





7/22/05 Reviewed complaint filed by Comp/ who stated that he was arrested and handcuffed by Q2 Jackson and, thereafter, struck w/ flashlight by plainclothes Q2 (Luis) DeJesus (#247) in chest, back, and face, breaking a tooth. There were (5) officers on the scene during this use of force. Q2 DeJesus justified the unnecessary use of force in his IR.



QIR # had Reporting Q2 Luis DeJesus #247 revealing Comp's arrest for above noted charges as well as detention of Supplemental Report revealed Victim/Q2 Holly Soumen as subject of ADW.



CAD Search on revealed foot pursuit of suspect (no radio code # given for pursuit) and Unit 3C38I/Holly Stoumen broadcasting suspect possessed weapon on right side and battery on Off occurred. Unit 3C00 (Off did not log on, but Q2 Stephen Coleman #4184 assigned unit at that time) reported suspect held at gunpoint and SIC. Off (battery victim, known to be Q2 Stoumen declined 408. Multiple units involved in responding to incident.

Use of Force Log for Co. C., dated 3/10/05, revealed Q50 Carl Fabbri's use of force entry re Q2 DeJesus using object on suspect, who suffered no injury and complained of none. Comment Section indicated battery on Off occurred (PC 245(c)).

SFPD Rosters for Co. C. and TACT, 3<sup>rd</sup> Watch, on 3/10/05 confirmed unit assignments and on-duty status of Offs responding to this incident.

QUH on all units (indicated in CAD) revealed no new info. Copied to file.

7/26/05 IR # rec'd into file w/ Reporting Q2 Luis DeJesus #247 reporting that Q50 Fabbri, he and Q2 Stoumen approached Comp (known dealer) and (known user), the latter immediately putting something into his mouth and swallowing Comp ran and, when grabbed by Q2 Stoumen, he lifted her up and body slammed her to ground. Offs pursued fleeing Comp (scaping into the housing trails) and Q2 Scott illuminated Comp w/ flashlight, ordering out of bushes w/ hands up. Comp assumed fighting stance/balled fists. Q2 Scott drew firearm, ordering Comp to ground (given distinct size advantage to Comp) when Q2 Lyons forced Comp to ground and O2s DeJesus/Scott agging in bandwoffing when distinct

and Q2s DeJesus/Scott assisted in handcuffing despite resistance. Q2 DeJesus stated he twice punched Comp in face as Comp resisted, swinging at him.

and Q2 DeJesus made appropriate entry in use of force log book.

Q50 Carl Fabbri #1815 attached statement reporting he wore SFPD Raid jacket when approaching who swallowed apparent crack cocaine rock. Q2 Stoumen attempted to apprehend Comp, who lifted her up, Q2's feet pointing straight up in air, and slammed her to ground, knocking the wind out of Q2 (per Stoumen). At Co. C., Comp asked what he was being charged w/ and Q50 Fabbri told him, "felony assault on police officer." Comp stated that he was not trying to hurt her but to get away, which was overheard by Q2s Ahern and DeJesus.

Q2 Holly Stoumen #1677 attached statement reporting that, while initial pain was slight, within 48 hrs. the pain was significant, resulting in DP.



8/18/05 SFPD Field Arrest Card submitted to file.

Comp returned HIPPA form to obtain relevant medical records.

ECD Tape rec'd into file - only info re injury at scene was 245/battery on Off, wherein Q2 Stoumen was reportedly thrown thru air but was o.k. and declining ambulance.

Tape-recorded interview w/ Comp/ who stated Q2 Jackson arrested him one block up from Cashmere cul de sac, handcuffed him and commenced escorting him to patrol vehicle parked 15 ft. away when Q2 DeJesus approached, grabbed Comp from Q2 Jackson's custody (Q2 Jackson throwing up his hands as if had no control over prisoner), and struck Comp 4x w/ flashlight - sternum (visible mark, swollen and filled w/ pus), mid-back (bruising), right arm pit, and right cheek (knocking out wisdom/rear molar). Offs stood about in disbelief, including Q2 Jackson, another B/M muscular Off (partner?), (2) Offs in transport unit, and, perhaps, members of Q2 DeJesus' "crew."

Comp was admonished re making incriminating statements and would not comment on why Q2 DeJesus used UF (i.e., retaliation for battery on Off).

Once at Co. C., Q2 DeJesus balled fist and cocked arm as if to strike Comp, who stood ifo Q2 w/ hands raised above his head so as not to provoke Off.

OCC took (5) photos of Comp in jail of alleged injuries to mid-back, sternum, and mouth. Originals to file.

