CHARGES

CHARGES

Charge 1

You have violated Article 6 of the Department's Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 6.2.4. Be in attendance for those hours specifically assigned and will be considered on duty at all times for the purpose of rendering emergency police service.

Specification 1

On May 21, 2005, you were scheduled to work the 2000 to 0400 tour of duty. You failed to report for duty.

Charge 2

You have violated Article 10 of the Department's Rules of Conduct specifically Article 10.1.7. Being absent without proper authorization.

Specification 2

On May 21, 2005, you called in sick for your night shift tour of duty. You advised Officer Collette to put down that you were not feeling well. You were calling from a bar and admitted that the real reason you were unable to come to work was because you were drunk.

Charge 3

You have violated Article 10 of the Department's Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.13. Intoxication whether on or off duty.

Specification 3

On May 21, 2005 you called in sick for your night shift tour of duty. The reason for this was because you were in an intoxicated condition.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 75 of the Civil Service Law of the State of New York, you are hereby notified that the following charges are preferred against you for specific instances of **misconduct:**

CHARGES

Charge 1

You have violated Article 10 of the Department's Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.31. by your Failure to seize, record, process and dispose of recovered or prisoner's property in conformance with Department orders and Procedure.

Specification 1

On December 16, 2004 you received a purse from a larceny complaint which was suppose to be dusted and logged into evidence. You failed to complete the evidence tag on such purse or turn same over to a Supervisor or the Detective. The purse was located in your locker on September 25th, 2005.

Specification 2

On January 22, 1999 you obtained a money bag and tagged as evidence in a larceny complaint that was filed from the Yankee dollars store. On December 18, 1999 you obtained several stolen items involving a larceny from K-Mart. The items totaled \$105.36. On January 10, 2004 you obtained several stolen items involving a larceny complaint from Kinney Drugs. In all of the above cases the items were turned back over to you to return them to the complainants. You failed to do this as all of the items were located in your Locker on September 25, 2005.

Charge 2

You have violated Article 10 of the Department's Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.29. by your failure to pay just indebtedness within a reasonable time.

Specification 1

On March 28th, 2005 and Income Execution was assigned against you by N.Y.S. Supreme Court in Franklin County for and amount of \$1,492.77 plus interest from such date. The creditor was Asset Acceptance LLC as assignee of Providian Bank.

Charge 3

You have violated the Code of Ethics of the Village of Malone's Police Departments both on and off duty and further have engaged in conduct unbecoming a police officer.

Specification 1

During the months of July, August and September, 2005, on several different occasions both on and off duty you met with a 17 year old female. (hereinafter Jane Doe, a 17 year old female.) You brought her and her 13 year old sister and 15 year old brother to your residence, asking them to lie to their parents about your relationship with their sister. On at least one of these occasions you brought Jane Doe along with her 13 year old sister to your residence and went upstairs to your bedroom and had sex with Jane Doe, while you left the 13 year old downstairs. The 13 year old could hear you having sex with her sister.

Specification 2

On September 10, 2005 you went to the residence of the mother of Jane Doe after being told by her not to have any contact with her daughter, Jane Doe, and to stay away from her residence.

Specification 3

On September 24th and 25th, 2005 you were with Jane Doe. You were aware that Jane Doe was reported as a runaway and that the New York State Police were looking for her. You switched vehicles with your brother to try and avoid detection. You also hid Jane Doe at your sister's residence and were hiding with her when the State Police showed up at the residence. This would constitute the crime of Obstructing Governmental Administration in the second degree.

Charge 4

You have violated Article 6 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 6.2.34. Obey the laws and ordinances, which you are is obligated to enforce.

Specification 1

On August 31, 2005 you issued two uniform traffic tickets to a Joshua Wolz for registration not affixed and illegal windshield (tinted). These tickets were written prior to stopping Mr. Wolz and in retaliation for Wolz talking to Jane Doe at Maplefields. This would constitute the crime of Official Misconduct.

Specification 2

On September 30, 2005, you were pulled over for speeding in the Town of Antwerp, NY, by the New York State Police. You advised the Trooper that you were "on the job" and worked for the Malone Village Police Department in an attempt to get out of a speeding ticket. You did this knowing that you were suspended from the Department and your badge and ID had been taken from you.

Charge 5

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.3. and article 10.1.4 by failing to comply with an order from your superior and by being insubordinate and disrespectful towards a superior officer.

Specification 1

On August 31, 2005, you were ordered to stay away from Jane Doe by the Chief Ronald Reyome. This was done after the mother of Jane Doe requested same. You failed to follow this order continued to have personal contact, both on and off duty through the month of September, 2005.

Specification 2

On August 31, 2005, you gave false information to Chief Ronald Reyome. When an inquiry was made about your association with Jane Doe you advised Chief Reyome that nothing was going on between you and Jane Doe and that the only thing that took place were phone calls. That you were not having a relationship. You did this knowing that you were lying to a Superior Officer and were in fact seeing Jane Doe on a Regular basis, both while you were on duty and off duty at your personal residence.

Charge 6

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.46. Operating a Department vehicle out of the Village except in immediate pursuit of law violators or when on official police business authorized by the Chief of Police or his immediate Supervisor.

Specification 1

During the middle to late part of August 2005, while on duty, you drove the Departments vehicle outside the Village limits to Aldi's parking lot to meet Jane Doe and her 15 year old brother. You did this without proper authorization and were not on official police business.

Charge 7

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.42. Failure to keep the Department vehicle in public view while assigned to general patrol duty except when authorized by a Superior Officer.

Specification 1

During the months of June, July, August and September, 2005 while on duty and assigned to general patrol duties, you repeatedly hid the Department vehicle behind the storage building off of Boyer Ave and behind trees off Finney Blvd. You did this to avoid being seen with Jane Doe. On several of those occasions Jane Doe would be with her 13 year old sister or her 15 year old brother.

Specification 2

On September 23, 2005 at around 7:05am while assigned to general patrol duties you hid the Department vehicle behind the storage buildings off of Boyer Ave. You did this to avoid being seen with Jane Doe.

