Gloria stated that when Louise came back, she went straight back to the office and put her coat in the office. (In Louise interview she stated that she did not go back to the office when she got back to the store and that she placed her coat under the counter by the register.) Gloria stated that the employees were not suppose to keep their coats up front and she is sure that Louise went to the office when she came in at 6:30pm.

Gloria stated that Louise first came in the store the Dudley's were the only people in the store and that there was no line. (Again this is does not coincide with Louise's interview,) Gloria did state that Louise did ring up one customer later on and when she was done she took the till back to the office to cash it up. This was around 6:45 to 7:15pm.

This is when Louise found the money missing. Louise then called Peggy and asked her where the money was. Gloria also stated that normally the office door is left open. She did not see anyone around the office while she was there.

01/29/99 Interview with Holy Brockway,

Holly stated that she has been employed at the store for about 7 months. On the day of the theft she was suppose to work from 1:00pm to 5:00pm. According to Holly Peggy had taken one of the tills at around 4:15pm and cashed it up. Holly's till was still in the registered but she had signed off at this time.

Peggy left the store at around 4:30pm to get some groceries and came back around 5:00pm. Holly then brought Peggy home. Holly stated that she did go back to the office at about 5:00pm to get her coat before she went home.

Both Holly and Gloria agreed to take a Polygraph exam.

I have made several attempts to contact Peggy Carroll to set up an interview and have been unable to get a hold of her. I will try again when I return to work on the 6th of February.

Peggy Carol came in for an interview. She stated that she hs been employed at the store for about 2 years and she is now the store manager.

Peggy stated that on the day of the theft she worked for 7-3:30pm. She went to the grocery store when she was done work and road home with Holly Brockway.

Peggy stated that she did the draws at about 3:15 on the day of the theft. After she got groceries she was in a hurry to get home because of the weather and she left the deposit bag in the back of the store. She did not tell Louise about the bag and this is why she is concerned why Louise would have even looked for the bag. Peggy said that she left the store at about 4:05pm.

Obtained the cash register receipts from the store and after checking them it was found that they did not follow with Louise's story about what had taken place. She did not run anybody through the register at the time when she returned back to the store from her supper break.

#### 03/25/99

Reinterviewed Louise and she basically stated what she had told me in the prior interview. When I confronted her about the problems with her facts, she insisted that she did what she told me in her first interview. I then showed her the cash receipts to prove that she did not ring up any customers when she returned to work. She got very nervous, but insisted that she did ring people up because Gloria had several people in her line.

Louise could not explain the differences between her interview and the other employees. She could not explain the fact that the cash receipts proved that she was not being truthful. SHe got very upset and wanted to leave. I ended the interview at this time.

Contacted Tammy Sauve and advised her of the investigation. Tammy wanted Polygraphs set up for each of the employees. I explained to her that this could not be done because I could not do exams on and employee theft case. There are no further leads at this time. Pending RER

Margaret called to report having \$200.00 stolen from her purse. Purse was kept under her bed but she found same in the bathroom gone through with the money missing. Margaret had her grandson and his live-in girlfriend over for lunch this afternoon and they left right after lunch, no one else has been in the apartment. Grandson and girlfriend are Ellis Nile and Melody Laffin, then live somewhere in the Hogansburg area but did not know where. Margaret believes that Melody did it so she went up to K-mart where Ellis and Melody went after leaving her apartment. Margaret spoke with Melody and she denied taking it and Ellis said he knew nothing about it. SJS

Patrolled to the above, spoke to Margaret who stated that she placed her purse under her bed at about 0930-1000hrs today. At about 1100hrs her step-grandson, Ellis Niles arrived at her apartment with Melanie Laffin and 2 babies. Ellis went into the bathroom (only through bedroom) immediately upon entering the apartment and was in there for only about 2-3 minutes. After Lunch at about 1230-1245 hrs Melanie entered the bathroom for about 3-5 minutes. Comp later found her purse in the bathroom. Comp states that neither of them have a job. She also states that she spoke to both of them in K-Mart but Ellis told her he didn't know anything about it and Melanie denied it.

Comp's Son Keith Russell (Ellis's step father/comp's son) called and advised me that he has had items come up missing after Ellis and Melanie have visited in the past. He stated that Ellis is a little slow but very honest and would tell if he knew something was happening. He feels Melanie did this. He will try to get a phone number and provided the following directions to Ellis's and Melanie's apartment: St Rt 37 from Malone, after the Western Door, before the double bridges take a left, go about 1 mile to the Hammel Store take a right (Post office at same intersection), take 1st driveway on left into apartments, apt building on left it is the second apartment from the left side on the ground floor, should be a white Jeep Laredo parked out front. He is not sure if this is a Hogansburgh or Roosevelt town address.



Request for Reduction Forms for Vehicle and Traffic Law Violations

The District Attorney's Office is not longer prosecuting our traffic tickets issued under the Village Code. Officers will be expected to prosecute the case if it goes to trial. Along with this our officers will be able to consent to reductions for Vehicle and Traffic Law tickets that are issued under the Village Code. The following procedures will be adhered to when considering a

Individuals requesting a reduction must come to the station and obtain a Request for Reduction Form, which have been printed for our Department. Once this has been completed fully and returned with a self-address stamped envelope, the form will be then placed in the issuing officer's mailbox or given directly to him.

The officer will then do a drivers history on the individual. The officer will take this history, along with the individuals attitude, location of the violation, road conditions and any other pertinent information into consideration when deciding to consent to a reduction or not.

Once this has been done the officer will complete the Consent to Reduction Form and submit it to a Supervisor for their approval. Once it has been approved and signed by both the officer and his supervisor it will be mailed back to the defendant and a copy will be sent to the court. Another copy will then be placed in the Dispatcher's box to be kept on file here.

When a traffic stop has been made and a ticket issued the Officer will not volunteer to the individual that reduction Forms are available. If the person inquires if something can be done he is to be instructed that he needs to contact the station for the necessary information. In other words you will not issue a ticket and then give the person a Reduction Form at the scene.

Evidence obtained at a crime scene and returned to the police department will be tagged immediately. This evidence is to be turned over to the shift supervisor. The shift supervisor in turn will secure the evidence in the evidence locker located in the back storage room. If the evidence is toolarge to fit in the locker the shift supervisor will then secure it in the back storage room or the Detective's Office. If there is evidence that has been stored outside the evidence locker in the storage room a memo will be placed into the Detective's mail slot.

Defective will then secure the evidence in the evidence room until the items can be returned or destroyed. There will be a joint effort between the first securing officer and Defective to monitor the deposition of the case and the evidence. Continuity must be kept and documented throughout this process. Defective will maintain the evidence room and evidence log.

No evidence will be left laying around the station and shall be placed in the appropriate location.

Evidence will be handled as outlined in the New York State Manual for Police.

Special items such as blood, fingerprints etc, etc will be flagged accordingly.
