Hello.

As you're aware my divorce recently concluded. As you're additionally aware, I am currently unable to occupy the relevant property in this case, but a hearing is set to take place on 1/4/2021 to allow me to return to the property. As you're most likely unaware, said divorce included testimony from agents from the Brevard County Sheriff's Office (exhibit 1.) This testimony was in reference to criminal acts I had allegedly committed on 8/20/2020 at the relevant property in this case, 127 Delvalle St. Melbourne Beach, Fl 32951. Through their testimony, the two BCSO agents have shown themselves to at best be negligent and at worst to be liars, but at a minimum to be uncredible. It was the word of these uncredible individuals that gave rise to warrants that allowed access to the inside of my home. - 7 behind your back" initially.

- 4 and who were the two agents who did it?

- 6 was -- I'm sorry. It was Agent Holland and Agent McMillan
- 7 at the time who did that.
- 8 Q. And then how long was that before the next
- 9 action was taken?
- 10 A. They actually -- just minutes before. I would
- 11 say about two minutes before.
- 12 O. And you had mentioned that Mr. Locke came
- 13 outside the house and went back in. So that first initial
- 14 time he came outside the house then, was it to address the
- 15 two agents who were either dressed as FP&L workers or
- 16 construction workers or something of that nature?
- 17 A. I don't want to -- I don't remember exactly
- 18 whether he answered the door for them or not. I honestly
- 19 don't remember. I know that they went and knocked on the
- 20 door and that they were walking along the side of the
- 21 property when I, from my position, observed Mr. Locke come
- 22 out the front door, walk to his car. He walked back inside
- 23 carrying a long object, like a tool or something. I
- 24 couldn't tell exactly what it was. He went inside and then
- 25 it takes -- it takes a little bit of pre-warning for us to

- 1 move in in a safe manner. So we did not move to arrest him
- 2 the first time he came out. When he came out the second
- 3 time we moved in to arrest.





Summary of Investigation

On May 13, 2016, Louise Goloversic came into West Precinct and completed a complaint tracking form in reference to her arrest for battery domestic violence and aggravated assault that occurred on December 26, 2015. Her complaint alleged that she was unlawfully arrested. After reviewing the reports and evidence, I have determined that her arrest was based on probable cause and Deputy Turbeville, ID 1891, is **EXONERATED**.

Relevant Facts

On December 26, 2015, FTO David Turbeville and FTO Leandro Balparda, ID 488, responded to the Chevron located at 6970 Highway 520. After speaking with the victims and reviewing cell phone video, FTO Turbeville determined that probable cause existed to arrest Ms. Goloversic for battery, domestic violence, against her daughter, Louise Goloversic, and aggravated assault against Mr. Rodeghier. Ms. Goloversic was arrested and transported to the jail.

Early in February Louise Goloversic arrived at West Precinct to speak to someone in reference to her case. At that time, she met with Lt. Little, ID 993, and provided him with a video from the Chevron. Lt. Little then gave the video to Sgt. Rosenfeld, ID 740, as FTO Turbeville was assigned to his squad. Sgt. Rosenfeld reviewed the video, the written reports and spoke with FTO Turbeville. At the conclusion of his inquiry, Sgt. Rosenfeld determined that video did not eliminate the probable cause for the arrest of Louise Goloversic for battery domestic violence, but called the aggravated assault charge into question. Sgt. Rosenfeld directed FTO Turbeville to contact the State Attorney's Office and write a supplemental report about the new evidence. Sgt. Rosenfeld did verbally counsel FTO Turbeville for not collecting or attempting to collect the store surveillance video at the time of the call. Sgt. Rosenfeld contacted Ms. Goloversic, via phone, and discussed his findings.

On May 13, 2016, Ms. Goloversic came back to West Precinct and completed a BCSO Civilian Complaint Form. In her complaint, she again stated she was falsely arrested. On May 26, 2016, I was able to obtain a copy of the video she previously turned over to the Sheriff's Office from records.

After reviewing the reports and video, I came to the same conclusion as Sgt. Rosenfeld. FTO Turbeville based his probable cause on the sworn statements from the victims, the injuries to the daughter, the call comments from the victim and the cell phone video from the male victim. The store surveillance video did not clearly contradict any of the information FTO Turbeville had obtained.

Conclusion

After reviewing the reports and evidence, I have determined that her arrest was based on probable cause. FTO Turbeville is EXONERATED.

NARRATIVE

Section 1: Narrative

On February 8th, 2016 I was advised by Sergeant Rosenfeld (ID#0740) that a new piece of video evidence had been provided in this case from the Chevron convenience store located at 6970 Highway 520, Cocoa, Brevard County, Florida 32926.

The video provided shows a much more accurate and full account of the incident from a large angle allowing the surrounding areas and full view of all persons involved to be viewed. Due to the new camera angle I was able to observe that Mr. Rodeghier appears to place himself in front of the vehicle intentionally as it accelerates. Furthermore, it is apparent that Mr. Jason Rodeghier (Witness) and Ms. Louise Julia Goloversic (Victim) acted in a manner which contributed to the start of a physical altercation by not allowing Mrs. Louise VV Goloversic (Suspect) to leave the area, and acting in an aggressive manner. The video DVD was collected as evidence in this case and will be forwarded to the State Attorney's Office for review in this case.

The original cell phone video shown to me by Mr. Rodeghier was from a first person point of view, much shorter in duration, and showed a much more narrow viewpoint than the newly provided Store Surveillance video. On February 12th, 2016 at 0937 hours I made contact with Mr. Jason Ray Rodeghier (Witness) in reference to him providing audio and video captured from his cellular phone on the date of the incident. Mr. Rodeghier provided me with a Silver "SNC" brand USB flash drive which he advised contained the video taken by him on the day of the incident. Mr. Rodeghier advised that he had attempted to send the video to Deputy Goff's (ID#1258) email address on the day of the incident, however the video was not successfully received. The USB was collected as evidence. There are no further developments in this case at this time.

Section 2: Crime Scene

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

Florida Highway Patrol troopers say a jogger was apparently killed along a darkened stretch of roadway in an early morning accident by a driver who fled the scene. Investigators evaluating the debris left behind near the man's body believe they are looking for an unknown make gray in color Chrysler and are hoping to track the vehicle down as more leads come in.

FHP has identified the jogger as 39-year-old Jason Rodeghier of Cocoa, who left his home just after 4:30 a.m on Monday.

Brevard County sheriff's deputies were initially called out to the site of the deadly incident about 7:10 a.m. today after a passerby found the body of a man near a ditch along a dead-end portion of Satellite Boulevard, a dirt road just north of State Road 520.

"More than likely he was hit before sunrise," said Kim Montes, spokeswoman for the Florida Highway Patrol. Montes reported that the suspect vehicle could have damage to the front end, possibly the headlight and turn signal area.