Charge 8

You have violated Article 6 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 6.2.12. Receive, record and service immediately all complaints and requests for service. Refer and transfer complaints and requests only in accordance with Department orders.

Specification 1

On September 23, 2005 at around 7:05am you were dispatched open/unlocked door complaint. You failed to respond immediately to the call.

Charge 9

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, Specifically Article 10.1.18 and 10.1.19 by your failure to treat any person civilly and respectfully and by willful maltreatment of a person.

Specification 1

On September 14, 2005 you requested to talk to prisoner, Joshua Wolz. Wolz was at the Franklin County Jail and you were on duty at the time. He was brought into a room where you threaten physical harm to Wolz. and advised him that if he was anywhere near Jane Doe he would take an even worse beating. You also threatened to kill him.

Charge 10

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.3. Disobedience of an order.

Specification 1

On September 20, 2005 you issued a traffic ticket to a Joseph Dingle for running a red light. At the same time that you issued the ticket

and without inquiry from Mr. Dingle you advised him that he could get a reduction form and that you would grant him the reduction. This was in direct contrast with Chief Reyome's written directive dated August 23, 2005. "When a traffic stop has been made and a ticket issued the Officer will not volunteer to the individual that reduction forms are available."

Charge 11

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, Specifically Article 10.1.3. Disobedience of an order.

Specification 1

On September 12, 2005, you issued a traffic ticket to a Danny Hollis for Speeding. At the same time that you issued the ticket and without inquiry from Mr. Hollis you advised him that he could get a reduction form. This was in direct contrast with Chief Reyome's written directive date August 23, 2005. "When a traffic stop has been made and a ticket issued, the officer will not volunteer to the individual that reduction forms are available."

Charge 12

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.78. No member or members of the Department shall initially contact the Board of Trustees on a police problems except through regular channels or by permission of the Chief of Police.

Specification 1

On October 5, 2005, you bypassed the chain of command and directly contacted Mayor Brent Stewart and complained about the fact that Chief Ronald Reyome gave you a letter. You did this without going through regular channels and without permission of the Chief of Police.

Charge 13

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.20 and Article 10.1.27 by knowingly making a false report, written or oral and by publicly criticizing the official actions of a Department member.

Specification 1

On October 5, 2005, you contacted Mayor Brent Stewart and falsely reported that you witnessed Chief Ronald Reyome in an apparent intoxicated condition at the Malone Country Club.

Specification 2

On October 6, 2005 while outside the Sunoco store located on East Main Street in the Village of Malone, you criticized Chief Ronald Reyome for giving you a letter in regards to official action that is being taken by the Department. You told this to Officer David Merrick and Officer Steven Kemp while in the view and in hearing distance of civilians that were at the store.

Charge 14

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.20. Knowingly make a false report, written or oral.

Specification 1

On October 6, 2005, while outside the Sunoco Store located on East Main Street you falsely reported to Officer David Merrick and Officer Steven Kemp that Chief Ronald Reyome was intoxicated on the night of October 5, 2005 while he was at the Malone Country Club.

Charge 15

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.4. Insubordination or disrespect toward a Superior Officer.

Specification 1

On October 6, 2005 you were insubordinate and disrespectful towards Chief Ronald Reyome, by telling his subordinates, Officer David Merrick and Officer Steven Kemp, that Chief Reyome was in an intoxicated condition on October 5, 2005. These allegations were false and you tried to tarnish Chief's Reyome reputation with his subordinate officers.

Charge 16

You have violated Article 6 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 6.2.34. Obey the laws and ordinances which he is obligated to enforce.

Specification 1

On or about the first week of June 2005, you gave Jane Doe, who is under the age of 21, a wine cooler. This would constitute the crime of Unlawfully Dealing with a Child.

Charge 17

You have violated Article 10 of the Department Rules of Conduct, specifically Article 10.1.44. Permitting any person not on official business to ride in a Department Vehicle unless specifically authorized.

Specification 1 On September 23, 2005 and on several prior dates you allowed Jane Doe and her 15 year old brother sit in the Department's marked Patrol vehicle.

You have engaged in a continuing pattern of misconduct over an extended period of time as evidence by a written record contained in your personnel file that is in addition to the allegations set forth herein; to wit:

Specification 1 February 6, 1997
Violated of Article 10.1.7 and 10.1.1 of the Department Rules of Conduct.

Specification 2 September 28, 2001
Counseling Memorandum for speaking publicly about an officer from an outside agency.

Specification 3 November 25, 2001 72002 Violated Article 6.2.34 and 10.1.1 of the Department Rules of Conduct

Specification 4 October 26, 2002 2500 Counseling Memorandum for failure to submit requested Supporting Deposition

Specification 5 October 9, 2003
Counseling Memorandum for abusive sick time

Specification 6 July 11, 2005 Letter concerning payment of past due debt

Specification 7 August 5, 2005

In accordance with the provisions of Section 75 of the Civil Service Law of the State of New York, you are hereby notified that the following amended charges are in reference to the original charges issued to you on or about October 11, 2005, and are in addition to said charges heretofore preferred against you for specific instances of misconduct:

AMEND CHARGE 3 – YOU HAVE VIOLATED THE CODE OF ETHICS OF THE VILLAGE OF MALONE'S POLICE DEPARTMENT BOTH ON AND OFF DUTY AND FURTHER HAVE ENGAGED IN CONDUCT UNBECOMING A POLICE OFFICER

Specification 1. During the months of July, August and September, 2005, on several different occasions both on and off duty you met with Jane Doe (hereinafter Jane Doe, a 17 year old female.). You brought her and her 13 year old sister and 15 year old brother to your residence, telling them to not divulge information to their parents about your relationship with their sister. On at least one of these occasions you brought Jane Doe along with her 13 year old sister to your residence and went upstairs to your bedroom and had sex with Jane Doe, while you left the 13 year old downstairs. The 13 year believes you had sex with her sister at that time based on what she heard at the time.

Specification 2. On or about August 24, 2005, you were directed by Jane Doe's mother, Mary Kay LaChance, to stay away from her daughter Jane Doe. In that conversation you falsely stated to Mary Kay LaChance that you did not have a romantic relationship with her daughter Jane Doe.

