Chief Pane,

On November 2, 2010 at or about 0345 Officer Colton was assigned marked patrol vehicle GV-7. The officer reports he was operating stationary radar in the grassy median on NYS Route 5(2)20 west of the Seneca Lake State Park and he was facing west. This part of 5@20 is outside the City of Geneva and outside Ontario County. The Officer states he went to pursue a gray Ford Focus for no tail lamps and inadequate exhaust. This part of 5@20 is not lit with street lights and I am wondering how he was able to get so details of the vehicle he was going to pursue. The Officer reports when he went to pursue the vehicle in question he struck and ran over a metal delineator post causing damage to front bumper of GV-7. The metal delineator was ripped from the ground and dragged out into the highway. There was a heavy frost on the night in question. When I went to the scene of the accident this Sergeant wasn't able to locate where the patrol vehicle had been sitting. None of the frost was melted or thawed in any way from the heat of the motor or exhaust system of the warm and running patrol vehicle. There were no spin marks in the grass where the Officer took off to pursue this vehicle and no frost was melted in the tire tracks. I could clearly see where Officer Colton's patrol vehicle travelled 85 feet 8 inches in the median before striking the sign post. This motor vehicle accident was **Preventable** the officer had no business being outside the City of Geneva or in Seneca County. GV-7 was taken out of service until it could be checked by a city mechanic the following day. CR# 2010-22148 was assigned to the motor vehicle accident. The damage to the patrol vehicle and the scene were documented with photographs. New York State Department of Transportation was contacted regarding the destroyed delineator.

ON 12-04-09 AT APPROXIMATELY 0025 HRS THIS OFFICER WAS TRAVELING EAST ON HAMILTON STREET IN A MARK PATROL UNIT BELIEVED TO BE GV5. WHILE PROCEEDING EAST ON HAMILTON STREET IN THE LEFT HAND LANE THIS OFFICER SAW A ORANGE PICK UP TRUCK BEHIND THE PATROL VEHICLE, OFFICER COLTON WAS DRIVING. THE ORANGE PICK UP TRUCK PROCEEDED TO THE RIGHT HAND LANE AND BEGAN TO PASS THE MARKED PATROL UNIT. THIS TOOK PLACE JUST BEFORE THE HILL ON HAMILTON STREET. WHILE GOING OVER THE HILL THIS OFFICER SAW MARKED PATROL UNIT GV6 PROCEEDING WEST ON HAMILTON STREET JUST PAST PULTENEY STREET. OFFICER COLTONS VEHICLES BRAKE LIGHTS CAME ON FOR A SECOND AND VEHICLE STILL PROCEEDED EAST. THIS OFFICER SAW GV6 CONDUCT U-TURN TO FOLLOW OFFICER COLTONS PICK UP TRUCK, AT THIS TIME THIS OFFICER INFORMED SGT. TURNER OVER THE RADIO IT WAS ONE OF OURS. SGT. TURNER ASKED IF IT WAS ORANGE THIS OFFICER SAID " YES." THIS OFFICER BELIEVES HE WAS TRAVELING AT 40 MPH IN THE MARKED PATROL VEHICLE. THIS OFFICER DID NOT ESTIMATE OFFICERS COLTONS SPEED BECAUSE IT WAS A FELLOW OFFICER. IF I HAD TO JUDGE HIS SPEED ON HOW FAST HE PASSED MARKED PATROL UNIT, THIS OFFICER WOULD SAY OFFICER COLTONS VEHICLE WAS GOING APPROXIMATELY 15 TO 20 MPH FASTER THAN THIS OFFICERS VEHICLE.

Lieutenant Trickler,

Sir, I am directing this document to you as requested for the allegation of my excessive rate of speed on the 4th day of December, 2009. On said date, I was operating my personal vehicle in an Easterly direction on Hamilton Street. I was traveling behind marked unit GV8, near Jefferson Avenue at speeds at or around thirty miles per hour. At this time I passed marked unit GV8 in a safe and non-reckless manner. As I crested the hill on Hamilton Street I observed marked unit GV6 driving in a Westerly direction, near Pulteney Street. At no time was I operating my personally owned vehicle at an excessive rate of speed.

On the 5th day of December, 2009, Sergeant Turner spoke with me regarding my alleged high rate of speed. Sergeant Turner started the conversation off by stating, "Going a little fast last night fucker or what?" Sergeant Turner then stated that I was operating my personally owned vehicle at sixty miles per hour. I informed Sergeant Turner that I was not driving at such a speed and that I did nothing wrong. Sergeant Turner then stated, "First of all, who said you did anything wrong? You're going fucking too fast. That's what the problem was." I then asked Sergeant Turner how fast I was going, to which he stated, "You were going probably fifty five or sixty."

Sir, I request that I personally speak with you about this matter. At no time was I operating my personal vehicle at an excessive rate of speed. As you know, I have taken full responsibility and have accepted all disciplinary action for my past actions. I have never once declined nor argued my actions in the past. This allegation made against me is false and I wish for you to listen to the recorded conversation between myself and Sergeant Turner. I am not declining that I was speeding above the posted speed limit but it was no more than that of forty five miles per hour, no traffic or pedestrians were using the roadway and my vehicle was under control at all times.

