police." Sanders stated that [REDACTED] had reached into his front waistband before turning away. Sanders never saw a gun. [REDACTED] ran upstairs. One of the other officers said, "Police," but Sanders is unsure who said that.

Sanders ran after the man, later identified as [REDACTED] and by the time he got around the balcony, [REDACTED] was gone and he saw a shade moving on a door. He tried to open the door but it was locked. Sanders tried to chase the man into the house because he was in pursuit of a suspect believed to be carrying a concealed weapon.

Sanders then ran around the other side of the building and could see the complainant looking out the second story window. She asked what was going on and Sanders said, "Someone just ran in your house. Was it [REDACTED] Sanders stated he may have said the name a little differently.

The comp replied, "Ain't nobody here but me." Sanders said no you're wrong and asked her to come downstairs. The comp was yelling profanities. At one point, [REDACTED] poked his head out of the upstairs window.

The comp came downstairs with her black dog next to her. She kept the dog to her side and talked to Sanders and Inspector Silver through the cracked door. She was wearing a t-shirt and no pants. Sanders told her, "Tell the person to come down."

Sanders also explained to the comp that he didn't need a weapon to come into her house because he was chasing someone. He explained several other things to her but he denied saying anything to the effect that she would be evicted.

She started walking upstairs and [REDACTED] was walking down the stairs. Silver saw this and entered the unit and took the dog and separated the comp. Sanders pulled the comp back and held her out of the way. Sanders grabbed her arm to get her out of the home. Somebody else then grabbed her.

Sanders went into the house and upstairs with Officer Reynoso. They cleared the upstairs area. They went back downstairs and [REDACTED] was still resisting. Once he was in handcuffs, Sanders went to the washroom and cleared that area.

Sanders went back upstairs to look for [REDACTED] gray sweatshirt that he was wearing. He couldn't find it. The sweatshirt was downstairs in the living though and he found it. Sanders didn't find a gun.

Sanders gave the comp a case number and an 849b. Sgt. Hall was talking to the comp and so did Sanders. She was still upset but became more understanding after talking. She gave Sanders a hug and said she would want to file a complaint and she was given instructions on how to do so.

Sanders has had contact with the comp and [REDACTED] before. Once, Sanders responded to the comp's home on a report of a shooting. [REDACTED]

Sanders had his badge visible during the contact. Sanders added that there is no question that he, DeJesus and Jackson are police officers despite being in plainclothes and an unmarked vehicle. They patrol the area on a regular basis and [REDACTED] knew who he was.

Sanders never told [REDACTED] to stop. Sanders never saw a gun, but he nonetheless stated that he believed that [REDACTED] was carrying a concealed weapon.

Sanders tried entry in the back door but it was locked. He went around to the front door and engaged in dialogue with the complainant. Once the complainant turned away from the slightly