Specification 3. On or about September 17, 2005, you falsely stated to Jane Doe's father, in words or substance, that you did not have a romantic relationship with his daughter Jane Doe and further falsely stated that he had not been with her in a

movie theater in Plattsburgh, New York on September 9, 2005, and that he had not had her in his truck going back from Plattsburgh to the Malone, New York area. This all took place after Jane Doe's mother had warned you to stay away from her daughter. In that same conversation, Jane Doe's father, in words or substance, directed you to not have any further contact with his daughter Jane Doe yet you continued to do so.

Specification 4. On September 10, 2005 you went to the residence of Mary Kay LaChance and unlawfully entered said residence for the purpose of meeting with Jane Doe without the knowledge or permission from Mary Kay LaChance after being directed by Ms. LaChance not to have any contact with her daughter, Jane Doe, and to stay away from her.

Specification 5. On September 24th and 25th, 2005 you were with Jane Doe. You were aware that Jane Doe was reported as a runaway and that the New York State Police were looking for her. You switched vehicles with your brother to try and avoid detection. You also hid Jane Doe at your sister's residence and were hiding with her when the State Police showed up at the residence. This would constitute the crime of Obstructing Governmental Administration in the second degree.

AMEND CHARGE 5 - YOU HAVE VIOLATED ARTICLE 10 OF THE DEPARTMENT RULES OF CONDUCT, SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE 10.1.3. AND ARTICLE 10.1.4 BY FAILING TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER FROM YOUR SUPERIOR AND BY BEING INSUBORDINATE AND DISRESPECTFUL TOWARDS A SUPERIOR OFFICER.

Specification 1. On or about August 24, 2005, Mary Kay Chance, the mother of Jane Doe, phoned Chief Ronald Reyome to inform him of a conversation she just had with the Respondent which, inter alia, she directed the Respondent to stay way from her daughter.

Specification 2. After being informed of the Ms. LaChance's directive to the Respondent, on August 31, 2005, you were ordered to stay away from Jane Doe by the Chief Ronald Reyome. You failed to follow this order and continued to have personal contact, both on and off duty through the month of September, 2005.

Specification 3. On August 31, 2005, you gave false information to Chief Ronald Reyome. When an inquiry was made about your association with Jane Doe you told Chief Reyome that nothing was going on between you and Jane Doe and that the only thing that took place were phone calls hat you were not having a relationship. You did this knowing that you were lying to a Superior Officer and were in fact seeing Jane Doe on a regular basis, both while you were on duty as a police officer and at your personal residence.

CHARGE 7 - delete Specification 2 and place as Specification 2 in Charge 8.

AMEND CHARGE 8 – YOU HAVE VIOLATED ARTICLE 6 OF THE DEPARTMENT RULES OF CONDUCT, SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE 6.2.12. RECEIVE, RECORD AND SERVICE IMMEDIATELY ALL COMPLAINTS AND REQUESTS FOR SERVICE. REFER AND TRANSFER COMPLAINTS AND REQUESTS ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT ORDERS.

Specification 1. On September 23, 2005 at **approximately** 7:05am, while assigned to general patrol duties, you hid the Department vehicle behind the storage buildings off Boyer Ave. while you were **with Jane.** You did this to avoid being seen with Jane Doe.

Specification 2. On September 23, 2005 at around 7:05 am, while on duty, you were dispatched to handle an open door complaint. You failed to respond immediately to the call because you were with Jane Dow parked behind the storage buildings off Boyer Avenue.

NEW CHARGE 18 – YOUR BEHAVIOR AS A KNOWN AND RECOGNIZED POLICE OFFICER FOR THE MALONE POLICE DEPARTMENT SINCE ON OR ABOUT JULY OF 2005 UP TO AND INCLUDING YOUR RECENT ARREST AS REPORTED IN LOCAL PAPERS FOR MISCONDUCT, SECOND DEGREE CRIMINAL TRESPASS, SECOND DEGREE OBSTRUCTION OF GOVERNMENTAL JUSTICE FOLLOWING AN INVESTIGATION OF YOUR INVOLEMENT WITH A 17 YEAR OLD HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT AND THE PUBLICITY RELATED THERETO HAS BECOME A TOPIC OF PUBLIC CONVERSATION THAT HAS CAUSED THE MALONE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO BE VIEWED WITH DISREPUTE.

NEW CHARGE 19 YOU HAVE VIOLATED ARTICLE 10 OF THE DEPARTMENT RULES OF CONDUCT, SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE 10.1.3. DISOBEDIENCE OF AN ORDER.

Specification 1. On September 24th and 25th, 2005 you failed to follow the Department's directive of handling 16 and 17 year old runaways. You were with Jane Doe and you were made aware that Jane Doe was reported as a runaway by her parents and you failed to return her to her parents or bring her to the station to be picked up. This is in direct contrast to the Department Directive dated March 8, 2004.

We drove around for a little while and at approximately 8:00 P.M., we drove over to Scott's brother Dennis's house on Jane St. Malone. I told Scott I had to get out of here as far as the Malone area. State the following: That on 06/10/05, I met SCOTT MULVERHILL. I was driving my 1995 Mercury Tracer on Main Street, Malone, New York, when one of the traffic lights turned red. SCOTT MULVERHILL was driving a marked Malone Village Police Vehicle. He drove on the right side of me and started a conversation with me from his car. He said he thought I was going to go through the red light and I replied, I saw the cops behind me and was not going to go through the red light. I then told SCOTT that I had gotten a ticket for going through a stop sign from Officer BARRETT. SCOTT told me that if I needed help in getting the ticket reduced to either stop by the police station or get a hold of him. The light turned green and I drove west on State Route 11 towards Stewart's. I drove around and then I went home to change into shorts and t-shirt. I drove back into the Village of Malone and saw the cop car at the Sunoco Station. I pulled in and saw SCOTT inside the cop car. I told him I needed to know what to do about the ticket and SCOTT told me to pull into Doctor POUPORE's parking lot so we could talk. SCOTT wrote down my name, birth date, and my parents names. He told me to go to the Airport and get a reduction form for the ticket. I told him I wanted to be a cop and SCOTT spoke to me about doing an internship at the police station. This conversation with SCOTT lasted about a half hour.