File forwarded to Acting Supervisor McMahon to review allegation recommendations and case referral status.

- 10/28/05 MRFs served on Q2s Parker/Jackson on 10/27/05 at GTF by Lt. Murphy.
- 11/1/05 MRF served upon Q2 Kenney on 10/28/05 w/ 11/17/05 return due date.
- 11/2/05 **Q50 Carl Fabbri #1815** returned his MRF stating he was not present during the reported use of force by Q2 DeJesus and to Q50's knowledge, Comp was uninjured and did not complain of pain.

Q50 Fabbri indicated that the digital photos taken of Comp revealed no injury.

- 11/7/05 MRFs served upon Q2s Stoumen, DeJesus, Fitzpatrick, Scott, Archini, Lyons, and Aherne on 10/31/05.
- 11/8/05 **Q2 Luis DeJesus #247** returned his MRF reiterating his IR statement as explanation for what occurred; that is, he struck Comp in the face w/ his fist twice to ward off Comp he swung at Q2 DeJesus w/ a closed fist. Q2 DeJesus denied any Off struck Comp w/ a flashlight.

Q2 DeJesus stated he did not know what other Offs were at the scene, other than Q2 Lyons/Scott. Q2 DeJesus reemphasized that he used force to combat Comp, who took fighting stance w/ balled fists and considerably outsized the Offs confronting him. Q2 DeJesus recalled no injury occurring to Comp or his complaining of any pain.

DATE & ACTIVITY (DATE & SIGN AFTER FINAL ENTRY ON EACH PAGE) Q2 Romina Izaguirre #4083 returned her MRF stating she was 11/8/05 not at the scene when Comp was taken into custody and, therefore, did not observe any Off use force on Comp. Q2 Izaguirre further stated she was not involved in transport or knew of any injury befalling Comp.

11/9/05 Q2 James Aherne #1095 returned his MRF stating he was not present when Comp was taking into custody and knows of no force being used by  $\phi$ ffs upon the comp. Q2 Aherne stated he first saw Comp at Co. C. and noticed no visible injury on the Comp.

> Q2 Gerald Lyons #4067 returned his MRF stating the IR accurately portrays what occurred; that is, he assisted Q2s DeJesus/Scott in taking Comp into dustody. It was dark as the Offs struggled in the bushes to control/arrest Comp, who flailed legs and attempted to punch the Off(s). Q2 Scott employed his flashlight to illuminate Comp, who struck a fighting stance w/ balled fists and was non-compliant w/ Q2 Scott's directives. Q2 Scott drew his firearm and Q2 Lyons moved in, when Comp pushed Q2 Lyons, who brought Comp to the ground. Q2 Lyons denied an Off struck Comp w/ a flashlight and he did not see any injury to or on the Comp.

Q2 Reginald Scott #441 returned his MRF stating the IR "clearly reflects an accurate account of the events ..." wherein he recalled only Q2s DeJesus, Lyons and himself involved and present at the scene. Q2 Scott recalled observing Comp, hiding in shrubs/ivy, and radioed his location. Q2 Scott ordered him to exit the bushes w/ his hands in the air but Comp did not comply. Q2 Scott held Comp at gunpoint, illuminating Comp's hands to be sure he did not possess a gun, when other Offs arrived. Comp assumed fighting stance when "contacted" by Q2s Lyons/DeJesus and struggle ensued. Q2 Scott holstered his gun and flashlight and assisted in handcuffing Comp w/o further incident. Q2 Scott stated that no Off struck Comp w/ a flashlight.

Q2 Scott stated that the minimal force needed to take Comp into custody was used. Com did not bear any visible injuries and made no complaint of pain.

11/17/05 Q2 Sean Archini #1500 returned his MRF stating he was not present when Comp was taken into custody and assumed

Q2 Rodney Fitzpatrick #114 returned his MRF stating Comp had already been taken into custody upon his arrival onto the arrest scene, such that he did not witness any force used by the Offs on the Comp.

WE OBSERVED B/ WHO I KNOW AS AN ACTIVE NARCOTICS DEALER IN THIS AREA. HE WAS WITH . WE KNOW AS A NARCOTICS USER FROM THIS AREA. THE TWO WERE WALKING WEST BOUND AND THEN AROUND THE REAR OF 146 WESTPOINT ROAD, THEY WERE WALKING AND BOTH LOOKING INTO THE OPEN PALMS OF . SGT. #### PC§ 602. Trespass

Except as provided in paragraph (2) of subdivision (v), subdivision (x), and Section 602.8, every person who willfully commits a trespass by any of the following acts is guilty of a misdemeanor:

(a) Cutting down, destroying, or injuring any kind of wood or timber standing or growing upon the lands of another.

