

**FIRST AGREEMENT TO RENEW
INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
FOR THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE COMMUNITY-BASED
EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS**

This First Agreement to Renew the Intergovernmental Agreement for the Consolidation of the Community-Based Early Childhood Programs ("First Renewal") is made and entered into as of July 1, 2018 ("Effective Date"), by and between the Board of Education of the City of Chicago, a body politic and corporate commonly known as the Chicago Public Schools (the "Board" or "CPS"), and the City of Chicago, a municipal corporation and home rule unit of government under Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois (the "City"), acting through its Department of Family and Support Services ("DFSS").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City and the Board entered into the Intergovernmental Agreement for the Consolidation of the Community-Based Early Childhood Programs (the "Agreement") with a Term commencing on July 1, 2017 and continuing through June 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, and by mutual written agreement of the parties, the Agreement may be renewed three (3) times for additional or successive periods of twelve (12) months each, according to the same basic terms, provided that adequate funding is available;

WHEREAS, the parties now desire to exercise the first option to renew as set forth in this First Renewal. Any and all capitalized terms in this First Renewal shall have the same definition as set forth in the Agreement unless stated specifically otherwise; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, including but not limited to the Recitals set forth above, which are incorporated into this Agreement by reference, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

**ARTICLE ONE:
FIRST EXERCISE OF OPTION TO RENEW**

The Agreement is hereby renewed for twelve (12) months, commencing on the Effective Date set forth above and continuing through June 30, 2019 ("First Renewal Term").

**ARTICLE TWO:
EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAM**

The parties agree that the Early Childhood Program continues to operate as described in the Agreement and that the City shall continue to provide, through its subcontractor community-based organizations the Services described in the Agreement through the First Renewal Term.

ARTICLE THREE:
GRANT

CPS shall continue to grant funds to DFSS for the Services provided pursuant to the terms of the Agreement during the First Renewal Term in accordance with the terms stated in the Funding Guidelines that are attached and incorporated into the Agreement as Exhibit C. The maximum amount payable to DFSS during the First Renewal Term shall not exceed Seventy-Two Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$72,800,000.00), as authorized by Board Report No. 18-0627-EX2, which was amended by 18-1024-EX2, and as may be amended subsequently. All other terms in the Agreement regarding compensation and payment remain in full force and effect during the First Renewal Term.

ARTICLE FOUR:
NO OTHER AMENDMENTS