At that time I had been hanging out with JOSH WOLZ. We kissed and stuff, but I didn't consider that we were dating. I found out some things about JOSH WOLZ such as he had been with four girls and used drugs. My mother also told me JOSH was bad news and

had been in jail. She told me to keep away from JOSH WOLZ. I still talked to JOSH WOLZ.

After that I talked to SCOTT at Maplefield's. SCOTT found out that I was hanging around with JOSH WOLZ and told me that JOSH WOLZ was a scum bag and he didn't think my parents would approve of me hanging with him. I had already spoken to JOSH WOLZ and told him I couldn't be around him and my parents can't stand him. JOSH would still wave to me when he saw me driving around town. The times I didn't wave back he would flip me off and follow me around. I told SCOTT about my problems with JOSH WOLZ and SCOTT told me he would speak to JOSH WOLZ' probation officer. SCOTT also gave his personal cell phone number. I started calling SCOTT and hanging up, just joking around. This progressed to talking a lot with SCOTT on the telephone. I then started hanging out with SCOTT at his house. I got burned in the end of June 1995, putting gasoline on a bon fire. By that time I had gone up to SCOTT's house on the Mandish Road, North Bangor, NY, two or three times. I would lie and tell my mother I was going somewhere else. I did not have any contact with SCOTT for a week or a week and a half after I got burned. I then ended up going to SCOTT's house. He wasn't there a couple of times, so I left a note saying I got burned. About a week after I left this note, I went to SCOTT's house and he was home. I started seeing SCOTT pretty frequently after that.

In early July 2005, I told my mother I was spending the night at ASHLEY RICE's house. ASHLEY RICE spent the night at some other guy's house and I spent the night with SCOTT MULVERHILL in his house. We had sex that night. I used my birth control pills for protection while SCOTT used a condom. I left there early the next morning and went to pick up my sister, BRYANA LACHANCE at her father's house on the Gale Road in Brushton, New York. After I picked up my sister I drove back to SCOTT's house to pick up a pair shoes I left there. My sister stayed in the car and I went inside SCOTT's house. The door was unlocked. Sometime after this, I was at the Maplefield's gas station with my sister, BRYANA. JOSH WOLZ was leaning inside my car talking to me when SCOTT pulled up in his patrol car. I don't remember what SCOTT said, but he was pissed. JOSH WOLZ pulled away. I left and SCOTT followed me around with his patrol car for a while. I ended up talking to SCOTT on my cell phone. We pulled over somewhere and talked. I don't remember exactly what parking lot we stopped at, but the talk went good. I don't remember whether or not SCOTT wrote JOSH WOLZ any tickets this day. I know he has written JOSH WOLZ tickets as have other police officers. After that JOSH WOLZ would follow me around when he saw me especially if SCOTT was working. JOSH would pull up next to me at Maplefield's and make believe he was talking to me just to get SCOTT mad. JOSH would also beep his horn at SCOTT when he drove by him.

During the months of July, August, and September 2005, I went up to SCOTT house a lot. Most of the time I went there alone, but sometimes I went with my sister, BRYANA. I don't remember having sex with SCOTT any of the times my sister was there. I only took my brother, BRET LESTER to SCOTT's house two or three times. I never had sex with SCOTT when LESTER was in SCOTT's house.

During the beginning of September 2005, SCOTT told me he went to the Franklin County Jail and when he was leaving, JOSH WOLZ yelled out "pedophile" SCOTT told me he talked to the main guy at the jail about this @

During August or September 2005, I was house sitting with my sister at KIM KECK's house on the Gale Road in Brushton, New York. SCOTT left his Jeep at the Brushton School and I picked him up. I spent two nights at KIM KECK's house, but SCOTT only spent one night there with me. We slept on KIM KECK's bed, but didn't have sex that night.

On September 24, 2005, I left my house at about 12:30 P.M. I made arrangements the day before with SCOTT MULVERHILL to meet him at a camp off the Brainardsville Road. SCOTT was concerned that the chief of police was talking to people and getting statements about our relationship. SCOTT wanted to know what I knew and I met SCOTT at this camp. I ended up not returning home and gave a statement about this to Trooper MARTIN on 09/25/05. I want to state that I did not go to Massena at all and I did not drive around that much. I left my car at JIM MANDISH's camp. SCOTT and JIM MANDISH were there at that time. From there I went to SCOTT's house with him. I told SCOTT I was sick of parents crap and I didn't want to go back home. I knew by then that my father was following me around after school. We then returned to MANDISH's camp. I moved my car into the woods to hide it. MANDISH was still there. I then used the phone in MANDISH's camp to call the hospital emergency room. We headed south on Route 30 towards Paul Smith's where SCOTT stopped at someone's house and changed vehicles. We then drove to LYNN's house (SCOTT's sister) on Duane Street, Malone, NY. This is where we spent the night. LYNN, RAYMOND, and some other guy were there. This is where the state police found me. @

State the following: That I reside at the above address with my two children. ASHLEY MARIE PALMER,

(Defendant)

In the middle of June, 2005, my daughter, ASHLEY met SCOTT MULVERHILL through my younger daughter, BRYANA LACHANCE. BRYANA's father is CLYDE LACHANCE who is a retired police officer for the Malone Village Police Department. CLYDE worked with SCOTT MULVERHILL and was friendly with him. This relationship led to a big brother type relationship between SCOTT MULVERHILL and BRYANA. In about the third week in July, 2005, I received a telephone call from an unknown female caller at my residence. She told me I should watch my daughter, ASHLEY and SCOTT MULVERHILL. She stated they have been seen kissing in Malone. I took this call seriously, but had some reservations about it. I first confronted my daughter, ASHLEY and she denied any type of relationship existing between her and SCOTT MULVERHILL. I also called SCOTT MULVERHILL and confronted him with this information. SCOTT also denied these allegations and told me an individual named JOSHUA WOLZ probably put somebody up to doing this. I told SCOTT it was alright to talk to my daughter if he should see her by chance, but I did not approve of him socializing with her since she is barely 17 years old and he is almost 40 years old.