(b) Carrying away any kind of wood or timber lying on those lands.

(c) Maliciously injuring or severing from the freehold of another anything attached to it, or its produce.

(d) Digging, taking, or carrying away from any lot situated within the limits of any incorporated city, without the license of the owner or legal occupant, any earth, soil, or stone.

(e) Digging, taking, or carrying away from land in any city or town laid down on the map or plan of the city, or otherwise recognized or established as a street, alley, avenue, or park, without the license of the proper authorities, any earth, soil, or stone.

(f) Maliciously tearing down, damaging, mutilating, or destroying any sign, signboard, or notice placed upon, or affixed to, any property belonging to the state, or to any city, county, city and county, town or village, or upon any property of any person, by the state or by an automobile association, which sign, signboard or notice is intended to indicate or designate a road, or a highway, or is intended to direct travelers from one point to another, or relates to fires, fire control, or any other matter involving the protection of the property, or putting up, affixing, fastening, printing, or painting upon any property belonging to the state, or to any city, county, town, or village, or dedicated to the public, or upon any property of any person, without license from the owner, any notice, advertisement, or designation of, or any name for any commodity, whether for sale or otherwise, or any picture, sign, or device intended to call attention to it.

(g) Entering upon any lands owned by any other person whereon oysters or other shellfish are planted or growing; or injuring, gathering, or carrying away any oysters or other shellfish planted, growing, or on any of those lands, whether covered by water or not, without the license of the owner or legal occupant; or damaging, destroying, or removing, or causing to be removed, damaged, or destroyed, any stakes, marks, fences, or signs intended to designate the boundaries and limits of any of those lands.

(h) (1) Entering upon lands or buildings owned by any other person without the license of the owner or legal occupant, where signs forbidding trespass are displayed, and whereon cattle, goats, pigs, sheep, fowl, or any other animal is being raised, bred, fed, or held for the purpose of food for human consumption; or injuring, gathering, or carrying away any animal being housed on any of those lands, without the license of the owner or legal occupant; or damaging, destroying, or removing, or causing to be removed, damaged, or destroyed, any stakes, marks, fences, or signs intended to designate the

boundaries and limits of any of those lands.

(2) In order for there to be a violation of this subdivision, the trespass signs under paragraph (1) must be displayed at intervals not less than three per mile along all exterior boundaries and at all roads and trails entering the land.

(3) This subdivision shall not be construed to preclude prosecution or punishment under any other provision of law, including, but not limited to, grand theft or any provision that provides for a greater penalty or longer term of imprisonment.

(i) Willfully opening, tearing down, or otherwise destroying any fence on the enclosed land of another, or opening any gate, bar, or fence of another and willfully leaving it open without the written permission of the owner, or maliciously tearing down, mutilating, or destroying any sign, signboard, or other notice forbidding shooting on private property.

(j) Building fires upon any lands owned by another where signs forbidding trespass are displayed at intervals not greater than one mile along the exterior boundaries and at all roads and trails entering the lands, without first having obtained written permission from the owner of the lands or the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession.

(k) Entering any lands, whether unenclosed or enclosed by fence, for the purpose of injuring any property or property rights or with the intention of interfering with, obstructing, or injuring any lawful business or occupation carried on by the owner of the land, the owner's agent or by the person in lawful possession.

(1) Entering any lands under cultivation or enclosed by fence, belonging to, or occupied by, another, or entering upon uncultivated or unenclosed lands where signs forbidding trespass are displayed at intervals not less than three to the mile along all exterior boundaries and at all roads and trails entering the lands without the written permission of the owner of the land, the owner's agent or of the person in lawful possession, and

(1) Refusing or failing to leave the lands immediately upon being requested by the owner of the land, the owner's agent or by the person in lawful possession to leave the lands, or

(2) Tearing down, mutilating, or destroying any sign, signboard, or notice forbidding trespass or hunting on the lands, or

(3) Removing, injuring, unlocking, or tampering with any lock on any gate on or leading into the lands, or

(4) Discharging any firearm.

(m) Entering and occupying real property or structures of any kind without the consent of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession.

(n) Driving any vehicle, as defined in Section 670 of the Vehicle Code, upon real property belonging to, or lawfully occupied by, another and known not to be open to the general public, without the consent of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in

lawful possession. This subdivision shall not apply to any person described in Section 22350 of the Business and Professions Code who is making a lawful service of process, provided that upon exiting the vehicle, the person proceeds immediately to attempt the service of process, and leaves immediately upon completing the service of process or upon the request of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession.