On 12-04-09 at 12:25a.m. I was patrolling in GV-6 westbound on Hamilton Street and saw a pick up truck heading eastbound at approximately 55-60 mph, I didn't know it at the time but it was Colton driving the orange truck. I turned around on the vehicle and Colton continued eastbound after spiking his brakes. P.O. Steve was in the area and he called on the radio stating that it was one of ours. I caught the red light at Pulteney Street and did not pursue Colton. I met up with P.O. Steve and asked him about the incident. P.O. Steve stated that Colton was trying to show off and was going over 60 mph. There was quite a few pedestrians out as well as cars at the Pulteney Street intersection and the speed was not acceptable at all and definitely unsafe.

On 12-04-09 at approximately 11:40p.m. I met with P.O. Colton to advise him to slow down as he was driving way too fast on Hamilton Street the previous night. P.O. Colton became highly defensive and insisted that he did nothing wrong. I told him he needs to be responsible both on and off duty. P.O. Colton again insisted that he had done nothing wrong.

On the 8th day of September, 2009 at or around 23:45 hours, I was traveling in a P.O.V. in an Easterly direction on Routes 5&20 near the State Park at a speed of 55 to 60mph. I observed a marked Geneva Police Vehicle traveling West on the above named highway. When I observed the marked unit, I did accelerate the vehicle that I was operating to a speed of around 85mph. I did observe the marked unit turn around while I accelerated passed it. I kept this speed until I was approximately 500 feet away from the underpass on Routes 5&20, in Seneca County. I did not believe that the marked unit was in pursuit of me, due to me not observing emergency lights and my belief of the operator of the marked unit, being Officer Vine recognizing the vehicle that I was operating. I slowed the vehicle that I was operating to the posted speed limit approximately 500 feet from the underpass and stopped for the red traffic signal on Routes 5&20 and 96A. While sitting at the traffic light, marked unit GV9 pulled behind me with its emergency lights activated. I looked into the rear view mirror and observed that the operator of marked unit GV9 was Sgt. Middlebrook. At this time, I identified myself and apologized for my actions. I am full aware that my erratic driving may have caused injury or even death to Sgt. Middlebrook, the passenger in my vehicle, other persons and myself. I will take full disciplinary action for the incident and understand all consequences involved.

I received the flashlight in by box but not the knife involved in the above referenced CR.

A couple of questions:

- 1.) Where is the knife?
- 2.) Why does the complaint state that the items were to be disposed of when the officer kept them?
- 3.) Why does the complaint say that the items are of no value when in fact it is clear that the flash light is new and in very good condition? In fact the owner states that he bought it a month ago for \$35.00.
- 4.) What would have happened if these it was determined that these items were used in the commission of a crime? I would first suspect that the items could be used as burglar's tools.
- 5.) What was the purpose of the officer keeping them? Was it for his own benefit?
- 6.) Is the officer familiar with GO 905 which deals with property management?

I would like PO Colton to put into writing the reasoning for his actions and the discrepancies between the complaint and his actions. When I called PO Colton and asked him about the items he stated that they were in his locker. I then called the owner of the items and relayed that information to him. If the knife can not be located that puts me in a very precarious position and it does not reflect favorably on the department. It would appear that the officer was attempting to keep the items for his own benefit. Please have these answers to me by the end of his shift.

October 6th, 2009

Sgt. Reale,

I was unable to locate the small novelty knife in my locker on the 5th of October, 2009. After a more thorough search of my locker and other places it may have been I located the knife in the bottom of my duty bag. I had full intentions of disposing of the two items but forgot to throughout my tour of duty on the date of the original complaint. When my tour of duty was over on the day of the complaint I seen the items in my duty bag and placed them on the top shelf in my locker. I believed that both items had no value, due to the flashlight not having a charger which renders it useless and the knife being of very little or no value which also renders it virtually worthless. I checked the front lobby area of the for any sign of a crime being committed, about to be committed or had been committed, which resulted negative. After not being able to locate the knife on the 5th, I was asked to write Lieutenant Trickler a memo in regards to me not locating the knife. Once again, I clearly forgot to write a memo to Lieutenant Trickler. On the 6th day of October, I attempted to contact Lieutenant Trickler which I could not. I have also read General Orders Section 905 and clearly understand that I have made a mistake. I will correct my actions in the future and will follow correct procedure in the finding of lost property. The flashlight was turned over to Lieutenant Trickler and the knife was placed in his mail box on the 6th of October.

I spoke to Officer Colton on 10-5-2009 concerning the above-referenced matter. I indicated that you wanted the knife and flashlight left in your box so the items could be returned to their rightful owner. Officer Colton indicated to me that he had already taken care of it.