During the first part of August 2005, SCOTT MULVERHILL called my residence at

about 11:30 P.M. and asked for my daughter, ASHLEY. When I confronted him about this, SCOTT said ASHLEY called his cell phone a couple of times. I questioned SCOTT MULVERHILL on this as well and SCOTT stated that he had given ASHLEY his cell phone because she had problems with JOSHUA WOLZ. I told SCOTT MULVERHILL at that point that he was not to have any contact with any of my children and I did not want him anywhere around them or my residence.

A couple of weeks later, SCOTT MULVERHILL was on shift at the Malone Police Department when he received a call on his cell phone from my daughter, ASHLEY. SCOTT showed his supervisor, DEAN FOUNTAIN his cell phone and advised ASHLEY keeps calling him. DEAN FOUNTAIN then advised ASHLEY that SCOTT has been ordered not to have any contact with her. My brother, MARK SIMONSEN who is a Border Patrol Agent, had already approached SCOTT's superiors prior to this incident. This incident was relayed to me by Sergeant DEAN FOUNTAIN.

On 09/24/05, during the early afternoon, ASHLEY advised me she was going to work out at Heart to Hart Fitness Center in Hogansburg, NY and was then going to a football party at KYLE BABBIE's house in Whippleville, NY. She left at a little after noon time in her 1995 Mercury Tracer, New York Registration CXH3117. She was wearing a cream colored Abercrombie Sweatshirt with dark pants. About ten to minutes after ASHLEY left, I got in my car with my daughter, BRYANA and started driving towards SCOTT MULVERHILL's residence. During this trip, BRYANA told me that ASHLEY was not going to SCOTT's house. She said that she was going to a cabin to meet SCOTT, but she was unsure of where this cabin was located. BRYANA also told me she has been to SCOTT MULVERHILL's almost everyday during the summer with ASHLEY. BRYANA said, sometimes ASHLEY and SCOTT went up to SCOTT's bedroom and she could hear them engaging in sexual intercourse. One time ASHLEY brought a lubricant of some type and went upstairs with SCOTT into his bedroom. After they came out of the bedroom half of the lubricant was gone. I contacted Malone Police Chief RONALD REYOME with this information as I knew Chief REYOME had started an investigation into this matter. At about 4:00 P.M., I called ASHLEY's cell phone from my residence and advised her father had been hurt at work and she needed to come home immediately. I left this on ASHLEY's voice mail as she did not answer her telephone. At about 4:38 P.M., ASHLEY called me back from her cell phone and questioned me about this. She told me she was at the mall in Massena, NY. ASHLEY hung up the phone and called again a few minutes later. She said "we called the facility" meaning Franklin Correctional Facility where her father is employed and he was not hurt. I told her I wanted her home and ASHLEY hung up the phone. I left ASHLEY another voice mail and she did not respond. At about 9:10 P.M., I went to the New York State Police Barracks in Malone, NY, to report my daughter, ASHLEY as a runaway.

On 09/30/05, at about 8:00 P.M., I was having a conversation at home with my daughter, ASHLEY. During this conversation, ASHLEY admitted to that she had received the phone message described in the preceding paragraph. ASHLEY stated she did not return

my call because she was upset I lied to her about her father getting hurt at work. I only did this because I wanted ASHLEY to come home.

State the following: That I have known SCOTT MULVERHILL since I was born. SCOTT was a good friend of my father, CLYDE LACHANCE, who is a retired Malone Village Police Officer. For the past year, SCOTT and my father have drifted apart and do not call each other. My mother and father split up when I was about three years old and I live with my mother. I also have an older half sister, ASHLEY PALMER who lives with me and my mother. We are pretty close, but she did not know SCOTT MULVERHILL. ASHLEY first noticed SCOTT MULVERHILL last January when all the cops got their heads shaved at the mall in Massena, New York. She had a crush on him since. ASHLEY told me in June of this year that she started talking to SCOTT MULVERHILL. During June, 2005, my sister ASHLEY was hanging around with ASHLEY RICE. They picked me up at my father, CLYDE LACHANCE's house on the Gale Road in Brushton, New York. After they picked me up, they both said they had to stop at SCOTT MULVERHILL's house to pick up ASHLEY RICE's pants because they had spent the night there and ASHLEY RICE left her jeans there when she took a shower. At that point my sister, ASHLEY PALMER told me she was dating SCOTT MULVERHILL. I also knew that my sister, ASHLEY told my mother that she was spending the night at ASHLEY RICE's house the night before when she in fact spent the night at SCOTT MULVERHILL's house which is located on the Mandish Road, just off the Eddy Road in the Town of Brandon, New York. My sister, ASHLEY went inside the house and got

the jeans. She told me to stay in the car because SCOTT didn't want me to know too much because he was afraid I might slip up. During the months of July, August, and September 2005, I went to SCOTT MULVERHILL's house almost everyday with my sister, ASHLEY PALMER. In the beginning SCOTT wasn't always there when we went, but later he was there all the time. I saw SCOTT and my sister, ASHLEY kissing every time we met. They would kiss each other on the lips, but they wouldn't make out in front of me. SCOTT and ASHLEY would normally hang out in the living room at SCOTT's house, but they would also go upstairs to SCOTT's bedroom everyday. I don't know how long they spent upstairs. I usually went for a walk or would play outside with SCOTT's dogs. SCOTT and ASHLEY were really jealous of each other. They would argue a lot. SCOTT made ASHLEY erase all the male names listed as contacts on her cell phone and ASHLEY made SCOTT erase all the female contacts on his cell phone. They got into fights about JOSH WOLZ all the time. JOSH WOLZ was ASHLEY's boyfriend, before she started dating SCOTT. ASHLEY dated JOSH WOLZ for about 3 weeks. ASHLEY broke up with JOSH WOLZ because he cheated on her with EMILY RITCHIE. He also stole \$40 from ASHLEY's car glove compartment.