Refusing or failing to leave land, real property, or structures belonging to or (0)lawfully occupied by another and not open to the general public, upon being requested to leave by (1) a peace officer at the request of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession, and upon being informed by the peace officer that he or she is acting at the request of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession, or (2) the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession. The owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession shall make a separate request to the peace officer on each occasion when the peace officer's assistance in dealing with a trespass is requested. However, a single request for a peace officer's assistance may be made to cover a limited period of time not to exceed 30 days and identified by specific dates, during which there is a fire hazard or the owner, owner's agent or person in lawful possession is absent from the premises or property. In addition, a single request for a peace officer's assistance may be made for a period not to exceed six months when the premises or property is closed to the public and posted as being closed. However, this subdivision shall not be applicable to persons engaged in lawful labor union activities which are permitted to be carried out on the property by the California Agricultural Labor Relations Act, Part 3.5 (commencing with Section 1140) of Division 2 of the Labor Code, or by the National Labor Relations Act. For purposes of this section, land, real property, or structures owned or operated by any housing authority for tenants as defined under Section 34213.5 of the Health and Safety Code constitutes property not open to the general public; however, this subdivision shall not apply to persons on the premises who are engaging in activities protected by the California or United States Constitution, or to persons who are on the premises at the request of a resident or management and who are not loitering or otherwise suspected of violating or actually violating any law or ordinance.

(p) Entering upon any lands declared closed to entry as provided in Section 4256 of the Public Resources Code, if the closed areas shall have been posted with notices declaring the closure, at intervals not greater than one mile along the exterior boundaries or along roads and trails passing through the lands.

(q) Refusing or failing to leave a public building of a public agency during those hours of the day or night when the building is regularly closed to the public upon being requested to do so by a regularly employed guard, watchman, or custodian of the public agency owning or maintaining the building or property, if the surrounding circumstances would indicate to a reasonable person that the person has no apparent lawful business to pursue.

(r) Knowingly skiing in an area or on a ski trail which is closed to the public and which has signs posted indicating the closure.

(s) Refusing or failing to leave a hotel or motel, where he or she has obtained accommodations and has refused to pay for those accommodations, upon request of the

proprietor or manager, and the occupancy is exempt, pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 1940 of the Civil Code, from Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 1940) of Title 5 of Part 4 of Division 3 of the Civil Code. For purposes of this subdivision, occupancy at a hotel or motel for a continuous period of 30 days or less shall, in the absence of a written agreement to the contrary, or other written evidence of a periodic tenancy of indefinite duration, be exempt from Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 1940) of Title 5 of Part 4 of Division 3 of the Civil Code.

(t) Entering upon private property, including contiguous land, real property, or structures thereon belonging to the same owner, whether or not generally open to the public, after having been informed by a peace officer at the request of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession, and upon being informed by the peace officer that he or she is acting at the request of the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession, that the property is not open to the particular person; or refusing or failing to leave the property upon being asked to leave the property in the manner provided in this subdivision.

This subdivision shall apply only to a person who has been convicted of a violent felony, as specified in subdivision (c) of Section 667.5, committed upon the particular private property. A single notification or request to the person as set forth above shall be valid and enforceable under this subdivision unless and until rescinded by the owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession of the property.

(u) (1) Knowingly entering, by an unauthorized person, upon any airport operations area if the area has been posted with notices restricting access to authorized personnel only and the postings occur not greater than every 150 feet along the exterior boundary.

(2) Any person convicted of a violation of paragraph (1) shall be punished as follows:

(A) By a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

(B) By imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six months, or by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or both, if the person refuses to leave the airport operations area after being requested to leave by a peace officer or authorized personnel.

(C) By imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six months, or by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or both, for a second or subsequent offense.

(3) As used in this subdivision the following definitions shall control:

(A) "Airport operations area" means that part of the airport used by aircraft for landing, taking off, surface maneuvering, loading and unloading, refueling, parking, or maintenance, where aircraft support vehicles and facilities exist, and which is not for public use or public vehicular traffic.

(B) "Authorized personnel" means any person who has a valid airport identification card issued by the airport operator or has a valid airline identification card recognized by the airport operator, or any person not in possession of an airport or airline identification card who is being escorted for legitimate purposes by a person with an airport or airline identification card.

(C) "Airport" means any facility whose function is to support commercial aviation.

(v) (1) Except as permitted by federal law, intentionally avoiding submission to the screening and inspection of one's person and accessible property in accordance with the procedures being applied to control access when entering or reentering a sterile area of an airport, as defined in Section 171.5.

