



John Moran and I met with Mr. Ronnie Moore at the Marianna Florida Police Department regarding the homicide of Theresa Corley that occurred in December of 1978 in the Town of Bellingham. We told Mr. Moore that we were investigating the homicide of Theresa Corley and we asked him

I asked Mr. Moore if he would voluntarily provide us with a DNA sample. Mr. Moore answered in the affirmative and I took Mr. Moore's DNA from a saliva collection kit. After obtaining Mr. Moore's DNA sample,

I then asked Mr. Moore if he placed that call to Bellingham PD and again he said that he did not. Mr. Moore then said that he wanted the case solved and would help in anyway he could. Mr. Moore then suggested that he meet with the Corley family after he sold his house in Florida and moved back to Massachusetts so he could dispel any of their fears. I then told Mr. Moore that I could arrange that meeting. Mr. Moore then told us that he said all he had to say, that we weren't going to pin the murder on him and he was ending the interview so he could buy some crack. Mr. Moore then took my phone number and said he would call me if he changed his mind about cooperating in the investigation.