One day in July, 2005, ASHLEY gave me some pills which were in her pocket and she didn't want my mother to see. ASHLEY asked me to put these pills in her glove compartment. These pills were birth control pills. One time in either July or August 2005, when I was in SCOTT's house, I heard SCOTT's bed squeaking while SCOTT and my sister, ASHLEY were in SCOTT's bedroom together. This squeak made me believe SCOTT and ASHLEY were having sex together.

One day in August, 2005, I was with ASHLEY at Maplefield's talking to JOSH WOLZ. SCOTT was working and pulled up in his patrol car. He got out of the car and told JOSH WOLZ "you better get out of here". He then told ASHLEY "we're done". SCOTT noticed ASHLEY had JOSH WOLZ' cell phone number written on her hand. This number was 651-4577. SCOTT memorized this number and later told me that he called JOSH at this number and told him "you are dead". ASHLEY and I left, but SCOTT followed us around all day with his patrol car. We stopped by the Congregational Church on Finney Boulevard and SCOTT started writing JOSH WOLZ' name on some tickets. I think he did this on two or three tickets. SCOTT later told me that he had given JOSH the tickets. SCOTT followed us around with his patrol car often when he saw us in the Village of Malone. ASHLEY would sometimes call SCOTT on his cell phone and meet him by the A&M Beverages storage sheds.

One day in August 2005, I went to the ST. Lawrence Mall in Massena, NY with my sister ASHLEY. She went into the Spencer's store and bought a bottle of lubricant. The front of the bottle said "when you put it on it warms". I later saw this bottle of lubricant, half empty in SCOTT MULVERHILL's bedroom night stand.

One day in August 2005, I was house sitting with my sister, ASHLEY at KIM KECK's house on the Gale Road in Brushton, New York. ASHLEY called SCOTT on the telephone. He parked his Jeep by the Brushton school and ASHLEY picked him up. ASHLEY and SCOTT spent the night in KIM KECK's bed together.

In August 2005, I was with my sister, ASHLEY two different times that she went to Planned Parenthood Office in Malone, New York. One time she picked up birth control pills and another time she got a test for sexually transmitted diseases. She called SCOTT

MULVERHILL after she got this test because she wasn't feeling so good.

On September 10, 2005, at about 9:00 PM, SCOTT came over to my house. SCOTT told me he parked his Jeep on the Irish Settlement Road and wrote a note saying the car was broke down. ASHLEY picked him up and brought him to my house. SCOTT said he didn't want my uncle MARK SIMONSEN finding his Jeep since SCOTT wasn't supposed to be at my house because my mother had banned him. SCOTT only stayed for about an hour. He said he had to get back home because he didn't know when my mother was going to return.

I never saw SCOTT give alcohol, cigarettes, or marijuana to my sister or anybody else.

I have known ASHLEY PALMER for about four years. We attended school together in Malone. I didn't start hanging out with ASHLEY until May of this year. She invited me to her birthday party in mid May and by the end of May we started hanging out together. We also worked together at Bokie's Tastee Freeze in Malone, NY. When we started hanging out together, ASHLEY PALMER was dating JOSH WOLZ who we call "Bear". I met JOSH WOLZ through ASHLEY PALMER. ASHLEY PALMER only dated Bear for two weeks. She broke up with him because according to ASHLEY PALMER, JOSH cheated on her with EMILY RITCHIE. During the first week in June 2005, ASHLEY PALMER started talking g to me about SCOTT MULVERHILL. He is a cop in the Malone Police Department. ASHLEY PALMER told me that SCOTT MULVERHILL was going to take care of a ticket she got for running a stop sign. ASHLEY got this ticket while she was going out with JOSH WOLZ. I witnessed this conversation between SCOTT and ASHLEY behind Doctor POUPORE's parking lot. I was inside ASHLEY PALMER's car. A day or two after this conversation, ASHLEY PALMER told her mother she was spending the night at my house and I told my mother I was spending the night at ASHLEY PALMER's house. I spent that night at Split Rock camping with friends and ASHLEY PALMER went to SCOTT's house and spent the

night there with him. ASHLEY PALMER picked me up at 6:00 A.M. or 6:30 A.M. the next morning. She was wearing her pajamas. After ASHLEY picked me up we went back to ASHLEY's house. I have not hung out with ASHLEY PALMER since late July 2005. This is because ASHLEY started hanging out with SCOTT MULVERHILL more often and I moved in with my father in Peru, NY, for a while.

During August 2005, I was with my best friend, CECILIA MERRILL at Sunoco's parking lot. JOSH WOLZ pulled up in JARED GRANT's vehicle. He was with JARED GRANT and MATT STEENBERGE. It was about 11:00 P.M. JOSH WOLZ borrowed CECILIA's cell phone and called ASHLEY PALMER's mother. I know this because JOSH asked me for ASHLEY's number. JOSH then called ASHLEY PALMER's mother and told her that SCOTT MULVERHILL was having sex with ASHLEY PALMER.

I, Bret M Palmer

My sister Ashley Palmer is 17 years old and lives sometime with my father and me and sometimes with her mother, Mary Kay LaChance out in Burke. Sometime in mid-August Ashley and I were at K-Mart, I heard her say to someone on her cell phone to met her at K-Mart. Ashley and I went outside and a Malone Village Police car pulled up to her and she said "hey Scoot met me out back". The police car went around back, Ashley and I got into her car and we drove around back to where the police car was. I have heard Ashley talk about Scott before but this was the first time I actually met him, his full name is Scott Mulverhill and he works for the Malone Village Police Department. Ashley pulled up beside the police car and talked to Scott through the window for about 10 minutes then we all left K-Mart at the same time.

About a week later Ashley and I going to Aldi's in her car, she called Scott on her cell phone and asked him to met her there. When we pulled in Scott, who was in the police car again, was sitting in the parking lot and followed us over to west side of the building. Scott and Ashley talked to each other for about 10 minutes through their driver's door window. They told each other that they loved each other then we left together, Ashley went to McDonald's and Scott went back into the Village.