(2) A violation of this subdivision that is responsible for the evacuation of an airport terminal and is responsible in any part for delays or cancellations of scheduled flights is punishable by imprisonment of not more than one year in a county jail if the sterile area is posted with a statement providing reasonable notice that prosecution may result from a trespass described in this subdivision.

(w) Refusing or failing to leave a battered women's shelter at any time after being requested to leave by a managing authority of the shelter.

(1) A person who is convicted of violating this subdivision shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than one year.

(2) The court may order a defendant who is convicted of violating this subdivision to make restitution to a battered woman in an amount equal to the relocation expenses of the battered woman and her children if those expenses are incurred as a result of trespass by the defendant at a battered women's shelter.

(x) (1) Knowingly entering or remaining in a neonatal unit, maternity ward, or birthing center located in a hospital or clinic without lawful business to pursue therein, if the area has been posted so as to give reasonable notice restricting access to those with lawful business to pursue therein and the surrounding circumstances would indicate to a reasonable person that he or she has no lawful business to pursue therein. Reasonable notice is that which would give actual notice to a reasonable person, and is posted, at a minimum, at each entrance into the area.

(2) Any person convicted of a violation of paragraph (1) shall be punished as follows:

(A) As an infraction, by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

(B) By imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year, or by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or both, if the person refuses to leave the posted area after being requested to leave by a peace officer or other authorized person.

(C) By imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year, or by a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars (\$2,000), or both, for a second or subsequent offense.

(D) If probation is granted or the execution or imposition of sentencing is suspended for any person convicted under this subdivision, it shall be a condition of probation that the person participate in counseling, as designated by the court, unless the court finds good cause not to impose this requirement. The court shall require the person to pay for this counseling, if ordered, unless good cause not to pay is shown.

## PC§ 69. Resisting Executive Officer

Every person who attempts, by means of any threat or violence, to deter or prevent an executive officer from performing any duty imposed upon such officer by law, or who knowingly resists, by the use of force or violence, such officer, in the performance of his duty, is punishable by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or by imprisonment in the state prison, or in a county jail not exceeding one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

### PC§ 245. Assault with a Deadly Weapon or Force Likely to Produce Great Bodily Injury

(a) (1) Any person who commits an assault upon the person of another with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for two, three, or four years, or in a county jail for not exceeding one year, or by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or by both the fine and imprisonment.

(2) Any person who commits an assault upon the person of another with a firearm shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for two, three, or four years, or in a county jail for not less than six months and not exceeding one year, or by both a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) and imprisonment.

(3) Any person who commits an assault upon the person of another with a machinegun, as defined in Section 12200, or an assault weapon, as defined in Section 12276 or 12276.1, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for 4, 8, or 12 years.

(b) Any person who commits an assault upon the person of another with a semiautomatic firearm shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for three, six, or nine years.

(c) Any person who commits an assault with a deadly weapon or instrument, other than a firearm, or by any means likely to produce great bodily injury upon the person of a peace officer or firefighter, and who knows or reasonably should know that the victim is a peace officer or firefighter engaged in the performance of his or her duties, when the peace officer or firefighter is engaged in the performance of his or her duties, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for three, four, or five years.

(d) (1) Any person who commits an assault with a firearm upon the person of a peace officer or firefighter, and who knows or reasonably should know that the victim is a peace officer or firefighter engaged in the performance of his or her duties, when the peace officer or firefighter is engaged in the performance of his or her duties, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for four, six, or eight years.

(2) Any person who commits an assault upon the person of a peace officer or firefighter with a semiautomatic firearm and who knows or reasonably should know that the victim is a peace officer or firefighter engaged in the performance of his or her duties, when the peace officer or firefighter is engaged in the performance of his or her duties, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for five, seven, or nine years.


(3) Any person who commits an assault with a machinegun, as defined in Section 12200, or an assault weapon, as defined in Section 12276 or 12276.1, upon the person of a peace officer or firefighter, and who knows or reasonably should know that the victim is a peace officer or firefighter engaged in the performance of his or her duties, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for 6, 9, or 12 years.

(e) When a person is convicted of a violation of this section in a case involving use of a deadly weapon or instrument or firearm, and the weapon or instrument or firearm is owned by that person, the court shall order that the weapon or instrument or firearm be deemed a nuisance, and it shall be confiscated and disposed of in the manner provided by Section 12028.

(f) As used in this section, "peace officer" refers to any person designated as a peace officer in Chapter 4.5 (commencing with Section 830) of Title 3 of Part 2.