Later Dispatcher Mahoney advised me that you phoned and wanted me to make sure those items were left in your box. I checked your mailbox and observed the flashlight, but no knife. I asked Officer Colton about the knife, and he said that he could not find it. I asked why he told me that he took care of it already if he couldn't find the knife. He said he looked everywhere and couldn't find it, but he would look again. I told him to leave a note for Lt. Trickler about the knife if he couldn't find it.

On 10-6-2009, I asked Officer Colton to submit a memo to me in response to the issues brought up in your memo to me. I told him to review G. O. 905 and to indicate that he did so in his memo. I also told him to include in the memo why he failed to leave a note for you concerning the knife as he was directed.

Later Officer Colton later indicated to me that he found the knife in his duty bag. I told him to leave it in your box and include his recovery of it in the memo. Officer Colton submitted a memo to me concerning the matter, including the above-mentioned items, a copy of which you have received.

On, or about, October 1st I was advised by **Exception of the set o**

protection and he had just bought the flashlight a month ago for \$35.00. He requested that I looked into the matter.

On, or about, 10-05-09 I contacted PO Colton via phone. PO Colton stated that he felt that the items had no value and that they were placed in his locker. This is contrary to what the call for service states. PO Colton stated that he would leave the items in my mail box. I then called **prop** and advised him that I have located the items and they would be returned to him.

The next day I returned to find the flashlight in my box but not the knife. It is clear that the flashlight was new and I cannot comprehend how PO Colton can declare it as not having any value. I contacted Sgt Reale and inquired as to where the knife was. He stated that PO Colton could not find the knife. I asked Sgt Reale to have PO Colton write a letter to me advising me why the knife was placed in his locker and not placed into found property. I contacted and now advised him that I had the flashlight but the knife could not be found. The next day I found the knife in my box but no letter from PO Colton. I asked Sgt Reale where PO Colton's explanation was and he stated that he did direct PO Colton to write me a letter. PO Colton apparently disregarded this order by his supervisor. I, once again, contacted and advised him that I now had both items and that they would be returned to him.

I had Sgt Reale, once again, direct PO Colton to forward me his explanation about the property and why he disregarded a direct order from his supervisor to do this in the first place. The next day this was placed in my box.

It was then brought to my attention that PO Colton "found" a quarter in the parking lot and brought it in to log in as found property. I believe this was an attempt to scrutinize the policies and procedures of the Geneva Police Department. This quarter that was placed into the evidence locker was reviewed by Sgt Heieck and found to be incomplete with numerous errors. I was further advised that PO Colton did an incident report about checking a playground (refer to **second second secon**

PO Colton's actions has caused unnecessary work for several members of the Geneva Police Department and it shows that he has a total lack of respect for both the policy and procedures of the police department and the supervisors. His actions took him off the street and brought him into the PD just so that he could make a point. I personally feel that I was put into an embarrassing situation as I had to call **form** on at least three separate occasions with different information regarding his property. I also feel that because of his actions **form** has lost a great deal of respect for the members of the department.

I believe that the actions of PO Colton are in direct violation of the following General Orders:

EMPLOYEE COUNSELING MEMORANDUM

Officer Colton,

On service for found property at the service for found for service indicated that the items were of no value and that you would be disposing of them. This is despite the fact that both items were in very good working condition and the flashlight was in fact brand new. Contrary to what was indicated on the Call for Service, you did not dispose of the items but

retained possession of them.

On or about October 5, 2009 you had a telephone conversation with Lieutenant Trickler in which he informed you that the owner of these items, had contacted him and would like the items returned. You then told Lieutenant Trickler that the items were in your locker and that you would leave them in his mailbox. Lieutenant Trickler then advised

asked me to make sure that you remembered to leave the items in his box so that he could return them to their rightful owner.

On October 5, 2009, I asked you if you had left the items in Lieutenant Trickler's mailbox. You told me that you had already taken care of it. However when I checked the mailbox, only the flashlight was present. I then asked you about the knife and you told me that you could not find it. I then told you to make every attempt to find the knife, and further that if you could not find it, to leave Lieutenant Trickler a note indicating such. You told me you had taken care of the matter when if fact you had only partially completed what was asked of you. Furthermore, you failed to leave an explanatory note as you were directed.

Your handling of this matter resulted in Lieutenant Trickler having to explain to an ever-changing account of what happened to his property on at least three separate occasions. In turn, this has caused a citizen of our community to loose a great deal of respect for members of this department. Your actions are in direct violation of the following General Orders contained in the Geneva Police Department's General Orders Manual:

G. O. 905, PROPERTY AND EVIDENCE MANAGEMENT, SECTION VII (A,B,C,F)

G. O. 305, RULES OF CONDUCT, SECTION III (A18a)

You must understand that this counseling memorandum is being served upon you so that you may take immediate corrective measures to ensure similar incidents do not occur in the future.

As you may or may not be aware, further violation of the General Orders may result in disciplinary action being taken against you.

My signature acknowledges that I have read and received a copy of this counseling memorandum. It does not mean I agree or disagree with the contents. I know I have the right to attach a rebuttal.