The next time I remember seeing Scott was at his house, it was before school started, towards the end of August. Ashley and I were in the car and she called Scott and said we would be up in a couple of minutes and told him what road we were on. When we got there we all sat in the kitchen talking for awhile, we where there for 30 to 40 minutes. Ashley and I then left and she dropped me off at a friend house who lives on Bangor off 11B.

Before school started I have been with Ashley about 10 times when she would meet with Scott. We would be heading to the store or something like that and he would meet her in a wooded clearing off of Finney Blvd across from the Niagara Mohawk building. Sometimes Scott would be working, driving the police car and some time he would be in his own vehicle. Since school has started Ashley has meet Scott in that same locating about 6 times, this would be in the morning before we went to school, sometimes Scott would be in the police car. When they would met in the clearing Ashley would get into Scott's vehicle, whichever he was driving, the police car or his truck. About half the time I would get into Scott's vehicle also, I always sat in the back. When it was the police car it was the one with the soft seat, Scott told me I was lucky as the other car had the hard plastic seat. We would usually be there for about 20 minutes, they would talk about different stuff, including where and when they would met again. they would also talk about Ashley's mother Mary Kay calling Scott and her being upset. They would usually hug and kiss each other before they left, saying they loved each other.

I have been to Scott's house twice more with Ashley, Ashley was suppose to be going to a friends house in Brushton but we went to Scott's instead. The first time they were in the kitchen and I was in the living room area playing with Scott's play station 2, playing PGA tour game. At some point while I was playing the game they left the kitchen and went upstairs, they were up there for about 45 minute to a hour then they both came down stairs together. We stayed for about another 10 minutes then we went back home. The other time we went there they went for a walk and I played with Scott's play station again, they were gone for about 15 minutes. When then came back they went upstairs again and they were up there for about 40 minutes then they came back down. When I was at Scott's I saw his three dogs, he had two that are alike, they were friendly. But he has a third one that is smaller and older and I do not think it like me, it would not stop barking at me and when it finally did it hide behind the couch and would not come near me.

On September 9th Ashley, myself and a friend of ours, Francis (Frankie) Wood were going to Plattsburgh to the mall to the movies. When we were leaving school I heard Ashley call Scott and tell him to met her out in Plattsburgh, that we were going to the movies. Ashley drove us to the movies and when we got there we met Scott in the food court area. All four of us when to the same movie, Frankie paid for the three of us and Scott paid for his own. When we got into the theater Frankie and I sat on one side and Ashley and Scott sat on the other side. When the movie was done we saw Scott in the food court and he told us that Ashley was waiting for us in the car. Frankie and I went to the car and met Ashley, we then went to Wal-Mat as planned. When we got to Wal-Mart Scott pulled in. All four of us went into the store and shopped for awhile then we left going out the main road. When we got to the overpass for the highway we had to stop for traffic that was backed up. Traffic was stopped and not moving, Ashley asked Frankie if he would drive her car, she then back to Scott's car. Scott made a U turn and Frankie followed him, we went down some back streets then came up to a road block and Scott pulled up next to a trooper and talked to him. The trooper waved us on and we followed Scott to another road then he pulled over and we pulled up beside him. Scott told us that a trooper had been shot, he told Frankie to go ahead and that he would met us back in Malone at Work Source One. They followed up a ways on the Military Turnpike but they kept falling further and further behind us. When we got back to Malone we went to Work Source One and waited for about 25 minutes then Scott and Ashley showed up.

I, Chief Ronald E. Reyome, am a police officer in the Village of Malone, New York, and by this supporting deposition make the following allegation of fact in connection with an accusatory instrument filed with this court against the above named defendant:

I am currently employed as the Chief of Police for the Malone Village Police Department. One of my duties as Chief of Police is to create and enforce the Department's Policy and Procedures and our Duties and Rules of Conduct. In Article 6.1 of the Duties and Rules of Conduct refers to the General Duties of a member of our force. It states that "A member of the Force will be responsible **at all times** for the prevention of crime, enforcement of all laws and ordinances, preservation of the public peace, protection of life and property, arrest and prosecution of law violators and professional adherence to Department rules and Regulations."

Our Department has a specific policy on dealing with sixteen and seventeen year old individuals. The policy is as follows. "We are treat 16 and 17 year olds like juveniles when it comes to being runaway. Children who don't return home when told and without reasonable explanation will be considered runaways. Children who refuse to return home will be considered runaways. We will use force if necessary to take them into custody. Pat down searches only, unless PC exist otherwise or if under arrest. They will not be detained in the holding cell unless under arrest. We will bring them to the PD and have parents come and get them, or return them home to parent. Parents must make an attempt to retrieve their children if they know their whereabouts before we will make transport as a runaway." This policy was developed in regards to the New York State Family Court Act section 718 Return of run away. This became effective on November 1, 2001.

On September 24th, 2005 an Ashley Palmer, age 17, was reported as a runaway to the New York State Police. Ashley was with one of my officers, the defendant, Scott M. Mulverhill. Ashley was located on September 25, 2005 at residence of Scott Mulverhill's sister in Duane Street in the Village of Malone. She was hiding in the residence along with Officer Mulverhill. When Officer Mulverhill was made aware that Ashley was considered a runaway he was obligated as a police officer and by our Department Policy to return her to her parents. He knowingly refrain from performing his duty, which is clearly inherent in the nature of his position as a police officer.

The foregoing factual allegations are based upon personal knowledge of the complainant (and upon information and belief, the sources of complainant's information and belief being,

Wherefore, Complainant prays that Scott M. Mulverhill

be dealt with pursuant to law.

False statements made in the foregoing instrument are punishable as a class A Misdemeanor pursuant to Section 210.45 of the Penal Law. Accordingly and with notice of the foregoing, I hereby affirm that the foregoing statements of facts are true under penalty of law this: 21st Day of October ,2005.



THE "HABITUALLY TRUANT" FROM SCHOOL COMPONENT OF A PINS REMAINS AT UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE (EDUCATION LAW SECTION 3205).

AN ACT to amend the social services law and the family court act, in relation to the definition of a "person in need of supervision"

Became a law December 19, 2000, with the approval of the Governor. Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 6 of section 371 of the social services law, as added by chapter 690 of the laws of 1962, is amended to read as follows:

- 6. "Person in need of supervision" means a [male less than sixteen years of age and female] person less than eighteen years of age who is habitually truant or who is incorrigible, ungovernable or habitually disobedient and beyond the lawful control of a parent or other person legally responsible for such child's care, or other lawful authority.
- § 2. Subdivision (a) of section 712 of the family court act, as amended by chapter 920 of the laws of 1982, is amended to read as follows:
- (a) "Person in need of supervision". A [male less than sixteen years of age and a female] person less than eighteen years of age who does not attend school in [accord] accordance with the provisions of part one of article sixty-five of the education law or who is incorrigible, ungovernable or habitually disobedient and beyond the lawful control of a parent or other person legally responsible for such child's care, or other lawful authority, or who violates the provisions of section 221.05 of the penal law.
- § 3. Subdivision (a) of section 718 of the family court act, as amended by chapter 843 of the laws of 1980, is amended to read as follows:
- (a) A peace officer, acting pursuant to [his] such peace officer's special duties, or a police officer may return to [his] a parent or other person legally responsible for [his] such child's care any [male under the age of sixteen or female] child under the age of eighteen who has run away from home without just cause or who, in the reasonable [opinion] conclusion of the officer, appears to have run away from home without just cause. For purposes of this action, a police officer or peace officer may reasonably conclude that a child has run away from home when the child refuses to give his or her name or the name and address of [his] a parent or other person legally responsible for [his] such child's care or when the officer has reason to doubt that the name or address given are the actual name and address of the parent or other person legally responsible for the child's care.
- § 4. Subdivision (b) of section 732 of the family court act is amended to read as follows:
- (b) the respondent[, if male, was under sixteen years of age and, if female,] was under eighteen years of age at the time of the specified acts; and



10/2 Spoke with Inv. Melo he stated he feels he has enough to charge Scott with Obstructing for trying to hide Ashley when she ran away. He talked to Bryana and Ashley more about same. In one of the phone calls that Ashley made home Scott could be heard in the back ground telling her to asked certain questions, and Ashley would repeat the answer to him when Bryana gave them to her. Scott wanted Ashley to asked what they had told the cops and if they were looking for them. Mary Kay had called Ashley's cell phone earlier and told her that the State police, Village Police, and Border Patrol where looking for her, that she was a runway. Scott was apparently trying to find out info on this and what info the police had on them. He stated he would be bring in further depositions and would be bring all the info to the DA's office for possible charges. He stated he did not thing they would not be perusing the trespass charge but would talk to the DA's office about same. Also informed him about what Ashley Rice had told me about the wine cooler, he is going to interview her also.

10/02 1730 hrs went to FCJ and spoke with Sgt Gravel to see about talking to Wolz who was being housed in solitary for discipline problems. Gravel checked and he would talk to me, Gravel stated there had been rumors around the jail also including some from the inmates but nothing substantial. Spoke with Josh Wolz, I told him that I heard that he had a complaint again one of our officer and he said no. I asked him if he has had problems with one of our officer's and he said that Scott Mulverhill has been harassing him. He said Scott was always telling him to leave Maplefield's, stopped him and gave him UTT's. He stopped him a couple of times and asked him where he was coming from, "he never asked me to search my car or me though". Wolz did say other officers have also stopped him and gave him UTT's and he had been told several time they can not hang out at Maplefield's. Wolz said there was no one incident that was real harassment it was everything added up and they way Scott seem to focus on him. Scott kept tell his probation officer things he was doing, like being in a bar when he was not suppose to be. Wolz said he went to Fat Jake's with some friends, but did not drink. While there he saw Scott watching him but there was no contact. Wolz's probation officer questing him about being in Fat Jake's.

I questioned Wolz about UTTs he was given by Scott and he stated Scott stopped him as his registration sticker was hanging off, he also gave him a ticket for the chrome tinting on the top of his windshield as Scott told him it was illegal. He has him stopped for about 15-20 minutes, he didn't say anything else to him. He then told me about the incident at the jail, as he was walking by Scott, he said "you like jacking deer and young girls". The Sgt on duty brought him into the interview room that we were presently in. Scott came into the room with the Sgt and there were some other officers near by. Scott stated yelling at him and told him to come to his house so he could fight with him. Wolz said Scott told him that he would beat him so bad that he would have to call the cops on him. He said come to my house and I'll kill kick your ass. I'm going to kill you boy, you come up to my house.

Wolz found out about Ashley and Scott from Ashley Rice, she told him that they had sex together. Wolz called Mary Kay LaChance to tell her about it, and it appears Scott is made at him for that and wants to fight with him. Wolz feels that Scott is harassing him and might continue his actions when he gets out of jai because of all the problems now.

10/02 1715 hrs. spoke with Jocelyn Gadway age 17 of 315 Co Rt 25 Malone 483-4594.

Jocelyn has know Ashley since Middle School and they have spent nights over at each other's house in the past. In late July she started hearing rumors about Ashley and an older guy so she asked Ashley about it. Ashley just snubbed it off and did not really answer her, but said it was over with. At the end of August she was at work at Price Chopper and she saw Cory Rovito talking to Ashley as they were walking out of the store together. Jocelyn saw a police car pull up to them in the parking lot and start talking to them, it was Scott. Cory went and picked up carts and Scott continued to talk to Ashley. Jocelyn could not hear them but she could see that Scott was upset. Jocelyn talked to Cory later and he told her that Scott was upset with Ashley as she told him that Scott was a friend of her mother. Scott told her something about you can't tell them I'm your boyfriend. Jocelyn did not see it, but Cory told her that Scott kept driving through the parking lot and was looking at him when he was picking up the carts.

Jocelyn stated she has not had much contact with Ashley over the summer so she knew something was wrong. She said Ashley used to call her all the time or come over, it stopped over the summer and she has not see her till school started.
